TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 19, 2011: In a 6-4 Yankees win over the Twins, Mariano Rivera records a perfect ninth inning at Yankee Stadium for his 602nd career save, surpassing Trevor Hoffman's previous Major League record of 601.

Sept. 19, 2007: Andy Pettitte (7.2IP, 7H, 1R) out-duels Baltimore's Brian Burres in a 2-1 win at Yankee Stadium, marking the left-hander's 200th career victory. Mariano Rivera records the save, his 30th of the season.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 20, 2022: Aaron Judge hits his 60th HR of the season in the ninth inning vs. Pittsburgh, tying Babe Ruth (60HR in 1927) for the second-most HR in a single season in Yankees history and American League history, trailing only Roger Maris' 61HR in 1961. Judge also becomes just the sixth player in Major League history (ninth time) to hit at least 60 home runs in a single season.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin their final homestand of the season tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Toronto (through Thurs.)...will also play a three-game series vs. Arizona this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 5-2 on their recent seven-game road trip, winning three-of-four games at Boston and winning two-of-three at Pittsburgh.

- **Have won three of their last four games and six of their last eight games** (since 9/10).
- **Since 8/28, have posted a Major League-best 14-6 (.700) record.**
- Are 16-9 in their last 25 games (since 8/23).
- Eight of the Yankees' last 10 wins have been come-from-behind wins (since 9/2).
- Have won five of their last six series (since 8/28).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees fell to the Pirates, 3-2, on Sunday at PNC Park...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.2IP, 6H, 3ER, 0BB, 10K, 1HR, 1WP) took the loss despite allowing just 3ER in 6.2IP...struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout...**1B DJ LeMahieu** (1-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the sixth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning...**C Austin Wells** (1-for-4, 1 double) and **CF Estevan Florial** (1-for-2, 1R) were the only other Yankees to pick up hits...**3B Oswald Peraza** (0-for-2, 2BB) extended his career-high on-base streak to 10 games...**RHP Randy Vásquez** (1.1IP, 2H) tossed 1.1 scoreless innings of relief.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.04 ERA (142.0IP, 48ER) in their last 27 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of those 27 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 20 of those starts.

ON A ROLL: INF **Oswald Peraza** has hit .333/.358/.490 (17-for-51) with 3R, 5 doubles, 1HR and 6RBI in his last 13 games (since 9/2)...also owns a career-high 10-game on-base streak (since 9/6).

GOT YOUR NUMBER: INF **Gleyber Torres** has hit .400/.429/.600 (8-for-20) with 1 double, 1HR and 1BB in his career vs. Toronto's Yusei Kikuchi...INF **DJ LeMahieu** owns a career .333/.417/.429 slash line with 2 doubles and 3BB against Kikuchi.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge has hit 32 career home runs vs. the Blue Jays, his second-most against any club (39HR vs. Baltimore)...**are the most by any Yankee vs. the Blue Jays all-time**...are the third-most HR by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017, trailing his own 39HR vs. Baltimore and Mike Trout's 33HR vs. Seattle.

- **Has hit 4HR in his last four games vs. the Blue Jays** (since 5/15/23).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 32HR this season are the fifth-most in the AL and his 78BB rank sixth.**
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 43BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (53).
- Has 11HR in his last 24 games vs. the AL East (since 5/13).

WHERE'S WALDO: INF/OF **Oswaldo Cabrera** is batting .320/.433/.520 (8-for-25) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB in his last seven games (since 9/10).

SCHMIDT'S CREEK: RHP **Clarke Schmidt** will make his 31st appearance (30th start) of the season tonight...is 8-4 with a 3.91 ERA (106.0IP, 46ER) and 94K over his last 21 appearances (20 starts) since 5/19.

- **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 23 starts this season, tied for the third-most such starts in the AL and tied for the fourth-most such starts in the Majors,** trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (27), Minnesota's Sonny Gray (27) and teammate Gerrit Cole (26).
- Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of his last 20 starts (since 5/19), 21 of his last 23 starts (since 5/3) and 22 of his last 25 starts (since 4/23).

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF **Anthony Volpe** hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning on Sunday at Pittsburgh...**seven of his last 9HR and 10 of his 21HR this season have either tied the game (five) or given the Yankees the lead (five).**

- **His 21HR are tied for the sixth-most by a rookie in franchise history.**...trails Aaron Judge's 52HR in 2017, Joe DiMaggio's 29HR in 1936, Miguel Andújar's 27HR in 2018, Joe Gordon's 25HR in 1938 and Gleyber Torres' 24HR in 2018...Kevin Maas also hit 21HR in 1990.
- **His 21 career home runs are the seventh-most by a Yankee prior to his 23rd birthday in franchise history**...trails Mickey Mantle (84HR from 1951-54), Joe DiMaggio (75HR from 1936-37), Gleyber Torres (62HR from 2018-19), Joe Pepitone (34HR from 1962-63), Ben Chapman (27HR from 1930-31) and Lou Gehrig (25HR from 1923-26).
- **Is the fourth Yankees shortstop in franchise history to hit at least 21HR in a season** (min. 50% games at SS), joining Derek Jeter (24HR in 1999, 23HR in 2004 and 21HR in 2001), Didi Gregorius (27HR in 2018 and 25HR in 2017) and Gleyber Torres (38HR in 2019).
- Ranks fifth among American League rookies and tied for eighth among Major League rookies in home runs.

BOUNCING BACK: LHP **Carlos Rodón** allowed 3ER over 6.2 innings on Sunday at Pittsburgh...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in five of his last six starts (since 8/22).

- **Struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout.**

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have not allowed a run in their last 9.1 innings (since the seventh inning on Friday)...have posted a Major League-best 3.28 ERA this season...**are one of two bullpens in the Majors to post an ERA under 3.50** (Milwaukee-3.49).

- Also lead the Majors with a .217 opponents' BA...rank second in the Majors in HR/9.0IP (0.86) and third in WHIP (1.21).

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a **9.15 PA/BB ratio** and a **4.04 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...**their 242 walks since the All-Star break are the most in the AL and second-most in the Majors,** trailing only Los Angeles-NL (244)...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86), and 23rd in walks (279).

LEMACHINE: INF **DJ LeMahieu** hit an RBI double in the sixth inning on Sunday at Pittsburgh...is batting .364/.391/.500 (8-for-22) with 4R, 3 doubles, 5RBI and 1BB in his last five games (since 9/12-61).

- Has reached base in 15 of his last 16 games (since 8/30), 33 of his last 36 games (since 8/1), 50 of his last 55 games (since 7/4) and 57 of his last 64 games (since 6/23).
- Is a career .332/.386/.526 (89-for-268) batter with 42R, 20 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 31RBI, 22BB and 4SB in 69 games vs. the Blue Jays...in 66 games vs. Toronto as a Yankee, has hit .336/.391/.533 (87-for-259) with 42R, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 31RBI, 22BB and 4SB...owns the highest BA among players with at least 100PA against the Blue Jays as a Yankee (next: Oscar Gamble, .331, 48-for-145).
- 11 of his last 24H (since 8/23) have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 7HR).

GLEYBER DAY: INF **Gleyber Torres** is batting .310/.404/.557 (49-for-158) with 27R, 12 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI, 23BB, 2HP and 5SB in 42 games (since 8/1)...has hit safely in 29 of those games and has reached base safely in 35 of those contests.

- Since 7/6, is batting .305/.375/.521 (72-for-236) with 37R, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 29RBI, 26BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 61 games.
- Has recorded a career-high 62BB in 147 games this season.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers retired 27 straight batters from the first out in the third inning on Saturday through the second inning on Sunday...have posted a 2.92 ERA (74.0IP, 24ER) and 83K over their last eight games (since 9/10).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (9-8, 4.56 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his 31st appearance (30th start) of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Toronto...the 27-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...last pitched in Game 2 of Thursday's doubleheader at Boston, allowing 4R/3ER over 5.1IP (7H, 3BB, 3K, 1HR, 1HP) without recording a decision...is 8-4 with a 3.91 ERA (106.0IP, 46ER) and 94K over his last 21 appearances (20 starts) since 5/19...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 18 of his last 20 starts (since 5/19), 20 of his last 23 starts (since 5/3) and 21 of his last 25 starts (since 4/23) ... his 23 starts with 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the third-most such starts in the AL and tied for the fourth-most such starts in the Majors this season ... has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 17 of his last 20 starts (since 5/19) and 20 of his last 25 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season**...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last four starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season (4/1-8/20)...made his second career Opening Day roster in 2023 (also 2022)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched in Game 2 of Thursday's doubleheader at Boston, allowing 4R/3ER over 5.1IP (7H, 3BB, 3K, 1HR, 1HP) without recording a decision...his 3BB matched his career high (ninth time).

- ✦ Marked just the second time in his last 20 starts (since 5/19) that he has allowed 4R-or-more (also 8R allowed on 8/14 at Atlanta).

VS. TORONTO: **Has not allowed an earned run in four career appearances (one start) vs. Toronto**...has gone 0-2 with 4R/0ER allowed over 8.1IP (5H, 4BB, 12K, 2HR) in those games.

- ✦ Made his first career start vs. the Blue Jays on 4/23 at Yankee Stadium, taking the loss despite allowing 3R/0ER with a career-high-tying 8K over 5.2IP (3H, 1BB, 2HR).
- ✦ Has made 11 starts vs. AL East opponents this season, going 2-4 with a 4.31 ERA (56.1IP, 27ER) and 52K...is 4-8 with one save and a 3.86 ERA (86.1IP, 75H, 46R/37ER, 31BB, 78K, 12HR) in 29 career appearances (13 starts) vs. the AL East.

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 4-5 with a 3.94 ERA (77.2IP, 34ER) and 74K in 16 appearances (15 starts) at home this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts.

- ✦ Has made 31 appearances (17 starts) in his career at Yankee Stadium, going 6-7 with one save and a 3.80 ERA (109.0IP, 99H, 54R/46ER, 32BB, 104K, 16HR) in those games.
- ✦ Has tossed 5.0IP-or-more in each of his last nine home starts (since 5/25) and in 11 of his 15 home starts this season...has also allowed 3R-or-fewer in nine consecutive home starts (since 5/25) and in 13 of his 15 home starts this season.

2023: Has made 30 appearances (29 starts) this season, going 9-8 with a 4.56 ERA (146.0IP, 154H, 83R/74ER, 41BB, 142K, 21HR)...**his 23 starts with 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the third-most such starts in the AL and tied for the fourth-most such starts in the Majors this season.**

- ✦ **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 18 of his last 20 starts (since 5/19), 20 of his last 23 starts (since 5/3) and 21 of his last 25 starts (since 4/23).**
- ✦ Is 8-4 with a 3.91 ERA (106.0IP, 46ER) and 94K over his last 21 appearances (20 starts) since 5/19.
- ✦ **Has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 17 of his last 20 starts (since 5/19) and 20 of his last 25 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season**...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last four starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season (4/1-8/20).
- ✦ Had a 14-start streak of 3R-or-fewer allowed from 5/19-8/8, marking the fourth-longest such streak in the Majors this season, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell's 21-start streak (5/25-present), Minnesota's Sonny Gray's 17-start streak (4/1-7/2) and Cleveland's Tanner Bibee's 16-start streak (6/18-present).
- ✦ Recorded a 10-start undefeated streak from 6/11-8/8, going 6-0 with a 3.42 ERA (52.2IP, 20ER) in that span.
- ✦ Made his first relief appearance on 7/9 vs. Chicago-NL (0.2IP, 1K)...marked his first relief appearance since 10/4/22-G2 at Texas.
- ✦ Tossed a career-high 6.2IP on 8/26 at Tampa Bay.
- ✦ Did not allow a HR in four straight starts from 5/14-31, marking the longest homerless stretch of his career *as a starter* (previous: three straight starts from 6/16-9/3/22).
- ✦ In his eighth start of the season on 5/9 vs. Oakland, earned his first win of the season after allowing just 2ER over a career-high-tying 6.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR, 1WP)...marked his first career win *as a starter*...reached 100.0 career innings in the first inning.
- ✦ Struck out Ezequiel Duran (swinging) in the fifth inning on 4/28 at Texas for his 100th career strikeout...struck out Spencer Torkelson (swinging) in the fourth inning on 8/31 at Detroit for his 200th career strikeout.
