HERE COMES YOUR 27TH MAN: RHP Nick Tropeano will serve as the 27th man for the team's doubleheader today...Tropeano has appeared in one game with the Mets, allowing a run on four hits with a walk in 2.0 innings of work on July 9 vs. Pittsburgh...He is 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (two earned runs/11.0 innings) with seven walks and 10 strikeouts in five games (one start) at Triple-A Syracuse this season.

METS BRING BACK BANNER DAY: The New York Mets today announced the return of Banner Day, a long-time Mets fan-favorite tradition...With access to the field limited due to safety protocols, this year's Virtual Banner Day will be a month-long digital fan celebration starting today at noon with the Mets announcing the winner August 26... Fans can submit their banners in the form of a photo or video at Mets.com/BannerDay... Submissions open today and will close on August 9.

DON'T THINK TWICE, IT'S ALRIGHT: The Mets will play their 11th doubleheader of the season today...The team is slated to play 13 twinbills this season, their most since 1979, when the team played 19 doubleheaders.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets will play two against the Braves for the second time this season (also, June 21 in New York)...New York swept doubleheaders from Philadelphia on April 13 at Citi Field as well as from the Rockies in New York on May 27...They split doubleheaders in Colorado on April 17, in St. Louis on May 5, in Washington on June 19, vs. Atlanta on June 21, vs. Philadelphia on June 25, at New York-AL on July 4, vs. Milwaukee on July 7 and vs. Pittsburgh on July 10...New York will also play two on August 31 vs. Miami and September 4 at Washington...The Mets are 8-2 in the first game of a doubleheader and 4-6 in the second game.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Blue Jays, 5-4, yesterday...The team has won five of its last seven games...The Mets claimed their 16th series victory of the season and their 10th at home...The Mets continue a 10-day, 11-game homestand (2-1) against the Blue Jays (2-1), Braves (five games) and Reds (three games).

HOMER BOUND: The Mets have homered in 11 of their last 13 games, hitting 27 home runs in that span...The team's 27 home runs since July 9 are the second-most in the majors...Only the Dodgers (30) have hit more...By comparison, the Mets hit 12 home runs in their previous 13 games.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is batting .368 (14-38) with eight runs, a double, five home runs, 10 RBI, five walks, a .436 OBP and a .789 SLG in nine games after the All-Star break...He ranks eighth in the majors in SLG in that span and sixth with a 1.231 OPS...He is batting .281/.345/.562 with 24 runs, five doubles, 15 home runs, 36 RBI, 15 walks and a .907 OPS in 50 games since the start of June.

PONY EXPRESS: Alonso has 91 home runs through 304 career games...Despite Alonso's second year in the majors being last year's 60-game season, he currently ranks tied for 15th all-time in home runs through his third career season...He is now tied for the 12th-most home runs through three big league seasons with Jose Abreu, Bob Horner and Ted Williams...Only seven players have hit 100+ homers through their first three major league seasons...Only 14 players in franchise history have hit 100 or more home runs with the Mets...He leads the major leagues in home runs since he entered the league in 2019.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 124 home runs and is now tied with Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list...Lucas Duda is seventh with 125...Pete Alonso is now 20th on the Mets all-time home run list with 91 blasts...Cleon Jones is next with 93 home runs.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco made his third rehab assignment and second with the Syracuse Mets yesterday...He tossed 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits with six strikeouts, throwing 38 pitches, 32 for strikes...Carrasco is on the 60-Day IL with a right hamstring injury.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8, a streak of 79 days...This is their longest run atop the East in the last 14 seasons...The 2007 Mets (135 days in a row) were the last iteration of the club to be in first longer than 79 days in a row, per Elias...The team has been in first place for 95 days overall this season, the most of any team in 2021.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their 400th win in franchise history against the Braves...The Mets have only won 400 or more games against two other teams, the Phillies (498) and Nationals/Expos (439).

REPLACE-METS: Entering today, the Mets have used 55 players through 96 games this season...The franchise record for most players used in a season is 56 by the 2018 Mets...The Mets have had 16 different pitchers start a game this season...That is the most in the majors...The Mets used 10 starters in 2020...The Mets have used 16 or more starters in a season only four times previously in franchise history...The team used 16 starters in 1964-66 and used a franchise-record 20 in 1967...The Mets enter the day leading the majors for the most starters used this season at 16.

THE STRO SHOW: Marcus Stroman is set to make his 21st start of the season and his 10th at home...He allowed only one hit, a walk and struck out seven over 8.0 innings in his last start on July 21 at Cincinnati...He is 7-8 with a 2.59 ERA (32 earned runs/111.1 innings) with 26 walks and 93 strikeouts and a 1.08 WHIP...He is 3-4 with a 2.62 ERA (13 earned runs/44.2 innings) at home this season...He has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 17 of his 20 starts this season.

JULY! JULY! JULY! As a team, New York is batting .269/.351/.460 with an .811 OPS in 20 games this month...This is their highest batting average, OBP and SLG in any month this season...The team leads the majors OBP, is second in OPS, fourth in the majors in average and fifth in SLG...The Mets hit .222/.297/.379 in 30 games in June...The team has hit 33 home runs this month, the third-most in the majors and tied for their highest total of any month this year...The team also hit a season-high 33 blasts in June...New York is 11-9 this month.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: Jeff McNeil is on a career-high 12-game hitting streak, batting .349 (15-43) with seven runs, two doubles, a home run, nine RBI, five walks and an .894 OPS in that span...It surpasses his previous best 11-game hitting streak, which he accomplished from August 16-26, 2018...He has safely reached base in each of his last 13 games, putting up a .429 OBP in that span...He is batting .328 (19-58) with 10 runs, two doubles, a home run, nine RBI and seven walks with a .823 OPS in 18 games this month.

IN A PINCH: The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .258/.342/.481 with 11 doubles, six home runs, 32 RBI and 13 walks...Their .258 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors and is the best in the NL...Their .824 pinch-hit OPS is also the best in the NL...The team's six pinch-hit home runs is tied for the third most in the majors.

ACT II: The Mets are batting .282/.364/.508 with 51 runs, 15 doubles and 19 home runs since the break...The team's 10 home runs after the All-Star break are tied for the most in the major leagues and most in the NL, while their .872 OPS tops all of MLB...The team's .364 OBP is second in the majors in that span and their .280 batting average is third in MLB in that span...The Mets hit .231/.310/.373 in the first half.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 home games in 10 days...The team owns a 30-15 record with a 2.59 ERA (111 earned runs/386.0 innings) with 136 walks and 418 strikeouts at home...The Mets have lost back-to-back games at home only twice this year (April 27-28 and June 21-22)...The team's 2.59 ERA at home is the best in the majors and their .667 winning percentage is the third-best...This compares to 22-29 with a 4.39 ERA (207 earned runs/424.1 innings) with 146 walks and 453 strikeouts on the road this year.

GIMME, GIMME, GIMME GUILLORME: Luis Guillorme is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .450 (9-20) with two runs, a double, a home run, three RBI and a walk in that span...Over his last 23 games, Guillorme is batting .355 (22-62) with seven runs, three doubles, a home run, four RBI, seven walks with a .420 OBP and a .452 SLG.

FOUR SCORE AND 42 WINS AGO: The Mets are 42-8 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 10-35 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 40-13 when scoring first this season...The team's .755 winning percentage is the third-best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

36 DAYS OF NO. 36: There are 33 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28...In honor of the event, the team is on a 36-day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career...On this day in 1968, Koosman tossed a complete game shutout, allowing only four hits and two walks, while striking out eight as the Mets defeated the Reds, 2-0, at Shea...Ron Swoboda produced both runs without recording a hit, while Larry Stahl, Ed Charles and Ed Kranepool each collected two hits in the win...Kooz improved to 14-5 with a 1.76 ERA on the season...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Stroman today will make his 20th start of the season and ninth at home...In his last start, Stroman had his best outing of the season to date... He tossed 8.0 shutout innings, allowing just one hit with a walk and seven strikeouts on July 21 at Cincinnati...It was the second time this year he's gone 8.0 innings in a start (also, April 18 at Colorado)...He had not thrown at least 8.0 scoreless innings in a game since September 8, 2014, when he blanked the Cubs in Toronto.

VS. ATLANTA: Stroman has never lost a start to the Braves, going 4-0 in five starts with a 1.80 ERA (five earned runs/25.0 innings)...He last faced the club on June 22 here at Citi Field and departed after 1.0 scoreless inning with left hip soreness...He has not allowed more than two earned runs in any of his five outings vs. Atlanta and has pitched at least 5.0 innings in all four of his non-injury-shortened starts against the Braves.

A GOOD RUN: Stroman's 2.59 ERA (32 earned runs/111.1 innings) through 20 starts is his best 20-start single-season stretch by that measure in his career... He has allowed two earned runs or fewer and pitched 5.0 innings or more in 13 of his 20 starts this year.

FEELING SIX-Y: Stroman completed at least 6.0 innings in eight straight starts (May 11-June 17) before leaving in the second inning due to injury on June 22... In his last start, he threw at least 6.0 innings for the first time since then...Those eight consecutive 6.0+ inning starts were good for the longest streak of his career...Stroman had a 2.50 ERA (14 earned runs/50.1 innings) over that stretch... The Mets are 9-3 when Stroman goes at least 6.0 innings this year and 1-7 when he does not complete 6.0 IP.

EXTRA, EXTRA: Stroman has allowed only 18 extra-base hits in 111.1 innings, the second-fewest among the 98 pitchers in the majors who have thrown at least 80.0 innings this season...Only Corbin Burnes (17) allowed fewer...Ranks 11th in the majors and ninth in the NL in opponent slugging (.323).

KEEP IT ON THE GROUND: Stroman currently ranks sixth in the majors and fifth the NL with a 50.9 percent ground ball rate...He is 10th in the NL with a 0.81 HR/9 ratio.

SUCCESS VS. LEFT: Lefties are slashing just .218/.266/.294 against Stroman, a .561 OPS against that ranks ninth in the majors among pitchers who've faced at least 150 LHB.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Stroman did not allow a run in his 14.1 innings until giving up a run in the seventh inning at Colorado on April 18...This scoreless streak extended from the last 2.0 innings of his first start on April 6, his 0.1 innings on April 11, his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 13 and his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 18...He fell 1.2 innings shy of tying his career-best streak (16.0 IP).

WITH THE METS: Stroman has gone 11-10 with a 3.00 ERA (57 earned runs/171.0 innings) in his 31 starts with New York...The Mets have gone 18-13 in his 31 starts after he joined the team on July 28, 2019...In 2019, he struck out 60 in 59.2 innings with the Mets (Stroman never averaged more than 9.0 K/9 in a season with Toronto).
