# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (37-40) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (36-41) June 24, 2024 at Great American Ball Park, Cincinnati, 0H - 7:10 EDT - GAME \#78/ROAD \#39 LHP BAILEY FALIER ( $3-5,3.74$ ERA) vs. RHP CARSON SPIERS ( $0-1,3.20$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...lost 3-1 against the Rays yesterday in the third and deciding game of their series...Have gone 14-12, including 5-6 on the road, in one-run games... Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone 28-3 (.903 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season... Have the fifth-best record (20-18) among all National League teams since $5 / 11$ behind the Phillies (24-14), Cardinals (24-14), Dodgers (22-17) and Brewers (22-18)...Are hitting . 281 ( $39-$-for-139) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks seventh in all of MLB behind the Diamondbacks (.310), Mets (.309), Nationals (.297), Astros (.286), Yankees (.286) and Red Sox (.283)...Have gone 9-5 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have the second-best ERA (3.15) among starting rotations this month behind the Mariners (3.10)... Have surrendered 17 home runs this month, which is tied for the second-fewest among all teams in MLB along with the Phillies (the Tigers have allowed a league-low 16 home runs this month).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting .350 ( 28 -for-80) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs and 13 RBI during his current career-high 20-game hitting streak...It's the longest active hitting streak in MLB coming into today as well as the third-longest hitting streak this season in MLB (Ketel Marte and Anthony Volpe each hit safely in 21 straight games earlier this year)...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate in a single season since
 2004 when Jason Kendall hit safely in 20 straight games...Nate McLouth also hit safely in 20 straight games that spanned from September 30, 2007, to April 21, 2008...A hit tonight would mark the first hitting streak of at least 21 games by a Pirate since 2003...That year Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games, Jason Kendall had a 23-game streak, and Aramis Ramirez hit safely in 22 straight games.

SWITCHING THINGS UP: Bryan Reynolds' 20-game hitting streak is the second-longest by a Pirates switch hitter in the modern era (since 1901), trailing Maury Wills' 24 -game streak in June of 1968...Ketel Marte had a 21-game hit streak earlier this season....Before Marte, the last MLB switch hitters with 20- game streaks were in 2012 (Jose Reyes, 26, Angel Pagan, 20, Pablo Sandoval, 20).

CUTCH AND THE REDS: Andrew McCutchen has 34 career home runs against the Reds, which are his second-most vs. any team (he has gone deep 40 times against the Brewers)... McCutchen is also one RBI shy of 100 in his career vs. Cincinnati (the only two teams he has collected more RBI against are the Cubs and Brewers with 106 apiece).

SETTING UP THE SERIES: The Pirates have won their last two series against the Reds, including two of three games last week....Pittsburgh's five series wins against the Reds since 2022 are its most against any single opponent in that span...The only times this century Pittsburgh has won three straight series against Cincinnati were in 2018 (four) and 2011 (three)...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

PLAYING THE FIELD: The Pirates bring a season-high 64.0 inning errorless streak into today (their last error came in the seventh inning at Colorado on June 15)...Pittsburgh's longest errorless streak in 2023 was 76.1 innings...Pittsburgh's errorless streak of seven consecutive games is the third-longest active streak in MLB according to the Elias Sports Bureau...The only two teams with a longer streak of games without a miscue are the Guardians and Braves at 10 games apiece.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today three strikeouts shy of tying Billy Wagner for the most punchouts (1196) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history... The 36 -year-old Chapman is tied for seventh in strikeouts (45) among all National League relief pitchers this season...Chapman's average of 15.00 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ranks third in all of MLB among relievers behind Jeremiah Estrada (16.70) and Mason Miller (15.58).

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Bailey Falter gets the start tonight in the opener of this three-game series at Great American Ball Park...Falter set a single-season career high with his seventh quality start in his last outing Tuesday against the Reds (Pittsburgh's starters posted a 1.35 ERA in the series last week)...Falter owns a 3.74 ERA in 14 starts this season after a 6.57 ERA in his 14 starts last season...That is the fifth-largest ERA improvement as a starter for any MLB pitcher this season (minimum 14 starts each season).

## ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 24, 1965: Willie Stargell hit three home runs and knocked in six as the Pirates beat the Dodgers 13-3 in Los Angeles. Roberto clemente also had three hits in the 15-hit attack, as Dodgers starter Don Drysdale was knocked out of the game after giving up seven hits and five runs in 3.2 innings of work. Don Cardwell pitched a complete game for the Buccos, giving up four hits and striking out seven.

STARTING OFF: The 27 -year-old lefthander is in his second season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline last season (August 1) in exchange for INF Rodolfo Castro...Falter is in his fourth Major League season...He made 50 appearances ( 24 starts) for the Phillies from 2021-23...He has also made 24 appearances ( 21 starts) with the Pirates from 2023-24 after being selected in the fifth round of the 2015 draft by Philadelphia.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss in his last outing on June 18 vs . Cincinnati after allowing just two runs on seven hits with three strikeouts against two walks in 7.0 innings of work.

AGAINST THE REDS: Falter will be making his seventh career appearance (fifth start) against the Reds... Has gone 0-2 with a 6.29 ERA (17 ER in 24.1 IP) in those outings.

Today will mark his second consecutive start against Cincinnati (see the above note)...He made three appearances against Cincinnati in 2023, two of which came as a member of the Phillies.
His lone appearance against the Reds in Cincinnati as a member of the Pirates was on September 23 of last year, allowing eight runs on nine hits in 2.0 innings of work...The Pirates would then make the largest comeback in franchise history that night, overcoming a nine-run deficit to win the game 13-12.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Falter enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including ranking first in pitches per batter faced (3.48) and pitches per inning (13.9), 18th in opponents batting average (.234) and 19th in opponents OPS (.683).

IF YOU TAKE AWAY ONE INNING...: Since allowing five runs in his first inning of the season on March 31 at Miami, Falter has pitched to a 3.22 ERA (78.1ip/28er).

GETTING IT DONE: Falter has twice posted outings of 6.0-plus innings pitched and two or fewer hits allowed - April 6 vs. Baltimore (6.0ip/1h) and May 31 at Toronto (6.0ip/2 h)...He is one of five NL lefties to have multiple such outings this season, joining PHI Ranger Suarez (2), ATL Chris Sale (2), LAD James Paxton (2) and ATL Max Fried (2).

IT'S GOING TO BE MAY: In five starts in the month of May, Falter went 1-0 with a 2.23 ERA (32.1ip/8er) and a. 193 opponents average (22-for-114)... He ranked in the top 10 in the NL in each of those categories, including tied for seventh in opponents average, ninth in innings pitched and 10th in ERA.
Among NL left-handed pitchers last month, he was tied for third in opponents average, fourth in innings pitched and fifth in ERA.

JUST LIKE SANDY: Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax....Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax.

THAT'S QUALITY: Falter turned in four consecutive quality starts from May 12-31, which matched the longest such streak of his career (also: July 29-August 31, 2022)... It was the longest quality start streak by a Pirates lefty since Jonathan Niese also had a four-game streak from May 9-27, 2016...The last Pirates southpaw with a quality start streak of five or more games was Francisco Liriano from June 26-July 23, 2015.

ON THE ROAD: Falter has gone $1-3$ with a 4.17 ERA ( $36.2 \mathrm{ip} / 17 \mathrm{er}$ ) in seven starts this season on the road...Falter has allowed just three runs in his last 17.2 IP (1.53 ERA) spanning three starts on the road since May 18.

His last start from PNC Park came on June 12 at St. Louis, taking the loss after allowing just three runs on eight hits with five strikeouts and one walk.
