TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME! With anticipated high attendance figures this weekend due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 5-3, yesterday to earn the series victory...New York will play 10 of their next 16 games at home...The Mets are 67-13 when scoring first this season...New York is now 30-8-3 in 41 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (5-2), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (2-1) and Nationals (three games)...Following this series, New York hits the road for a seven-day, six-game trip to Pittsburgh (three games) and Miami (three games).

TAI'S TACOS: Tajuan Walker will partner with The New York Foundling to give out free tacos to fans pregame today at Citi Field...Fans will have the opportunity to donate to The New York Foundling organization as Walker serves fans between 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. outside of Jackie Robinson Rotunda Entrance...Since 2018, Walker and his wife have partnered with different foster care organizations as they have been closely connected to people who have been a part of the foster care system...The Foundling is one of New York City's oldest and largest providers of foster care...Their services are geared toward keeping children safe and helping youth in foster care return to their biological parents, remain with their extended family, or find a permanent home.

WASH AND FOLD: The Mets have won all three games against the Nationals at Citi Field this year...They are 10-2 against Washington at Citi Field since the start of last season, posing a 2.77 ERA in that span with a .319/.376/.511 slashline...They have outscored them 71-33...In 2022, the Mets are 10-3 against the Nationals, posting a 2.68 ERA and a .300/.381/.450 slashline...They have outscored the Nats 75-37 in 2022...The Mets have recorded 10 or more wins in four of their last five seasons against Washington...The franchise record for total wins against Washington/Montreal in a single-season is 14 accomplished in 1991...Since the team moved to D.C., the Mets have recorded a record 12 wins against the club three times (2019, 2008 and 2006).

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 45-86 Nationals today...Each of their next 16 games and 24 of their 30 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 45-18 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .714 winning percentage...Their .714 winning percentage is the third-highest winning percentage in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

WHEN YOU'RE 15: Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have record at least 15 doubles, 15 home runs and stolen 15 bases this season...They are the first pair of Mets teammates to accomplish that feat in the same season since Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright did so in 2008...Lindor and Marte joined Texas's Adolis García and Marcus Semien as the only pair of teammates to hit 15 or more home runs and record 15 or more stolen bases this season...Lindor also joined Trea Turner, Tim Anderson and José Ramírez as the only players with four seasons of 15 or more homers and 15 or more steals since 2017.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has recorded multiple-hits in back-to-back games...Overall he is batting .269/.346/.445 with 18 doubles, four triples, 21 home runs, 86 RBI, 54 walks and 15 steals with a .791 OPS...In 39 games since the All-Star break, Lindor is batting .320 (.47-147) with 27 runs, six doubles, a triple, five home runs, 20 RBI, 18 walks and five steals with an .875 OPS...He ranks eighth in the majors and sixth in the NL with a 5.6 fWAR this year.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte is 20-57 (.351) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 12 RBI, four walks, three steals with a .422 OBP and a .667 SLG over his last 15 games...He is batting .312 (.69-221) with 40 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 32 RBI, 13 walks with a .364 OBP, a .538 SLG and a .902 OPS in 58 games at home...This compares to a .279/.336/.416 slashline with a .752 OPS in 56 road contests.

THE DAVID: David Peterson is slated to make his 17th start and 21st appearance for the Mets tonight...The lefty is 7-3 with a 3.21 ERA (32 earned runs/89.2 innings) with 40 walks and 104 strikeouts this year and has held opponents to a .227 average...As a starter, he is 6-3 with a 3.09 ERA (28 earned runs/81.2 innings) with 35 walks and 96 strikeouts.

REVOLUTION NO. 9: Peterson has not allowed more than three runs in any of his last nine starts, going 4-2 in that span with a 2.42 ERA (13 earned runs/48.1 innings) with 18 walks and 67 strikeouts...He has struck out at least five batters in each of those starts...He is the first lefty to record at least five strikeouts in nine straight starts for the Mets since Steven Matz did so from June 30-August 14, 2016...Only three players in franchise history have had a longer streak, Jerry Koosman, Johan Santana and Sid Fernandez...If he strikes out at least five tonight, it will be the longest such streak since Johan Santana from April 24-June 25, 2012.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 36 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for the year...New York has won 84 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .636 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 84-48 record through the team's first 132 games...Only the 1986 (88-44) team posted a better record through the first 132 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 26-13 in the second-half...The team's 26 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors and their .667 winning percentage is third overall...The team is batting .2679/.337/.430 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and rank fifth in average and SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 180-134 following the break.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have clinched the season series against the Nats and have won it in four of the last five years.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 143 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 13 of its last 16 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 45-21 at Citi Field...They are fourth in the majors and second in National League with a .682 winning percentage at home...The team's .682 winning percentage is currently the second-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better home winning percentage...They are right above the 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679)...The Mets have posted a 3.03 ERA with 187 walks and 648 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 648 at home this year...That is already the 10th most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

ADAM'S SONG: Adam Ottavino is 1-0 with three saves and a 1.00 ERA (two earned runs/18.0 innings) with four walks and 24 strikeouts in 17 appearances following the All-Star break...Overall, he is 5-2 with three saves and a 2.01 ERA (12 earned run/53.2 innings) with 14 walks and 65 strikeouts in 54 appearances this year...Opponents are averaging 85.0 MPH exit velocity against Ottavino...That is the eighth-lowest in the majors and sixth-lowest in the National League...Teammate Edwin Díaz ranks ninth-lowest in the majors with a 85.1 MPH opponents exit velo.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 appearances...He has tossed 10.0 innings in that span, allowed seven hits, four walks, struck out 13 and posted a 0.90 ERA (one earned run/10.0 innings)...In 16 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.65 ERA (three earned runs/16.1 innings) with seven walks and 18 strikeouts.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,244 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,261 have struck out more...The team's 1,244 strikeouts are already the eighth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.53 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.6 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 101 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.83 ERA (three earned runs/32.2 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 63 strikeouts in 32 appearances since the start of June.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.0% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 53 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.04 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.52 ERA (nine earned runs/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 17 walks...The Mets are 47-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for fourth in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a 2.81 ERA (101 earned runs/323.1 innings) in 56 games with 346 strikeouts and 78 walks...The Dodgers are the only team with a better ERA (2.51) in that time frame...New York's 346 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.49 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.49 ERA from their starters.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 25 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 11 of the Mets' 26 second-half wins.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Earned his career-high seventh win of the season of August 27 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with four hits and seven strikeouts...Recorded his 100th strikeout of the season for the first time in his career...Was his second career start of 6.0 scoreless innings (also, June 14, 2021 vs. Chicago-NL)...Has not allowed an earned run in three of his last four starts, posting an 1.29 ERA (three earned runs/21.0 innings) across that stretch.

GOT 'EM: Peterson has struck out at least five batters in nine straight starts since June 20...He has 69 strikeouts across 49.2 innings since then (11 G/9 GS) for a 12.50 K/9 ratio, a mark that ranks seventh in the majors in that span (min. 30.0 IP)...His 67 strikeouts over his last nine starts are the most by a Mets left-handed starter over a nine-game span since Johan Santana punched out 69 batters in nine starts from April 18-June 2, 2009.

VS. WASHINGTON: Will be facing the Nationals for the second time this season...Did not factor in the decision on May 30 at Citi Field after allowing four runs on six hits and four walks with one strikeout through 4.2 innings...Has two career wins against the Nats, both from the 2020 season...Has pitched to a 2.53 ERA (six earned runs/21.1 innings) in his four career starts against the club...Peterson is 3-2 with a 3.05 ERA (14 earned runs/41.1 innings) in eight games (seven starts) against the National League East this season.

200 KLUB: Struck out the 200th batter of his career on August 6 vs. Atlanta when he punched out Matt Olson swinging in the sixth frame...Is the 10th pitcher in Mets history to reach 200 strikeouts in their first 43 career games...He was the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz recorded his 200th strikeout in his 39th career game in 2017.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has limited lefties to a .197 (14-71) average...Among left-handed hurlers, it is ninth-best opponents' average in the National League (min. 75 LHB faced).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: Peterson has held batters to a .182 (22-121) average with his slider this season and 67 of his 104 strikeouts have come on the pitch...His 50.0 slider-strikeout percentage is the eighth-highest in MLB (min. 50 PA).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 15 of his 20 games this season and 33 of 45 career games (175 career hits)...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (153 hits) allowed less hits in their first 45 major league games (min. 175.0 IP).

I SEE THE LIGHT: Has gone 3-0 with a 1.41 ERA (five earned runs/32 innings) across six starts during the day this season...This compares to 3-3 with a 4.17 ERA (23 earned runs/49.2 innings) in 10 starts at night...It's the best day-time ERA among pitchers with at least five such starts in the NL and third-best in the majors.

ON THE FARM: Peterson has made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season...He has gone 2-3 and has posted a 4.85 ERA (14 earned runs/26.0 innings) with 10 walks against 34 strikeouts.

OH, THE RELIEF: In four outings out of the bullpen this year, Peterson has gone 1-0, posting a 4.50 ERA (four earned runs/8.0 innings)...This compares to a 3.09 ERA (28 earned runs/81.2 innings) while going 6-3 in 16 starts.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (9-4, 2.27)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss on August 28 vs. Colorado after tossing 7.0 innings of one-run ball with four hits, one walk and a season-high-tying 11 strikeouts...Lost consecutive starts for the first time since May 25 & May 30, 2021.

LOOKING FOR 200: Scherzer is one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (242) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career.

- Is a career .335/.425/.701 hitter against the Nationals...His 21 homers, 38 extra-base hits and 48 RBI are his most against any opponent.
- Lined a walk-off single on August 26 vs. Colorado...Was his second walk-off RBI of the year...He is tied for sixth in Mets history with six career walk-off RBI.
- His 105 RBI this year are tied for 18th in a single season in Mets history...Needs nine RBI to enter the top-10...The Mets record is 124 RBI (done twice).
- Leads the majors with a Mets-record 25 game-winning RBI and 33 go-ahead RBI this season...Since 1954, only three players have had more in a season: Willie Mays (27, 1962), Joe Torre (27, 1971) and Jim Gentile (26, 1961)...Has 12 go-ahead RBI and 11 game-winning RBI since the break.
- Tied for sixth in MLB and tied for fifth in the NL with 31 homers...Tied for the NL lead and tied for third in MLB with 105 RBI...Ranks 17th in the NL with 72 runs.
- Ranks 13th in MLB and seventh in the NL with a .506 SLG...Is 17th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .853 OPS.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is third in games with multiple RBI (27) this season.
