FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals play the last of a three-game series with the San Francisco Giants today. This is the second opponent of a six-game homestand against the two teams from Northern California after taking 2-of-3 from the Athletics (Sept. 1-3). The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central, 17.0 games behind first place Milwaukee and 5.5 games behind New York for the final Wild Card position.

SUNDAY SERIES SHOWDOWN: A win today will give the Cardinals a 3rd straight series win, taking series at Cincinnati and against the Athletics. The last time the Cardinals won three straight series was May when they took five straight series (NYM, PIT, at WSH, at PHI, at KC) as part of a season-high nine-game win streak.

CITY BY THE BAY: The Cardinals lead San Francisco by a slim 365-363 margin in the all-time series since the Giants moved from New York in 1958. The Cardinals have won the season series over the Giants nine times in the last 11 seasons since 2013.

BIG ONES: **Jordan Walker** snapped a career-high 0-for-25 with a two-RBI double for his first career walk-off hit/RBI last night as the Cardinals rallied for three runs in the 9th inning in a 3-2 win over San Francisco. The walk-off win was the Cardinals 6th of the season and their second win of the season when trailing after eight innings (2-63).

NEVER OUT OF IT: Last night's comeback win was the Cardinals 36th of the season, 5th-most in Major League Baseball this season trailing only Los Angeles-NL (42), Toronto (42), Los Angeles-AL (38) and Seattle (38). However, it was the Cardinals first 9th inning comeback win of the season.

SON-DAY: Starting pitcher **Sonny Gray** leads the Cardinals with 12 wins and the Cardinals 13 wins when Gray starts at home this season are the most in MLB by any pitcher who starts at home. Gray has seven career starts vs. the Giants, but has never pitcher at Oracle Park in his 13-year career. Gray needs to pitch 4.1 innings for 1,900 career (9th active pitcher) and three strikeouts for 1,900 career. With five strikeouts, Gray will pass 2003 World Series MVP **Josh Beckett** (1,901) for 109th all-time.

LAST CALL: Cardinals infielder **Nolan Gorman** led off last night's 9th inning rally with a single, the 300th hit of his career. Gorman is batting .375 (9-24) in the 9th inning, his best batting average in any inning. When it comes to Close & Late situations this season, Gorman is batting .327 (17-52), 8th best mark in the National League, with four extra-base hits and five RBI.

NO DOUBTING THOMAS: Rookie infielder **Thomas Saggese** has hit safely in 7-of-his-last-8 games and in the last calendar month (since Aug. 8), ranks 2nd on the Cardinals with 26 hits over that period, trailing only **Lars Nootbaar** with 27. He also ranks 2nd on the squad in doubles over that period with five (Nootbaar - 6).

SVAN SONG: Rookie RHP **Matt Svanson** has put together an outstanding season. In just 31 appearances this season, Svanson leads all National League relievers in opponent BA (.147) and hits/9 IP (4.44), while ranking 3rd in baserunners/9 IP (8.14) and WHIP (0.84) and 7th in ERA (2.03). Despite just 31 appearances, he's had 19 appearances of four outs or more (T-14th in MLB) and has made eight straight scoreless appearances when pitching 2.0 innings or more, tied for the longest streak in MLB this season with **Jack Dreyer** (LAD) and **Hayden Birdsong** (SF). The last pitcher in MLB with nine or more was **Bryan Hudson** (MIL) with 10 in 2024. -*Elias Sports Bureau*

Nolan Arenado's brother, **Jonah Arenado**, was selected by San Francisco in the 16th round of 2013 MLB Draft...played seven minor league seasons (2013-19) in the Giants organization.

Nolan Arenado, Nathan Church, and Matt Chapman are graduates of El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

Daniel Descalso was born in Redwood City and resides in Danville, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004...played college baseball at UC-Davis (2005-07).

Cardinals Bullpen Coach **Julio Rangel** was the Giants Minor League Pitching Coordinator in 2018.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Keith Hernandez** was born in San Francisco, CA...graduated from Capuchino High School in San Bruno, CA.

Late Hall of Famer **Orlando Cepeda** played parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1966-68)...in 1967, was NL All-Star, NL MVP and won the World Series...traded by the Cardinals to Atlanta for **Joe Torre** (March 17, 1969).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill...resides in Hercules...worked as an asst. coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, CA.

2025 Cardinals Hall of Famer **Édgar Rentería** played two seasons in San Francisco (2009-10)...member of the 2010 World Series Champion Giants and was named World Series MVP.

Andrew Knizner played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2019-23)...selected in the 7th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Cardinals.

Joey Lucchesi pitched two seasons at Southeast Missouri State (2015-16).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Morris** pitched two seasons in San Francisco (2006-07).

Erik Miller was born in St. Louis and is a native of nearby Wildwood...graduated from De Smet Jesuit High School.

Giants Special Asst. **Will Clark** played in 51 games in his final season (2000) with St. Louis...slashed .345/.441/.621 in eight Postseason games.

Duane Kuiper is a graduate of Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Ill.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** made his MLB debut at San Francisco (April 7, 1984).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Tommy Herr** played 32 games for the Giants during his final season (1991).

Cardenales broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10).

Cardinals Major League Video Coordinator **Chad Blair** is a native of Santa Rosa, Calif., who also worked for the Oakland Athletics.

TODAY'S GAME:

- The Cardinals Opening Day starter is set to make his 29th start of the season (337th career appearance/327th start). It's his 57th career start for St. Louis.
- Ranks 7th among active pitchers with 326 starts.
- Ranks 110th in career strikeouts with 1,897; needs five strikeouts to pass **Josh Beckett** in 109th with 1,901. With 4.1 innings, becomes the 9th-active pitcher with 1,900 career innings.
- Is the first Cardinal with back-to-back 10-win seasons since **Adam Wainwright** (2021-22).
- Has a 8-5 record with a 3.98 ERA (13 HR) in 18 home starts, but 4-3 with a 5.24 ERA (10 HR) in 10 road starts.
- Boasts the 2nd-highest strikeout percentage on the Sweeper (49.2) trailing only **Garrett Crochet** (BOS, 50.3) of those with 100 or more batters faced.
- The Cardinals are 19-9 in Gray's 28 starts this season. Tied for 3rd trailing San Francisco's Robbie Ray (21) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (21) for most team wins any pitcher.**
- St. Louis is 13-5 in his 18 home starts this season, most wins by a home team record for any starting pitcher in MLB this season.** Toronto's Chris Bassitt (12) is 2nd.
- Sonny's 17 wins at home since joining St. Louis (2024-25) are 3rd-most in the majors behind **Tarik Skubal (19)** and **Carlos Rodon (18)**.
- Leads the Cardinals staff in percentage of Swings That Miss (27.1%) - 10th-best in the NL.
- Has 20 career double-digit strikeout games, including three since May 19. Since his career began in 2013, ranks T-28th among his peers in 10+ K games.
- Issued one-or-fewer walks in MLB-leading 21-of-28 starts this season; St. Louis is 15-6 in those games.
- Has six scoreless starts of 6.0 innings or more, tied for 4th-most in MLB behind the Tigers LHP Tarik Skubal (12), Pirates RHP Paul Skenes (7) and Angels RHP Jose Soriano (7).**
- Is one of 11 pitchers in Busch Stadium III history with 200+ strikeouts (255 K). **Kyle Lohse** ranks 9th with 297 strikeouts.
- 23 of his 163 hits allowed in 2025 have been homers and **38 of his 84 runs (45.2%) allowed this season have come via home run.**
- Over past two seasons since joining St. Louis (2024-25), ranks among MLB leaders in strikeouts (376, T-5th) and wins (25, T-6th).
- St. Louis is 36-20 (.643) in his 56 starts with the club since joining in 2024; His record stands at 25-17 while wearing the Birds on the Bat.

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, Sept. 1 vs. Athletics): Tied his season-high allowing three home runs (Bleday 2, Gelof) including back-to-back shots in an 11-3 loss to his former club. Pitched 6.0 innings and only 82 pitches allowing seven runs on 11 hits in the game.

2025:

- Has two starts holding the opposition to one hit this season (8/4 at LAD 7.0 IP & 6/27 at CLE 9.0 IP).
- Authored a one-hit complete-game shutout masterpiece at CLE (6/27) striking out a season-high 11 Guardians on only 89 pitches in the 5-0 Cardinals win. His only blemish was a two-out Nolan Jones single in the bottom of the 5th inning.
- Marked Gray's 5th career shutout and first since July 28, 2015 at Los Angeles Dodgers. It was the 11th time a Cardinal threw a one-hitter, one batter over the minimum since 1901, and first since **Jordan Montgomery** at Wrigley Field on Aug, 22, 2022.*
- Since pitch counts were accurately kept in 1988, Gray joined **David Cone's** perfect game (July 18, 1999) as the only two pitchers to throw shutouts of one hit or fewer with 10+ strikeouts in 89 pitches or fewer.*
- His 19 starts before the All-Star Break tied his single-season most (2014).

GRAY vs. SAN FRANCISCO

- Is 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA in seven career starts against the Giants.
- Holds a .193 opponent BA vs. SF, 5th-best among actives (Snell .170; Hendricks .186, Burnes .188, deGrom .188). *min.* 7 GS
- Has never allowed more than three earned runs in any of his seven career starts vs. SF.
- Faced them once as a member of the Cardinals at Busch Stadium last year to complete a three-game sweep on June 23, 2024 in a 5-3 victory.
- Pitched 7.0 innings allowing just one hit with eight strikeouts. His second career one-hit start vs. SF (8/27/22 - 5.0 IP w/MIN).
- Has never pitched at Oracle Park despite making 326 career starts overall, and seven vs. the Giants since 2013, including five years as a crosstown rival in Oakland (2013-17).
