MOST RBI THRU FIRST 5 GAMES: Eugenio Suárez's 11 RBI thru the team's first 5 games of a season are a franchise high, ahead of Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (10 RBI thru first 5 G in 2024).

· Suárez's 11 RBI thru the team's first 5 games also ties the most by a third baseman all-time with José Ramírez/CLE (2022) and Alex Rodriguez/NYY (2007).

PERDOMO HITS SAFELY IN 5 STRAIGHT: Geraldo Perdomo became the second D-backs' shortstop all-time to hit safely in each of the club's first 5 games of a season (also: Willie Bloomquist, April 1-6, 2011)...no D-back shortstop has ever hit safely in each of the first 6 games of a season.

LATE ANSWER-BACKS: Since 2024, the D-backs' 19 comeback wins when facing a 1+-run deficit in the seventh inning or later are tied for second most in the Majors with the Rays, behind the Tigers (21).

- The D-backs' 16 runs tallied in the eighth inning or later this season lead the Majors, ahead of the Angels (11) and Marlins (10).
- Since 2024, Arizona's 316 runs scored and 1.89 R/G in the seventh inning or later lead the Majors, ahead of the Twins (289 R, 1.73 R/G).

SCORING RUNS: Among teams with 5 or fewer games played this season, the Yankees (41 in 4 G) and D-backs (34 in 5 G) rank first and second respectively.

- The D-backs' 4 games with 6+ runs scored are tied for the most in the Majors with the Cubs and Dodgers... since 2024, Arizona's 66 occurrences of 6+-run games are tied for the most in MLB with the Dodgers, ahead of the Padres (64), Mets (63) and Yankees (62).
- Last season, Arizona led the Majors with a franchise second-best 886 runs (behind 1999/908 runs), ahead of the Dodgers (842) and Yankees (815).

SUÁREZ'S FIRST CAREER NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Eugenio Suárez was named NL Player of the Week for the first time in his career after hitting .286 (4-for-14)/.412 OBP/1.143 SLG/1.555 OPS with 4 homers, 7 RBI, 2 walks, 5 runs scored and 1 stolen base over 4 games.

- It marked the second consecutive season (and second occurrence all-time) a D-back was selected in the opening week of the season (also: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., March 28-31, 2024).
- · He joined Eddie Mathews (4 HR, '58 Milwaukee Braves) as the only third basemen in MLB history to reach 4+ homers in the team's first 3 games.

FACING THE YANKEES: Since 2019, the D-backs have gone 6-5 vs. Yankees (3-3 on the road).

Randal Grichuk's 18 homers vs. Yankees since 2015 rank fourth most among active players, behind Rafael Devers/BOS (28), Manny Machado/SD (20) and Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR (20).

OFFENSE MOMENTUM CARRIED OVER: Since July 1, 2024, the D-backs lead the Majors in AVG (.277), OBP (.355), SLG (.486), OPS (.842), runs (526), runs per game (6.34), extra-base hits (302), home runs (138) and hits (796).

NEXT STARTER: MERRILL KELLY (1-0, 1.69)

- Made his first start of the season on March 28 vs. Cubs (W: 1 ER in 5.1 IP).
- In 3 career starts vs. Yankees, is 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA (5 ER in 17.1 IP)...made last start on April 3, 2024 (2 ER in 7.0 IP).
