### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 10, 2015:** Michael Pineda strikes out 16 Orioles in seven innings in a Mother's Day matinee at Yankee Stadium, tying David Cone for the Yankees' single-game record for strikeouts by a right-handed pitcher.

**May 10, 1975:** In his first start against his former team, Catfish Hunter tosses a two-hit complete-game shutout in a 3-0 Yankees win at Oakland.

**May 10, 1936:** Joe DiMaggio goes 1-for-4 and hits his first Major League home run (off George Turbeville) in a 7-2 Yankees win vs. Philadelphia-AL.

**May 10, 1934:** Playing just five innings due to a severe cold, Lou Gehrig nevertheless goes 4-for-4 with 2 doubles, a grand slam and 7 RBI as the Yankees defeat the White Sox, 13-3, at Yankee Stadium.

**May 10, 1868:** Former Yankees Hall of Fame executive Ed Barrow is born in Springfield, Ill.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 11, 1903:** In the fifth inning of the Highlanders' 8-2 victory at Detroit's Bennett Park, first baseman John Gangel hits the first home run in Yankees franchise history, an inside-the-park solo homer off Tigers pitcher George Mullin.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game road trip today with the second game of a three-game set at the Athletics (1-0 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...went 3-3 on their recent homestand after dropping two-of-three vs. Tampa Bay and winning two-of-three vs. San Diego.

- Have won each of their last 3G (since 5/6), their longest winning streak since a season-high five-game streak from 4/14-18.
- Their +69 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+84).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the Athletics, 10-2, on Friday at Sutter Health Park...**RHP Will Warren** (7.1IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 7K, 0HR) earned his second win of the year after allowing only 1R/ER over a career-high 7.1 innings...**LF Jasson Domínguez** (3-for-4, 3R, 3HR, 7RBI, 1SF) became the youngest player in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game, hitting solo HRs in the third and seventh innings and his first career grand slam in the eighth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) hit his fourth HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the third inning...**DH/C Ben Rice** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 1RBI, 1HP) hit an RBI double in the eighth inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (0-for-4, 1R, 2BB), **RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1BB), **SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-4, 1BB, 1SB), **C J.C. Escarra** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1BB, 1SB) and **2B Jorbit Vivas** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double) each reached base multiple times.

- **Yankees rookies recorded 7H, their most in a game since 8/19/16 at Los Angeles-AL (also 7H).**

**OUT OF THE WORLD:** At 22 years, 91 days, **OF Jasson Domínguez** became the youngest player in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game on Friday at the Athletics, hitting solo HRs in the third and seventh innings and his first career grand slam in the eighth inning...**became the second rookie in franchise history to hit at least 3HR in a game**, joining Ben Rice on 7/6/24 vs. Boston...**was the 28th player in Yankees history to hit at least 3HR in a regular season game (39th time) and second to do so this season** (also Aaron Judge on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee)...including the postseason, Domínguez is the 29th player in Yankees history to accomplish the feat (42nd time).

- Was the 11th youngest player in Major League history to hit 3HR in a game and the youngest since Yordan Alvarez did so on 8/10/19 at Baltimore at 22 years, 44 days.
- Became the 15th player in franchise history to homer from both sides of the plate and first since Neil Walker did so on 8/9/18 vs. Texas.
- Recorded a career-high 7RBI on Friday...**became the second-youngest Yankee in franchise history to record at least 7RBI in a game**, trailing only Lou Gehrig who recorded 7RBI on 7/23/1925 vs. Washington-AL at 22 years, 34 days...was the second Yankee this season to record at least 7RBI in a game, joining Judge who recorded 8RBI on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee.
- His HR in the seventh inning on Friday marked his first career home run as a right-handed batter.
- His 3HR on Friday also marked his first career multi-HR game.
- His 3H on Friday tied his career high (third time).

**GOOD AS GOLD:** INF **Paul Goldschmidt** reached base three times and hit his fourth HR of the year with a go-ahead solo home run in the third inning...**has hit safely in 25 of his last 32 games (since 4/4), batting .361/.406/.492 (44-for-122) with 18R, 7 doubles, 3HR, 16RBI, 10BB, 2SB and 1SF.**

- **Has hit safely in each of his 17 road games this year, batting .438/.474/.575 (32-for-73) with 12R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI, 5BB and 1SB**...is one of only seven Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 17 road games of the season, joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007), Jack Lelivelt (21G in 1912), Ben Chapman (18G in 1933) Patsy Dougherty (18G in 1904), Alfonso Soriano (17G in 2003) and Earle Combs (17G in 1926).
- Has hit .455/.525/.606 (15-for-33) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for fourth in the Majors in hits (tied for second in AL), ranks sixth in BA (fifth in AL) and seventh in OBP (third in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 29 of his 38 games this season, batting .345/.397/.486 (49-for-142) with 23R, 8 doubles, 4HR, 18RBI, 12BB/2IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- Is tied for first in the Majors in multi-hit games (17, tied for first in AL), ranks third in BA (third in AL) and tied for fourth in hits (tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks fifth in the AL in OBP.

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.69 ERA (124.OIP, 37ER) over their last 23 starts (since 4/14)**...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.200), opponents' OBP (.272), opponents' OPS (.588) and WHIP (1.09), rank second in opponents' SLG (.316, first in AL) and third in ERA (second in AL).

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of their last 23 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 17 of those starts.

**SAVED BY THE BELL:** INF/OF **Cody Bellinger** has hit safely in each of his last five games (since 5/3), batting .316/.381/.632 (6-for-19) with 4R, 2HR, 4RBI, 2BB and 1SB over that span...has 2HR in his last four games (since 5/4) and 3HR in his last eight games (since 4/29).

- In 14 career games vs. the A's, has hit .370/.435/.519 (20-for-54) with 11R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR, 6RBI, 7BB and 1SF.
- Has hit .346/.367/.538 (9-for-26) with 2 doubles, 1HR and 2BB vs. left-handed pitching this season.

**ALL RISE:** **OF Aaron Judge** reached base twice on Friday at the Athletics...**has reached base in 36 of his 38 games this year**, batting .396/.488/.743 (57-for-144) with 35R, 10 doubles, 2 triples, 12HR, 34RBI, 24BB/6IBB, 2HP and 3SB.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 42 points, OBP by 45 points, SLG by 88 points and OPS by 162 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 23 of his last 29 games (since 4/7), 26 of his last 33 games (since 4/3) and 28 of his 38 games this year**...his 28 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.
- Has hit 4HR in his last nine games (since 4/29) and 5HR in his last 11 games (since 4/27-G2).
- Is batting .478/.613/1.217 (11-for-23) with 2 doubles, 5HR and 8BB vs. left-handed pitching this season.
- Over his last 29 games (since 4/7), has hit .421/.512/.692 (45-for-107) with 21R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR, 17RBI, 19BB/4IBB, 1HP and 1SB.
- Has hit .483/.583/.862 (14-for-29) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 21RBI, 6BB/5IBB and 1HP with RISP this year.
- In 40 career games vs. the Athletics, has hit .299/.416/.633 (44-for-147) with 30R, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR, 38RBI, 28BB/2IBB, 2HP and 1SF...has 3HR in his last six games vs. the A's (since 4/24/24).

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters** scored double-digit runs for the seventh time this season on Friday at the Athletics and for the second time in the last three games (since 5/6).

- Have homered in a season-high nine straight games (since 4/29), hitting 21HR over that span...marks their longest single-season home run streak since a 13-game streak from 5/21-6/4/24.
- **Have hit a Major League-leading 66HR this year, their most home runs through their first 38 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 62HR in 2003).
- Lead the Majors in HR (66), OBP (.344), SLG (.475), OPS (.819) and XBH (139), rank second in runs per game (5.68, first in AL), total bases (611, first in AL) and times on base (507, first in AL), third in runs scored (216, first in AL) and fourth in walks (153, second in AL).

**PITCH PERFECT:** **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.84 ERA (222.OIP, 70ER) over their last 25 games (since 4/12), the third-lowest ERA in the Majors over that span, trailing only Detroit (2.50) and Kansas City (2.68).

- Lead the Majors this season in opponents' BA (.206), opponents' LG (.328) and opponents' OPS (.619), rank fifth in opponents' OBP (.291, fourth in AL) and sixth in K/9.OIP (9.24, third in AL).

**RODOMINANT:** **LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his ninth start of the season today...is 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (48.2IP, 16ER) in eight starts this season...**leads the Majors in opponents' BA (.151), ranks fourth in opponents' OBP (.241, third in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.277, fifth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.518, fifth in AL), sixth in strikeout rate (30.3%, third in AL) and is tied for sixth in strikeouts (57, tied for third in AL) and innings pitched (tied for fifth in AL).**

- **Is 3-0 with a 0.70 ERA (25.2IP, 2ER) over his last four starts** (since 4/18)...has tossed at least 6.OIP and allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all four starts.

**HIGH VOLPAGE:** INF **Anthony Volpe** has hit safely in his last 13G vs. the Athletics (since 5/9/23), batting .382/.424/.582 (21-for-55) with 7R, 1 double, 2 triples, 2HR, 9RBI, 3BB, 1HP and 3SB over that span.

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 11-3 vs. the Athletics since 2023, 16-5 since 2022 and 20-8 since 2021.

**MERRY GRISHMAS:** **OF Trent Grisham** reached base twice on Friday at the Athletics...is hitting .280/.374/.613 (26-for-93) with 2OR, 1 double, 10HR, 20RBI, 13BB and 1HP in 32 games this season.

- **Seven of his 10HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (six).**
- Has 6HR in his last 14 games (since 4/19).
- Has 10HR in 32G this season after hitting 9HR in 76G in 2024.
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL), is tied for sixth in go-ahead RBI (eight, tied for second in AL) and tied for seventh in HR (tied for third in AL).

**LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his ninth start of the season today at the Athletics...the 32-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...made his eighth start of the season on Monday vs. San Diego, tossing 6.2 scoreless innings without recording a decision (3H, 1BB, 5K)...is 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (48.2IP, 25H, 18R/16ER, 20BB, 57K, 16HR) in eight starts this season...**is 3-0 with a 0.70 ERA (25.2IP, 11H, 3R/2ER, 8BB, 29K, 1HR) over his last four starts** (since 4/18)...among Major League pitchers this year, **leads the Majors in opponents' BA (.151), ranks fourth in opponents' OBP (.241, third in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.277, fifth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.518, fifth in AL), sixth in strikeout rate (30.3%, third in AL) and is tied for sixth in strikeouts (57, tied for third in AL) and innings pitched (48.2, tied for fifth in AL)...also ranks ninth in the AL in groundball percentage (46.8%)**...has recorded at least 7K in six of his eight starts this season, including eight-or-more strikeouts in four starts...made 32 starts with the Yankees in 2024, going 16-9 with a 3.96 ERA (175.0IP, 157H, 81R/77ER, 57BB, 195K, 31HR)...his 16 wins and 32 starts were both career highs...**his 195K and 175.0IP marked his second-most in a single season in his career, trailing only his 237K and 178.0IP in 2022 with San Francisco...his 195K was the 10th-most by a Yankees left-handed pitcher in franchise history and the most since CC Sabathia recorded 197K in 2012...was tied for second in the AL and tied for third in the Majors in wins...also ranked fourth in the AL in K/9.0IP (10.03), tied for fifth in starts, and ranked seventh in strikeouts**...since 2021, ranks third in the Majors with an 11.09 K/9.0IP ratio (738K/598.2IP), trailing only Blake Snell (11.85) and Dylan Cease (11.17)...is tied for seventh in double-digit strikeouts in games (19) over that span, trailing only Gerrit Cole (24), Kevin Gausman (22), Snell (22), Corbin Burnes (21), Cease (21) and Shohei Ohtani (20)...has recorded at least 10K in 10 and OBB in seven games, the seventh-most such games in the Majors during that stretch, trailing only Jacob deGrom (10), Gausman (10), Cole (nine), Burnes (nine), Zack Wheeler (nine) and Zac Gallen (eight)...has pitched over parts of 11 Major League seasons with the Chicago White Sox (2015-21), San Francisco Giants (2022) and Yankees (2023-25)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made seven Opening Day starts (2016, '19-22, '24-25)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22...

**2025:** Is 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (48.2IP, 25H, 18R/16ER, 20BB, 57K, 6HR) in eight starts this season...among Major League pitchers this season, **leads the Majors in opponents' BA (.151), ranks fourth in opponents' OBP (.241, third in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.277, fifth in AL) and opponents' OPS (.518, fifth in AL), sixth in strikeouts rate (30.3%, third in AL) and is tied for sixth in strikeouts (57, tied for third in AL) and innings pitched (48.2, tied for fifth in AL)...also ranks ninth in the AL in groundball percentage (46.8%).**

- ★ Made 18 road starts in 2024, going 7-7 with a 4.69 ERA (94.0IP, 96H, 50R/49ER, 30BB, 104K, 16HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 18 road starts and 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts...among Major League pitchers last season, his 18 starts on the road were tied for the fourth-most.

**ALL THAT'S LEFT:** In his career, left-handed batters have hit .218/.291/.339 (190-for-870)...has surrendered just 22HR to 974BF.

- ✦ His 10.01 K/9.0IP ratio since his Major League debut in 2015 ranks fifth among left-handed pitchers in that span, trailing only Chris Sale (11.77), Blake Snell (11.17), Robbie Ray (11.12) and Clayton Kershaw (10.05).
- ✦ Since 2015, his 1,263K are the seventh-most among active left-handed pitchers...his 26 double-digit strikeout games over that stretch among lefties are the fifth-most in the Majors, trailing only Sale (71), Ray (40), Kershaw (39) and Snell (35).

- ✦ **His 195K in 2024 were the 10th-most by a Yankees left-handed pitcher in franchise history and the most since CC Sabathia recorded 197K in 2012.**
