METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets return from the All-Star break today to begin the second-half of the season...The Mets begin a six-game homestand against the Cincinnati Reds (three games) and Los Angeles Angels (three games).

FIRST-HALF DUBS: New York collected 55 wins prior to the All-Star break... That is the third-most wins in franchise history in the first-half behind 59 wins in 1986 and 58 victories in 2022.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 33-14 record at home...Their .702 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors...Their 33 wins are tied for the most in The Show...New York has posted a 3.10 ERA at home this year, which is the fourth-best in MLB and third in the NL.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: Sean Manaea is set to make his first start and second appearance of the season today...The left-handed pitcher tossed 3.1 innings and allowed one earned on five hits with seven strikeouts...In 32 starts last year, Manaea went 12-6 with a 3.47 ERA...He owns a 7-2 record with a 3.43 ERA (38 ER/99.2 IP) with 27 walks and 107 strikeouts in 18 games (16 starts) lifetime at Citi Field.

GRAND GROUP: Four players in franchise history have played in 1,000 or more games, hit 100 or more homers and walked 500 or more times...Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, David Wright and Brandon Nimmo.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in 11 straight games...He is batting .310 (13-42) with nine runs, two doubles, three homers, 10 RBI, four walks, three steals, a .383 OBP and a .571 SLG in that span...In 39 games since the start of June, Nimmo has hit .293/358/520 with 22 runs, seven doubles, nine homers, 24 RBI, 12 walks, nine steals and an .878 OPS...He has stole 10 bases in 93 games this year...He stole a career-high 15 in 151 contests in 2024.

WALK THIS WAY: Juan Soto has drawn 77 walks, the most in team history prior to the All-Star Game...John Olerud is second with 74 walks in 1999...Soto had 83 free passes in 2023 with San Diego, the most prior to the break for him...The last players other than Soto with more walks in the first half was Mike Trout with 84 and Bryce Harper with 78 free passes in 2018.

ONLY JUAN: Since May 30, Juan Soto is tied for first in the majors with 36 runs scored, first with a .457 OBP, second with a 1.133 OPS, fourth with a .676 slugging percentage and 15 homers during that span.

KEEPIN' IT 200: Francisco Lindor collected his 200th career stolen base on July 12 at Kansas City...He is one of nine active players with 200 or more stolen bases...He joins Roberto Alomar and Carlos Beltrán as the only Puerto Rico-born players with 200 homers and 200 stolen bases.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 258 home runs and stolen 198 bases as a *shortstop*...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

RONNY RAKES: Ronny Mauricio is batting .302/388/512 with eight runs scored, three doubles, two homers, three RBI and six walks over his last 14 games dating to June 24...In 12 home games, Mauricio has a .297/366/514 (11-37) slash line with two homers, two doubles, three RBI and seven runs.

POLAR BEAR POWER: Pete Alonso has six seasons of 20 or more homers, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homers.

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is second in the majors with 26 doubles, tied for eighth in the NL with 21 homers, seventh with a .908 OPS and a .376 OBP and 11th with a .532 SLG.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 19 saves in 20 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for third in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 19 saves...He has not allowed a run in 25 of his last 26 games dating back to April 26 with 38 strikeouts covering 27.0 innings.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is hitting .283 (15-53) with four doubles, one homer, six RBI, a .350 OBP and a .765 OPS in his last 19 games dating to June 23... In 42 home games this season, Baty has an .862 OPS with eight home runs, three doubles, one triple, 22 RBI and 17 runs.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Luis Torrens ranks second in the majors with 41.9 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 13 CS, 435.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 428.0 IP).

JUNIOR METS BASEBALL CAMP: On Friday, the Amazin' Mets Foundation and USA Baseball wrapped up the fifth and final day of their week-long Junior Mets Baseball Camp, presented by New Balance. After a week of baseball drills and championship games at Leavitts Park in Flushing, each participant received a completion plaque and certificate. The annual camp brings together local youth from all backgrounds to learn the fundamentals of the sport, build their skills, and grow their love for the game...Youth athletes ages 8-10 took part in this first week of Junior Mets Baseball Camp. New this year, there will be a second week of camp which will be for athletes ages 11-12 and begins on July 28.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his season debut on July 13 at Kansas City, and he allowed one run over 3.1 innings in relief while suffering the loss...He struck seven of the 15 batters he faced...It was the 31st relief appearance of his Major League Career and his first since September 6, 2023, at Chicago-NL while with the Giants.

VS. CINCINNATI: He has made four career appearances (three starts) against Cincinnati, and he has a 2-0 record with a 3.60 ERA (8 ER/20.0 IP) against the Reds lifetime...He made two starts against them last season and he tossed 5.0+ innings and struck six or more in both starts...The Mets won both games he started in against the Reds last season.

IN THE CITI: In 18 career appearances (16 starts) at Citi Field he has posted a 3.43 ERA (38 ER/99.2 IP) and has a 7-2 record...Last season he went 6-2 with a 3.30 ERA (33 ER/90.0 IP) at home and his last loss at Citi Field came on June 1 against Arizona...Over his last nine home starts last season he went 6-0 and recorded a 2.76 ERA (18 ER/58.2 IP)...The Mets were 11-4 in games he started at Citi Field last season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

RIGHTY DOMINATION: Last Season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250. It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

SINK OR SWIM: Last season, Manaea threw his sinker 44.7% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw had a run value of 15 with his sinker, which was the fifth-best mark in the majors... He also had 71 strikeouts via the sinker, which was the highest mark in the majors.

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 77-63 record, a 4.00 ERA (528 ER/1187.2 IP), and 1116 strikeouts in 229 games and 198 starts...His 1116 career strikeouts are the 15th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Allowed two earned runs and four hits in one inning of relief on July 11 at Kansas City (1.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER).
- Has made six relief appearances against Cincinnati and he hasn't allowed a run over 7.1 innings and has struck out 12 of his 31 Red batters faced...He has held Cincinnati to a .154 (4-26) batting average over his six games against them.
- Earned his second save of the season and his career on July 8 at Baltimore (1.0 IP, K)...Three of his last five appearances have been scoreless.
- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- On June 28 at Pittsburgh, allowed a season-high-tying four earned runs over 0.1 IP (2 H, 2 BB, K)...Gave up an RBI single to Ke'Bryan Hayes in eighth inning and left the game with the bases loaded, all runners eventually scored...Allowed four or more runs for the fourth

time in his career and second time this year (also: June 19 at ATL)...Was also tied for his shortest outing of the season (also 5/3-G1 at St. Louis and June 24 vs. ATL).

- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...Has allowed a total of 10 earned runs in his last eight appearances (7.2 IP)...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- This season, has gone 5-2 with two saves, 10 holds and a 3.99 ERA (21 ER/47.1 IP) through 39 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .211 average (34-161)...Right-handed hitters have batted .181 (17-94) against him compared to a .254 average against left-handers (17-67)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .141 average (11-78)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth-best in franchise history through as many games.
- Has stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (12.5%) is the seventh-best mark in the majors and the second-best in the NL among qualified relievers.
- 12 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...11 of those appearances have been scoreless, which is tied for the seventh-most in the among Major League relievers...Has posted 10 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the third-most such outings among Major League relievers...His seven scoreless outings of 2.0+ innings are tied for the sixth-most and he is one of nine relievers to post such numbers.

- Allowed one earned run over 2.0 innings at Kanas City...Was the first multi-inning outing of his Major League career.
