DETROIT TIGERS (60-42) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (41-61)

July 23, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #103/Home #53

RHP Troy Melton (Major League Debut) vs. LHP Bailey Falter (6-5, 4.00 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won each of the first two games of this three-game series vs. Detroit...Will host the Tigers for one more game before welcoming Arizona (Friday-Sunday) to PNC Park for three games to conclude this nine-game homestand (were swept by Chicago-AL in a three-game series from July 18-20)...Are in the final game of a stretch of

15 straight games against American League opponents (it's also the final game of a 12-game stretch against the American League Central)...Have gone 28-24 at home this season...Are 29-35 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 against Atlanta.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Pittsburgh scored eight runs in Tuesday night's win over the Tigers at PNC Park...The Pirates are 12-2 in their last 14 games when scoring at least four runs, a stretch that began with a 5-4, walkoff victory over Philadelphia on June 6.

CHECKING THE BROOM CLOSET: Today, the Pirates will attempt to sweep Detroit in Pittsburgh for the fourth time since the teams first faced each other in 1998...Pittsburgh's three sweeps here were two-game series from August 7-8, 2017, August 11-12, 2014 and May 29-30, 2013...It would also mark the Pirates' third sweep in their last four home series...Pittsburgh swept back-to-back home series against New York (NL) and St. Louis from June 27-29 and June 30-July 2, respectively...This would also mark the Pirates' first home sweep over an American League opponent since September 17-19, 2018, when they swept Kansas City in three games.

MAKE IT A DOUBLE: Pittsburgh doubled eight times in Tuesday night's 8-5 victory vs. Detroit, its most doubles in a game since August 24, 2002 at Milwaukee (nine)...The Pirates' last home game with at least eight doubles before Tuesday was August 4, 1998 vs. Colorado at Three Rivers Stadium (nine)...Pittsburgh had three players (Spencer Horwitz, Tommy Pham, Oneil Cruz) with multiple doubles in Tuesday's win, the first time that's happened since August 24, 2002 (Brian Giles, Abraham Nunez, Pokey Reese).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds has recorded multiple RBI in consecutive games for the second time this season (also June 27-28 vs. New York-NL) and the 10th time in his career (he's never done it in three straight games)...He has hit safely in six of his last seven games (since July 12 at Minnesota), going 10-for-28 (.357) with four doubles, four RBI and four runs scored...His first-inning double off Detroit's Casey Mize in Tuesday night's 8-5 win was the 908th hit of his career, surpassing Al Martin for 46th place on Pittsburgh's all-time hits leaderboard (Omar Moreno and Owen Wilson are tied for 44th place with 915 hits apiece)...It was also Reynolds' 20th double of the season, giving him his fifth season with at least 20 doubles...The five-such seasons are tied with four other players for the third-most by any Pirates switch hitter since at least 1901, trailing only Max Carey (11) and Neil Walker (six).

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Horwitz had three hits on Tuesday vs. Detroit, his second straight game with three hits...He became the first Pirates leadoff batter to have at least three hits in back-to-back games since Ben Gamel from May 4 [G2]-7 [G1], 2022...Horwitz also became the first Pirates first baseman to have three hits in consecutive games since John Nogowski from July 7-9, 2021...In his last three games (since Sunday vs. Chicago-AL), Horwitz has gone 7-for-12 (.583) with two doubles, three RBI and three runs scored.

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz doubled twice, walked, stole a base and scored a run on Tuesday vs. Detroit...It was Cruz' third career multi-double game, his first since July 19, 2024 vs. Philadelphia...He became the first Pirates batter with two doubles, a walk, a stolen base and a run scored in a game since Jose Tabata on June 1, 2012 at Milwaukee...Cruz has hit safely in eight of his last 10 games (since July 8 at Kansas City), going 11-for-35 (.314) with three doubles, a triple, a home run, four RBI, two walks, three steals and three runs scored.

PHAMTASTIC: Tommy Pham went 3-for-5 with two doubles, two RBI and a run scored in Tuesday night's 8-5 win over Detroit...It was his second multidouble game of the season (also June 22 vs. Texas) and his fourth three-hit game of 2025 (last on July 9 at Kansas City)...In his last 20 games (since June 22), Pham is batting .391 (27-for-69) with six doubles, four home runs, 18 RBI and nine runs scored...His .391 average in that span is the best in all of Major League Baseball among those with at least 65 at-bats...Pham's 18 RBI during that stretch are tied with two others for the ninth-most in the National League.

<u>July 23, 1991</u>: Rookie John Wehner went 5-for-5 with an RBI and three runs scored in Pittsburgh's 12-3 win vs. Atlanta at Three Rivers Stadium. Wehner became the first Pirates rookie with a five-hit game since Richie Zisk in 1973. Pittsburgh banged out 16 hits in the victory, including a fifth-inning grand slam from Gary Redus. Doug Drabek pitched 7.0 innings and earned his 10th win.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

STARTING OFF: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed four runs on six hits and one walk while striking out six batters over his 4.0 innings of work on Friday vs. Chicago (AL), losing a 10-1 decision... In eight starts since the beginning of June, Falter has posted a 5.60 ERA (35.1ip/22er).

AGAINST THE TIGERS: Falter allowed three runs on five hits (two home runs) and one walk (four strikeouts) over 5.0 innings in his only career start against Detroit, which came on June 17 at Comerica Park...Falter had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 7-3 loss.

ALONG THE BANKS OF THE ALLEGHENY: Today will be Falter's 12th start of the season here at PNC Park, where he has has gone 5-1 with a 3.65 ERA (56.2ip/23er)... Since giving up seven runs over 4.0 innings in his first home start on April 5 vs. New York (AL), Falter has recorded a 2.73 ERA (52.2ip/16er) in his 10 starts here at PNC Park.

FIRST-HALF HIGHLIGHTS: Falter ended the first half of the season with a 3.79 ERA (97.1ip/41er), the seventh-lowest ERA among left-handed pitchers in the National League with at least 95.0 innings pitched...The only pitchers on that list with a lower first-half ERA than Falter were Chicago's Matthew Boyd (2.34), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (2.50), San Francisco's Robbie Ray (2.65), Washington's MacKenzie Gore (3.02), New York's David Peterson (3.06) and Cincinnati's Nick Lodolo (3.38).

RISPY BUSINESS: Falter has posted a .239 batting average against (17-for-71) with runners in scoring position this season...Since his outing on May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter has limited opposing hitters to a .173 batting average against (9-for-52) with RISP.

WINNING THE DAY: Falter had his career-high-tying five-game winning streak come to an end in his outing on July 4 at Seattle...He had a 2.54 ERA (49.2ip/14er) and a .225 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...He also won five consecutive decisions from August 20 [G2]-September 13, 2022 with Philadelphia.

THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter's 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/ zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

NOTHING TO SEE HERE: Falter has recorded three separate scoreless streaks of at least 11.0 innings this season...He had his most-recent 11.0-inning scoreless streak end in the first inning of his start on June 6...Falter also compiled a scoreless streak of 11.0 innings from April 11-22, as well as a 16.2-inning streak that stretched from May 9-20.

THE FALTER FILE: Attended Chino Hills High School, where he was classmates with NBA players Lonzo and LaMelo Ball...Had committed to play collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara prior to being drafted by Philadelphia in 2015.
