METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets scored three runs in the top of the ninth to defeat the Phillies, 10-9, yesterday...New York will play 19 of its next 25 games in New York City, including two against the Yankees...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (18-7)...The Mets are 62-12 when scoring first this season...New York is 28-7-3 in 38 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, nine-day road trip (4-4) to Atlanta (1-3), Philadelphia (3-1) and New York-AL (two games)...Following this series, the Mets are off on Wednesday...They return home on Thursday for an 11-day, 10-game homestand against the Rockies (four games), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded 136 home runs thus far in his career...He ranks sixth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons... This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games.

MAX EFFORT: In his last start, Max Scherzer struck out eight on the way to career win number 199...Justin Verlander (241) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 199-99 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

HECK OR HIGH-WATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 35 games over .500...Prior to this year, the last time the team was 35 games above .500 was when they were a season-high 35 games over on September 13, 2006...A win tonight would mark the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60)...New York has won 79 games this season, second-most in the NL and in the majors...Their .642 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 79-44 record through the team's first 123 games...Only the 1986 (82-41) team posted a better record through the first 122 games of the season.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are batting .274 with runners in scoring position this season...Their .274 average is third in the majors, while their 292 hits and 425 RBI with RISP are second...Jeff McNeil ranks fifth in the National League with a .345 (39-113) average with RISP this season...Pete Alonso has slashed .312/.427/.664 SLG with RISP this year, hitting 12 home runs and 74 RBI in those situations...His 12 home runs with RISP are the most in the majors, while his 74 RBI ranks second in the majors and tops the National League...The single-season franchise record for home runs with RISP is 15 by Todd Hundley in 1996...Three players have recorded 13 home runs with RISP - Carlos Beltran (2006), George Foster (1983) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...The single-season franchise record for RBI with RISP set by David Wright with 91 in 2006.

NATE THE GREAT: Yesterday, Nate Fisher became the fifth player this year to make his major league debut with the Mets...He hurled 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed a hit, walked two and struck out one...He is in his first year in the Mets system and in 24 games (12 starts) between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse went 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA (27 earned runs/72.0 innings) with 31 walks and 71 strikeouts.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Yesterday, Mark Canha went 3-5 with two runs, two home runs and recorded a career-high five RBI in the victory over the Phillies...It was the third time in his career he hit multiple home runs in a game and first as a Met...Over the last eight games, Mark Canha is batting .440 (11-25) with five runs, four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, two walks with a .481 OBP, a .960 SLG and a 1.441 OPS...He is batting .305 (64-210) with 11 doubles and six home runs with an .850 OPS against right-handed pitching this year.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets are 2-0 against the Yankees this year...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees last season, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020...Last year, the Mets earned their first season Subway Series victory since 2013, when they went 4-0 against the Yankees...The Mets and Yankees had gone .500 against one another from 2018-20.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS, PLEASE: The Mets recorded a two-game sweep of the Yankees at Citi Field from July 26-27...It marked their first two-game Subway Series sweep since May 12-13, 2014 at Yankee Stadium and the first one at Citi Field since May 27-28, 2013.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play today against the Yankees...The Mets are 7-8 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .510 winning percentage (233-224) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

SUBWAY CARDS: The Mets are 29-40 in The Bronx and 16-20 since 2009...The Amazon's are 60-76 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 108-144-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: They have won seven of their last nine matchups against the Yankees.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 149 players who have played for both clubs, including three current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, LHP Joely Rodríguez and RHP Miguel Castro...Rodríguez and Castro were traded for each other on April 3 earlier this year in what marked the 18th trade between the two clubs.

JUICY J: Jeff McNeil is batting .313 (35-112) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors...McNeil leads the majors with a .358 (72-201) road batting average...He is batting .358/.406/.512 with 25 runs, 20 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks in 53 games on the road this year.

PICK SIX: McNeil is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .444 (12-27) with four runs, four doubles, three RBI, a walk, a .646 OBP and a .593 SLG...He leads the majors in batting average with a .425 (34-80) mark in the month of August...In 21 games this month, he is batting .425/.453/.650 with 13 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and three walks.

TRUE AMERICAN: McNeil owns a .342 (78-228) batting average with 33 runs, 12 doubles, seven home runs, 33 RBI, 15 walks with a .386 OBP and a .487 SLG in Interleague play...It is the highest career batting average (min. 200 PA) in Interleague play among active hitters...He is right above Starling Marte, who has hit .331 (217-656) in Interleague play...Marte has recorded 113 runs, 44 doubles, 11 triples, 27 home runs, 82 RBI with a .390 OBP and a .555 SLG in Interleague play.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 68-6 this season when scoring four or more runs...That is a .919 winning percentage, which is tied for the second-best among teams in the Live Ball era (1920 to present)...Only the 1943 Cardinals, with a .929 winning percentage (78-6), have posted a higher mark since 1920...The 1968 Orioles had the same 67-6 mark as the 2022 Mets...Courtesy of Sportradar.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 21-9 in the second-half...The team's 21 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .700 winning percentage ranks third...The team is batting .278/.347/.451 following the All-Star break...They are second in the majors in average and OBP and are third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 153-110 following the break.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 39-25 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .609 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB...New York is batting .260/.327/.418 away from Citi Field...Their .260 road average is the best in the NL and second in the majors and their .327 OBP on the road ranks fourth in the majors and third in the NL.

FWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting 12-33 (.364) in that span with six runs, a triple, a home run, two RBI and two steals...Since the All-Star break, Lindor has hit .353/.415/.543 with 26 runs, five doubles, a triple, five home runs, 18 RBI, 12 walks, three steals with a .958 OPS...He ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 5.5 fWAR.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso collected his 24th game-winning RBI on Friday night, tying a Mets single-season record also held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBIs...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 10 of the Mets' 21 second-half wins.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 132 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's the fifth longest-streak in franchise history.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 97 strikeouts...That is 19 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 49.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 51.3% of batters faced (97/189), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 49 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.70 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 28 saves, a 1.46 ERA (8 ER/49.1 IP), allowing 29 hits and 15 walks...The Mets are 43-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is batting .308/.402/.498 with 50 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 33 RBI and 31 walks in 63 road games this season...This compares to a .209/.286/.311 slashline with 24 runs in 51 games at Citi Field in 2022...Nimmo's .404 road OBP is fourth in the National League and seventh in the majors.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win after throwing 6.1 innings against the Atlanta Braves at Truist Park on August 17...Scherzer left the bases loaded before exiting the game with one out in the seventh...All three runs crossed the plate, leaving four runs on his line...He struck out eight and tied a season high with three walks.

MILESTONE ALERT: Scherzer has 199 career wins, one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (241) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 199-99 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

MORE 200: Scherzer's 200th win, if it happens today, would come in his 425th career game...He would be the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 425 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Since returning from the IL on July 5, Scherzer has gone 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (12 ER/59.1 IP) in nine starts...That is the second-lowest ERA in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...He leads the major leagues with 75 strikeouts since that date...Scherzer's 59.1 innings since his return are tied for second in the majors...He leads the NL and is second in the majors with a 8.33 K/BB ratio since July 5...Scherzer made five starts in July, going 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) while striking out 45 and walking just four, making him one of just eight pitchers ever with a sub-1.50 ERA, at least 45 strikeouts and fewer than five walks in a calendar month...His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third...His 11.25 K/BB ratio was the best in MLB last month.

VS. YANKEES: Scherzer has produced 31 strikeouts in just 19.2 innings over his last three outings against the Yankees, making one start in each of the last three seasons...He last started against the club on his 38th birthday, July 27 at Citi Field, throwing 7.0 shutout innings in a 3-2 Mets win.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks fourth all-time with 109 double-digit strikeout games in his career, one more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens (110) is next on the list...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

DIG DEEP: Opponents are 4-30 (.133) with RISP in his last six starts and 7-40 (.175) in eight games since Scherzer came off the IL...Over the last two seasons, opponents are slashing .173/.243/.253 against Scherzer with runners in scoring position...That .496 OPS against ranks third in the majors behind Shohei Ohtani (.426) and Ranger Suárez (.463).

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings seven times in 17 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed and has allowed three hits or fewer four times...Despite missing seven weeks on the Injured List, those seven outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the sixth-most in the majors.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He was passed by Justin Verlander while on the IL, but has moved back in front of the veteran righthander and into a 13th-place tie with Pedro Martinez...Scherzer is still within striking distance of Fergie Jenkins this season...He is needs 39 strikeouts to pass Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

HAPPY SCHERZDAY: Scherzer started his 38th birthday, July 27...He was the 30th pitcher to start on his birthday at 38 or older...He threw 7.0 shutout innings against the Yankees, making him the second pitcher ever to toss 7.0 or more scoreless frames on his birthday at 38 or older, joining Sad Sam Jones, who threw a shutout on his 42nd birthday in 1934...Scherzer lowered his ERA on his birthday to 0.82 ERA (3 ER/33.0 IP)...He has never allowed more than two runs in a start on his birthday.

- Also reached the 100-RBI mark on August 19...He is the seventh player in Mets history with multiple 30-100 seasons...He is the fourth-fastest Met to reach 100 RBI in a season, getting to the century-mark in 119 games.
- Has six home runs and 16 RBI in 18 career games against the Yankees...Tied for fourth among Mets all-time in homers vs. the Yankees.
- Has 11 go-ahead RBI and 10 game-winning RBI in 29 games since the break...Leads the majors with 24 game-winning RBI and 32 go-ahead RBI this season... He has tied the Mets record for game-winning RBI (also, Keith Hernandez, 1985).
- Hitting .288 (32-111) with eight doubles, six homers, 24 RBI, 19 runs and a .905 OPS since the All-Star break.
- Ranks sixth in MLB and fourth in the NL with 30 homers...Tied for the MLB lead with 102 RBI...Ranks 17th in the NL with 69 runs.
