TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 4-game series vs Jared Hughes' Phillies and Game 2 (0-1) of a 7 -game homestand that includes an upcoming weekend series vs the Diamondbacks (3g)...following Sun afternoon's game vs Ari, the Redlegs will fly to Seattle and spend Mon's off day there...Tue night will begin their second consecutive 3 -city road trip ( 3 g at Sea, 3 g at Ari, 3 g at Chi) and the fourth of their 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast (0-3 at LAD \& 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA).

SERIES NOTES: Last season, from 4/9-4/11 at Citizens Bank Park the Reds were swept in a 3 -game series in Philadelphia for the first time since 4/12-4/14, 1993, while from 7/26-7/29 at Great American Ball Park the Reds won a 4-game series vs Phi (3-1) for the first time since 9/12-9/14, 1997.

WE MEET AGAIN: During his time in Cincinnati (5/27/08-7/31/16), among all Reds players Jay Bruce ranked first in games, HR, RBI, extra-base hits and triples; ranked second in doubles, slugging percentage, walks, total bases and runs; and ranked third in hits, game-winning RBI and times on base...was selected by the Reds in the first round (12th overall) of the June 2005 first-year player draft out of West Brook High School in Beaumont, Texas...in 8 career apps vs his former team, including 5 games as a Met and 3 games as a Phillie, Bruce is 5 -for-28 (.179, 2hr, 6rbi)...Most Outstanding Pitcher Jared Hughes in 2018 became the first Reds pitcher to produce an Pitcher Jared Hughes in 2018 became the first Red
ERA below 2.00 while making more than 70 apps.

DIAMONDBACKS UP NEXT: From 8/10-8/12 of last season the Reds won a series vs the Diamondbacks at Great American Ball Park (2-1) for the first time since a $2-1$ series win here from 7/22-7/24, 2016...the Reds have won 6 of the last 11 games vs Ari...the Reds are 38-30 at Chase Field, including 21-13 there the last 10 seasons....are 32-18 with the roof closed and $6-12$ with the roof open...Cin won its first 7 g at Bank One Ballpark until a 9-6 loss on 7/1/00

FOLLOWED BY THE MARINERS: Next week the Reds and Mariners will meet for the first time since 2016 and for the first time in Seattle since 2010...the Redlegs are 2-13 all-time vs Sea, including 0-3 in 2016 at Great

 American Ball Park, 1-2 in 2013 at GABP, 0-3 in 2010 at Safeco Field, 1-2 in 2007 at Safeco and 0-3 in 2002 in the final season of Cinergy Field...the Reds won their first game at the ballpark then known as Safeco Field, 16-1 on 6/22/07, but since then have lost 5 straight games at what is now named T-Mobile Park.

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: In August, rookie Aristides Aquino led all Major League batters in HR (14) and RBI (33) and led the National League while ranking second in the majors in slugging percentage (.767, Bos' J.D. Martinez .768)...also ranked among the NL leaders last month in extra-base hits (18, T3rd), on-base percentage (.391, T16th) and batting average (.320, 20th)...established a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month (Frank Robinson, August 1962 \& Greg Vaughn, September 1999)...was National League Player of the Week for 8/5-8/11...his 33 RBI are second-most ever by a Reds batter in August (Frank Robinson, 34 RBI, August 1962) and the most by a Reds batter in any month since Jay Bruce had 33 RBI in May 2011...the club record for RBI in any calendar month remains 45, held by Gus Bell (June 1953).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 15 HR in his first 33 career games and 125 plate apps, including a 3-homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

Holds modern Major League records for fewest career games to 14 HR $(28 \mathrm{~g})$ and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122pa)...Phi's Rhys Hoskins holds the record since 1900 for fewest plate apps to 16 HR (137).
Is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps, the only player with 14 HR in his first 108 career plate apps and the only player with 15 HR in his first 122 career plate apps...Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as 12 HR in their first 100 career plate apps.
Holds modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins holds the Major League record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).
With 14 HR in August has established a new National League record for home runs by a rookie in a calendar month Det's Rudy York holds the Major League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month with 18 HR in August $1937 .$.
Aquino shares with Frank Robinson (August 1962) and Greg
Vaughn (September 1999) the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 87 of the Reds' 137 games so far this season, including 58 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once solely as a pinch hitter, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), twice as a pitcher/LF, twice as a P/RF, 4 times as a CF, 4 times as a LF, 9 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$ Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a HR, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 399.1 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958.

## Tonight's Pitcher - \#39 Lucas Sims, RHP

## RED HOTS

Lucas Sims tonight is making his third start of the season for the Reds...is filling the spot in the rotation vacated by injured LHP Alex Wood (low back soreness)... is in his second stint with the Reds this season...has made 1 start and all 15 of his relief apps since he was promoted just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day ( $7 / 18$ )...while pitching in relief, 6 times threw more than 1.0 inning, twice threw 2.0 innings and on $7 / 30$ vs Pit threw a season-high 2.2 innings in relief...made his first start in the $11-6$ win on $\mathbf{5 / 2 8}$ vs Pit, in the club's 55 th game of this season...was the latest in a season the Reds used a sixth starting pitcher since 2012, when in that year's 121st game (on 8/18), RHP Todd Redmond started the night game of a DH vs the Cubs...in that 2012 NL Central Division championship season, Homer Bailey (33), Johnny Cueto (33), Mat Latos (33), Bronson Arroyo (32) and Mike Leake (30) made 161 of the team's 162 starts... Sims was optioned back to Louisville following the next afternoon's game, on $5 / 29$, and pitched for the Bats until his second promotion on $7 / 18$...in that start and $11-6$ win on $5 / 8$ vs Pit threw 7.1 innings with 9 strikeouts, both career highs....was the longest outing by a Reds pitcher until Gray threw 8.0 innings on $7 / 3$ in the club's 84th game...took a 3-hit shutout into the eighth inning before Kevin Newman hit his 100th and final pitch for a grand slam, the first homer of Newman's career...is a 2019 International League All-Star and IL Pitcher of the Week for 7/1-7/7

## Tomorrow's Pitcher - \#27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

## RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tomorrow will make his seventh appearance for the Reds and his first start on 3 days' rest since $9 / \mathbf{2 5 / 1 8}$ for Cle at WSox...in his career has made 2 regular season and 2 Postseason starts on short rest (see Page 1)...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...has recorded a career high 222 strikeouts...is his second consecutive $\mathbf{2 0 0}$-strikeout season and his third career 30 -start season...ranks among the Major League leaders in innings pitched (186.2, 2nd) and strikeouts (222, fourth)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in strikeouts (443), 12th in ERA (3.41), and ninth in innings pitched (362.0)...in 2018 was an American League All-Star, finished fifth in the Cy Young Award voting, ranked second in the AL in ERA (2.21) and allowed the fewest HR per 9 innings in the league (.0462)...in his $5-2$ win on $8 / 9$ vs Cubs, in his Great American Ball Park debut as a Red recorded 11 strikeouts, his 26 th career 10 -strikeout game and seventh of the season.

Is hitting 226 ( $7-31$ ) in 8 apps since he was reinstated from the injured list on Wednesday...since $8 / 18$ had been on the 10-day IL with a low back strain...missed 11 games while injured, and the Reds went 5-6.
In his return to the lineup Wed at Mia went 0-for-5, snapping his 6-game hitting streak (8-22, .364, $32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 3 \mathrm{rbi}$, $.636 \mathrm{slg}, .440 \mathrm{obp}$ ) and his 13-game on-base streak (.261ba, .386obp).
From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
Beginning $5 / 8$ made his last 85 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish. His first-inning double on 8/10 off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864)... hasn't played at GABP since $8 / 11$ vs Cubs.
For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
