RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude a six-game homestand against the Angels (2-1) and Tigers (0-2, one to play) today at Tropicana Field...following tomorrow's off day, will commence a brief three-game, weekend road trip in Miami starting Friday before hosting the Red Sox at Tropicana Field next week (June 8-10)...despite dropping three of four and seven of their last nine games, have still won 18 of 28, 24 of 35, and 31 of their last 46 games, holding MLB's best record since April 22 (24-11)...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 25 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18-25...have the best home record in the majors (21-8)...after last night's loss, are 9-2-1 in their last 12 series...have the majors' fifth-easiest remaining schedule (485 opp. winning pct.)...have had a 1.0-game lead in the AL East for the last two days, their smallest since May 10 (1.0)...have spent 31 days leading the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays were shut out, 8-0, last night, with the top four spots in the lineup going a combined 1-for-15 (.067)...it was their third time being blanked this season, joining May 24 at NYY (2-0) and May 8 at BOS (2-0)—in the AL, only the Orioles and Twins (both none) have been shut out fewer times...it marked the Rays largest shutout defeat since Sept. 16, 2023 at BAL (8-0) and was their largest at home since April 18, 2015 vs. NYY (9-0).
- ★ Rays relievers covered 7.1 frames, their second most this season behind April 18 at PIT (9.1IP)...the bullpen has worked 4.0 IP or more in four straight and seven of the last eight games...the four-game streak is tied for their second longest this season behind April 5-11 (6G)...the pen has thrown 120.2 IP since the calendar flipped to May, third in the AL to the Tigers (131.2) and Blue Jays (121.2).
- ★ The loss snapped a streak of six consecutive home series wins, tied for the seventh-longest streak in club history, marking the Rays first time dropping a series at Tropicana Field since April 20-22 vs. CIN...they have dropped four of their last five series with the Tigers on the heels of a 7-1-1 stretch from July 9, 2018-Aug. 6, 2023.
- ★ The Rays staff has a 6.75 ERA (73.1IP, 55ER) over their last eight games since May 25, tied with the Twins for the highest in the AL...they have allowed 65 total runs in that span, their most over an eight-game stretch since July 22-30, 2007 (65)...Rays pitchers have allowed eight runs or more in back-to-back games for the second time this season, joining April 1-3...the staff has been charged with 18 runs this series—their most in any set this season is 26 from May 25-27 at BAL.
- ★ The Rays need to win today to avoid being swept for the second time this season, both of which would come within a three-series span (also: May 25-27 at BAL)...it would mark their first time being swept at home since Aug. 19-20, 2025 vs. NYY at Steinbrenner Field and their first time in a series of three games or more since May 6-8, 2025 vs. PHI...they were last swept at Tropicana Field from Aug. 12-14, 2024 vs. HOU.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays recalled RHP Mason Englert from Triple-A Durham and optioned RHP Trevor Martin to Durham...last night, due to injury, RHP Jonathan Heasley (right elbow stress reaction) was returned to the major league roster and placed on the 15-day IL, effective May 29.

★ This is Englert's second stint with the Rays this season, joining Opening Day—May 9...he was on the 15-day IL from April 20—May 8 (right forearm tightness) before being optioned to Triple-A Durham.

TRICKY NICKY—AL ERA leader Nick Martinez has permitted two runs or fewer in each of his 11 starts, tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak by a traditional starter in the modern era (since 1900) and the longest since LAD Hyun Jin Ryu (14GS) in 2019...MIL Kyle Harrison also has an active 11-start streak...the modern era record is 15 starts, set by DET AL Benton in 1945...the 11-start streak is tied with Blake Snell (Aug. 4—Sept. 29, 2018) for the second longest by a Rays traditional starter at any point in a season, one shy of Alex Cobb's club-record 12-start run from July 9—Sept. 11, 2014...Martinez has gone 5.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer and one or zero walks in a franchise-record seven consecutive starts, the longest streak in the majors since CWS Lance Lynn went seven straight from Aug. 14—Sept. 15, 2022...Ryu holds MLB's last longer streak, an 11-start run from April 20—June 16, 2019...there have been only two longer streaks in AL history: a nine-start stretch from BAL Milt Pappas in 1964 and an eight-start run by MIN Jim Merritt in 1967.

- ★ Martinez has won each of his last five decisions, tied with Shane McClellan (April 25-pres.) for the longest streak by a Ray this season...the last longer single-season streak belongs to Zack Littell (6, April 26—June 6, 2025)...Martinez and McClellan are tied for the AL's longest active streak.
- ★ His 1.62 ERA is the lowest by a traditional starter through his first 11 outings with the Rays, surpassing Drew Rasmussen (2.15, 2021-22), and is the lowest by any traditional starter through his first 11 games with a franchise since NYY Max Fried last season (1.29)...in the Wild Card era (since 1995), the only right-handers with better ERAs through their first 11 starts with a club are Lynn with the White Sox (1.23) in 2021 and HOU Justin Verlander (1.22) from 2017-18.
- ★ The 1.62 ERA is the lowest by a pitcher in his first 11 starts with a franchise at age 35 or older.

HOMER (UN)HAPPY—The Rays have allowed 8 HR over the last two games, their most in a two-game span since Aug. 19-20, 2025 (14)...they have permitted a long ball in four straight, 12 of 13, and 15 of their last 17 games...the staff has been tagged for an AL-most 33 HR in their last 21 games since May 8 on the heels of yielding 1 HR in a nine-game stretch from April 28—May 7...of the 261 runs allowed by Rays pitching, 111 (42.5%) have come on the 71 HR against them, which are fourth most in the AL/eighth most in MLB...over the last four games (May 30-pres.), 20 of the 34 runs (58.8%) they have allowed have come on 13 HR by opponents.

- ★ Between Griffin Jax (2HR) and Steven Matz (3HR), Rays starting pitchers have permitted multiple home runs in back-to-back games for the first time this season...the rotation's last longer streak was three straight starts from May 10-25, 2025...entering the current streak, Rays starters had served up multiple home runs in only three of 56 outings all season.
- ★ The bullpen has yielded a homer in four straight games, all at Tropicana Field, and eight of the last nine games overall...Rays relievers have not had a longer streak since Aug. 22-25, 2025 (5G), and their last longer streak at home came from July 26-Aug. 11, 2023 (5G).

WALKIN' ON THE SUN—The Rays have tallied an MLB-most 88 walks in their last 18 games since May 12, producing a majors'-best 12.3 pct. walk rate in that timeframe...this, compared to 128 walks and an 8.5 pct. walk rate in their first 40 games (Opening Day—May 11), both of which ranked 14th among AL clubs...they have recorded 216 walks through 58 games and are pacing for 603 free passes, which would mark their highest total since a franchise-record 672 walks in 2010.

★ Junior Caminero has drawn a walk in four of five and 10 of his last 14 games, with his 15 walks in the latter span (May 17-pres.) ranking second in the majors to LAA Mike Trout (17).

LA MÁXIMA—Junior Caminero has reached base safely in 12 of 19 PA over his last four games, and 15 of 24 PA in his last four contests...he has reached base at a .432 clip since the beginning of May, third in the majors behind ATH Nick Kurtz (.457) and CHC Michael Busch (.444), after entering the month with a .328 on-base pct...Caminero has hit safely in 10 straight games at Tropicana Field, going 16-for-35 (.457) with 8 XBH, 11 RBI, 12 BB vs. 4 SO, and 10 R in that span, reaching base safely in 28 of 47 PA (.596 OBP)...the 28 TOB are the most in club history across any 10-game span at home, excluding multi-season spans...the franchise record across an 11-game home stretch is 29 TOB, shared by Yandy Diaz (2x, last: Sept. 3-20, 2025) and Carlos Peña (4x, last: Aug. 29—Sept. 19, 2008).

- ★ The MLB leader in average bat speed (79.9 mph), Caminero is slashing .370/.507/.630 (20-for-54) with 8 XBH, 11 RBI, 15 BB vs. 7 SO, and 11 R over his last 15 games, raising his on-base pct. from .333 to .379.
- ★ He leads the AL with 73 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster, third in the majors behind ATL Matt Olson (75) and ATL Michael Harris II (74), and is pacing for 203, which would break Diaz's Statcast era (since 2015) club record established last season (200)...he would join Diaz, ATL Ronald Acuña Jr. (2023), LAD Shohei Ohtani (2024-25), and TOR Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (2024, 2021-22) as the only players to record 200 such batted balls under Statcast.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE—Yandy Diaz is slashing .338/.427/.708 (22-for-65) with 6 2B, 6 HR, 15 RBI, and a 1.134 OPS during a season-high 17-game on-base streak, the third-longest active run in MLB (see table on the right) and his longest since a 27-game run from June 3—July 4, 2025...it marks the eighth-longest streak of his career, one game shy of tying two other streaks for sixth (last: April 15—May 6, 2022)...since the current streak began on May 12, only two players in the majors have better OPS's than Diaz: LAD Shohei Ohtani (1.286) and ATH Nick Kurtz (1.185).

MOTOR CITY KITTIES—The Rays and Tigers wrap up the first leg of a six-game series today before reconvening from Aug. 24-26 at Comerica Park...the Rays need to win this afternoon to avoid being swept by Detroit for the eighth time, first since Sept. 24-26, 2024 at DET, and for the fourth time at Tropicana Field, which would join June 30—July 3, 2016, Sept. 4-6, 2009, and Sept. 3, 2004 (one-game series - 2G postponed due to Hurricane Frances)...a loss would also mark their second time dropping their first three games against the Tigers to begin a season, joining 2011 (5G)...they have lost five of their last six meetings with Detroit and are 4-10 against the club since 2024...the Rays are 5-2-1 in the last eight season sets dating back to 2017, but would need to win the next four matchups to claim this year's series.

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 12th start with the Rays and sixth at home...marks his 292nd career appearance (141st start) and ninth (fifth start) opposite the Tigers...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ Ranks second among MLB qualifiers with a 1.62 ERA (66.2IP, 12ER), behind only PHI Christopher Sanchez (1.47).
- ★ Seven of his 11 starts this season have been quality.
- ★ With a quality start today, Martinez would record his fourth straight QS, tying the longest streak by a Rays pitcher in an age-35-or-older season, matching Corey Kluber (Aug. 17–Sept. 3, 2022), Rich Hill (May 7–25, 2021), and Charlie Morton (2x, last: Sept. 7–25, 2019).
- ★ Martinez has fashioned a 1.05 ERA (25.2IP, 3ER) in day games, the fourth-lowest mark among qualified starters in the majors behind LAA Jose Soriano (0.35ERA), NYY Ryan Weathers (0.66ERA), and TEX Jacob deGrom (0.69ERA).

LAST TIME OUT—Turned in his third straight quality start (May 16–pres.) on May 29 vs. LAA after yielding two earned runs on eight hits with five strikeouts across 7.0 innings...retired his first five batters faced before yielding a pair of singles in the 3rd inning...allowed his two earned runs on Vaughn Grissom and Zach Neto singles before retiring his final five batters...utilized his sinker 48.0 pct. of the time, up from his 32.0 pct. usage so far this season...was one strikeout shy of tying a season high (6SO on April 22 vs. CIN).

- ★ His four-seam fastball averaged 91.3 mph on May 29 vs. LAA, down 1.4 mph from his season average (92.7mph).
- ★ Generated a season-high-tying 10 whiffs alongside April 5 at MIN and May 10 at BOS.
- ★ After fanning leadoff batter Zach Neto, he eclipsed 1,000.0 career innings pitched, becoming one of 49 active pitchers to reach the mark.
- ★ Martinez's 1.52 ERA (29.2IP, 5ER) in May joined teammate Shane McClanahan (1.41ERA/32.0IP, 5ER) as the only Rays duo in franchise history to turn in a 1.55 ERA or lower during May.

ALL IN THE DET-AISL—The veteran right-hander is 2-2 with a 4.63 ERA (23.1IP, 12ER) and 15 strikeouts in eight career appearances (four starts) opposite the Tigers...as a starter, he is 2-2 with a 4.42 ERA (18.1IP, 9ER)...earned a save on July 26, 2022 at DET, one of his eight career saves.

- ★ Martinez is 8-11 with a 4.88 ERA (138.1IP, 75ER) and 103 strikeouts in 38 career appearances (23 starts) vs. AL Central opponents...is 8-9 with a 5.03 ERA (120.0IP, 67ER) with 87 strikeouts across those 23 starts...is 1-0 with a 0.69 (13.0IP, 1ER) across two starts against AL Central clubs this season, posting quality starts on April 5 at MIN and April 28 at CLE.

ON TROP OF THE WORLD—In five starts at home this season, Martinez is 3-0 with a 1.47 ERA (30.2IP, 5ER) and 23 strikeouts...his ERA at home this year ranks third among AL starters (min. 25.0IP), trailing CWS Davis Martin (1.21ERA), and DET Casey Mize (1.27ERA)...is one of five AL starters to have allowed five runs or fewer at home this season (min. 25.0IP)...joins teammate Shane McClanahan (5-0) as Rays arms with three wins or more without a loss at the Trop this season.

- ★ Martinez's 1.47 ERA (30.2IP, 5ER) is the lowest mark through a traditional starter's first five home starts with the franchise in club history (min. 25.0IP)...the last traditional starter with a lower ERA under the same parameters was CWS Adrian Houser (1.38ERA) in 2025.

GONE STREAKING—Martinez has posted a 1.62 ERA (66.2IP, 12ER) in 2026, the fourth-lowest ERA by a traditional starter through their first 11 starts with a franchise after turning 35 season since the start of the live-ball era, trailing WSH Johnny Niggeling (1943, 1.25ERA), BAL Hoyt Wilhelm (1958, 1.34ERA), DET Doyle Alexander (1987, 1.53 ERA), and NYY Phil Niekro (1984, 1.60ERA)...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first 11 starts this season, the longest season-opening streak by an MLB starter age 35 or older in the live-ball era (since 1920)...his 11-start streak is tied for the longest in the majors this year with MIL Kyle Harrison and is the longest by a traditional starter in Rays history to begin a season...is also the longest such streak by an AL pitcher age 35 or older at any point in a season since TEX Jacob deGrom posted 14 straight from April 18–July 1, 2025.

WHOLE LOTTA RED—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Fastball Run Value (10) and Offspeed Run Value (7) are in the 99th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (13) is in the 96th percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value, 0 Fastball Run Value, and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.

- ★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.1 pct. hard-hit rate is third lowest in the majors (min. 1.000BF) behind NYY Ryan Yarbrough (29.7 pct.) and TOR Tyler Rogers (29.8 pct.).

- ★ Opposing hitters have an average exit velocity of 86.7 mph since the beginning of 2023, ranking fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1.000BF) behind LAA Kyle Hendricks (85.8), SD Michael King (86.5), and NYY Max Fried (86.7).

NO FREE 90S—Since the start of 2024, Martinez has issued only 72 walks, the recording the fifth-lowest walks per 9.0 innings (1.73) in the majors during that stretch (min. 250.0IP)...the veteran right-hander trails only SEA Bryan Woo (1.50), DET Tarik Skubal (1.55), SEA George Kirby (1.59), and CHC Shota Imanaga (1.67) during that span...min. 50.0 IP this season, his walks per 9.0 innings ranks second in the majors behind NYY Cam Schlichter (1.53).

NOT JUST QUALITY—On April 28 at CLE, Martinez became the oldest Ray to turn in consecutive ultra quality starts (7.0IP or more with 2ER or fewer) in franchise history (April 22–28) and the oldest pitcher to turn the trick since HOU Justin Verlander registered five straight (May 10–June 1, 2019).

- ★ The last Ray to record back-to-back ultra quality starts was Taj Bradley between May 27–June 1, 2025.
- ★ Turned in his third ultra quality start of the season in his last outing on May 29 vs. LAA, tied for fourth most in the AL behind KC Michael Wacha (5), CLE Gavin Williams (5), and TEX Nathan Eovaldi (4).
