METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Diamondbacks, 6-5, in 10-innings last night...The Mets have won five of their last six games...The Mets continue a six-game road trip to Arizona (1-0) and St. Louis (three games)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Thursday before beginning their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are looking for their fifth series victory of the season tonight...The Mets have won each of their first four series of the season for the third time in franchise history...They also accomplished this feat in 2006 (first four series) and in 2018 (first five series)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: New York is seeking to match their season-high winning streak of three games...New York won three straight from April 7-9, from April 12-15 and again from April 17-19...On the other hand, the Mets have lost back-to-back games just once this season, from April 10-11.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Mets improved to 2-0 in extra-inning games this year...The Mets defeated the Giants in 10-innings in the first game of a doubleheader on April 19 at Citi Field and again last night...New York went 11-7 in extra-inning games in 2021...The 11 wins tied for third-most in the majors, tied for the fifth-most in franchise history and were the most since the Mets also had 11 victories in extra-innings in 2004.

TWO OUT, BUT NOT DOWN: The Mets are batting .261/.361/.424 with two outs this season...Their 43 hits with two outs is tied for second in the majors, while their .261 batting average is fourth in the majors and second in the National League...Their .361 OBP is third in MLB, while their .424 SLG is sixth.

HERE COMES TREVOR: Trevor Williams is set to make his first start of the year for the Mets...He is 0-1, allowing two unearned runs in 1.2 innings of work this year...This will mark his eighth career game (seventh start) against the Diamondbacks...He is 2-3 with a 2.65 ERA (10 earned runs/34.0 innings) with four walks and 26 strikeouts lifetime against the Snakes.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is 5-13 (.385) with two runs, a double and two walks over his last three games...Overall in 11 games this year, Nimmo is 13-40 (.325) with nine runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and seven walks...His career .394 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 8-1 with a 2.07 ERA (9 earned runs/82.2 innings) with 18 walks and 89 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, WHIP (0.82), opponent's batting average (.173), strikeouts and innings.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: The Mets have posted an 11-4 record through the team's first 15 games...That is tied for the fourth-best record in team history (also, 2006 and 1972)...Three teams, the 2018 Mets, 2015 team and the 1986 team are tied for the best mark at 12-3...New York's pitching staff has struck out 154 this season...That ranks second in team history behind the 2018 Mets (165)...The team's 154 strikeouts lead the major leagues...The team's collective 2.57 ERA is the eighth-best mark through 15 games...It's the best ERA since the 2007 team posted a 2.50 mark in the same span.

THE BANK IS OPEN: Eduardo Escobar, who played for the Diamondbacks from 2018-21, is a .269/.320/.511 hitter with 113 runs, 38 doubles, 13 triples, 35 home runs, 117 RBI and 55 walks in 184 career games at Chase Field...Starling Marte has played 34 career games at Chase Field and has hit .366/.430/.537 with 14 doubles, three triples, a home run and 16 RBI in the ballpark...Dominic Smith is 12-32 (.375) with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and four walks in nine games in Arizona...Brandon Nimmo 8-22 with two doubles, two home runs and three RBI in five games in AZ, while James McCann has gone 7-21 (.333) with a double, three home runs and nine RBI in six games at Chase Field.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .304 (17-56) with 10 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, seven walks, a .391 OBP and a .589 SLG...They rank second in SLG, third in average, doubles, and OBP and are tied for second in homers.

DBACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series in each of the last three years...Since 2019, the Mets have posted a 18-6 record against Arizona...That is their best record against any NL opponent in that span.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (129) and runs (73), they are second in OBP (.346), fourth in average (.257) and walks (59), tied for fourth in home runs (15), sixth in OPS (.743) and seventh in SLG (.397)...Through 15 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 73-42.

MY BAD: The Mets have committed just one error over their last 10 games...Overall, the Mets have committed only four errors this year...That is the second-fewest in the National League and tied for the third-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank third in the majors with a .933 fielding percentage.

IT'S WAR: Eduardo Escobar is sixth in the majors with a 1.0 fWAR...He has recorded seven doubles in 14 games this year...That is tied for the major league lead and leads the Senior Circuit...Nine of Escobar's 14 hits have gone for extra bases...He has drawn 12 walks in 14 games this year...That is tied for the fourth-most in the majors...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .304 (17-56) with 12 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks, three steals, a .403 OBP, a .589 SLG and a .992 OPS...He has safely reached base in 14 of the 15 games this season...He ranks fifth in the major leagues with a 1.1 fWAR this year.

THE CHARMING MAN: In seven games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits and three walks while striking out eight in 7.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.92 ERA (27 earned runs/83.1 innings) with 27 walks and 743 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for second in the majors and tied for the lead in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .276 (16-58) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, two walks, a .483 SLG and an .806 OPS in 15 games this year...He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run on Sunday vs. Arizona...That breaks his tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 11 stolen bases through 15 games...That is for second in the major leagues...The Mets did not record their 11th steal until May 17 last season in the team's 36th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte are tied for sixth in the majors with three steals.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is tied for fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS: Buck Showalter is in his first year with the Mets...He became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins.

WILLIAMS NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 0.2 scoreless inning vs. Arizona in relief of David Peterson on April 17 at Citi Field, allowing two hits and recording his first strikeout of the season...Entered with one out in the fifth inning.

VS. ARIZONA: In seven career appearances (six starts) vs. the D-backs, Williams is 2-3 with a 2.65 ERA (10 earned runs/34.0 innings)...He has fanned 26 batters and walked only four in those outings...He already appeared once vs. the Snakes in 2022, throwing 0.2 innings of scoreless relief in his most recent appearance, April 17 at Citi Field...His last start against the club was his final appearance with the Cubs before being traded to the Mets...He threw 6.1 shutout innings, allowing just five hits with six strikeouts and no walks at Wrigley Field on July 25, 2021.

WITH THE METS: Since being acquired from the Mets on July 30, 2021, Williams has made 12 appearances (three starts) with the Amazin's...Williams has a 2.91 ERA (11 earned runs/34.0 innings) with nine walks and 30 strikeouts.

STARTS/RELIEF: With New York, Williams has a 1.98 ERA (three earned runs/13.2 innings) with four walks and nine strikeouts in three starts...In nine relief outings, he is 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA (eight earned runs/20.1 innings).

MEET THE MET: Was acquired from Chicago-NL on July 30, 2021 with INF Javier Báez for minor league OF Pete Crow-Armstrong...Aside from baseball, Williams co-hosts a podcast with former teammate Steven Brault (@podcastIMHO)...He is the co-founder of Project 34; a non-profit that assists with the purchasing of medical equipment and assistive devices that may not be otherwise accessible to a patient, as well as providing grants to individuals to afford physical therapy for optimal function (projectthirtyfour.com)...Wore #34 in Pittsburgh to honor former ASU teammate Cory Hahn, who suffered a career-ending injury in 2011...He has four kids, including the newest addition to the family, a girl in the 2021-22 offseason...Is an avid reader, especially science fiction...Is a big Star Wars fan.
