## RHP Cal Quantrill (2-2, 3.97) vs. RHP Carlos Carrasco (0-2, 8.56) SNY - WCBS 880 AM • WEPN 1050 AM

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Rays, 3-2, yesterday to earn their sixth series victory and the third series victory at home...The victory snapped a streak of seven series without a victory...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (2-1) against Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (three games)...The Mets are off on Monday before they begin a six-game road trip to Chicago-NL (three games) and Colorado (three games).

ARMED FORCES WEEKEND: In honor of MLB's Armed Forces Weekend, the Mets hosted Military Appreciation Night at Citi Field supported by the Mets Military, Veterans \& Peers Employee Resource Group... The Mets honored front office and gameday staff members who have served our country, as the honorary Veterans of the Game, and the Mets recognized service members from each military branch for an on-field pre-game ceremony...In addition, the Mets along with all teams throughout Major League Baseball will wear military inspired caps and socks.

AND I WOULD WALK .500: With a victory tonight, the Mets would move back to .500 ...It would be the first time the club is at .500 since they were 17-17 on May 6.

MAKING MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets are expected to make a series of roster moves...RHP Carlos Carrasco is expected to be reinstated from the 15-Day IL...He has been on the IL since April 16 with Right elbow inflammation... He made two rehab appearances with Double-A Binghamton where he posted a 1.29 ERA (1 ER/7.0 IP) with two walks and five strikeouts...Catcher Gary Sánchez will be selected to the major league roster...Sánchez was signed to a minor league contract on May $9 \ldots .$. In eight games with the Syracuse Mets, he went 9-26 (.308) with three runs, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...The two-time All-Star has hit 154 career home runs in 666 career major league games.

HELLO OLD FRIENDS: Carrasco will face his former team in Cleveland for the first time in his career...Cookie went 88-73 with the team and posted a 3.77 ERA and struck out 1,305 batters... However, having pitched for the Guardians for the first 11 years of his career, he has faced AL Central opponents 115 times, including 95 starts and has pitched to a $41-40$ record with a 3.89 ERA ( 249 ER/576.2) in those appearances... He has fanned 587 AL Central batters in his career...Francisco Lindor played six seasons and 777 career games with Cleveland...He was drafted with the eighth overall pick by the team in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...Today will mark his first game with the club.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 20-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2012...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 115 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the second-longest streak in franchise history....From October 1, 1990September 2, 1992, the Mets won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in three straight contests, hitting seven home runs in that span...The Mets are 18-9 when hitting a home run this season and 7-5 when hitting multiple homers.

HOMERS ARE SICK: Pete Alonso has homered in three or more consecutive games for the second time this season (Also: April 5-April 8) and the sixth time in his career...Is one of five Mets to homer in three or more consecutive games six or more times joining Howard Johnson (six), David Wright (eight), Mike Piazza (nine) and Darryl Strabwerry (nine)... Alonso homered in four straight games from August 5-9, 2019.

SWEET 16: Alonso has hit 16 home runs this season, which leads the majors leagues... His 16 home runs are the most by a Met in franchise history through the team's first 45 games of the season...His 37 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 417 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

GUARDIANS-METS NOTES: The Mets are playing the Guardians for the first time since a three-game set from August 20-22, 2019...This series marks the third time that the Guardians have visited Queens.

CITI BOMBS: Alonso has 70 homers at Citi Field, the second-most in the ballpark's history...Lucas Duda is first with 71.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 34 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season... His 34 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a strech of six straight games against the American Leagueh...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 5-4 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 240-231 record in Interleague play...The team's .510 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is on a five-game hitting streak, batting . 400 (8-20) in that span with four runs and RBI...He recorded his 14th multi-hit game of the year, which is tied for the eighth-most in the National League...He has 177 multi-hit games in his career, which is 19th all-time in Mets history... Wally Backman is next with 179 multi-hit contests... He is batting . 333 (1957) with nine runs, three doubles, a triple, a home run, seven RBI and 11 walks in 18 games at home this year.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos, Josh Walker), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil), 2012 (Tomás Nido) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 9-9 at Citi Field this year...The team's 18 home games are tied for the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55$26, .679$ ) had a better home winning percentage.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 15 errors in 25 games this year...That gives the team a . 990 fielding percentage....Their .990 fielding percentage ranks fourth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 15 errors are the second-fewest committed...Only the Padres (11) have committed fewer.
COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP AI Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

THE RIVER FUND BABY SHOWER: Today, the Amazin' Mets Foundation teamed up with the Mets wives and the SheUnit Employee Resource Group to host a baby shower for new and expecting mothers at the River Fund NY...The River Fund is a frontline poverty center in Richmond Hill, Queens that helps provide low-income mothers the support they need to start their family...Mets wives and Mrs. Met spent the day playing games and gifting the women with newborn essentials including highchairs, clothing, diapers, and more.

## CARRASCO NEWS \& NOTES

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made two appearances with Binghamton (AA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 15-day IL with right elbow inflammation, both against the Hartford Yard Goats...Threw 33 pitches in his first rehab start on May 9, allowing one earned run on three hits and a walk...On May 14 , threw 4.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits and one walk while fanning four batters.
FACING A FAMILIAR FOE: Carrasco will face his former team in Cleveland for the first time in his career...However, having pitched for the Guardians for the first 11 years of his career, he has faced AL Central opponents 115 times, including 95 starts and has pitched to a 41-40 record with a 3.89 ERA ( 249 ER/576.2) in those appearances... He has fanned 587 AL Central batters in his career.

HE'S GOT THE MONTH OF MAY: In 38 appearances and 31 starts in the month of May, Carrasco has pitched to an 18-8 record with a 4.20 ERA ( 97 ER/208.0 IP)...His .692 winning percentage in May is the best split of any month during the season...In those appearances, Carrasco has thrown three complete games, including one shutout, and has tallied 198 strikeouts compared to 46 walks.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628 ...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA ( 3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts... The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.
WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15 -win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more $15+$ win seasons since 2017 ...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.
MILESTONES \& MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1461.2...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 286 and 239, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...ls one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
