## Detroit Tigers (86-74) at Boston Red Sox (88-72)

**SIMPLE PLAN:** The Detroit Tigers and Boston Red Sox this afternoon continue their three-game series at Fenway Park after the Tigers endured a 4-3 setback last night, their ninth loss in the last 10 games ... nevertheless, the Tigers woke up this morning needing just one win or Houston Astros loss over the next two days to clinch their second playoff appearance in as many seasons ... the Tigers also remain co-leaders of the A.L. Central as they seek their first division title since 2014.

- The Tigers have lost 12 of their last 14 and 21 of their past 29 games since August 24 ... Detroit has gone 27-40 in its last 67 games after going 59-34 in its first 93 games through July 8.
- The Tigers have reached 86 wins this year, matching their total from a season ago ... Detroit has 86 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since a four-year run from 2011-14.

**WHERE THINGS STAND:** The Tigers can clinch a playoff spot today with a win OR a loss by the Houston Astros, who play at the Los Angeles Angels with first pitch at 9:38 p.m. ET ... in regards to the A.L. Central, any combo of three Tigers wins/Guardians losses and the Tigers win the division ... since Cleveland owns the tiebreaker, any combo of two Guardians wins/Tigers losses and Cleveland wins the division ... the Guardians can clinch the division as early as today while Detroit's earliest opportunity to win the A.L. Central could not come until Sunday.

**A LONELY SEPTEMBER:** The Tigers last night dropped to 6-16 (.273) thus far in September, the second-lowest winning percentage in the majors this month ahead of only the Rockies (4-19, .174) ... the Mariners lead the majors with a 17-6 (.739) record in September while the Guardians are 18-7 (.720), the second-best mark in the majors this month.

- Detroit's 4.97 ERA (108 ER/195.2 IP) this month is third-highest in the A.L. and 1.17 points higher than its 3.80 team ERA through August, which was fourth-best in the A.L. ... Cleveland leads the majors with a 2.51 ERA this month, 0.64 points better than anyone else.
- The Tigers offense has posted a collective .679 OPS thus far in September, which ranks 10th in the A.L. ... the club had a .740 team OPS through the end of August, fifth-best in the A.L.

**A SEASON FOR THE AGES:** Riley Greene has 31 doubles, 36 homers and 111 RBI, just the second Tiger in the 125-season history of the franchise to reach those numbers in his age-24-or-younger season, joining Hank Greenberg in 1935 (46 doubles/36 homers/168 RBI) ... Greene (2025), Greenberg (1935, 1937, 1940) and Miguel Cabrera (2008, 2010, 2012) own the only seven individual seasons in the history of the franchise that reach those totals, regardless of age.

- Only five other major leaguers in the past 20 years have reached Riley's current totals in their age-24-or-younger season: Rafael Devers (BOS, 2021), Cody Bellinger (LAD, 2019), Nolan Arenado (COL, 2015), Mike Trout (LAA, 2014) and Prince Fielder (MIL, 2007).
- Overall, Greene is the second Tigers left-handed hitter to reach 36 homers in the past 50 years, the first in the last 40 years when Darrell Evans slugged 40 bombs in 1985 ... Greene is the first Tigers lefty to reach 36 homers and 111 RBI since Norm Cash in 1961 (41 HR, 132 RBI).

**OH TO BE YOUNG AGAIN:** The Tigers this year have now hit 101 homers by players in their age-25 season or younger, by far their most in a single season since TruMedia began tracking this statistic in 1974 ... their next best mark in the last 52 seasons?: the 1979 Tigers with 87 such homers.

- The Tigers rank second in all of baseball this season with the 101 home runs, trailing only the Athletics and their 116 homers from players in their age-25 season or younger ... Detroit is now one of only four teams to have reached 100 such homers in the last five seasons, joining the 2025 Athletics, the 2023 Royals (103 homers) and the 2022 Braves (105 homers).

**SOUTHERN HOSPITALITY:** Tonight marks the third of three-straight scheduled games vs. left-handed starting pitchers ... the Tigers previously faced three southpaws in a row on June 15 and 17-18 ... Detroit has a 24-17 (.585) record vs. lefty starters this year, good for the fifth-best winning percentage in all of baseball vs. opposing southpaws (Milwaukee leads at 29-17, .630).

- This marks the second year in a row that the Tigers have been elite vs. left-handed starting pitchers, as the club went 21-12 (.636) last year ... Detroit's combined 45-29 (.608) record the last two seasons is the best in all of baseball ... the Dodgers are second best at 60-40 (.600).
- Collectively, the Tigers have a .782 OPS vs. left-handed pitching this season, the second-best team mark in all of baseball ... the Yankees lead with a .796 OPS vs. lefties.
- Individually, the Tigers have four players with an OPS greater than .900 and six players greater than .800 vs. left-handed pitchers: Jahmai Jones (.970), Dillon Dingler (.963), Gleyber Torres (.920), Spencer Torkelson (.905), Wenceel Pérez (.880) and Zach McKinstry (.861).

**HE'S CATCHING ON:** Dillon Dingler has an .864 OPS on the road, the best mark on the club ... Dingler could post the highest road OPS by a Tigers catcher in 45 years, as Lance Parrish had a .927 OPS in 1980 ... other catchers since then in the neighborhood of Dingler: Pudge Rodriguez had an .866 OPS in 2004 and Chad Kreuter had an .871 OPS in 1993 ... min. 200 plate apps.

**AND FINALLY:** Only 20 players in baseball (min. 100 ABs) have a .900 OPS or better vs. lefties and 20 percent of them are on the Tigers: Jahmai Jones, Dillon Dingler, Wenceel Pérez and Zach McKinstry ... Detroit has not had four such players in a single season since TruMedia's records began in 1974.

- Set to make his third consecutive start for the Tigers...allowed three earned runs in three innings in his last outing on Sept. 20 against Atlanta, allowing two hits (both home runs) while walking four in the outing.
- Earned a win with five scoreless innings on Sept. 14 against Miami, allowing three hits while striking out five in his first start with the Tigers since July 25 against Toronto.
- Began the 2025 season with Triple-A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.79 ERA in his two starts...allowed three runs on six hits and one walk while striking out 11 over 9.2 innings.
- Named International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 7-13, 2025, after picking up the win with 5.2 perfect innings and six strikeouts on April 10.
- Saw his first Major League action last year, appearing in 19 games (16 starts) with Detroit, going 6-6 with a 4.76 ERA (52ER/98.1IP) and 77 strikeouts. He made his Major League debut on May 29 against Pittsburgh.

- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Acquired by Detroit on July 31 for minor league RHPs Josh Randall and R.J. Sales.
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.

- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on Aug. 17 and recalled just under a month later, on Sept. 16...threw 2.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and striking out two over his final two games with the Mud Hens.
- Did not allow a run in seven straight outings from July 19 to Aug. 6...tossed two or more innings in four of the seven games, topping out at 3.1 frames on July 29 against Arizona.
- Allowed 13 runs (six earned) over nine games in June, giving up 16 hits and eight walks while striking out 12...did not record an out in his final two outings of the month.
