METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 5-0, last night in Atlanta...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games (0-2)...The Mets are in the midst of a six-game road trip (0-2) to Atlanta (0-2) and Philadelphia (three games)...Following the trip, the Mets return home for a brief four-game homestand against the Braves.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have dropped five straight games, which is their longest losing streak of the season...The team lost a season-high five straight games twice in 2024...New York has posted a 5.64 ERA (28 ER/44.2 IP) over the last five games, while batting .208/.293/.298...They have been outscored 34-13 in that span.

HOLMES, SWEET HOLMES: Clay Holmes is set to take the bump tonight...He is 7-3 with a 2.87 ERA, 25 walks and 68 strikeouts...He has thrown more innings this year than any single season in his career...His 68 strikeouts are tied for the third-most in his career...He has appeared in five games at Truist Park, going 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/5.2 IP) and three strikeouts...Holmes is 4-2 with a 2.41 ERA (10 ER/37.1 IP) on the road, compared to a 3-1 mark with a 3.29 ERA (15 ER/41.0 IP) at home.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL...New York is 12-6 against the NL East this season, sporting a 2.55 ERA...They have hit .255/.327/.425 against the division.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Juan Soto is one hit away from 1,000 for his career...Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 45-29 record this season...Their record through 74 games is the fifth-best start in franchise history...Only the 1986 (53-21), 2022 (47-27), 1988 (46-28) and 2006 (46-28) teams had a better season-opening record.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 18-19 (486) on the road compared to 27-10 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets have won four of their last seven and six of their last 10 on the road...The Mets have posted an MLB-best 3.16 ERA on the road this year.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last 21 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .305 (25-82) with 15 runs, three doubles, five homers, 12 RBI, eight walks, four steals and an .898 OPS...In 16 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .339/.409/.593 with three doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, six walks and two steals.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 26-40 at Truist Park since the facility opened in 2017...The Mets are in a stretch where they will play seven of 10 games against Atlanta...They are 0-2 in that span.

HAPPY JEFF: Jeff McNeil has reached base safely in his last 20 games dating back to May 25, the longest such streak of his career and the longest active streak in the majors...He is batting .300 (21-70) with eight runs, four doubles, five homers, 12 RBI, six walks, a .367 OBP and a .571 SLG during his current on-base streak...He is batting .296 (16-54) with six extra-base hits, 10 RBI and a .367 OBP in 16 games this month...He batted .222 (14-63) in 24 games in May.

JUAN OF A KIND: In 16 games this month, Juan Soto is batting .315/.493/.648 with 16 runs, three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, 18 walks and one steal...Over the last 11 games, he is batting .359 (14-39) with five extra-base hits and a .500 OBP...He has recorded a Major League-leading 61 walks...His 61 walks through the team's first 73 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 85.5 (59-69) stolen base percentage this season which is the second-best mark in the majors...The Mets are one of eight teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 41.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-51), the best mark in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0 innings of one-run ball in the Mets' 7-5 loss vs. Tampa Bay on June 13...Allowed three hits, issued two walks and recorded three strikeouts...Marked his seventh start of the season in which he allowed one or zero runs...Has allowed one or zero runs in three of his last four starts.

WHAT UP HOLMES?: Holmes is one of 10 pitchers in franchise history to win seven or more games and strike out 60 or more batters, while sporting a sub-3.00 ERA in their first 14 games with the franchise...The others are Pedro Astacio, Al Leiter, Pedro Martínez, Steven Matz, Frank Viola, Max Scherzer, Johan Santana, Matt Harvey and R.A. Dickey.

THE GAME OF RISP: This season, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .118 (6-51) average with runners in scoring position, the second-best mark in the majors trailing only teammate Kodai Senga (.103, min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Out of the six hits Holmes has allowed this season with runners in scoring position, only one has gone for extra bases...He is one of nine pitchers in the majors to allow one or zero extra-base hits with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.6% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 66.7% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.8% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last seven starts, Holmes has allowed nine home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes has allowed two home runs in three of his last six starts after he never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career game.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 159 career road outings, Holmes has pitched to a 4.07 ERA (90 ER/199.0 IP)...In 102 road games since 2022, Holmes has posted a 2.61 ERA (38 ER/131.0 IP), a 4.27 earned run average improvement from his first 56 career road games...Since 2022, Holmes ranks seventh in the majors in road ERA (min. 100.0 IP)...This season, Holmes is 4-2 with a 2.41 ERA (10 ER/37.1 IP) in seven road starts...His four road wins are tied for the third-most in the majors while his road ERA is the seventh-lowest mark in the NL and the 15th-lowest in the majors (min. 30.0 IP).

BRAVEHEART: In 10 career appearances against the Braves, Holmes is 1-0 with a 0.82 (1 ER/11.0 IP), nine strikeouts, a 0.55 WHIP and a .081 (3-37) opponents' batting average...His ERA, WHIP and opponents' batting average against Atlanta are his lowest marks amongst the 16 clubs Holmes has faced 10 or more times in his career...Holmes has yet to allow a run over five appearances (5.2 IP) at Truist Park.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established a career-high 73.1 innings pitched...Holmes is also one win shy of matching his career high (8, 2021) and 10 strikeouts from matching his career high (78, 2021)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 8-5 with a 3.66 ERA (38 ER/93.1 IP) in 18 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

CLAYMATION: Holmes became the seventh Mets pitcher to make their team debut as the club's Opening Day starter...The others are Roger Craig (4/11/62 at STL), Don Cardwell (4/11/67 vs. PIT), Mike Hampton (3/29/00 vs. CHC), Tom Glavine (3/31/03 vs. CHC), Pedro Martínez (4/4/05 at CIN) and Johan Santana (3/31/08 at FLA)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Additionally, Holmes celebrated his 32nd birthday on Opening Day...He became the seventh pitcher in major league history to start Opening Day on their birthday joining Vic Willis (4/12/1906 PIT at STL),

Marty Pattin (4/6/1971 MIL at MIN), Bert Blyleven (4/6/73 MIN at OAK and 4/6/79 PIT vs. MTL), Catfish Hunter (4/8/76 NYY at MIL), Jon Lieber (4/2/01 CHC vs. MTL) and Ryan Drese (4/5/05 TEX at LAA)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazerowski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazerowski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
