SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs overcame a late 2-run deficit and walked off 5-4 over the Blue Jays.

- ◆ **Geraldo Perdomo**'s one-out sacrifice fly in the ninth inning marked his first career walkoff RBI.
- ◆ Ryne Nelson did not factor in the decision after a strong 7.0 inning performance (3 R, 5 H, 0 BB, 5 K).
- ◆ Alek Thomas delivered a game-tying 2-run, 2-out base hit in the eighth inning.

BACK TO WHERE WE BELONG: The D-backs are above .500 for the first time since entering play back on April 5 (4-3).

RETURN OF THE ANSWERBACKS: The D-backs have 2 comeback victories in their last 3 games (also: July 10 vs. Braves), and fourth of the month (July 3 @ Dodgers and July 6 @ Padres)...the D-backs have 15 comeback victories overall this season.

WALKOFF: Last night marked the D-backs' fifth walkoff of the season (last: June 3 vs. Giants, Pavin Smith 2-run HR)...**Geraldo Perdomo**'s walkoff sacrifice fly was his first career game-winner.

WIN THE SERIES: The D-backs have won or split their last 4 series (3-0-1) and 10 of their last 12 series overall since May 30, going 7-2-3.

SERIES OPENERS: With their comeback victory last night vs. Blue Jays, the D-backs have won 8 of their last 12 series openers.

FINISHING THE HALF STRONG: The D-backs have won 9 of their last 13 games dating back to June 29...only the Astros (10) have more wins in the span.

AMONG THE LEAGUE: Since June 29, the D-backs' 77 runs scored are the most in the NL and second in the Majors, behind only the Astros (85).

In the span, the D-backs rank among the Majors in walks (1st, 55), sacrifice hits (1st, 6), AVG (3rd, .274), OBP (2nd, .354), hits (3rd, 122), XBH (3rd, 50), total bases (3rd, 211) and SLG (5th, .473).

WALK IT OUT: The D-backs' 6 occurrences of 9+ walks in a game are tied for the most in the NL with the Dodgers, and tied for second most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (9 occurrences).

TAKING BASES: The D-backs' 125 bases taken [bases advanced on fly balls, passed balls, wild pitches, balks, defensive indifference] are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Cardinals (115), Dodgers (100) and Giants (98).

VS. BLUE JAYS: The D-backs are hosting the Blue Jays for just the fifth time ever (also: 2002, '10, '13, '16) and first time since July 19-20, 2016.

- ♦ Are 6-1 in their last 7 home games vs. Blue Jays (5-7 all-time).
- ♦ Were swept last July 14-16 @ Blue Jays and prior to that swept the Blue Jays in Toronto June 7-9, 2019.

HOMER HAPPY: The D-backs' 18 home runs in July are tied for fourth in the Majors (also: Braves), behind the Reds (22), Pirates (19) and Tigers (19).

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT: The D-backs, in their last 13 games vs. AL, are hitting .269 AVG/.800 OPS with 75 runs (5.77 R/G).

- ♦ Among NL teams in Interleague play since June 11, rank first in runs (75), hits (113), times on base (173) and walks (51), second in AVG (.269), OBP (.355), OPS (.800) and extra-base hits (44), and third in SLG (.445).
- **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 8 of his last 11 Interleague starts, batting .385 (15-for-39)/1.186 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 10 RBI and 7 walks...has hit safely in 14 of 18 home starts vs. AL at a .354 clip (23-for-65)/1.099 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 14 RBI and 12 walks.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit in 4 of his last 5 games vs. AL, all home games, at a .389 clip (7-for-18)/1.151 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 homer, 5 RBI, 1 walk and 1 hit by pitch.
- **Christian Walker** has hit safely in 6 of his last 8 Interleague games at a .379 clip (11-for-29)/1.075 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 homer and 6 RBI.

ALL-STAR STARTER: Ketel Marte is now a 2-time All-Star as the fan-elected NL starting second baseman (besting Luis Arraez/Padres 55% to 45%)...second career All-Star selection/start (also: 2019)...second D-back with multiple fan elections (also: Paul Goldschmidt)...D-backs' eighth fan-elected start for a position player.

EL PIKE: Ketel Marte has reached base in 17 straight home games since June 11, batting .345 (20-for-58)/.451 OBP/1.071 OPS with 12 walks.

- Has not struck out in 27 consecutive plate appearances, since July 4, the team's seventh-longest streak since 2023 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- His 5 strikeouts since June 24 are tied for third fewest in NL with Miguel Rojas, behind Keibert Ruiz/WSH (3) and Luis Arraez/SD (4).

AT A GLANCE: Fourth professional season (since 2021).

- In 2023, opened at High-A (22 GS) and finished at Double-A (3 GS).
- In 2022, started at Low-A (11 G-9 GS) then received promotion to High-A (8 GS).
- Debuted in 2021 in Rookie ball (19 G-1 GS).
- Signed by D-backs as a non-drafted free agent on Feb. 5, 2001.

BIO: Born in Guatire, Venezuela.

 Joins fellow Venezuela natives José Herrera (San Carlos), Gabriel Moreno (Barquisimeto) and Eugenio Suárez (Puerto Ordaz) on the active roster.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Making his second Major League start, second @ home.

• Ranked as the D-backs' No. 16 prospect by MLB Pipeline.

VS. BLUE JAYS: First time facing the Blue Jays.

LAST START: Did not factor in the decision and posted a quality start (1 ER in 6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 BB, 5 K) in his Major League debut on July 8 vs. Braves.

• Lone run allowed came on an Austin Riley homer in the first inning... retired 16 of 20 batters faced following it.

DEBUT DETAILS: At age 23-324, became the fifth youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings in their debut, behind Tyler Skaggs (21-040, 2012), Archie Bradley (22-244, 2015), Bryan Augenstein (22-306, 2009) and Enrique González (23-318, 2006).

- Diaz also became the 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to record a quality start in his MLB debut (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres).
- His 83 pitches marked the fewest thrown among D-back starters alltime who threw at most 6.0 innings in a debut (previous low: John Patterson, 85 on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).

IN THE MINORS: His 105 strikeouts lead all D-backs farmhands.

- Last start was with Triple-A Reno on July 1 @ Sacramento...tossed 6.0 no-hit innings on 2 walks with a career-high 13 strikeouts.
- Named the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for July 1-7, after tossing 6.0 no-hit innings with a career-high 13 strikeouts @ Sacramento.

THIS SEASON: Began the season with Double-A Amarillo and went 3-5 with a 4.33 ERA (26 ER in 54.0 IP), .196 AVG (38-for-194)/.617 OPS, 29 walks and 77 strikeouts in 11 starts with the Sod Poodles.

 Promoted to Triple-A Reno on June 13 and in 4 starts with Triple-A Reno, went 1-3 with a 3.27 ERA (11 R-8 ER in 22.0 IP), .220 AVG (18-for-82)/.675 OPS, 9 walks and 28 strikeouts.

2024 MINORS COMBINED SPLITS: Has held righties to a .224 AVG (30-for-148)/.615 OPS with 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 15 RBI, 25 walks and 58 strikeouts, while lefties are hitting a .203 AVG (26-for-128)/.655 OPS with 8 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI, 13 walks and 47 strikeouts.

• With runners in scoring position, held opponents to a .191 AVG (13-for-68)/.644 OPS with 10 walks and 19 strikeouts.

STEE-RIKE!: Has recorded 5 double-digit strikeout games in the minors (3 10-strikeout games, 1 11-strikeout game and 1 13-strikeout game).

2023 RECAP: In 2023, split the season between High-A Hillsboro and Double-A Amarillo, going 3-10 with a 4.82 ERA (60 R-55 ER in 102.2 IP), .216 AVG (80-for-371)/.702 OPS, 58 walks and 140 strikeouts.

2020 DETERMINATION: During the 2020 pandemic, Yilber was a try out player in the Dominican Republic.

- In March 2020, the country and the airports closed and was 1 of 14
 Venezuelan players who could not return to their country.
- 12 were already signed but Yilber and one more remained at try outs.
- He spent 8 months training, focused, gaining weight, eating well with a focus to be signed. In October 2020, Venezuela finally opened the border and he returned home.
- On February 5, 2021, at 20, he signed his contract (in Latin America players generally sign from 16-18 and when they are 20 years they are sometimes even labeled as "old").

YOUNGER YEARS: At the age of 17, he drew interest from Major League teams after converting from a position player to a pitcher...but at age 18, he was unable to sign due to a wrist injury from basketball, so he guit baseball.

- He moved out of Venezuela looking for a better life.
- He moved to Ecuador, Colombia and Peru where he sold energy drinks and strawberries with whipped cream at traffic lights and cleaned windshields.
