**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action last night with a 10-2 victory over the Tigers...The Mets are 6-4 over their last 10 games... The Mets have scored double-digit runs for fifth time this season and are 5-0 in such contests...They have won each of their last five series openers dating back to April 28 vs. Washington...New York is in the midst of a six-game homestand (1-0) against the Tigers (1-0) and Yankees (three games).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Happy birthday to Bobby Valentine who turns 76 years young today...Later this year, Valentine will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame...He ranks third in team history with 536 wins guiding the Mets from 1996-2002...In 1999, he led the Mets to the Postseason for the first time since 1988...The following year, Valentine took the team to the World Series, becoming the first manager in Mets history to lead the team to consecutive playoff appearances.

**MAY FLOWERS:** The Mets are 6-4 in May...The team has posted a 2.64 ERA (26 ER/88.2 IP) with 31 walks and 98 strikeouts...Their 2.64 May ERA is fourth in the Majors and third in the National League...Their 98 strikeouts are tied for the sixth-most in the Majors...They are hitting .221/.296/.344 in the month of May...Their .221 average is 24th in the Majors...They have posted a .641 OPS in May, which ranks 25th in the majors.

**A.J. STYLES:** Yesterday, A.J. Ewing laced an RBI triple in the seventh for his first career hit and RBI...He became the first Met ever to record a triple in their Major League debut and joined Leroy Stanton (9/28/70), Eric Cammack (7/5/00) and Marco Scutaro (7/22/02) as the only Mets to have recorded a triple for their first career Major League hit...Courtesy of Elias...He became the first Met ever to draw three walks in their Major League debut...He joined Darryl Strawberry (1983), Jeff Gardner (1991), Kaz Matsui (2004), Travis d'Arnaud (2013) and Carson Benge as the only players in franchise history to walk multiple times in their Major League debut...Is the 19th player in Major League history with multiple walks and a stolen base in his Major League debut since the modern stolen base rule was adopted in 1898 (last: Carson Benge)...The only other season with multiple such instances was in 1904 when Cincinnati Reds teammates Sam Woodruff and Miller Huggins accomplished the feat in consecutive games...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...He joined Matsui (5 times) to reach base four or more times in their Major League debut.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** Ewing recorded his first career stolen base in the sixth...Is the first player in Major League history with three walks and a stolen base in their Major League debut since 1898...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are in the midst of their fourth homestand of the season...The team is 7-12 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.37 ERA (85 ER/175.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026...They are hitting .231/.297/.342 at Citi Field.

**PETE AND PETE:** David Peterson has appeared in nine games (five starts) this year, going 1-4 with a 5.49 ERA (24 ER/39.1 IP) with 14 walks and 38 strikeouts...He is 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA (21 ER/23.1 IP), 13 walks and 26 strikeouts as a starter...In four appearances in relief, Peterson is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP) with one walk and 12 strikeouts.

**RETURN OF THE MARK:** Over his last 13 games, Mark Vientos is batting .255 (13-51) with six runs, three doubles, three homers, 10 RBI, three walks, a .296 OBP, a .490 SLG and a .786 OPS...His six multi-homer games are tied with Francisco Alvarez for the second-most on the current team...Francisco Lindor has 11 which is tied for the ninth-most in team history.

**TIGERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets hosted the Tigers from April 1-4, 2024...The team dropped the first two games of the series before winning the nightcap of a doubleheader on April 4 to earn their first win of the 2024 season.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** The Mets are 5-5 against the AL in 2026...New York went 24-24 against the American League in 2025... Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the Mets are 307-305 against the American League.

**MR. PULCHRITUDINOUS:** Carson Benge is 8-26 with seven runs, three doubles, one homer, six RBI, four walks and a 1.010 OPS over his last eight games...He is batting .309 (17-55) with 10 runs, four doubles, two homers, nine RBI, four walks, a .356 OBP, a .491 SLG and an .847 OPS over his last 17 games.

**I RALEY LIKE YOU:** Brooks Raley has appeared in 17 games this year for the Mets...He has not allowed a run over his last nine games (8.2 IP)...In 17 games this season, has pitched to a 1.13 ERA (2 ER/16.0 IP) and a 0.94 WHIP...He has allowed one home run this season.

**DREAM WEAVER:** Over his last nine games, Luke Weaver is 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) allowing seven hits, three walks and striking out 12...He has stranded all four inherited runners in that span.

**WARREN COURT:** Austin Warren tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in relief last night...He has allowed one run in 11.0 innings this season and has 13 strikeouts...Yesterday marked his third scoreless outing of multiple innings this season...In 13 career games with the Mets, has pitched to a 0.89 ERA (2 ER/20.1 IP).

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**TRAVEL ALERT:** Please be advised there is a potential Long Island Rail Road strike that could go into effect on Saturday, May 16, which may result in disruptions to travel to and from Citi Field for the Mets vs. Yankees games on May 16-17. **THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets fell to the Braves, 6-3 at Shea Stadium...Rick Aguilera took the loss, allowing four runs in relief...Keith Hernandez drove in the team's lone run, going 2-4 with one runs, one RBI and a walk...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

- Allowed two earned runs over 1.0 inning as an opener on May 10 at Arizona (1.0 IP, 2 ER, 3 BB)...Over 6.0 career innings as an opener he has allowed two earned runs.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 17 of his last 21 appearances...He is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (5 ER/25.0 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .169 batting average (15-89) over that span...His ERA is the 10th-best among NL pitchers over that span (min. 25.0 IP).
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 40 appearances (two starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 3.19 ERA (17 ER/48.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts.
- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings in relief on May 2 at Los Angeles-AL (1.1 IP, K)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 19 relief appearances, which is the seventh-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his ninth scoreless relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the 11th-most such games among NL relievers during that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Threw a scoreless eighth inning on May 9 at Arizona (1.0 IP, 2 BB, K)...He hasn't allowed an earned run in eight of 10 appearances this season.
- Has made 24 career appearances at Citi Field and he is 1-0 and 15-for-15 on save opportunities...Has posted a 2.31 ERA (6 ER/23.1 IP) with 31 strikeouts over those appearances.
- Over 135 career Interleague matchups he has 56 saves, a 3.71 ERA (53 ER/128.2 IP) and 188 strikeouts...His 56 saves in Interleague play are tied for the third-most in Major League history.
- Allowed four earned runs on May 7 at Colorado (1.0 IP, 3 H, 4 ER, 2 K, BB)...Marks the sixth time in his career he's allowed at least four earned runs in an outing and the first time since September 17, 2024, vs. San Francisco while with Baltimore.
- Struck out two over a scoreless inning in his Mets and 2026 debut on April 11 vs. the Athletics (1.0 IP, H, 2 K)...Has now made an appearance for 10 Major League clubs.
- Made an appearance for Single-A St. Lucie on April 7 and he completed a scoreless inning while recording one strikeout.
- Among relievers all-time, he is tied for fourth in strikeouts and fifth in saves...Among active relievers, he ranks second in strikeouts behind only Aroldis Chapman and second in saves behind Kenley Jansen.
- Last season, he appeared in 14 games between Atlanta (one game) and Houston...He went 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) with two holds and 17 strikeouts.
- He is a nine-time All-Star, which is the second-most selections all-time among relief pitchers, only trailing Mariano Rivera's 13 selections
- He was the National League Rookie of the Year in 2011 while with the Atlanta Braves...He was also named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2014 with Atlanta and the Mariano Rivera AL Reliever of the Year with Boston in 2017.

- Threw a scoreless eighth inning on May 10 at Arizona (1.0 IP, 2 K, BB)...Has recorded multiple strikeouts in eight of his nine outings this season.
- Has thrown 23.1 innings in relief this season, which is the ninth-most among NL relievers...His 26 strikeouts this season are tied for the fourth-most among NL relief pitchers.
- Recorded seven strikeouts over 3.1 innings in relief on April 24 vs. Colorado (3.1 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 7 K, BB)...Marked his third career game with seven or more strikeouts as a relief pitcher (also: 8 K, 5/22/23 at Minnesota w/San Francisco and 7/13/25 at Kansas City)...Joins Tug McGraw (5), Nolan Ryan and Skip Lockwood as the only relief pitchers in franchise history with multiple seven+ strikeout games.
- Is one of three relievers in the majors who have thrown 3.0 or more innings in at least five relief appearances this season.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.72 ERA (4 ER/9.2 IP) with two walks and nine strikeouts in three starts during Spring Training.
- In 42 career games in relief, Manaea is 5-4 with a 4.51 ERA (57 ER/113.2 IP) with 37 walks and 129 strikeouts.
- In 2025, finished the season going 2-4 with a 5.64 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 12 walks and 75 strikeouts in 15 appearances (12 starts).
- Last season was originally placed on the 15-Day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-Day IL on April 29.
- In 2024, he recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL.
- Originally signed by the Mets to a two-year contract as a free agent on January 12, 2024...Opted out of the second year of the deal on November 4....Re-signed by the Mets to a three-year contract on December 27, 2024.

- Threw a scoreless second inning and recorded two strikeouts on May 10 (1.0 IP, H, 2 K).
- His only appearance against Detroit came on June 7, 2024, at Detroit, and he tossed 8.0 scoreless innings while only allowing one hit and striking out five.
- Recorded his first career save after tossing a scoreless 10th inning on May 8 at Arizona (1.0 IP, 2 K).
- Has thrown 22.2 innings in relief this season, which is tied for the 10th-most in the NL...Has recorded at least four outs in 10 his 13 appearances this season.
- Is one of seven NL relievers with at least seven multi-inning relief appearances this season.
- Made his first start of the season on April 19 at Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, H, 2 K, BB)...He fired 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded two strikeouts.
- In 30 career games as a reliever, he is 2-2 with two holds, a save and a 2.41 ERA (15 ER/56.0 IP)...He is holding opposing batters to a .215 (45-209) batting average over his career as a reliever.
- Was acquired from Milwaukee along with RHP Freddy Peralta in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams....Made 49 career appearances (31 starts) and was 10-9 with a 3.15 ERA (66 ER/188.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts as a Brewer.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster...In five Grapefruit League appearances (two starts) he posted a 2.31 ERA (3 ER/11.2 IP) and recorded 14 strikeouts.
