METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Royals, 7-3, in the final game of their three-game set yesterday...It marked their first series win since they took two of three from Atlanta at Citi Field from June 12-14...New York had lost or split their prior six series...They are 6-7 in rubber games and 19-21 in days games...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand before the All-Star break, a six-game homestand (2-1) against the Kansas City Royals (2-1) and Boston Red Sox (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - RHP Tobias Myers has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse... RHP Dan Hammer has been designated for assignment...INF Mark Vientos has been placed on the 10-Day Injured List with a right hand fracture...INF Zack Short has been selected to the Major League roster.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets are 29-5 when scoring five or more runs in 2026... Their .853 winning percentage when scoring five or more runs is eighth in the Majors and sixth in the National League....Last year, the Mets went 59-13 when scoring five or more runs, tied for the 11th best in the Majors.

MANY HOMERS CLUB: The Mets have homered in a season-high 11 straight games...Since June 28, the Mets have hit 18 home runs, batting .263/.346/.445...It's their longest streak since a 16-game homer streak from June 15-July 3, 2024.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Mets have scored six or more runs in five straight games, their longest such streak since July 9-13, 2024...Yesterday, they sent 10 batters to the plate and scored five runs in the fourth...Have scored five runs in an inning for the second game in a row and for the third time in their last five games (also: 7/5 at Atlanta)...Mets batters have combined to hit .467 (21-45) with runners in scoring position over their last five games.

9 IS FINE: Yesterday, Brett Baty extended his hitting streak to a career-high nine games with a single in the fifth...Is batting .294 (10-34) during that stretch.

HOW NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Major League Baseball announced that outfielder Juan Soto was named to the National League All-Star team...The 96th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 14 in Philadelphia...Soto was selected by the fans and will make his second career All-Star starting nod...He also started the 2024 All-Star Game for the AL...Soto was named to his fifth overall All-Star team and first as a member of the Mets.

20/20 VISION: Soto has reached 20 home runs prior to the All-Star Break for the fourth time in his career (also: 2022, 2024, 2025)...He joins Pete Alonso (4 times), Darryl Strawberry (3 times), Howard Johnson and Dave Kingman as the only Mets to hit 20 or more home runs before the All-Star Break on multiple occasions...Joins Matt Olson and Kyle Schwarber as the only players in the majors to have eight seasons of 20+ home runs since 2018.

JUAN OF A KIND: Soto has four home runs in eight games in July, tied for the most in the majors during the month...His blast yesterday marked the 265th home run of his career, tied with George Bell for the 20th-most in Major League history by a player born in Dominican Republic (next: Hanley Ramirez and Raúl Mondesí, 271)...His 265 career home runs are the 11th-most in MLB history prior to turning 28...Giancarlo Stanton's next with 267.

RED SOTO CUPS: Soto has reached base three or more times in seven of his last 14 games...In his last 27 games since June 9, has a .341/.500/.682 slashline with eight home runs, 20 RBI, 16 runs, 28 walks and a 1.182 OPS... During that span, leads the majors in OBP and ranks third in SLG and OPS (min. 75 plate appearances).

SOX-METS NOTES: The Mets host the Red Sox 40 years after they faced each other in the 1986 World Series...The Mets defeated the Sox in seven games to earn their second World Championship.

BO KNOWS: Over his last 33 games since June 3, Bo Bichette has a .333/.352/.519 slashline with 20 runs, eight doubles, one triple, five homers, 23 RBI with an .870 OPS.

THE BENGE: Carson Benge hit an RBI single in the fifth...Also singled in the seventh...Has recorded multiple hits in four straight games...He has hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games and in 19 of his last 21 games...Over the longer span, is batting .322/.385/.517 (28-87) with four home runs, three doubles, one triple, 15 runs and a .902 OPS...His 28 hits since June 17 are tied for the most in the majors during that span.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver allowed an unearned run in the 10th inning of last night's contest...Weaver ranks seventh amongst relievers in the National League in ERA (1.89) and is 20th with 42 strikeouts.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won back-to-back games and three of their last five at Citi Field...They are now 21-25 at home this year...The team has posted a 4.46 ERA, while batting .239/.314/.393 at Citi Field.

50/50 RAFFLE: This series-long raffle will benefit Venezuela earthquake relief efforts and World Central Kitchen - a non-profit organization that is first to the frontlines, providing meals in response to humanitarian, climate and community crises.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Braves, 5-1, at Shea Stadium...Bob Ojeda earned his 10th win as he tossed a complete game...He allowed an unearned run on seven hits with two walks and six strikeouts in the victory... Gary Carter hit his 14th home runs, while George Foster recorded three RBI in the win...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

LAST TIME OUT: Picked up his sixth win of the season on July 5 at Atlanta (6.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 2 ER, BB, 5 K, HBP) after tossing 6.0 innings and striking out five...He has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last four starts dating back to June 17 at Cincinnati...It is the longest streak of such starts in his career...Over his last seven starts, dating back to May 31, he has gone 4-1 while pitching to a 2.70 ERA (12 ER/40.0 IP) and he has allowed two or fewer earned runs in six of those seven starts.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 6-5 with a 3.73 ERA (42 ER/101.1 IP) with 118 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .205 batting average (76-370)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks third in opposing batting average, tied for sixth in strikeouts and 11th in WHIP (1.12)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, third in innings pitched and in batting average against, seventh in WHIP, and 12th in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 12.6% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,318 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.0% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .111 (7-63) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the 10th-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 26 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .100 (9-90) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.0% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 33.9% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 17-run value, which is the fourth-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .173 (27-156) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 26 career starts, McLean is 11-6 with a 3.19 ERA (53 ER/149.1 IP) and 175 strikeouts...His 175 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 26 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 214, Matt Harvey's 191, Noah Syndergaard's 187 and Kodai Senga's 181...Per *Elias*...He is one of nine pitchers in Major League history to strike out 175+ batters and allow 53 or fewer earned runs through their first 26 appearances.

AL WHO?: Is set to make his first career start against Boston and his eighth career Interleague start...In his first seven career starts against the American League, he is 4-0 with a 2.41 ERA (11 ER/41.0 IP) and 52 strikeouts...He has a K/9 of 11.41 against AL opponents.

IN THE CITI: Over 13 starts at Citi Field he has posted a 3.47 ERA (28 ER/72.2 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in 12 of his 13 home starts...He became only the second player in Major League history to strike out at least six each of their first 10 career home starts (also: Kerry Wood, 6 K's in each of his first 11 career home starts in 1998 with CHC)...His first three career home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...Per *Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan,

Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
