**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 10-game road trip today with the 3rd of 4 games against the Oakland Athletics (0-2)...Seattle is coming off a 3-game series at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) to begin the trip and will travel to Busch Stadium to take on the St. Louis Cardinals (3 G, 9/6-9/8) to finish the trip... tonight's game against in Oakland will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners fell last night to the A's by a 3-2 score, their 4th-consecutive loss, each by just 1 run with 3 of the losses coming via a walk-off.

- **Last Hurrah at the Coliseum** - Seattle is set to play its final series at the Oakland Coliseum...the Mariners have played 362 games at the Coliseum, going 157-205.
- **Robbing Third Base Blind** - The Mariners are 17-for-17 when attempting a steal of 3rd base, the only team in the Majors with at least 10 attempted steals of 3rd base without being caught...**Victor Robles** is 7-for-7 when stealing 3rd base since joining the club.
- **Shiners** - The Mariners lead the Majors with 94 hit-by-pitch this season, ranking ahead of second-place Minnesota (88 HBP)...Seattle also led the Majors in HBP in 2023 after being plunked a franchise-record 111 times...the Mariners are looking to become the first team to lead the Majors in hit-by-pitch in back-to-back seasons since Cleveland (2008-09).
- **Unfamiliar Feeling** - Seattle is below the .500 mark for the first time since April 21 (10-11).
- **August MiLB Award Winners** - The Mariners minor league awards for August were announced yesterday...OF **Lazaro Montes** and INF **Michael Arroyo** were named Co-Players of the Month, RHP **Michael Morales** and RHP **Juan Mercedes** were named Co-Pitchers of the Month and RHP **Luis Curvelo** was named Reliever of the Month

**THE BIG DUMPER**...**Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers with 28 home runs, ranking ahead of Salvador Perez-KC (25 HR) and Shea Langeliers-OAK (25)...after pacing MLB catchers in homers in both 2022 (27 HR) and 2023 (30 HR), and setting the franchise record for most homers by a catcher in the process, Cal is trying to become the first catcher to lead his position group in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Hall of Famer Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons from 1999-2002...additionally, with 2 more homers this season Cal would become just the 12th catcher in MLB history with multiple 30+ homer campaigns, with at least 50% of those games played at catcher.

**THE GOLD STANDARD**...**Cal Raleigh** leads American League catchers with 14 defensive runs saved (per *Sports Info Solutions*), 11 catcher framing runs (per *Baseball Savant*), a 3.29 catcher ERA, 116 games played at catcher and 953.0 innings caught...Cal is also tied for the Major League lead with 22 catcher caught stealing (also: Will Smith-LAD)...if Raleigh finishes with the Major League lead, he would become the first player to lead the Majors in CCS in back-to-back seasons since Hall of Famer Gary Carter for the Montreal Expos from 1982-83.

**TAYLOR OF TROY**...right-hander **Troy Taylor** tossed a scoreless inning last night, lowering his ERA to 0.96 on the year...the rookie has not allowed a run in 8 consecutive outings (8/17-c), spanning 8.0 innings... in 10 appearances to begin his Major League career, Taylor has a 0.96 ERA (1 ER, 9.1 IP) with 3 walks, 12 strikeouts and 0.75 WHIP, limiting opponents to a .121 batting average (4x33).

**THE HUMAN ENERGIZER BUNNY**...**Victor Robles** is batting .375 (15x40) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 8 RBI, 2 walks and 5 stolen bases over his last 12 games (8/17-c), getting on base at a .395 clip and slugging .525 (.920 OPS) during that span...since making his Mariners debut on June 5, he is batting .295 (49x166) with 21 runs, 11 doubles, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 18 stolen bases, and a .782 OPS...Victor's 1.7 fWAR is the 2nd-most among Mariners position players since June 5, trailing only **Cal Raleigh** (2.4).

**THE PITCHING STAFF**...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.53)...Seattle is trying to lead the American League in ERA in back-to-back seasons (3.74 ERA in 2023) and the Majors in ERA for the first time since 2001 (3.54 ERA)...this season, the Mariners pitching staff also leads MLB in opponent batting average (.222), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.44), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.77), opponent OPS (.656) and quality starts (82)...Seattle's pitching staff has 13 shutout wins, tied with Boston for most in the American League.

**SODO RUN CLUB**...the Mariners are 116-for-142 (81.7%) in stolen base attempts this season, 2nd best stolen base percentage in the American League, trailing Toronto (82.3%)...Seattle is on pace to set the franchise record in stolen base percentage, surpassing the 80.6% mark achieved by the 2001 team... **Dylan Moore**, who swiped his 100th career bag on Saturday, has 28 stolen bases this year (T-6th in AL)...**Victor Robles** is 18-for-18 in stolen bases with the Mariners, passing Henry Cotto (1988) for most successful attempts without being caught to begin a Mariners career.

**WELCOME TO THE J-ROD SHOW**...center fielder **Julio Rodriguez** went 1-for-4 with 1 double in lat night's game...over his last 33 games (7/4-c), Rodriguez is batting .304 (35x115) with 17 runs, 7 doubles, 6 home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks, getting on base at a .386 clip, slugging .522 with a .908 OPS...J-Rod recorded his 20th steal of the season on Monday, joining Ichiro Suzuki (2001-03) as the only players in franchise history with 20+ stolen bases in each of his first 3 Major League seasons.

**WHEN THEY GET 5 ON IT**...in 48 games this season when scoring 5+ runs, the Mariners are 44-4 (.917) which is the best such record in the Major Leagues...Seattle is 25-65 (.278) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs... in 69 games when scoring 4+ runs, the Mariners are 56-13 (.812), 4th-best record in the Majors.

**LUKE LALOOSH**...**Luke Raley** is batting .258 (16x62) with 12 runs, 2 doubles, 6 home runs, 15 RBI and 11 walks over his last 23 games (8/2-c), getting on base at a .385 clip and slugging .581 (.965 OPS) during that span...since Aug. 2, Raley's 1.010 OPS ranks 8th in the American League (min. 50 PA).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Cal Raleigh** recorded his 83rd and 84th RBI of the season in last night's game, surpassing current Mariners Manager **Dan Wilson** (83 RBI in 1996) for the most in a season by a Mariners catcher, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that in addition to the RBI record, Raleigh holds the single-season record for Mariners catchers in home runs (30 in 2023), extra-base hits (54 in 2023), runs (78 in 2023), walks (57 in 2024) and total bases (234 in 2023)?

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 29th start of the season and his 2nd against Oakland...he is also making his 85th career start and 8th against the Athletics.
• Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started.
• Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.

LAST TIME OUT...W#10 on 8/30 at LAA...he pitched 5.2 innings and allowed 5 runs on 5 hits with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts and 3 home runs.

ROAD WARRIOR...in his last 10 starts away from T-Mobile Park, he is 5-2 with a 3.38 ERA (22 ER, 58.2 IP) and 53 strikeouts...he has allowed 2-or-less runs in 8 of those 10 contests...in each of those 8 starts with less than 2 runs allowed, he has spun at least 5.0 innings.

NO FREE RIDES...is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed (84 starts, 62 walks).

TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 2nd in SO/BB (7.29) and 2nd in BB/9 (1.17) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with 1.16 BB/9 (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a 1.64 BB/9 mark.

WALK THE WALK...among pitchers with at least 125.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby has the 2nd-fewest walks in the Majors with 21 (Zach Eflin-BAL/TB, 16)...his BB% is 3.2%, trailing Eflin (2.7%) for the best in MLB and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.

UNDER CONTROL...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 84 career starts, the 3rd-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher...he is 13 starts behind Chris Bosio for 2nd-best...has a 58-start streak with 2-or-less walks, the longest active streak in the Majors by a starting pitcher.

NO JUNE GLOOM...in his 5 starts in June, he held a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...the 1.74 ERA in June is his lowest in a month during his career...his ERA was the 2nd lowest on the Mariners (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.

A LOT OF 0s...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on 4/15 vs. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4th inning against the Astros on 5/3.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on 5/8/22, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 7.39), WHIP (5th, 1.11), ERA (3rd, 3.46), innings pitched (4th, 481.1), wins (5th, 31) and strikeouts (9th, 458).

END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting .214 (42x196) with 7 doubles, 2 triples and 7 home runs and 45 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .221 (15x68) with 14 strikeouts.

QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 16th quality start of the season in his start at Pittsburgh on 8/18...in 2023, had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.

GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on 4/27 with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked a career-high...19 of his whiffs were fastballs.

MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a 33-19 record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 12-19.

MARINERS HISTORY...Kirby has made 84 starts in his career and tallied 458 strikeouts...even prior to today's start, he ranks 5th in Mariners franchise history for most strikeouts through a pitchers first 84 starts with the franchise.

STRIKE 24...began his outing on 8/24/22 vs. Washington by throwing 24 consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-c), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on 8/30/18 vs. STL with PIT.
