#OPENINGDAYSTL: The St. Louis Cardinals open their 135th season of play in the National League today when they host the Tampa Bay Rays in the opening game of the regular season ... St. Louis is 62-70-2 (.463 win pct.) overall on Opening Day, including a 38-33 (.535) mark at home. **BUSCH III OPENERS:** Today is the Cardinals 10th season opener at home (4-5) in 21 years since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006.

UNIQUE OPENERS: Today marks the first Opening Day meeting between St. Louis and Tampa Bay, and only the third Cardinals Interleague lid-lifter after beginning the 2023 campaign vs. Toronto and 2025 season against the Twins ... Today's opener is the earliest game in franchise history, besting last season's March 27th game vs. Minnesota ... The 2020 Opening Day was scheduled for March 26 at Cincinnati before the COVID-19 pandemic postponed the start of the season.

OPENING DAY NOTABLES: JJ Wetherholt becomes just the 6th Cardinal all-time to make his Major League debut as the team's leadoff man on Opening Day, the first since 3B Tommy Glaviano in 1949 at Cincinnati, and first at home since Emil Verban in 1944 vs. Pittsburgh.

• Wetherholt also becomes the 30th overall in MLB history to bat leadoff while starting at second base in his MLB Debut on Opening Day and third Cardinal to do so, joining Pug Bennett (1906 vs. Pittsburgh) and Verban (1944 vs. Pittsburgh).

• With his start today, Matthew Liberatore is the first Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since Donovan Osborne on April 5, 1999 vs. Milwaukee ... The last Cardinals Opening Day lefty starter to be credited with a win was John Tudor in a 9-3 win over the Cubs on April 1987 at Wrigley Field.

• 23-year-old Jordan Walker becomes only the 4th in MLB history to make four or more Opening Day starts in right field before turning age 24 with Al Kaline (5, 1954-58 Detroit), Ty Cobb (4, 1907-10 Detroit), and Jason Heyward (4, 2010-13 Atlanta).

• With his start in center field today, Victor Scott II becomes the first Cardinal to make three consecutive starts in center field since Jim Edmonds made seven straight (2000-07) and first to make three or more starts in center before turning age 26 since Terry Moore (4, 1935-38).

• Shortstop Masyn Winn joins Paul DeJong (2020-21), Jhonny Peralta (2015), Khalil Greene (2009), Rogers Hornsby (1918-1919), and Dave Brain (1905) as Cardinals shortstops to bat cleanup on Opening Day.

NEW TO THE FLOCK: Pitchers Justin Bruihl, Dustin May, Ryne Stanek, George Soriano, Matt Pushard, and infielder Ramón Urías are six first-time Redbird on the active Opening Day 26-player roster ... 18 players were developed within the Cardinals organization ... Other Cardinals newcomers include Asst. Hitting Coach Casey Chenoweth and Asst. Pitching Coach Kyle Driscoll.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Today marks the first Opening Day rosters for pitchers Michael McGreevy, Matt Pushard, and Matt Svanson; catcher Yohel Pozo, infielders José Fermín, Thomas Saggese, and JJ Weatherholt; and outfielder Nathan Church.

SOME LIKE IT HOT: According to *Baseball Reference*, the hottest first pitch temperature for an Opening Day game in St. Louis is 73° on April 5, 1999 against Milwaukee at Busch Stadium II ... When the 2020 season was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Cardinals and Pirates opened the 60-game slate on July 24 when the first pitch temp was 90°.

BABY BIRDS: For the first time since the 1944 World Series Champion Cardinals, all eight position players for the Cardinals are under age 30 on Opening Day ... That game was also the last time all players (including pitchers who appeared) were age 29 or younger. - Elias

MARCH MADNESS: St. Louis is 8-10 all-time in March games during the regular season (3-3 at Busch Stadium III) ... 18 different Cardinals have homered in the month of March, led by five bombs by Paul Goldschmidt ...The three active Cardinals with March home runs are Nolan Gorman (1), Victor Scott II (1), and Pedro Pages (1).

CONGRATS TO THE RIPPER: Congratulations to Visiting Clubhouse Manager Rip Rowan, who is celebrating his 50th season with the Cardinals organization this afternoon (1977-2026) ... In 1977, Rowan began working for the ballclub as a bat boy.

TAMPA & ST. PETERSBURG CONNECTIONS

Matthew Liberatore was originally selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (16th overall) in the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history... pitched two seasons (2018-19) in the Rays minor league organization...traded to St. Louis with Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Hence) for José Martínez, Randy Arozarena and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams), Jan. 9, 2020.

MLB's Fastest Friends Victor Scott II and Chandler Simpson are both Atlanta natives...were teammates on the 2021 Fond du Lac Dock Spiders... Co-led Minor League Baseball in 2023 with 94 stolen bases...Scott II aka "Argo" recently released a rap music album that featured Simpson.

Steven Matz pitched parts of four seasons in St. Louis (2022-25)...traded to Boston for INF Blaze Jordan (July 31, 2025).

Ryne Stanek pitched parts of his first three seasons with the Rays (2017-19)...was selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (29th overall) in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Oliver Marmol attended Dr. Phillips High School in nearby Orlando.

Hall of Fame Manager Tony La Russa is a Tampa native...raised in Ybor City and graduated from Jefferson High School in Tampa...earned undergraduate degree from the Univ. of South Florida.

The Rays selected C Mike DiFelice in the first round (#10 overall) and OF Kerry Robinson in the second round (#22 overall) from the Cardinals in the 1997 MLB Expansion Draft.

Brandon Allen played in seven games for Tampa Bay in 2021.

Ryan Vilade played in seven games for St. Louis in 2025.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations Chaim Bloom worked 15 years in the Rays baseball operations department, including the final three as Senior Vice President, Baseball Operations.

Rays broadcaster Dewayne Staats is a graduate of SIU-Edwardsville, where he began his sports career with WSIE Radio...won an Emmy Award as the sports director at KPLR TV in St. Louis.

Cardinals Baseball Information & Media Services Manager Chris Tunno graduated from Stetson University...worked in Sports Information at Stetson and the University of Central Florida.

Rays Comm. Director. Elvis Martinez spent 2017 in the Cards organization as a Baseball Operations Fellowship & GCL Cardinals Coord. in Jupiter, Fla. The Cardinals called Waterfront Park and Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg their Spring Training homes for 57 seasons (1938-42, 1947-97).

TODAY'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old **Liberatore** makes his 1st career Opening Day start today, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that Libby was born. He's one of just 16 LHP's to make the Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1901 (MLB).
- Today's matchup with the Rays **Drew Rasmussen** is one of two this year in MLB to feature both starters making their first career Opening Day start.
- The last Cardinals Opening Day lefty starter to be credited with a win was **John Tudor** in a 9-3 win over the Cubs on 4/7/87.
- Libby will be making his 121st career Major League appearance and his 54th career start.
- Is facing his drafting team the Tampa Bay Rays (1st round, 2018) for the 3rd time in his career and for the 2nd time at Busch Stadium.
- Pitched arguably his finest career outing against the Rays at Tropicana Field (Aug. 10, 2023) firing a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball with a season-high seven strikeouts in a 5-2 win.
- Was 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in 4 Spring Training appearances, striking out 19 to just 2 walks in 15.0 IP.**

LAST TIME OUT (Friday, March 20 at NY Mets): W, 4-3; 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 54 pitches).

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

CAREER YEAR: Joined the starting rotation in a full-time capacity and established career highs in wins (8), decisions (20), starts (29), quality starts (11), strikeouts (122), and innings pitched (151.2). Libby's 151.2 innings surpassed his 149.2 combined in 2022 between St. Louis (34.2 IP) and AAA-Memphis (115.0 IP), while his eight wins matched his Major League combined total from his first three seasons (2022-24).

ST. LOUIS SOUTHPAWS: Libby's 29 starts were the most by a St. Louis southpaw since **Jaime García** (32 in 2011), and the most by any Cardinals left-hander age 25 or younger since the same 24-year-old García in 2011.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Became the youngest Cardinals lefty to win eight games since 23-year-old **Jaime Garcia** (13 wins in 2010), while Libby's eight victories were the most by any Cardinals left-hander since García's 10 wins in 2016.

LEFT IS RIGHT: Led all Major League left-handers age 25 or younger in strikeouts (122), co-led in quality starts (11), and ranked 2nd in wins (8) and starts (29).

THREE'S COMPANY: Limited his opposition to three runs or fewer in 21-of-29 starts, and two runs or fewer in eight consecutive from April 13-May 24, the longest streak by a Cardinal since **Jack Flaherty** ran off nine straight (July 7-Aug. 23, 2019). Worked 6.0 innings or more in 12 starts (11 quality).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Over his initial 13 starts of the season, held opposing left-handed batters to a .190/.254/.207 slash line (11-58) with one extra-base hit.

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Was acquired by the Cardinals from the Rays in a four-player trade in 2020, with a compensation pick that netted the Cardinals RHP **Tink Hence**.
- Is a career 13-21 with a 4.87 ERA (253.0 IP) in his 53 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.
- Has limited left-handed batters to a .237/.299/.342 (79-333) with a .641 OPS average over his Major League career.
- 2021 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year, his first season of play in the Cardinals organization.

LIBERATORE VS. TAMPA BAY:

- Makes his third career start/appearance vs. Tampa Bay, his original drafting team. Selected in the 1st round (16th overall) in the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history at the time.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA in his two career starts against the Rays (12.1 IP/4 ER) with 12 strikeouts.
- Authored the pitching performance of his MLB career in his only appearance against Tampa Bay in 2023. Hurlled career-high 8.0 shutout frames while allowing a pair of hits in the 5-2 Cardinals win at the Trop.
- Became the first Cards rookie LHP to throw 8.0+ scoreless IP since **Jaime Garcia** (9.0 on Aug. 22, 2010 vs. Giants) and the 9th since 1984 when **Ricky Horton** hurled a complete game shutout on June 29, 1994 at San Diego.
- Pitched two seasons in the Rays minor league organization (2018-19).
- Traded to St. Louis with **Edgardo Rodriguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B in exchange for **José Martínez**, **Randy Arozarena**, and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (January 9, 2020) ... The Cardinals used the Rays 2020 Compensation draft pick B gained in the trade (63rd overall) to select RHP **Tink Hence**.

NEWS TO KNOW: Delivered scoreless outings in 5 of last 6 Grapefruit League apps. (1.50 ERA) ... Tied for team lead with 8 Grapefruit League apps. ... Makes his 2nd career Opening Day roster and 1st since 2022 with the Dodgers ... Has never allowed a run within his first 2 MLB apps. of a season.

GIVE ME A FIFTH: Former non-drafted free agent looking to appear in games with 5th Major League club, previously appearing in 94 total games with LAD (65), TOR (15), COL (7) and PIT (7) ... Signed as a free agent with the Reds in 2024, but did not pitch in an MLB game.

BANNER YEAR: Pitched in 15 games in relief for AL Champion Toronto, as well a 0.1 IP relief outing in Game 2 of the 2025 ALDS vs. NYY.

WHIRLWIND OFFSEASON: Acquired by Cleveland from Toronto in exchange for cash considerations on 12/17/25, and acquired by St. Louis from Cleveland in exchange for cash considerations on 1/6/26.

vs. AL: Delivered scoreless outings in 7 of his 11 appearances against AL teams in 2025. **vs. RAYS:** Has not allowed a run in 3 of his 4 career appearances against TB, including his final regular-season outing of 2025, tossing 1.0 perfect frame with 2 K's.

NOTABLE:

- Pitched a scoreless 5th inning with 1 strikeout in the exhibition game Monday at Double-A Springfield.
- Has held LHBs to a .224 AVG (36-161) and .580 OPS in his career.
