METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed due to rain yesterday on Friday, the Mets defeated the Guardians, 10-9, in walk-off fashion last night in 10 innings...The Mets have won three straight games...New York is seeking its second straight series victory, it's seventh series victory overall and it's fourth at home...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (3-1) against Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (1-0)...The Mets are off on Monday before they begin a six-game road trip to Chicago-NL (three games) and Colorado (three games).

THE GRASS IS ALWAYS GREENER: The Francisco Lindor Grass Growing Bobblehead presented by Northwell Health giveaway will now take place on game one of the today's doubleheader for the first 15,000 fans attending the 1:40 p.m. game.

ARMED FORCES WEEKEND: The Mets, along with all of Major League Baseball, will celebrate Armed Services Weekend...The team will wear military inspired caps and socks for the entire series against the Guardians.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are set to play their fourth doubleheader of the season today...This includes the completion of the suspended game last Saturday in Washington..New York is 2-4 in twinbills this season...New York has swept seven of their last 14 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps last season.

WINNING COMBO: Max Scherzer (204) and Justin Verlander (245) have combined to win 449 regular season major league games...According to Elias, the last MLB team with 449 or more combined wins by their starting pitchers in a doubleheader was the Texas Rangers when Nolan Ryan (300) and Charlie Hough (184) headlined a twinbill on August 17, 1990 vs. ChicagoAL.

THREE'S COMPANY: According to Sarah Langs, with Max Scherzer and Justin Verlander scheduled to start today, the Mets would be the first team to start pitchers who have each won three or more Cy Young Awardss in both ends of a doubleheader...The only team to start pitchers who had even won two or more Cy Young Awards in a twinbill is also the Mets...On September 7, 2008 vs. Philadelphia...Pedro Martínez started game one, while, Johan Santana started the night cap.

METS 5-0: The Mets earned their largest comeback win of the season last night...The team was down 5-0 heading into the bottom of the fifth and won the game 10-9 in 10-innings..It was New York's first win after trailing by at least five runs since an 8-7 win over Philadelphia on May 5, 2022...The Mets won after trailing 7-0 and were also rained out the following day.

SECOND TIME AROUND: Friday night marked the second time that the Mets won two games when trailing by multiple runs in ninth inning or later within a three-game span...They did it two straight games in 1965: April 23-24 at Giants...Courtesy of Elias.

DOWN AND NOT OUT: Francisco Alvarez tied the game up with a single with two outs and an 0-2 count in the bottom of the 10th inning on Friday...He has delivered a game-tying hit with his team down to its last out in each of his last two games played (Wednesday and Friday)...Only one other MLB player in the last 10 years has done that in back-to-back games played: Albert Pujols (April 9 \& 11, 2017)...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

AND I WOULD WALK ABOVE .500: With a victory in game one the Mets would move back above .500 ...It would be the first time the club is above .500 since they were 17-16 on May 5.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Mets improved to 3-0 in extra-inning games this year... Since the start of last season, the Mets are a major league-best 13-2 (.867) in extra-inning games.

GUARDIANS-METS NOTES: The Mets are playing the Guardians for the first time since a three-game set from August 20-22, 2019...This series marks the third time that the Guardians have visited Queens.

BABY METS, DOO-DOO, DOO-DOO: Brett Baty went 2-5 with two runs, a double, a home run and an RBI on Friday...Francisco Alvarez went 2-4 with two runs, a home run and two RBI, while Mark Vientos went 1-4 with an RBI and a walk...Baty is batting $.286(6-21)$ with four runs, a double, two home runs, four RBI, two walks with a .967 OPS over his last six games...Baty has hit .333 (14-42) with six runs, four doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, four walks with a 1.106 OPS in 13 games at Citi Field this year.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in four straight contests, hitting 10 home runs in that span...The Mets are 18-9 when hitting a home run this season and 8-5 when hitting multiple homers.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor collected his fifth career walk-off RBI on Friday night...He finished the night going 3-6 with two runs, a double and an RBI... He now has 15 doubles on the season, which tied for fourth in the majors and tied for third in the NL...Over the last six games, Lindor is 9-27 (.333) with five runs, three doubles, two RBI and a walk.

HOMERS ARE SICK: Pete Alonso has homered in four consecutive games for the second time in his career...Alonso homered in four straight games from August 5-9, 2019... He back the second player in franchise history to homer in four consecutive games twice, joining Mike Piazza (May 17-21, 1999 and August $13-16,1999$ )...Alonso is one game shy of tying Richard Hidalgo's franchise-high regular season home run streak of five games, which was accomplished from July 1-5, 2004...Daniel Murphy homered in six straight playoff games in 2015.

GRANNIES ARE SICKER: Alonso smashed his third career grand slam on Friday...He joins Todd Hundley (April 26, 1995) and Carl Everett (September 13,1997 ) as the only other players in franchise history to hit a game-tying grand slam.

KEY TO THE CITI: Alonso's grand slam was the 71st Citi Fleld home run of his career, tied with Lucas Duda for the most in the 15 -year history of the ballpark... He is one of 11 active players to have the most homers at an active MLB venue...See below for the other 10:

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 20-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 115 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the secondlongest streak in franchise history....From October 1, 1990-September 2, 1992, the Mets won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

WHEN I WAS 17: Alonso has hit 17 home runs this season, which leads the majors leagues... His 17 home runs are tied for the most by a Met in franchise history through the team's first 46 games of the season...Dave Kingman also had 17 in 1976... His 41 RBI are third in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 421 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 35 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season... His 35 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

ALL-AMERICAN JEFF: Jeff McNeil has batted . 330 (94-285) with 41 runs, 14 doubles, seven home runs, 35 RBI, 20 walks with a .379 OBP and a .453 SLG in 77 career games against the American League...His .330 batting average in Interleague Play in the highest among active players.


LAST TIME OUT: Started after a 10-day layoff due to neck spasms that delayed his scheduled outing...Earned the win against his former team the Washington Nationals on May 14 at Nationals Park...Allowed one earned run on two hits and two walks in 5.0 innings... Fanned six Nationals batters, tying his season high.

LENGTH AND PUNCHOUTS: Scherzer has not completed 6.0 innings since his Opening Day start in Miami on March 30... His streak of five straight starts of fewer than 6.0 IP is the second-longest of his career...His only longer streak was in 2010 with Detroit (six straight GS under 6.0 IP)...Scherzer has not recorded more than six strikeouts in any of his last seven starts dating back to his final start of the 2022 season... He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only once in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/ Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez... His next $10+\mathrm{K}$ game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just six punchouts separating the two...With 153 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts. All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day Scherzer exited with the score tied 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory 202 He 2 . 2 in . 202 . 2 -3 in games...He became the first pitcher ever to star both for and against the Mets on Opening against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

QUITE THE DEBUT: After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA ( 37 ER/145.1 IP) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati Blanked the Yankees over 70 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field Ofed Alata the tim on Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

## VERLANDER NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss in his Mets Citi Field debut on May 16 vs. Tampa Bay... Tossed 5.0 innings and allowed six runs on eight hits, two walks and threes strikeouts...Were the most runs Verlander allowed in a start since allowing seven runs (four earned) on June 18,2022 vs. Chicago-AL...Ended a streak of 17 straight starts allowing three runs or fewer, one shy of his career-high from August 16, 2019 to May 21, 2022.

VS. CLEVELAND: Tonight's start will mark Verlander's 55th against Cleveland...That's tied for the most starts by an active pitcher against one opponent with Clayton Kershaw who has started 55 games against the Giants....Through 54 starts against the Guardians, Verlander is $22-24$ with a 4.53 ERA ( 170 ER/337.2 IP) and 359 strikeouts.

30 FOR 30: With a win on May 10th against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams... He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY: In 57 career Interleague starts, Verlander is $38-10$ with a 2.71 ERA ( $112 \mathrm{ER} / 372.1$ IP)...In Interleague play history, Verlander has the most wins, the second-most strikeouts at 415 trailing only Max Scherzer (447), and the third-best ERA among qualifiers... 41 of Verlander's 57 career Interleague starts have been quality starts, one behind Greinke for the most in Interleague play history.
3K AND COUNTING: Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12 th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just six separating the two entering today... Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer...During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery....Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA ( 34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA ( 42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186) , opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winnner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).
