**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell Giants, 5-1, last night in San Francisco...The Mets have dropped three straight after winning six straight...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 12-6...The Mets are in the midst of their second trip of the season, a six-game trip (2-3) to Los Angeles-NL (2-1) and San Francisco (0-2)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning home for a seven-game home stand against the Cardinals (three games) and Cubs (four games).

**GIANTS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have taken the season series from the Giants in each of the last two years...The Mets have won the season series against the Giants in five of the last seven seasons they've matched up against each other.

**THE BIG APPLE TV+:** Friday's game against the St. Louis Cardinals will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+...Fans can access the game by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** In 16 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .277/.345/.423 with 89 runs, 28 doubles, one triple, 17 home runs, 52 walks with an .768 OPS...Their .277 average is the best in the majors, while their .349 OBP is second-best and their .777 OPS is third-best... That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

**ONE AWAY:** Starling Marte is one hit away from 1,500 for his career... He would become the sixth player born in the Dominican to record 1,500 hits and 300 steals.

**ADAM'S SONG:** After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made six scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit or a walk in those 6.1 innings, striking out 11 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (2 ER/8.1 IP) this season.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Starling Marte is batting .348 (24-69) with 13 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, six steals with a .905 OPS in 16 games since April 6...He has safely hit in 13 of those 16 games...The Mets are 12-6 in that span...He is 9-20 with three-extra base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...Overall, Marte is batting .305/.347/.474 with eight extra-base hits in 23 contests in 2024.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** New York owns the third-lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.64 (83 ER/205.0 IP) mark...Their 218 strikeouts are tied for third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.99 ERA (30 ER/90.1 IP) with 40 walks and 111 strikeouts... Their 2.99 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit...Their 111 strikeouts from the bullpen lead the major leagues.

**RETURN OF THE MANAEA:** Sean Manaea returns to Oracle Park after spending the 2023 season with the Giants...He has appeared in 23 games at the ballpark, including 11 starts and has gone 3-7 with a 3.44 ERA (33 ER/86.1 IP) with 26 walks and 90 strikeouts...He has made 11 starts against the Giants in his career, going 3-3 with a 3.00 ERA (20 ER/60.0 IP) with 16 walks and 47 strikeouts.

**TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT:** As a team, the Mets are batting .270/.336/.435 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .270 average is sixth in the major leagues, and fifth in the National League... Their .435 SLG ranks sixth in MLB...This compares to a .237/.319/.357 slashline against righties.

**RANK AND FILE:** Pete Alonso is now one home run away from 200 for his career...He is rising the leader-board in several categories in franchise history:

**SWING AND NO MISS:** Mets batters have struck out 171 times this year...That is the second-fewest in the major leagues and the fewest in the NL...Overall, the team has posted an 19.4 strikeout percentage, which is the third-lowest in the majors and second in the National League...Jeff McNeil ranks fifth in the majors, striking out only 10.6% of the time.

**REEDING RAINBOW:** On Saturday, Reed Garrett earned his first career save yesterday...He has made six appearances this year and has yet to allow a run in 10.2 innings...He is 3-0 and has allowed two unearned runs, five hits and three walks...He has struck out 21 of the 41 batters he faced...His 21 strikeouts are the most in the major leagues.

**SAVE ME:** Edwin Diaz has recorded 100 saves as a member of the Mets...He is the sixth player in franchise history to record at least 100 saves with the Club...His current save streak of 26 games is the longest active in the majors...It is his second-longest of his career... Diaz career-best is a 28 save streak from June 2-August 15, 2018.

**THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS:** Jeff McNeil is a .342 (25-73) hitter with 15 runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI with a .407 OBP and a .521 SLG in 19 games at Oracle Park...Harrison Bader is 14-56 with six extra-base hits in 17 games at the ballpark...Pete Alonso has homered seven times in 16 games at the ballpark.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York is in the midst of their second road trip of the year...The team is 6-5 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .269/.338/.409 on the road this year...Their .269 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401... The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

### MANAEA NEWS & NOTES

**WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA:** In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.

**SUCCESSFUL SEAN:** In his first two starts as a Met, Manaea allowed one run over 11.0 innings...He joined Harry Parker, Masato Yoshii, Dillon Gee and Chris Bassitt as the only starters in franchise history to allow one or zero runs through their first two career starts with the Mets...Manaea allowed only four hits in his first two start with the club, tied with Rick Reed, Bruce Chen and Kazuhisa Ishii for the fewest hits allowed by a Met in their first two games with the club (Min. 10.0 IP)...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Bassitt, Steven Matz and Kodai Senga for the fifth-most in franchise history by a pitcher through in their first two games with the club...Only Pedro Martínez (21), Aaron Harang (18), Matt Harvey (18) and Pedro Astacio (16) had more strikeouts through their first two games as a Met.

**I USED TO WORK HERE:** Last Season, Manaea appeared in 37 games (10 starts) with the San Francisco Giants...Made his first start of the season vs. Kansas City on April 8 and allowed one run over 6.0 innings while tallying eight strikeouts...Was a starter in six of his first eight games of the season before becoming a full-time reliever on May 16...Tied a season-high eight strikeouts in just 3.2 innings of relief on May 22 at Minnesota... Became the first MLB left-hander to throw at least 80 pitches and strike out eight+ batters in a scoreless relief outing since Randy Johnson struck out 16 in 7.0 innings on July 19, 2001... Courtesy of *OptaSTATS*... Did not allow a home run in a 53.2 inning stretch from May 22 through his first inning of work on August 21 at Philadelphia...Rejoined the rotation on September 12 and started his final four games of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP)...Pitched to a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (Min. 50.0 IP)...In 23 career games (11 starts) at Oracle Park, Manaea has a 3.44 ERA (33 ER/86.1 IP) and 90 strikeouts.

**SWEEPIN SAMOAN:** At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first four starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are 2-12 with eight strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch.

**SUPERB SOUTHPAW:** Since his debut season, 2016, Manaea ranks in the top-10 among left-handed pitchers in several categories including innings (1022.1, seventh), wins (66, ninth) and strikeouts (946, eighth)...In 2021, Manaea was tied for the AL lead with 32 games started and ranked eight in the AL with a career-high 194 strikeouts...In 2018, Manaea ranked sixth in the AL in WHIP with a 1.08 clip (Min. 150.0 IP).

**NO HITS FOR YOU:** On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to *Elias*, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JOSÉ BUTTÓ (0-0, 1.65)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed two runs over 4.1 innings in the Mets' 6-4 victory at Los Angeles-NL on April 20...Issued five walks and struck out six batters...Has recorded six or more strikeouts in each of his first three starts of the season.

**QUALITY EATS:** Dating back to September 6, 2023, Buttó has pitched to a 2.68 ERA (13 ER/43.2 IP) over eight starts...Five of those starts have been quality starts and the right-hander has held opposing batters to a .186 (29-156) average during that span.

- Is one homer shy from 200 for his career...Would join Darryl Strawberry (252), David Wright (242) and Mike Piazza as the only Mets with 200 or more homers...Will play in his 708th career game today...Is seeking to become the fourth-fastest player in major league history to reach the 200-career home run mark...Ryan Howard (658 games), Aaron Judge (671 games) and Ralph Kiner (706 games) have reached the 200-career home run mark in the fewest amount of games...Courtesy of *Elias*.
- Is batting .347/.429/.741 with five home runs, three doubles, nine RBI, 12 runs and seven walks over his last 13 games.
- Since April 9, is tied for third in the majors in homers (five) and runs (12), sixth in total bases (35), sixth in SLG (.711), tied for sixth in extra-base hits (eight), and seventh in OPS (1.143) (Min. 30 plate appearances).
- Is tied for third in the majors with seven home runs and tied for 11th in runs with 18.
- Was named NL Player of the Week for the period ending April 14...Batted .429 (9-21) with four homers, seven RBI, eight runs and seven walks during the week...Was his fourth career NL player of the week selection (Also: 6/24/19, 9/26/22 and 7/31/23).
- Went 3-3 with a two homers and three RBI on April 13 vs. Kansas City...Was his 20th career multi-homer game, the third most such games in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21)...Are the second most such games since 2019 behind only Aaron Judge.
- Hit a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning in the second game of a doubleheader on April 4 vs. Detroit...Was his 500th career RBI...Became the 10th Met to reach the 500-career RBI mark...José Reyes and Cleon Jones are next (521)...Is the third player in major league history to record 194 or more home runs and 500 or more RBI within their first 690 games joining Ralph Kiner and Ryan Howard...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein...His 199 home runs and 510 RBI are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

- Is batting .348/.384/.522 with three homers, three doubles, 13 runs, 11 RBI and six stolen bases over his last 16 games...Is tied for second in the majors in hits (24) and tied for eighth in the majors in runs (13) since April 6...His nine multi-hit efforts during that span are most in the majors.
- Is fourth in the majors with a .370 (17-46) road average (Min. 40 at-bats).
- Had eight RBI in three games from April 17-20...Is the most he has had in any three-game span of his career.
- Went 2-5 with a three-run homer and an RBI single on April 20 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his first four-RBI performance since May 30, 2022.
