YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles defeated the Marlins, 7-6, in 10 innings to snap a three-game skid and avoid the series sweep...The $0^{\prime}$ 's scored their $500^{\text {th }}$ run of the season yesterday in their $102^{\text {nd }}$ game of the season; the last time Baltimore scored 500 runs in fewer games played in a season was in 2004 ( 99 games)...Corbin Burnes spun a season-high 7.1 innings after allowing three runs on six hits ( 1 HR ) and one walk with five strikeouts...Ryan Mountcastle connected on
a go-ahead, game-winning RBI single in the $10^{\text {th }}$ inning...Anthony Santander rocketed his $28^{\text {th }}$ a go-ahead, game-winning RBI single in the $10^{\text {th }}$ inning...Anthony Santander rocketed his $28^{\text {th }}$ home run of the season in the first inning, tying Gunnar Henderson for the team lead....Colton Cowser blasted a three-run shot in the third inning, tallying three-or-more RBI in consecutive games for the first time in his career and the fourth time an Oriole has done so this season....
Connor Norby homered for the second time this season in his first game since being recalled from Triple-A Norfolk yesterday.
WHAT'S TRENDING: The Orioles have lost eight of their last 12 since July 9...At 61-41 (.598), the Birds are tied for the second-best record in MLB with the Guardians (.598, 61-41) and behind only the Phillies (.627, 64-38)...Since the start of 2023, Baltimore is 162-102 (.614), the best winning percentage and tied for the most wins in the majors with the Dodgers during that time...The O's are 245-181 (.575) since the start of 2022, the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best MLB behind the Astros (.585, 249-177), Braves (.609, 259-166), and Dodgers (.638, 273-155).
HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles lead MLB with 160 home runs, 11 more than the second-place Yankees (149) and 19 more than the Dodgers (141), who rank third...The Birds homered in 22 consecutive games from June $1-23$, setting a franchise record.
O. Baltimore has an MLB-best eight players with at least 10 home runs, the most in
MLB: Gunnar Henderson and Anthony Santander (28), Adley Rutschman (17), Jordan Westburg (16), Colton Cowser (14) Ryan Mountcastle and Ryan O'Hearn (12), and Cedric Mullins(10); the Birds had eight third time in team history, joining the 2000 and 1987 seasons.
O. Henderson and Santander are one of two duos with at least 25 home runs, along with New York-AL's Aaron Judge (35) and Juan Soto (26); this marks the third time an O's team has had multiple players with $25+$ homers through the first 100 games of a season, joining Brady Anderson (31) and Rafael Palmeiro (25) in 1996, and Boog Powell (27) and Frank Robinson (25) in 1969
$\theta$. The Orioles lead MLB with nine leadoff homers this year; Gunnar Henderson has eight of those, tied with Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber for the most in MLB and tied for the second-most in a single season in Orioles history with Cedric Mullins (2021), trailing only Brady Anderson $(12,1996)$.

The O's hit 60 home runs in June, the most homers in a month in franchise history; they are the third team with at least 60 in a month in MLB history, joining the 2023 Braves, who hit 61 in June, and the 2019 Yankees, who hit 74 in August; Baltimore has hit 21 in July, tied for $16^{\text {th }}$ in MLB this month, with six coming from Anthony Santander

TOP GUNN: Gunnar Henderson ranks third in MLB with 81 runs scored behind Kansas City's Bobby Witt Jr. and New York-AL's Juan Soto (83)...It's tied for the most runs scored through the first 100 team games to begin a season in Orioles history with Frank Robinson (1969)... He scored three runs on July 19 at Texas for the eighth time this year, two more than the next closest player Henderson's 15 such games since the start of 2023 are five more than any other player in that time...He's on pace to score 129 times...Only one player in team history has scored 130 runs in season: Roberto Alomar, who set the team record with 132 runs in 1996,
Q. Three players in team history have led the AL in runs scored: Frank Robinson in 1966 (122), Cal Ripken, Jr. in 1983(121), and Don Buford in 1971(99).

MASHED TATERS: Anthony Santander is slashing .280/.325/. 632 ( 51 -for-182) with five doubles, one triple, 19 home runs, 28 runs scored, 38 RBI, 12 walks, one hit-by-pitch, and one stolen base in one triple, 19 home runs, 28 runs scored, 38 RBI, 12 walks, one hit-by-pitch, and one stolen

Santander is the ninth player in O's history to hit $25+$ homers in at least three straight seasons, matching Frank Robinson (1969-71), Lee May (1976-78), and Manny Machado (2015-17), and trailing Eddie Murray (1982-85) and Rafael Palmeiro (1995-98), who did so in four consecutive years, Chris Davis (2012-17) and Cal Ripken, Jr. (1982-87), who had six, and Adam Jones (2011-17), who hit 25 or more homers in seven straight years
0. He has 15 multi-homer games, eighth-most in franchise history behind Frank Robinson (16), Brady Anderson (17), Chris Davis and Manny Machado (19), Eddie Murray and Boog Powell (20), and Cal Ripken, Jr. (21)
$\theta_{j}$ Drove in his $400^{\text {th }}$ career run on Thursday in his $688^{\text {th }}$ game, becoming the fifth switch hitter in franchise history to record 400 or more RBI; the only hitter to do so in fewer games with the Orioles is Eddie Murray (643)

FEELS GOOD TO BE HOME: The Orioles open a seven-game homestand tonight with the opener against the Padres...The Birds welcome the Blue Jays for a four-game slate next week through Wedneday, including a doubleheader Monday...Baltimore is coming off their first losing homestand (1-5) since September 11-17, 2023 (3-4)...Since the start of 2023, the Birds have gone in MLB behind the Brewers (.614, 78-49), Braves (.621, 82-50), Phillies (.642, 86-48), and Dodgers (.644, 87-48).

AGAINST THE FRIARS: The Orioles and Padres are meeting for their first series in Baltimore since 2019...The O's lost two of three games in San Diego last season from August 14-16...In the last series at Camden Yards, the Friars swept a two-game set from June 25-26...The Birds have dropped six of the last seven games between the teams at Oriole Park after winning the first two games between the clubs in 2002.
$\theta_{\text {. }}$ Baltimore is 13-16 (.448) against the NL this season; of the nine series losses in 2024, five have come against NL opponents; the Orioles are an MLB-best 48-25(.658) against the AL.

MONTHLY DUES: The O's have nine consecutive winning months(min. 10 games played) since the start of 2023, the longest streak by the O's since May 1982 through September 1983 (11), per the Elias Sports Bureau...At 8-10 this month, the Birds will need to go 5-2 in their final seven games in July to extend the streak...The current stretch is the longest active streak in the majors.

ROSTER MOVES: The Orioles acquired right-handed pitcher Seranthony Dominguez and outfielder Cristian Pache from the Philadelphia Phillies in exchange for outfielder Austin Hays today... To make room on the 40-man roster, right-handed pitcher Levi Stoudt was designated from asignment...The O's also acquired right-handed pitcher Zach Eflin and cash considerations league infielder/outfielder Mac Horvath, and minor league outfielder Matthew Etzel...To make room on the 40-man and active rosters, right-handed pitcher Vinny Nittoli was designated for assignment...Domínguez and Pache have both reported while Eflin has yet to report.

His 12 wins are one behind the MLB lead, which is held by Atlanta's Chris Sale...With 76 total runs of support this season, his 6.47 RSA/9 ranks first in MLB...His 249 strikeouts are the most in an O's pitcher first 41 games with the team in club history....Posted a $7-4$ record and Began last season with Triple-A Norfolk before being promoted and making his MLB debut on April 5 at Texas...Optioned to Norfolk on May 27...Recalled on July 17 for the remainder of the season...Originally selected by the Orioles in the first round (No. 11 overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft
LAST TIME OUT: Secured his $12^{\text {th }}$ win of the year on July 20 at Texas after allowing two runs on three hits and two walks with eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings... His 12 wins on the year are tied with Kansas City's Seth Lugo for first in the AL and tied for second in MLB...Marked his team-leading sixth game with 8+ strikeouts... 2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Rodriguez opened last season with the Norfolk Tides, earning the nod as their Opening Day starter...Recalled by the Orioles on April 5, making his MLB debut in a start at Texas....Marked the first of six Orioles to make their big-league debut last year...Earned his first career win on April 29 (G2) at Detroit, throwing 5.0 shutout innings and striking out nine...Tossed a careerhigh 8.0 scoreless innings on September 16 vs. Tampa Bay, tied for the longest outing by an Oriole in 2023; at 23 years old, 304 days old, became the youngest O's starter to work 8.0 scoreless frames since Zack Britton (23-141) tossed a shutout on May 12, 2011 vs. Seattle, and the youngest rookie right-hander to do since Brad Bergesen (23-257) worked 8.0 scoreless on June 9, 2009 vs. Seattle.
