AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Baltimore (1-0 thus far)...are 2-2 on the road trip after dropping two-of-three games at Toronto this past weekend and winning their series opener at Baltimore on Tuesday...following this series, will return home for a 10-game homestand, featuring a three-game set vs. Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), a three-game series vs. Houston (8/25-27) and a four-game set vs. Boston (8/28-30).

- **Their 70-55 (.560) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (78-48, .619), Tampa Bay (75-50, .600), Los Angeles-NL (76-51, .598), Atlanta (74-52, .587) and Chicago-NL (74-53, .583).
- Have won back-to-back games after losing their previous three games (8/13-15)...have won four of their last seven games (since 8/11) and six of their last 10 games (since 8/7)...**are 16-11 in their last 27 games (since 7/19) and 20-13 in their last 33 games (since 7/9)**.
- **Have won three of their last five completed series (since 7/31) and have won or split eight of their last 11 completed series since 7/6 (are 6-3-2 in those series)**.
- Have had 23 of their last 32 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (since 7/10), going 15-8 in those games...are 35-28 (.556) in games decided by 2R-or-fewer this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Orioles, 3-1, in their series opener on Tuesday at Camden Yards...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (4.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 4K, 1HR) was reinstated from the I.L. and made his first start since 6/28 at Boston, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.0IP in a no-decision...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) drove in all three of the Yankees' runs, hitting his 17th HR of the season with a go-ahead solo shot in the third inning and a go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning...**SS George Lombard Jr.** (2-for-4, 1R) recorded his third multi-hit game...**RHP Yerry de los Santos** (2.0IP, 1H) earned his second career win and first of the season after tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...**LHP Brent Headrick** (0.2IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) was scoreless in relief...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.1IP) retired his only batter faced, stranding two inherited runners in the seventh inning...**RHP Paul Blackburn** (1.0IP, 1BB, 2K) tossed a scoreless eighth inning...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 2K) earned his 28th save of the year with a scoreless ninth inning.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham drove in all three of the Yankees' runs on Tuesday at Baltimore, hitting his 17th home run of the season with a go-ahead solo shot in the third inning and a go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning...eight of his 17HR this year have either tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (four)...as a Yankee (since 2024), 32 of his 60 home runs have either tied the game (11) or given the Yankees the lead (21).

- **Is batting .361/.378/.889 (13-for-36) with 7R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 1BB over his last nine games (since 8/8)**.
- 11 of his last 16 hits have been XBH (5 doubles, 6HR).
- **Has hit 5HR in his last eight games (since 8/9) and 6HR in his last 13 games (since 8/3)**.
- Has hit .296/.429/.778 (8-for-27) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 7BB and 1SF in eight games vs. the Orioles this year.

PUT TO BED: RHP David Bednar earned his 28th save of the year on Tuesday at Baltimore after tossing a scoreless ninth inning, striking out 2-of-3BF...**has not allowed a run in 27 of his last 30 appearances (since 5/22), going 5-0 with 17 saves, a 0.79 ERA (34.1IP, 3ER) and 38K during that span**...opponents are batting .113/.183/.148 (13-for-115) over that stretch.

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. recorded two hits on Tuesday at Baltimore...has hit safely in nine of his first 12 career games, batting .293/.370/.463 (12-for-41) with 8R, 1 double, 2HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB.

- According to FanGraphs, his eight defensive runs saved are tied for the third-most among shortstops this season.

WHAT A RELIEF: RHP Yerry de los Santos earned his second career win and first of the season on Tuesday at Baltimore after tossing 2.0 scoreless innings and retiring 6-of-7BF (1H)...has not allowed an earned run in nine of his 10 appearances this season, going 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA (14.0IP, 1ER).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 39-28 (.582) on the road this year, the best record in the AL and the second-best in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (39-25, .609)...are 12-6 in their last 18 road games (since 7/9) and 25-15 in their last 40 games on the road (since 5/25).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 16 of their last 19 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 14 of those starts, posting a 1.98 ERA (109.0IP, 24ER) during that span...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 19 of their last 24 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 17 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.30 ERA (133.0IP, 34ER) with 148K during that span.

- **Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of their last five starts (since 8/13) and seven of their last eight starts (since 8/9)**.
- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 98 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 125 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 97GS in 2021 and 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 74 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 125 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 78 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 30 of their last 34 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 25 of those starts, posting a 2.70 ERA (183.0IP, 55ER) during that span.
- **Yankees starters own the best ERA in the Majors (3.37)**, rank third in strikeouts (698, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.2%, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.34, first in AL), opponents' BA (.226, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.662, second in AL), fourth in HR/9.0IP (1.04, second in AL) and opponents' SLG (.372, third in AL), fifth in opponents' OBP (.290, third in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.29, third in AL) and WHIP (1.16, fourth in AL), and seventh in BB/9.0IP (2.84, fourth in AL).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.24 ERA (1,116.2IP, 402ER) this season (next: Milwaukee-3.43)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 of their last 24 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 13 of those games, posting a 2.51 ERA (219.0IP, 61ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of their last 32 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.71 ERA (292.0IP, 88ER) with 312K during that span.
- Their 467R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 125 games of season in the last 46 162-game seasons (since 1979), trailing only their 437R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

RODOMINANT: LHP Carlos Rodón was reinstated from the injured list on Tuesday and allowed only 1R/ER in 4.0IP in a no-decision on Tuesday at Baltimore...marked his first start since 6/28 at Boston...in 10 starts this year, is 4-2 with a 3.22 ERA (50.1IP, 18ER) and 56K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 2ER-or-fewer in six starts.

- Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his last eight starts (since 5/21), posting a 2.76 ERA (42.1IP, 13ER) over that stretch.

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: Yankees relievers allowed only two hits over 5.0 scoreless innings on Tuesday at Baltimore (2BB, 5K)...**have posted a Major League-best 2.50 ERA (244.1IP, 68ER) over their last 65 games (since 6/3)**, holding opponents to a .200 (176-for-881) BA during that stretch.

- **Own the best inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season (21.5%) and the second-best bullpen ERA (3.04, second in AL)**...also rank second in the Majors in opponents' OPS (.648, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (.221, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.347, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.302, second in AL) and WHIP (1.20, second in AL), fourth in HR/9.0IP (0.91, second in AL) and 10th in K/BB (2.47, fifth in AL).
- **Have three relievers in the top-six for the lowest inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season** - Tim Hill (6.7%, first), Brent Headrick (10.3%, fourth) and Fernando Cruz (13.6%, sixth).

ON A ROLL: RHP Paul Blackburn tossed a scoreless eighth inning on Tuesday at Baltimore (1BB, 2K)...**has not allowed an earned run in 24 of his last 26 appearances (one start) since 6/21, going 2-1 with one save, a 0.74 ERA (36.1IP, 3ER) and 33K during that stretch...has held opponents to a .111/.206/.197 (13-for-117) slash line during that span**.

- Has gone 4-2 with one save, a 1.83 ERA (69.0IP, 14ER) and 56K in 47 games (two starts) this season, holding opponents to a .190/.271/.285 (46-for-242) slash line.

CRUZ CONTROL: RHP Fernando Cruz stranded two inherited runners in the seventh inning on Tuesday at Baltimore after retiring his only batter faced...has stranded 38 of his 44 inherited runners this season...his 13.6% inherited runners scored percentage ranks sixth among Major League relievers (fourth in AL).

- Has gone 3-6 with two saves, a 2.49 ERA (43.1IP, 12ER) and 50K over his last 47 relief outings (since 4/25)...has not allowed a run in 36 of those games...over that span, has stranded 34 of his 37 inherited runners.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (8-6, 4.42 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his 24th start (25th appearance) of the season in tonight's game at Baltimore...the 27-year-old will pitch on extended six days' rest...did not record a decision in his last start on 8/12 vs. Seattle (4.0IP, 6H, 5R/ER, 4BB, 3K, 3HR)...is 8-6 with a 4.42 ERA (118.0IP, 125H, 70R/58ER, 41BB, 117K, 18HR) in 24 games (23 starts) this season...the Yankees have won 15 of his 23 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 23 starts...**his 37 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the AL and tied for the fifth-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 32 wins in his starts since 2025 the most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors...**last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not record a decision in his last start on 8/12 vs. Seattle (4.0IP, 6H, 5R/ER, 4BB, 3K, 3HR)...matched his career high with 3HR (also 3HR on 7/7/26 at Tampa Bay)...also matched his career high in walks (sixth time, last on 7/2/25 at Toronto).

- 2026:** Is 8-6 with a 4.42 ERA (118.0IP, 125H, 70R/58ER, 41BB, 117K, 18HR) in 24 games (23 starts) this season...the Yankees have won 15 of his 23 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 23 starts.
- Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in 16 of his 23 starts this season, including 1BB-or-fewer in 10 of those starts.
 - His 42 called strikeouts are tied for the seventh-most in the AL.
 - Has allowed one-or-zero HR in 19 of his 23 starts this season, including 11 starts without allowing a HR.
 - Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 18 of his 23 starts.
 - The Yankees are 15-8 in his starts, tied for the fifth-most wins in a pitcher's starts in the AL.
 - Since 5/25, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of 13 starts.
 - Went 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA (36.2IP, 39H, 21R/14ER, 15BB, 31K, 2HR) over seven starts from 5/12-6/20...the Yankees went 6-1 in those starts...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in five of those seven starts.
 - Went 4-0 with a 2.39 ERA (37.2IP, 32H, 15R/10ER, 8BB, 46K, 4HR) in his first seven starts of the season (3/28-5/1)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those seven starts...the Yankees won six of those seven starts.
 - Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts this season (3/28-5/1), the most in the Majors in that span (most in the AL)...was only the seventh Yankees pitcher (eighth time) in the last 66 years (since 1961) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts of a season (excluding openers), joining Max Fried (first 11GS in 2025), Michael King (first 8GS in 2023), Gerrit Cole (2x: first 8GS in 2021 and first 7GS in 2023), Nestor Cortes (first 7GS in 2022), Michael Pineda (first 9GS in 2014) and Hideki Irabu (first 7GS in 1998).
 - Recorded at least 6K in six straight starts (4/13-5/12), posting a 12.40 K/9.0IP (45K/32.2IP) over that span...marked a career long streak...was one of only three Yankees (fifth time) in the last seven years (since 2020) to record six-or-more strikeouts in at least six straight games, joining Cam Schlitler (9GS from 9/11/25-4/17/26) and Gerrit Cole (3x: 15GS from 8/8/20-G1-4/30/21, 11GS from 6/22-9/1/21 and 12GS from 6/14/22-8/15/22).
 - Made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year on 4/18 vs. Kansas City after allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0 innings (5H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR, 1PO)...**his 11K tied his career high (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)**...marked his third career double-digit strikeout game (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 10K on 5/20/25 vs. Texas)...marked the second time in his career he has recorded at least 10K without surrendering a walk (also 11K and 0BB 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...no other Yankee had done so since Warren last accomplished the feat on 6/17/25...his 7.0 innings marked the second-longest start of his career (7.1IP on 5/9/25 at the Athletics)...also marked his sixth career start with 0BB and his second this season (last on 4/3 vs. Miami).

ROAD TRIPPIN': Is making his 13th road start of the season tonight...is 4-3 with a 4.45 ERA (60.2IP, 30ER) and 46K in 12 road starts this year...the Yankees have won nine of his 12 road starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of his road starts...the Yankees have won nine of his road starts, tied for the fifth-most wins in a pitcher's road starts this season.

- Made his last road start on 7/31 at Chicago-NL and recorded his eighth win of the season after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 7K)...marked the longest scoreless start of his career, his first scoreless start of the season and first since 8/5/25 at Texas (5.0IP)...also marked his fewest walks allowed (0BB) and most strikeouts (7K) in his previous five starts (7/1 vs. Detroit, also 0BB and 7K)...marked his first win since 5/31 at the Athletics.

- VS. BALTIMORE:** Is making his seventh career start against the Orioles tonight...has gone 3-2 with a 3.94 ERA (32.0IP, 14ER) and 37K in six starts vs. Baltimore...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in four of his six career starts vs. the Orioles.
- In his last four starts vs. the Orioles (since 9/19/25), is 3-1 with a 3.22 ERA (22.1IP, 8ER) and 26K.
 - Made his last start vs. Baltimore on 5/12 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards and recorded the win after allowing just 2R/ER in 5.2IP (4H, 1BB, 6K, 0HR, 1WP).
 - Made his fifth career start vs. the Orioles this season on 5/1 at Yankee Stadium and recorded the win after allowing just 2R/1ER over 6.1IP (3H, 1BB, 9K, 1HR)...his 3H allowed match his fewest in a start this season (also 3H on 4/13 vs. LAA and 5/25 at KC)...after allowing his only earned run of the game on a solo HR to Pete Alonso in the second inning, retired 16 of his next 17 batters (1H).
 - Is 1-2 with a 4.40 ERA (14.1IP, 7ER) and 15K in three starts at Oriole Park at Camden Yards.

- GOOD WILL WARREN:** **His 37 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the AL and tied for the fifth-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 32 wins in his starts since 2025 the most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.**
- Has made 63 career Major League appearances (61 starts), going 17-17 with a 4.87 ERA (303.0IP, 316H, 187R/164ER, 116BB, 317K, 45HR).
 - Has gone 11-9 with a 4.17 ERA (181.1IP, 187H, 104R/84ER, 59BB, 171K, 29HR) over 36 games (35 starts) since 7/25/25 after going 6-8 with a 5.92 ERA (121.2IP, 129H, 83R/80ER, 57BB, 146K, 16HR) over his first 27 career games (26 starts) from 7/30/24-7/19/25...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 35 starts over that span.
 - His 56 starts since the start of 2025 are tied for the eighth-most in the Majors and tied for the second-most in AL.
 - His 317K over his first 63 career games (61 starts) are the sixth-most in franchise history, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (380K in 63G/GS), Al Downing (380K in 63G/54GS), Luis Severino (343K in 63G/52GS), Orlando Hernández (336K in 63G/GS) and Dave Righetti (320K in 63G/57GS).

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 16th start of the season in Thursday's series finale at Baltimore...the 35-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last pitched on Friday at Toronto and suffered his sixth loss of the season in the Yankees' 3-1 defeat despite allowing only 2R/1ER in 6.0 innings (5H, 2BB, 5K, 0HR)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last four starts (since 7/28) and 1ER-or-fewer in three of those starts, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (24.2IP, 4ER) with 26K during that span**...missed the entire 2025 season and the first 51 games of this season recovering from "Tommy John" surgery...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) was unanimously named the 2023 American League Cy Young Award winner and has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting six times (first in 2023, second in 2019 and 2021, fourth in 2015 and 2020, and fifth in 2018)... owns two of the Yankees' top three single-season strikeout records and three of the top-eight records (his 257K in 2022 are the most in franchise history, his 243K in 2021 are the third-most in franchise history and his 222K in 2023 are tied for the seventh-most in Yankees history)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11).
