METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 7-5, last night at loanDepot park...The Mets have won three straight and five of their last six...New York claimed their 20th series victory of the season and their ninth on the road...The team has won three straight road games and four of their last five...The Mets continue their six-game road trip (2-0), heading to Miami (2-0) and across town to Yankee Stadium (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Mets Pitching Coach Justin Willard celebrates his birthday today...As does former Mets player Todd Zeile...We wish them well.

HOW SWEEP IT WOULD BE: The Mets are seeking their fifth sweep of the season...New York swept the Marlins earlier this year from May 29-31 at Citi Field...New York is looking for their first sweep of the Marlins in Miami since July 29-31, 2022.

HANG 10: The Mets are one of only two teams in the ,majors with 10 players who have hit 10 or more homers this year (Francisco Alvarez, Brett Baty, Carson Benge, Bo Bichette, Francisco Lindor, Luis Robert Jr., Marcus Semien, Juan Soto, Tyrone Taylor, Mark Vientos)...The Yankees also feature 10 players...This ties a franchise record, also accomplished in 2019 and 2017.

ONE MORE FOR SOTO: Juan Soto recorded his 24th home run of the season last night in Miami...He is one homer away from 25 for the season... That would mark his seventh season with at least 25 home runs...With one more dinger, Soto would join only 12 others in Major League history to record seven seasons with 25+ homer before turning 28...Only Mike Trout and Eddie Mathews had more such seasons with eight.

ON DEADLINE: The Mets are 20-12 since the trade deadline...Their .625 winning percentage is tied for the second-best mark in the majors during that span, trailing only Philadelphia (21-11, .656)...They are batting .253/.321/.438 with a .759 OPS...Their .438 SLG ranks second, while their .759 OPS and 48 home runs ranks third in the Major Leagues in that span.

WHAT A RELIEF: Over the last three games, the Mets bullpen has tossed 12.1 innings, posting a 0.73 ERA...They have allowed eight hits, one walk and struck out 15...Over 48 games since the All-Star break, Mets relievers are 12-4 with a 2.99 ERA...They have allowed 57 ER in 171.1 innings...Their 2.99 ERA is the second-best mark in the majors, trailing only Milwaukee (2.97).

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has appeared in 14 games since the trade deadline and is 0-1 with a 2.03 ERA (3 ER/13.1 IP), six walks and 15 strikeouts... He has converted all seven save opportunities.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 33-31 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his first relief appearance of the season on September 4 vs. San Francisco (0.1 IP, H) and he recorded one out in the eighth inning...Prior to that appearance, he made his last start on August 31 at Tampa Bay and he earned his first win of the season after firing 5.1 scoreless innings while striking out four (5.1 IP, 5 H, 4 K)...Overall this season, he is 1-3 through six starts (one relief appearance) with a 5.81 ERA (17 ER/26.1 IP).

HOT AND COLD: Has made six starts this season and he is 1-3 with a 5.88 ERA (17 ER/26.0 IP) with 25 strikeouts...In four of his six starts, he has completed at least 4.1 innings and allowed one or zero earned runs while striking out at least four...His last start on August 31, was his longest appearance of the season and his only scoreless start...Marked the second time this season he hasn't allowed an earned run in a start (also: 8/14 vs. WSH)...Over six starts this season, he has posted an 8.65 K/9.

BEEN A LONG TIME: When he earned the win August 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Robert Stock became the fourth pitcher in Major League history to go seven+ calendar years between wins (4/5/19-8/31/26), with both wins coming under the same manager (Andy Green)...The others are Travis Blackley (7/1/04-6/15/12) with Bob Melvin, Jing Johnson (9/10/1919-7/11/27) with Connie Mack and Ray Prim (9/23/35-5/31/43) with Jimmie Wilson...Per Sarah Langs.

FIRST TIME'S THE CHARM: Was selected to the Major League Roster prior to their game on August 2 vs. Miami (5.0 IP, 3 H, ER, 4 K, HR) and he fired 5.0 innings and allowed one run on three hits while striking out four...Marked his first Major League appearance since June 8, 2025 at New York-AL while with Boston and his first start since July 20, 2021 at Cincinnati during his first stint with the Mets.

FAMILIAR FACE: Prior to this season, he made two appearances for the Mets in 2021...Over two starts in July of 2021, he threw 5.0 innings and allowed three runs while striking out six...Made one appearance for the Mets in Major League Spring Training this season, and he fired 3.0 scoreless innings against Houston on February 26.

VS. MIAMI: Will be making his second start against Miami this season, and it will be his third career appearance against the Marlins...He allowed one earned run over 5.0 innings on August 2 vs. Miami (5.0 IP, 3 H, ER, 4 K) in his 2026 season debut...His other appearance against Miami came on September 16, 2020 as a member of the Red Sox and he threw 2.0 scoreless innings in relief...Through 7.0 career innings against Miami, he's allowed one run.

START ME UP: Nine of his 64 Major League appearances have come as a starter, and he has completed at least 4.0 innings in seven of those nine outings...His 5.1 innings on August 31 marked a career-high and he didn't issue a walk for the second time as a starter (also:8/2/26 vs. MIA)...Over nine career starts he is 1-5 with a 6.43 ERA (25 ER/35.0 IP) and 34 strikeouts.

2026: Was placed on the 60-day Injured List on March 18 and was activated on July 19...Over eight total appearances between High-A Brooklyn (six rehab appearances) and Triple-A Syracuse (two appearances) he has pitched to a 2.91 ERA (7 ER/21.1 IP) with 31 strikeouts...His last minor league appearance came on July 25 in a start for Triple-A Syracuse at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, where he fired 3.2 innings and allowed one run on a season-high 66 pitches.

CAREER: In his Major League career, he has pitched in 64 games (nine starts) between San Diego, Boston, Chicago-NL and New York-NL...He has gone 3-7 with a 5.13 ERA (58 ER/101.2 IP) and 102 strikeouts in the big leagues...The 36-year-old Bellevue, Washington Native was originally a Cardinals second-round pick in 2009 out of the University of Southern California.

- Allowed three runs on four hits while recording two outs on September 2 at Tampa Bay (0.2 IP, 4 H, 3 ER).
- Threw a scoreless ninth inning on August 30 (1.0 IP) vs. Houston...Was his first appearance with the Mets this season.
- Was outrighted by Pittsburgh on August 5 and he elected free agency on August 7...Signed a minor league contract with the Mets on August 11...Was selected to the Major League roster on August 28.
- Made five appearances for Triple-A Syracuse and he allowed one run over 7.1 innings across five appearances.
- Was in the Pittsburgh organization earlier this year and he made three appearances for the Pirates, allowing two runs over 2.1 innings while recording three strikeouts...His last Major League appearance came on May 2 vs. Cincinnati.
- Pitched in 13 games (one start) for the Mets last season and he pitched to a 2.16 ERA (4 ER/16.2 IP).
- The 35-year-old has pitched for 11 Major League seasons for the Astros (2016-2020), Diamondbacks (2021-2022), Phillies (2022), Angels (2023), Rays (2023-2024), Mets (2025/2026) and Pirates (2026).

- Fired a scoreless eighth inning on September 7 at Miami (1.0 IP)...18 of his 22 appearances have been scoreless.
- Allowed two runs and recorded two outs on August 31 at Tampa Bay (0.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, BB).
- Picked up his second save of the season and the third of his career after tossing a scoreless ninth inning and striking out two on August 17 vs. San Diego (1.0 IP, 2 K).
- Has pitched 2.0 or more innings four times this season and during those 8.1 innings hasn't allowed a run and only two hits.
- Earned the win on August 10 at Atlanta (2.0 IP, BB) with 2.0 shutout innings.
- Notched his second career save and first as a Met on August 5 at Cleveland (1.0 IP, BB) when he tossed a scoreless 10th inning...His only other Major League save up until that point came on August 13, 2023, at Pittsburgh while with Cincinnati.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
