**ROAD-TRIPPING REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates play the last game of a three-game series this afternoon at PNC Park. After sweeping the Minnesota to open the season, the Cardinals have gone 2-6 over their last eight games, going 1-4 (0-3 at BOS, 1-1 at PIT) on the road trip. St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central Division, 2.5 games behind Chicago.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** Following this afternoon's game, the Cardinals fly home to St. Louis and will have an open date Thursday before a six-game homestand starting on Friday against the Philadelphia Phillies (April 11-13) and Houston Astros (April 14-16) involving the two participants of the 2022 World Series.

**DAY YAY!:** Since PNC Park opened in 2001, the Cardinals are 32-22 in day games at the venue. Their .593 winning percentage under the sun is the best winning percentage here of any National League Central team. This record includes a nine-game win streak in matinees from 5/26/18-8/12/21. The Toronto Blue Jays (4-0), Boston Red Sox (3-0), Texas Rangers (3-0) have never lost a day game at the venue.

**FOREVER YOUNG:** St. Louis Cardinals manager **Oliver Marmol** enters today with 252 wins and is tied with **Mike Shildt** (2018-2021) for 15th all-time in franchise history. With a win today, the 38-year old Marmol, the youngest manager in Major League Baseball, would take over sole possession of 15th place.

**FIRST BATTER...GONE!:** The St. Louis Cardinals and Milwaukee Brewers lead all opponents with lead-off home runs at PNC Park with five. St. Louis last hit one on Aug. 10, 2021 as **Tommy Edman** took **Steven Brault** deep to ignite the game. The Cardinals have hit four lead-off home runs on the banks of the Allegheny since the start of the 2018 season. Cardinals' lead-off batter **Lars Nootbaar** has six career lead-off home runs in his career, including one this year on 3/31 vs. LAA.

**CATCH THE FEVER!:** Cardinals catchers are responsible for 19-of-68 RBI (25%) this season, most by Cardinals catchers through their first 11 games, out-distancing the next highest total of 11, most recently by Joe Torre in 1970. The last set of three catchers combining for the most RBI through 11 games was 2002 when **Mike Matheny**, **Mike DiFelice** and **Eli Marrero** combined for 10. -ORF

**DONNY-BROOK:** Cardinals utility-man **Brendan Donovan** leads the Cardinals with 17 hits this season and has 12 since April 4th, the most in all of Major League Baseball over that period.

**NOLAN KEEPS ROLLING:** Despite not getting a hit last night, halting his hit streak at 15 games, **Nolan Arenado** reached base on a walk to extend his on-base streak to 18 games, T-5th-longest active streak in MLB

**WINN NO MATTER WHAT:** Cardinals shortstop **Masyn Winn** scored in his 7th straight game last night, tying his career-high (9/21-28/24) and is now the longest active streak in MLB, one shy of the 2025 season-high by **Shohei Ohtani** with eight (3/18-4/2/25). Winn began the season 0-for-20 before going 10-for-21 (.476) including four straight multi-hit games (4/2-6).

**FOUR SCORES AND 11 GAMES AGO...:** St. Louis has scored 4+ runs in all 11 games to begin their season, the only MLB team this season to do so and one game shy of its season-opening franchise record streak of 12 games by the **1954** Cardinals. The **1978** Boston Red Sox hold the MLB record with 18 games of 4+ runs scored to begin their season. Dating back to Sept. 24, 2024, the Cardinals have scored 4+ runs in 16 consecutive games overall, T-2nd longest streak in franchise history over any span of games behind the **1921** Cardinals (21 games from May 27-June 14).

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY APRIL, 9, 2024:** **Sonny Gray** makes his St. Louis Cardinals debut after beginning the season on the Injured List after being announced as the Opening Day starter. Gray fires 5.0 scoreless innings of five-hit ball with five strikeouts en route to his first Cardinals win. The Cardinals back him with three runs as Gray is now 14-0 when getting three or more runs of support as a member of the franchise after last night's win in Pittsburgh, his first career win at PNC Park.

#### PITTSBURGH CONNECTIONS

**Oliver Marmol** was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the 31st round of the 2004 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

**Victor Scott II** grew up a fan of **Andrew McCutchen** and **Starling Marte** as a child...Scott's father was Pirates fan from Pittsburgh, although Victor II grew up a Braves fan.

**Miles Mikolas** spent one month as a Pirate during the 2013 offseason...traded by San Diego with **Jaff Decker** to Pittsburgh for **Alex Dickerson** (Nov. 25, 2013), then traded by Pittsburgh to the Rangers for **Chris McGuiness** (Dec. 30, 2013).

**Michael Siani's** younger brother, **Sammy Siani**, was selected by Pittsburgh with the 37th overall pick in the 2019 MLB Draft...is an outfielder for Altoona (AA) in the Pirates organization.

**Brant Brown** played in 130 games for the Pirates in 1999 before traded to the Marlins for OF **Bruce Aven** (Dec. 13, 1999)...traded by the Cubs to Pittsburgh for RHP Jon Lieber (Dec. 14, 1998).

**Wilson Contreras** (June 17, 2016 at Wrigley Field), **Sonny Gray** (July 10, 2013 at PNC), **Andre Pallante** (April 10, 2022 at Busch), **Nolan Gorman** (May 20, 2022 at PNC), **Luken Baker** (June 4, 2023 at PNC), and **Matthew Liberatore** (May 21, 2022 at PNC) made MLB debuts vs. the Pirates.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** signed with Pittsburgh as an amateur free agent in 1956...played parts of five seasons in the Pirates minor league organization (1956-60).

**Riley O'Brien's** great uncle, **Eddie O'Brien** played for Pittsburgh as an infielder and also made five pitching appearances (1953, 1955-58)...his grandfather **Johnny O'Brien**, played part of four seasons with the Pirates (1953, 1955-57).

**Tommy Pham** was selected by the Cardinals in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft...played parts of his first five seasons in St. Louis (2014-18).

**Nolan Arenado** (2009) and **Paul Skenes** (2020) are graduates of El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Has entered his 8th season in Major League Baseball and his 1st to begin a season with the Cardinals. Has previously pitched for the Nationals (2017-22) and White Sox (2024).
- Making his 3rd start of the season with earlier starts against the Twins (3/29) and Red Sox (4/4).
- Exited his last start vs. BOS (4/4) after 3.0 innings for the Red Sox home opener at Fenway Park in a 13-9 loss allowing six runs on five hits. Was his most runs allowed as a member of the Cardinals in 12 starts. Previous high was five runs at CHI in his first start with St. Louis.
- Started the Cardinals 2nd game of season (3/29 vs. MIN) and allowed just one run on two hits in his 6.0 IP (73 pitches), earning the 5-1 win.
- Improved to 2-2 with 2.97 ERA in 7 career starts at Busch Stadium, including a 2-2 mark with 1.98 ERA (27.1 IP/6 ER) in his 5 starts as a Cardinal at Busch Stadium with no HR's allowed.
- Was acquired by the St. Louis Cardinals with OF Tommy Pham in a three-team/nine-player trade from the Chicago White Sox which included the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 29, 2024.

FEDDE vs. PITTSBURGH:

- Making his 4th career start vs. the Pirates, all since 2022. His one start with the Cardinals resulted in a no decision the Cardinals lost 3-2 as he left with a 2-1 lead before the Pirates scored single tallies in their 7th and 8th innings.
- Held the Pirates to two runs and four hits or less in all three starts posting a 1-0 record with a 2.81 ERA in 16.0 innings pitched.
- Won his only start at PNC Park as a member of the Nationals on April 15, 2022. Tossed 5.0 innings allowing two runs with six strikeouts in a 7-2 victory backed by 3 RBI games from Josh Bell and Nelson Cruz.
- Is 0-3 with a 4.76 ERA in four career starts vs. N.L. Central clubs as a member of the Cardinals, facing each divisional opponent once.

LAST START vs. PIRATES: 9/19/24 at STL (ND, L, 3-2; 6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 3 K; 85 pitches)

2024/CAREER NOTES:

- Went 2-5 with a 3.72 ERA in his 10 starts with the Cardinals last season and had a 7-4 mark with 3.11 ERA in 21 starts for the White Sox.
- The White Sox were 27-81 at the time he was traded; 7 of those 27 wins (26 pct.) belonged to Fedde.
- Posted a 1.94 ERA in 13 home starts in 2024 between Guaranteed Rate Field (CWS) and Busch Stadium (STL). Ranked 2nd in MLB behind only Reynaldo Lopez (1.78) of Atlanta.
- Had four scoreless starts of 5.0 for the White Sox at home. Posted an 0.95 ERA over his first six starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, lowest by a White Sox pitcher in his first six home starts since Tommy John recorded a 0.76 ERA in 1967.
- Played one season for NC Dinos of the KBO League in 2023 where he led the league in wins (20), ERA (2.00), strikeouts (209) and WHIP (0.95) over 30 starts covering 180.1 innings pitched.
- Earned the 2023 Choi Dong-won Award, annually awarded to the best pitcher in the KBO League.
- Was a member of the 2019 Washington Nationals World Championship squad, making 12 starts and 21 appearances during the regular season. Did not make the postseason roster but traveled with the team on the Taxi Squad.
- Played high school baseball at Las Vegas High School where he was teammates with Bryce Harper. Compiled a 14-8 record over his three-year varsity career.
- Was a two-sport athlete, starring as an All-State honoree in soccer. Helped LVHS to the 2009 Nevada High School State Championship, defeating Bishop Gorman 4-3 in a shootout.
- Played college baseball at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. Was 8-2 with a 1.76 ERA (76.2 IP) over 11 starts with 82 strikeouts during his junior season in 2014.
- Drafted by the Washington Nationals in the first round (18th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of UNLV.
