**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (1-2), and Minnesota (three to play) today at Target Field...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR)...are fourth in the AL East, 3.0 GB the first-place Yankees (5-1)...have spent two days in third, three in fourth, and three in fifth.

- \* The Rays entered the 8th inning tied 2-2, but yielded six runs in the frame en route to an 8-2 setback on Wednesday in Milwaukee...nearly 40.0 pct. (14) of the 38 runs permitted by the Rays have come in two frames (also: 8R on March 26 at STL - 6th inn.).
- \* Six of the Rays seven runs scored against the Brewers came on 5 HR...they went 0-for-16 with RISP, their eighth time going hitless in scoring situations over a series of three games or more, first since Oct. 3-5, 2022 at BOS (0-for-14)...Rays hitters on an 0-for-18 skid with RISP overall.
- \* They have left 50 men on base, tied for fourth most in the majors and tied with 2017 for their second most through six games of a season behind 2003 (58).
- \* Despite the RISP struggles, Rays hitters still pace the AL in average (.274) and rank third in on-base pct. (.337), OPS (.739), and runs per game (5.0)...they have 14 XBH in their last four games after recording 1 XBH in their first two.
- \* The Rays have lost their first two series for the fifth time, joining the 2018 (first 3), 2011 (3), 2003 (2), and 2001 (3) campaigns...they are 0-8-1 in their last nine sets dating back to Sept. 4-7 vs. CLE, their longest stretch of winless series since Sept. 10, 2007-April 10, 2008 (0-6-3), with their last longer streak coming from Sept. 4, 2006-April 22, 2007 (0-10-4)...their most recent series win was a three-game sweep from Sept. 1-3 vs. SEA.
- \* The Rays need to win today to avoid a 2-5 (or worse) start for the eighth time, first since 2018 (1-6).

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Today, the Rays placed LHP Garrett Cleavinger (right calf tightness) on the 15-day IL (retro March 31) and recalled RHP Hunter Bigge from Triple-A...Bigge's last major league appearance came on May 1, 2025 vs. KC...he landed on the 15-day IL on May 6 with a right lat strain and was transferred to the 60-day IL July 17...on June 19 vs. BAL, he suffered multiple facial fractures after being struck by a 105-mph foul ball while in the Rays dugout.

- \* Bigge has made two appearances with Durham, retiring six of seven batters faced with 4 SO.

**BABY, IT'S COLD OUTSIDE**—According to the National Weather Service, today's forecast calls for a temperature of 40 degrees at first pitch in Minneapolis...per Baseball-Reference, that would mark the Rays coldest first-pitch temperature since April 18, 2022 at CHC (40 degrees)...the Rays have played 15 games with a gametime temperature of 40 degrees or colder, going 8-7...only one of those 15 games came at Target Field: an 8-2 win on April 27, 2011 (40°)...the coldest first-pitch temperatures in franchise history are 35 degrees (April 9, 2018 at CWS) and 34 degrees (April 17, 2003 at BOS).

- \* Temperatures are currently projected to be around 38 degrees at the scheduled 7:10 p.m. ET first pitch tomorrow night.

**BOOTS AND BLUNDERS**—The Rays nine errors are tied for the most in the majors (also: LAA & WSH), and their .958 fielding pct. is tied for the worst along with the Nationals...they have committed an error in each of their first six games for the first time in club history...the nine miscues are their second most through six games behind the 2003 Devil Rays (10), and their seven unearned runs are tied with 2021 for their second most behind 2001 (9)...only the Diamondbacks (10) and Angels (9) have yielded more unearned runs than the Rays...the club record for errors through seven games is 10 (2003 & 2001).

- \* Junior Caminero committed all three Rays errors on Wednesday in Milwaukee, tying the club record (8x, last: Evan Longoria on April 17, 2012 at TOR)...his five errors lead MLB.
- \* The Rays have led in each of their first six games, including all four losses...the bullpen's 8.69 ERA (19.2IP, 19ER) is third highest in the majors, better than only the White Sox (9.12) and Royals (9.00)...Rays relievers have yielded multiple runs in five of six games.

**THAT'S HIS FORTE(S)**—Nick Fortes is the first catcher in franchise history to reach base safely in each of the Rays first six games...his seven hits are tied with COL Hunter Goodman and MIA Liam Hicks for third most among primary catchers, trailing ATH Shea Langeliers (9) and ATL Drake Baldwin (8)...it marks the most hits by a Rays catcher through the club's first six games since Toby Hall (8) in 2004...the record through seven games is also eight, shared by Hall (2x, also: 2002) and John Flaherty (2000).

- \* All seven of Fortes' hits have come off fastballs (7-for-15/.467)...he has whiffed on only two of his 32 swings on heaters (93.7% contact rate)...his 87.2 pct. contact rate overall ranks third in the AL to MIN Victor Caratini (90.9%) and KC Vinnie Pasquantino (88.1%).
- \* He has hit safely in a career-high 10 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 17, 2025 vs. TOR, batting .342 (13-for-38) with 2 2B, 1 HR, and 5 RBI in those games.
- \* He has gone 5-for-7 on ABS challenges from behind the plate, tying MIN Ryan Jeffers, KC Salvador Perez, and LAD Will Smith for the most successful challenges among catchers.

**CHAN IS THE MAN**—Chandler Simpson has hit safely in each of the Rays first six games, going 10-for-21 (.476)...he joins Randy Arozarena (10G, 2023), and Yandy Diaz (6G, 2019) as the only Rays over the last 12 seasons (2015-26) to accomplish the feat...his .476 average ranks third in the majors to WSH Joey Wiemer (.588) and NYY Giancarlo Stanton (.500), and his four multi-hit efforts are tied for second behind Stanton (5)...in his last 20 games dating back to Sept. 11, 2025, Simpson is batting .392 (31-for-79) with 5 XBH, 4 RBI, 4 BB, 7 SB, and an .890 OPS...min. 75 AB, it marks the majors' best average in that span.

- \* He is batting .303 (132-for-435) through 115 major league games, second in franchise history over such a span to Jorge Cantú (.304, 2004-05).
- \* According to FanGraphs, Simpson's 0.7 bWAR ranks second among major league left fielders, trailing only HOU Yordan Alvarez (0.8).

**MR. RELIABLE**—Yandy Diaz's 12 hits pace the majors and are tied with Carl Crawford (2003) for third in franchise history through the Rays first six games, trailing Quinton McCracken (14, 1998) and Eyan Longoria (13, 2009)...McCracken also holds the club record through seven games (16H)...Diaz has tallied an RBI in four of his last five games, and his 8 RBI are tied for the AL lead with ATH Shea Langeliers...in all of MLB, only MIA Liam Hicks (12) has driven in more runs than Diaz.

**ALL ARANDA BASES**—Jonathan Aranda has reached base safely in a career-high 20 consecutive games (July 19, 2025-pres.), the longest active streak in the AL and second longest in the majors to LAD Shohei Ohtani (37G)...he is slashing .301/.398/.548 (22-for-73) with 3 2B, 5 HR, 15 RBI, 13 BB, and a .946 OPS during the streak, which is the longest by a Ray since Brandon Lowe (23G) from June 9-July 5, 2025.

- \* Aranda and teammate Yandy Diaz are tied for the AL lead with 13 hard-hit balls each.

**JONNY ROCKETS**—Jonny DeLuca has hit safely and recorded an RBI in all three of his starts, going 5-for-12 (.417) with 1 2B, 1 HR, and 4 RBI in those games...he is looking to become the fifth Ray to tally an RBI in each of his first four starts...he would join Jose Siri (5G, 2023), Manuel Margot (4G, 2021), Evan Longoria (4G, 2009), and Jorge Cantú (4G, 2005)...in six total games, DeLuca has already recorded the three hardest hits of his career (109.0-mph homer, two 108.1-mph singles).

**CASH CONSIDERATIONS**—Kevin Cash has 898 wins in his managerial career, two shy of becoming the fourth active skipper with 900 career victories...he would join CIN Terry Francona (2,036), DET A.J. Hinch (966), and LAD Dave Roberts (948)...Cash would also become the ninth manager in MLB history to reach the mark while managing only one team in his career, joining LAD Walter Alston, LAA Mike Scioscia, LAD Tommy Lasorda, BAL Earl Weaver, MIN Tom Kelly, DET Hughie Jennings, PIT Danny Murtaugh, and STL Red Schoendienst (Stats Perform).

**TWIN CITIES SHOWDOWN**—The Rays and Twins open a six-game season series this afternoon at Target Field after splitting, 3-3, in 2025...the Rays are unbeaten (2-0-1) in the last three season series and are 5-2-3 in the previous nine (2016-25; clubs did not meet in 2020)...each of the Rays last seven games at Target Field have been decided in the final at-bat, their longest streak at any ballpark, home or away in franchise history (Stats Perform)...they are 4-3 during the streak, which began with a 5-4 win on Sept. 13, 2023 when Randy Arozarena hit a go-ahead solo homer in the 9th...12 of the last 15 meetings between these clubs overall have been decided by two runs or fewer, including 10 one-run games.

- \* The Rays are 4-1-1 in their last six series against the Twins since 2023...they have won two of three series at Target Field in that span.
- \* Last season, Jonathan Aranda hit .435 (10-for-23) with 7 RBI in six games vs. the Twins...Yandy Diaz has registered an RBI in five consecutive games at Target Field, tied for the longest streak by a Ray at this venue, matching Logan Morrison (June 2, 2016-May 26, 2017) and Evan Longoria (May 17, 2015-June 5, 2016).

**TODAY'S START**—Joe Boyle will make his second start of the campaign today, his second career start against the Twins...he was acquired from the Athletics along with **INF Will Simpson**, **RHP Jacob Watters**, and a Competitive Balance Round A selection (**OF Brendan Summerhill**) for **LHP Jeffrey Springs** and **LHP Jacob Lopez**, Dec. 14, 2024.

✦ This season marks his second career Opening Day roster (2024 w/ OAK) and his first with the Rays...he is one of 16 Rays to have made their first Opening Day roster with the organization in 2026.

✦ At 6'8", he is tied for the fifth tallest pitcher in Rays history, behind only **Paul Gervase** (6'10"), **Aaron Slegers** (6'10"), **Aaron Slegers** (6'9"), and **Jeff Niemann** (6'9").

**LAST TIME OUT**—Boyle made his first start of the year on March 28 at STL, going 6.0 innings and allowed two runs on three hits with four strikeouts...the outing marked his fifth career quality start and his first since Sept. 15, 2025 vs. TOR where he tossed 6.0 scoreless frames...he set down the last 16 batters he faced after allowing a **Nolan Gorman** RBI-single in the 1st inning...the Cardinals only other run off of Boyle came two batters prior to Gorman on an **Alec Burleson** RBI-single.

✦ He would be the first Rays pitcher since **Shane Baz** (3G, April 1-14, 2025) to throw consecutive quality starts to open a season...he would be the first Ray to turn the trick with both games away from home since **Tyler Glasnow** did so on April 1, 2021 at MIA (6.0IP, OR) and April 6, 2021 at BOS (6.0IP, 1R).

**COLD LIKE MINNESOTA**—Made his lone career start against the Twins last season on July 6, 2025...Boyle threw 5.0 innings in relief and allowed one run (OER) on two hits and one walk with seven strikeouts...his seven strikeouts in that outing are a career high in a road appearance and a career high in relief.

✦ Across his career, he has made 18 appearances (12 starts) against AL opposition to a 4-6 record, 4.36 ERA (76.1IP, 37ER), 84 strikeouts, and a .205 (57-for-278) opp. average...in 11 of 15 outings of 3.0 innings or more against the AL, he has allowed three runs or fewer.

**NERVOUS FLYER**—In 14 career appearances (10 starts) on the road, he holds a 2-5 record, 6.63 ERA (55.2IP, 41ER), and 60 strikeouts...compared to a 4-5 record, 3.41 ERA (66.0IP, 25ER), and 73 strikeouts in 16 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks.

**SUGAR YOU'RE GOIN' DOWN SWINING**—Since his major league debut on Sept. 17, 2023, he has a 9.84 strikeout per 9.0 rate...he is one of 17 AL pitchers in that span to have a rate of 9.75 or higher...of his 133 career strikeouts, 106 have been swinging with 27 looking.

✦ In starts where Boyle records six strikeouts or more, his teams are 6-3... compared to 3-11 when he has five strikeouts or fewer.

**ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT**—Boyle has held righties to a .184 batting average (40-for-217) in his career, and .000 (0-for-9) this season...he has allowed just 13 extra-base hits, walked 31 batters, and struck out 69 right-handed batters over the course of his career...meanwhile, lefties have hit at a .241 clip (56-for-232) against him with 20 extra-base hits, 42 walks, and 64 strikeouts.

**A YEAR IN REVIEW**—The right-hander split time between Tampa Bay and Triple-A Durham in 2025, making a combined 31 appearances (26 starts)...in the majors, he went 1-4 with a 4.67 ERA (52.0IP, 27ER) and a .221 (43-for-195) opp. average...in Durham, he spun a 8-4 record with a 1.88 ERA (86.0IP, 18ER), 114 strikeouts, and 1.01 WHIP...he allowed three runs or fewer in every minor league outing, with a total of five quality starts and nine scoreless outings.

✦ He was named a Baseball America Triple-A All-Star, International League Postseason All-Star in 2025 in addition to winning International League Pitcher of the Month and Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month in June...additionally, he won the International League Pitcher of the Week on three occasions (April 20, May 18, June 8).

✦ He made five starts with one relief appearance in June to a 3-0 record, 1.80 ERA (30.0IP, 6ER), 49 strikeouts, and a 0.97 WHIP...his 49 strikeouts were the most at the Triple-A level in a single month since May 2019 (**Zac Gallen**, 50) and the fourth most since 2015.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST**—Across his career, Boyle has a .188 (40-for-213) opp. average on his first time thru the order with 12 extra-base hits (7 2B, 5HR), a .624 OPS, and 71 strikeouts...his second time through the order he holds a .197 (35-for-178) opp. average, 14 extra-base hits (9 2B, 1 3B, 4HR), 49 strikeouts, and a .623 OPS.

✦ Last season opposing hitters went 18-for-98 (.184) the first time facing him with 5 2B, 2HR) and a .600 OPS.

**FIRING FLAMES**—In 2025, Boyle threw 28 pitches at 100.0 mph or more, eighth most in the AL among right-handers and 11th among all pitchers...his average fastball velocity a year ago was 98.5 mph, which ranked 23rd among all major league pitchers and seventh in the AL...his 98.5 mph average was a 0.8 mph improvement from 2024 (97.7mph).

**FIRST IMPRESSIONS**—Boyle's first start for the Rays came in a spot start on April 13, 2025 vs. ATL...he earned his first and only win of 2025 after tossing 5.0 hitless innings (2R, OER) with 2 BB, 1 HBP, and 7 SO...the right-hander retired 13 straight batters to open the game before allowing his first baserunner to reach via walk in the 5th inning...put out the next two batters before yielding a hit-by-pitch and a walk to end his outing.

✦ He became one of 22 players since 1901 to toss five hitless innings (or more) in his debut with a team and the second Ray to turn the trick (**Nathan Eovaldi** - 6.0IP on May 30, 2018 at OAK).

**A SLIDING SCALE**—Tossed a total of 58 strikeouts in the majors in 2025, with 32 of those coming on sliders...his 32 strikeouts via slider were the most on the Rays last season and tied for the eighth most by a Ray since 2020.

**FINISH HIM**—In two strike counts last season, he held opposing hitters to a .117 (13-for-111) average with 58 strikeouts in 126 plate appearances...in such situations, he held opponents to a .402 OPS with five extra-base hits (4 2B, HR).

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (1-0, 7.20)

**LAST TIME OUT**—Earned the win on March 29 at STL (W, 5.0IP, 6H, 4R, BB, 2SO, HR), his first win as a Ray and his first win since July 5 @ CHC...marked his first career win at Busch Stadium playing against the Cardinals.
