**HERE'S THE RUB:** The Detroit Tigers and Toronto Blue Jays today play the rubber match of their three-game series at Comerica Park after trading last at-bat wins in the first two games ... following yesterday's setback, the Tigers have now lost nine of their last 11 games and 14 of their last 20 since a 10-3 stretch prior to this rough patch upped Detroit's record to 14-12 on April 23 ... after today's finale, the Tigers wrap their homestand with four games against Cleveland starting tomorrow.

- The Tigers are five games into a run of 13-games-in-13-days, matching the club's longest stretch of the season without a day off thus far ... the Tigers are scheduled for one additional 13-day stretch this year plus a season-long 14-games-in-14-days stretch from June 19-July 2.
- Yesterday was Detroit's 14th one-run game of the season (5-9), tied for third-most in baseball ... it was also Detroit's first day game loss at home, dropping the club to 6-1 in such contests.

**HOME AND ROAD IS NIGHT AND DAY:** The Tigers are now 13-7 at home this season, the fifth-best home record in all of baseball and a far cry from their 7-19 road record to date, last in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 5-1-0 in their six home series and 1-6-1 in their eight road series so far this season ... the Tigers aim to win six of their first seven home series for the second year in a row.

**GREENE STREAK PART I:** Riley Greene has reached base safely in 26-straight games, extending his career high and the second-longest active streak in all of baseball behind only Nick Kurtz (39 games) ... it is the longest streak by a Tiger this season and the longest by any Tiger since Jeimer Candelario had a 29-game on-base streak from April 29-June 3, 2021.

- This run marks Greene's second streak of reaching base safely in 16 or more games already this season, as he started off by reaching base safely in his first 16 games of the campaign.
- Greene has the longest streak by a Tigers left-handed hitter since Prince Fielder tallied a 29-game on-base streak from August 8-September 9, 2012.

**GREENE STREAK PART II:** Riley Greene yesterday also extended his hitting streak to 11 games, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Greene is batting .439 (18-for-41) with a .500 on-base percentage and 1.085 OPS during this run ... for Greene, it's his longest hitting streak of the season and second-longest by a Tiger in 2026 (Kevin McGonigle, 13-game hitting streak, April 15-29).

**IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** Kevin McGonigle has a 2.4 bWAR through his first 44 major league games, the fourth-best mark in the A.L. this season and trailing only Bobby Witt Jr (3.0 bWAR), Aaron Judge (2.6 bWAR) and Willyer Abreu (2.5 bWAR) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

**MILESTONE FOR JACK:** Jack Flaherty this afternoon makes his 200th career major league appearance ... today marks Flaherty's 194th major league start, tied for 36th most among all active pitchers ... his 1,174 strikeouts rank 32nd among active pitchers while his 10.27 strikeouts per nine innings ranks ninth among active pitchers ... today Flaherty takes aim at his first win since September 10, 2025 at the New York Yankees

- Flaherty is winless in his last 11 starts dating to September 17 ... during this streak, however, Flaherty has averaged 2.64 runs of support per start, tied for the third-lowest mark in all of baseball among pitchers with at least 10 starts in this span.
- Despite the winless streak, Flaherty still ranks ninth in the A.L. by averaging 10.34 strikeouts per nine innings during this span (starting September 17, min. 45 innings), the best mark of any pitcher on the Tigers ... Tarik Skubal is at 10.08 strikeouts per nine innings and Casey Mize is at 9.55 strikeouts per nine innings since last September 17.

**IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE:** Riley Greene is now batting .387 (43-for-111) with 10 doubles, four homers, 17 RBI, a .477 on-base percentage, a .586 slugging percentage and a 1.063 OPS in his last 32 games over the past five+ weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in on-base percentage and batting average and is fourth in the majors in OPS in this span.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** Detroit has an extra-base hit in 44-straight games dating to March 28, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 38-straight games ... this is Detroit's longest extra-base hit streak since a 44-game run from August 4-September 23, 2025 ... the Tigers' last streak of more than 44 games?: a 60-game run from August 17, 2024-April 19, 2025.

- Detroit has an extra-base hit in 48-straight home games dating to July 27, 2025, the longest active home streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 25-straight home games ... it's Detroit's longest home extra-base hit streak since a 50-game run from April 16-August 9, 2019.

**AND FINALLY:** The Tigers yesterday dropped to 0-3 in extra-inning contests this season, joining the Yankees (0-2) and the Dodgers (0-0) as the lone teams winless in extras this season ... the Tigers last reached mid-May without an extra-inning win in 2017 when they picked up their first extra-innings victory that season on July 16.

- Makes his 200th career major league appearance and 194th major league start today against Toronto...his 194 starts will be tied for 36th most among all active pitchers while his 1,174 strikeouts rank 32nd among active pitchers and his 10.27 strikeouts per nine innings ranks ninth among active pitchers.
- Reached 1,000 career innings pitched in his last start against Minnesota...allowed just one earned run on five hits and three walks while striking out six over 5.2 innings in the outing.
- Started 31 games for the Tigers last season with an 8-15 record...posted a 4.64 ERA (83ER/161.0IP) and 188 strikeouts.
- Made his 11th-career playoff start on Oct. 7, which was one more than the rest of the Tigers post-season roster combined at the time last season.
- In 14 starts since the beginning of July last year, had a 4.35 ERA but his FIP was much lower at 3.06, the fifth-lowest FIP in the A.L. in that span among qualifying pitchers.
- Had four straight quality starts from May 22 - June 8, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4ER/24.2IP) over that span...came one out shy of a quality start on May 16 against Toronto, allowing two earned runs over 5.2 frames.
- Struck out José Ramírez to end the first inning on May 22 for his 1,000th career strikeout, becoming the 567th player in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts.

- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Earned the win on Sunday Night Baseball on May 10 against Kansas City, delivering a perfect 2.1 innings with a strikeout.
