ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have optioned RH Brent Honeywell Jr. to the alternate training site and recalled RH Trevor Richards from the alternate site...Honeywell made his major league debut yesterday and retired all 6 BF, going 1,300 days and four elbow surgeries since his last outing in the Triple-A National Championship Game on Sep 19, 2017...Richards will be the 33rd player used by the Rays this season, most in the majors.

+ In addition, C Joseph Odom has cleared waivers and accepted his outright assignment to the alternate training site.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost five of their last 7 games following a 2-0 start to the season; however, they have won two of their last 3 games since a 4-game losing streak...the Rays have held a lead in eight of their 9 games this season and blown a lead in four of their 5 losses...yesterday the Rays had a second attempt at their first sweep of the season, but lost in extra innings to the Yankees...four of the five teams in the AL East are 4-5 and behind the first-place Red Sox (6-3), who have won six straight.

- + This homestand the Rays have scored 17 runs in innings 1-thru-4, compared to 1 run from the 5th inning on...to compare, on the first road trip they scored 5 runs in innings 1-thru-4 and 18 runs after.
- + The Rays are 13-2-4 in regular-season series since Aug 4, 2020.
- + Since 2020, the Rays have a AL-most 22 come-from-behind wins.
- + This series the Rays continue stretches of games on 13 consecutive days (April 9-21) and 30 games in 31 days (April 9-May 9).

**DOES NOT COMPUTE**—Yesterday was the second time this season (April 6 at BOS) the Rays lost when leading after 7 innings, falling to 2-2 in those games after going 25-0 in them last season...said another way, it was the second time in the last 5 games the Rays lost when leading after 7, compared to no losses of that type in the previous 119 games (July 28, 2019–April 5, 2021)...yesterday was the first time the Rays lost at home when leading after 7 innings since July 20, 2019 vs. CWS (led 1-0, lost 2-1).

**DOME SWEET DOME**—The Rays are 12-0-4 in their last 16 home series since Aug 30, 2019...since the start of 2020, the Rays are 22-10 (.688) at home, 3rd in the majors...they are 37-12 (.755) in their last 49 home games since Aug 21, 2019, best in the majors over that stretch...in 2020 the Rays won in walk-off fashion four times, tied for 2nd in the majors...the Rays haven't lost back-to-back home games since Aug 19-20, 2019 vs. SEA.

CLOSE SHAVES—Since the start of last season, the Rays are 25-11 (.694) in games decided by 2 runs (or fewer) and 15-6 (.714) in 1-run games (10-2 at home, 5-4 on the road), both of which are the best winning pct. in the majors…beginning Aug 7, 2020, the Rays are 14-4 (.778) in 1-run games.

+ Combining regular season and postseason in 2020, the Rays had 13 pitchers with a save, most in major league history...despite the shortened season, the Rays had 12 pitchers with one in the regular season, tying the major league record set by the 1973 Rangers.

RAYS vs. RANGERS—This is the first series between the two clubs since Sep 10-12, 2019 at TEX and first at Tropicana Field since June 28-30, 2019...tonight is the first of 7 games between the clubs this season, with a 3-game series from June 4-6 in Arlington...the Rays went 3-3 against the Rangers in 2019 (2-1 at home, 1-2 on the road) and are 87-98 (.470) all-time against them, going 48-42 at home (45-42 at Tropicana Field, 3-0 at Disney Wide World of Sports) and 39-56 on the road...the Rays are 14-10 (.583) against them since the start of 2016, incl. 6-2-0 in series play since then.

- + Globe Life Field was the neutral site for the 2020 World Series, the first time any World Series games were played on artificial turf since Games 1-2 of the 2008 World Series at Tropicana Field.
- + Since 2010, the Rays have made five trips to the postseason (2010, 2011, 2013, 2019, 2020)...strangely, during that stretch the Rays have won 6 games in Arlington and 5 games at Tropicana Field.
- + RH Pete Fairbanks (injured list) and LH Jeffrey Springs were both selected by the Rangers in the 2015 June Draft...Fairbanks, who was acquired for DH Nick Solak, had 3 saves last postseason including Game 7 of the ALCS...1B Nate Lowe, who ranks 2nd in the AL with 14 RBI, was traded to the Rangers in the offseason.

**NOT THE RAYS WAY**—The Rays rank 23rd in the majors and 10th in the AL with a 5.07 ERA (81.2-IP, 46-ER)...they have allowed 55 runs this season, their most in the first 9 games since 2012 (57)...the Rays have allowed 8 runs (or more) in four of 9 games, 6+ runs five times and 5+ runs

six times...the bullpen has a 6.13 ERA (39.2-IP, 27-ER), 29th in the majors.

- + The Rays have only yielded 8 HR, tied for 4th-fewest in the majors, and only 23.6 pct. (13 of 55) of their runs allowed have come on homers...the Rays have also pitched two shutouts, one of four teams in the majors with multiple shutouts...these shutouts are the only times this season the Rays have allowed fewer than 4 runs.
- + Last season the Rays ranked 3rd in the majors with a 3.56 ERA behind the Dodgers (3.02) and Indians (3.29)...it was the second consecutive season the Rays finished among the majors' top three in ERA, and fourth straight season they finished among the top ten.

THE GREAT RANDINO—Rookie Randy Arozarena has homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career, following Sep 6-7, 2020 vs. MIA, at WAS...his 8-game hitting streak is the longest by a Ray to start the season since **Ben Zobrist** (8) in 2010...if he hits safely tonight, it will be the club's longest to start a season since **Evan Longoria** (10) in 2009.

- + Since his Rays debut on Aug 30, 2020, Arozarena has 9 HR in 31 games (25 starts)...over that stretch, his 9 HR are tied for 6th in the AL behind MIN Byron Buxton (13), CLE José Ramírez (12), LAA Jared Walsh (12), BOS Rafael Devers (11) and NYY Luke Voit (10).
- + Including postseason, Arozarena has 19 HR in 51 games (45 starts) in a Rays uniform, and 6 HR in 11 games against the Yankees.

GLASS CEILING—Tyler Glasnow is unbeaten in his last 10 regular-season starts, going 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (58-IP, 20-ER) and 87 SO...the Rays are 9-1 over this stretch, with the only loss coming on April 6 at BOS when Glasnow left with a 3-1 lead...Glasnow has allowed 1 run on 5 hits, 2 BB and 15 SO in 2 starts this season and is one of six pitchers in Rays history to start a season with consecutive starts of 6 IP (or more) and 1 run (or fewer), most recently Jake Faria (3) after his call up in June 2017.

BANNER YEAR—Last season the Rays won the American League pennant for the second time in franchise history (2008), but lost the World Series to the Dodgers...the Rays won the AL East for the third time (2008, 2010)...after a shortened 60-game regular season, they set a major league record by playing 20 postseason games, thanks in part to the expanded playoff format...the Rays were the ninth team in major league history to play a "winner take all" game in the Division Series (won 2-1 over the Yankees) and League Championship Series (won 4-2 over the Astros) but only the third to win both, joining the 2012 Giants and 1981 Dodgers.

TARGET ON OUR BACKS—Since the introduction of the Wild Card in 1995, three teams have repeated as AL Champions...the Yankees won the AL pennant in four consecutive years from 1998–2001, the Rangers won it in both 2010-11 and the Royals in both 2014-15...in the Wild Card era, teams losing in the World Series have won 57.1 pct. of their games the following season, which equates to a 92-70 record over a 162-game season...64 pct. (16 of 25) of these World Series losers have won at least 90 games the next season, and 28 pct. (7 of 25) have won at least 100 games...76 pct. (19 of 25) made the playoffs the next season, including the last 11 in a row...64 pct. (16 of 25) won their division, 44 pct. (11 of 25) won a postseason series and 12 pct. (3 of 25) made it back to the World Series.

SINGLE-GAME TICKETS—Single-game tickets for the first two homestands are on sale in the MLB Ballpark app and <a href="raysbaseball.com">raysbaseball.com</a>...tickets are available in socially distant pods of up to six seats...to accommodate 6 feet of separation between pods, the 300 Level of Tropicana Field was reopened, and the overall capacity will be limited to about 9,000 fans.

Fans will be asked to participate in health and safety measures by wearing face masks at all times, except while actively eating or drinking in their seats, and washing hands frequently.

TWO DISTINCT ERAS—Since becoming the Rays in 2008, the Rays own the 5th-best record in baseball at 1,085-929 (.539) and have made six trips to the postseason, incl. three AL East division titles (2020, 2010, 2008) and two World Series appearances (2020, 2008)...during this span, only three clubs (Dodgers, Yankees, Cardinals) have reached the postseason more often, and only two (Dodgers, Giants) have competed in more World Series...the Rays have seven 90-win seasons since 2008, a number matched by only three other teams in baseball: Dodgers (8), Red Sox (7) and Yankees (7)...this success comes after the Devil Rays amassed the majors' worst record at 645-972 (.399) over the club's first decade of existence.

**LAST START**—On Tues at BOS, took no decision despite allowing 1 run in 6 IP and leaving the game with a 3-1 lead...his only run allowed came in the 1st inning after a leadoff double to **Alex Verdugo** and a 2-out wild pitch...following a perfect 2nd, stranded runners in scoring position in three of his last 4 IP, including the 6th when he struck out **Christian Vázquez** on a 98.1 mph fastball with runners on first and third to end his start...his line: ND, 6 IP, 4 H, 1 R/ER, 2 BB, 9 SO, 1 WP, 97 pitches, 60 str.

- + Has made consecutive starts of 6+ IP and 1 run (or fewer) for the second time in his career, following April 5-10, 2019 at SF/CWS.
- + Was the fifth time in his last 8 starts recording 9 SO (or more).

**HOT START**—Is one of six pitchers in Rays history to start a season with consecutive starts of 6 IP (or more) and 1 run (or fewer), first since **Jake Faria** (3) did so after his call up from June 7-18, 2017...is attempting to join Faria as the only Rays to do this in three straight starts to begin a season.

- + Dating back to the end of the 2020 regular season, is unbeaten in his last 10 starts and the Rays have gone 9-1 in those games...during that span, he is 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (58-IP, 20-ER), .183 opp avg. (39-for-213) and 87 SO...his active 5-game winning streak is his longest since a career-high 6-game streak from March 30-May 3, 2019.
- Ranks 2nd in the AL in WHIP (0.58), 3rd in ERA (0.75) and opp avg. (.122), 6th in SO/BB ratio (7.50) and 8th in strikeouts (15).

vs. RANGERS—Has made one career start against the Rangers, recording a win against them on Sep 17, 2018 at Globe Life Park after throwing six scoreless innings, including 4.2 hitless innings to start the game...struck out Adrian Beltré with runners on second and third in the 1st inning to avoid any damage...retired his next 11 BF until an Isiah Kiner-Falefa infield single in the 5th inning, his first hit allowed...worked out of a 2-on, 2-out jam in the 6th by getting a Beltré flyout, his last batter faced.

**2020 IN REVIEW**—In his second full season with the Rays, led the team with 57.1 IP, 91 SO and tied for 2nd with 5 wins behind **Pete Fairbanks** (6)...went 5-0 with a 3.00 ERA (42-IP, 14-ER) and 64 SO in his last 7 starts beginning on Aug 19...this lowered his season ERA from 7.04 to 4.08.

+ His avg. fastball velocity, according to StatCast, was 96.9 mph, 2nd in the AL (min. 200 BF) behind CWS **Dylan Cease** (97.5)...reached 100 mph three times, including a career-high 100.9 mph on Sep 18...got 73 swings-and-misses against his fastball, 4th in the AL.

 $\underline{\textbf{CRAZY CURVE}}-\text{In }2020,$  limited batters to a .120 avg. (10-for-83) in atbats ending with the curveball, 5th in the majors (min. 25 AB)...recorded a

majors-most 48 SO on a swing-and-miss against the curveball...totaled 58 SO with the curve, 2nd in the majors behind HOU Framber Valdez (60).

+ His 7 SO with the curveball this season rank 4th in the majors behind MIN José Berríos (10), MIL Freddy Peralta (8), ATL Drew Smyly (8)...has achieved this despite throwing it 10.3 pct. of the time.

**ROLLIN' AS A RAY**—Since making his Rays debut on Aug 1, 2018, he is 12-7 with a 3.15 ERA (185.2-IP, 65-ER) and 246 SO in 36 starts...has a 2.76 BB/9 IP ratio and .193 opp avg. (130-for-673) since the trade, compared to a 5.79 BB/9 IP ratio and .273 opp avg. (150-for-550) with the Pirates.

+ Min. 175 IP, since being acquired by the Rays he ranks 2nd in the AL in opp avg., 3rd in WHIP (1.01) and 4th in SO/9 IP ratio (11.92).

**DOME SWEET DOME**—Is 4-3 with a 3.92 ERA (78-IP, 34-ER) in 16 starts at Tropicana Field since joining the Rays on Aug 1, 2018, but was 2-1 with a 4.85 ERA (26-IP, 14-ER) in 5 starts at home last season...has allowed 3 ER (or fewer) in 14 of his 16 career starts at Tropicana Field while limiting visiting batters to a .229 avg. (67-for-292) with 6 2B, 15 HR and 4.40 SO/BB ratio (110-SO, 25-BB)...the Rays have won six of his last 7 starts here.

KING OF THE K—His 91 SO last season were 4th in the AL behind CLE Shane Bieber (122), CWS Lucas Giolito (97) and NYY Gerrit Cole (94)...min. 50 IP, his 14.28 SO/9 IP ratio led the majors and was the 2nd-highest in club history behind Brad Boxberger (14.47) in 2014...his 81 SO through his first 50 IP of last season were the 2nd-most by a starting pitcher in major league history behind CLE Shane Bieber (82) in 2020.

**POSTSEASON**—Went 2-3 with a 6.28 ERA (28.2-IP, 20-ER) in 6 starts last postseason...his 40 SO were the most by a Rays pitcher in a single postseason and his 48 SO in his postseason career are most in club history.

- + Yielded 9 HR, a major league record for a single postseason.
- + The Rays won his first 3 starts of the postseason and lost the last three...in Game 2 of the ALDS vs. NYY, recorded a Rays postseason-record 10 SO...started the decisive Game 5 of the ALDS against Gerrit Cole...faced the Yankees once through the order and did not allow a run or hit, but walked two and got 2 outs on 3-0 pitches.
- → In Game 1 of the World Series at LAD, became the 11th pitcher in major league history to record 8 SO (or more) and allow 6 BB (or more) in a World Series game...was the first to do so since PHI Steve Carlton (10 SO, 6 BB) in Game 2 of the 1980 World Series vs. KC.
- + According to StatCast, threw 30 postseason pitches at 100 mph (or more), 2nd-most in the majors behind LAD **Brusdar Graterol** (33).
