TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners wrap up their season-opening homestand with the finale of 3 games against the New York Yankees (1-1) in a rubber match for both the series and homestand (3-3)...Seattle also faced the Cleveland Guardians (2-2) on the 'stand...today's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's contest to the Yankees by a 5-0 score, one night after defeating them in walk-off fashion by a 2-1 score.

- **Rubber Soul** - With a win today, the Mariners would have their first home series win against the Yankees since taking 2-of-3 from Aug. 8-10, 2022.
- **Ouchy!** - **Randy Arozarena** has recorded 99 hit-by-pitches in his career, 1 away from becoming the ninth active player with 100+ career HBP at the plate.
- **Luis Luis** - On Monday night against the Yankees, right-hander **Luis Castillo** became the 11th Dominican-born pitcher to record 1,500+ career strikeouts in the Major Leagues.

MARINERS SIGN COLT EMERSON TO CONTRACT EXTENSION...the Mariners announced yesterday the club signed infield prospect **Colt Emerson** to a contract extension through the 2033 season, with a club option through 2034...Emerson has been selected to the 40-man roster and optioned to Triple-A Tacoma... Emerson, 20, is ranked as the Mariners #1 prospect, and the #7 overall prospect in the Major Leagues, according to both *MLB Pipeline* and *Baseball America*...Emerson joins a list of homegrown Mariners players who have signed contract extensions with the team in recent years, which includes **Cal Raleigh** and **Julio Rodríguez**...the left-handed hitting infielder was selected by the Mariners in the 1st round (22nd overall) of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of John Glenn High School in New Concord, Ohio...in a corresponding 40-man roster move, right-handed pitcher Ryan Loutos was designated for assignment.

J.P. BEGINS REHAB ASSIGNMENT...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** began a rehab assignment (right shoulder inflammation) with Triple-A Tacoma last night...he batted second in the Rainiers lineup, going 0-for-4 with a walk and strikeout.

A STELLAR STARTING STAFF...through its first 6 games, the Mariners starting rotation has a 2.86 ERA (11 ER, 34.2 IP) with 44 strikeouts and 9 walks...Mariners starters **lead the Majors in innings pitched**, with Houston (30.2 IP) ranking next-closest...Mariners starters have limited opponents to a .169 batting average, 3rd-lowest in the big leagues, also ranking 3rd in WHIP (0.84) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.89).

DONOVAN MAKING STRONG FIRST IMPRESSION...**Brendan Donovan** is batting .429 (9x21) with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 4 RBI and 3 walks in 6 games this season, getting on base at a .538 clip with a 1.300 OPS...he's reached base safely in all 6 contests, reaching base multiple times in 5 of 6 games... Donovan has started all 6 games at third base.

YOUNG MAN, ARE YOU LISTENING TO ME...**Cole Young** is batting .333 (7x21) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 4 RBI in 6 games this season, slugging .571 with a .935 OPS...the 22-year-old has started at second base in each of Seattle's 6 games to begin the year...after going hitless in the first game, Young has hit safely in 5 consecutive contests.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...right-hander **George Kirby** makes his second start of the season today...he tossed 6.0 innings with one run allowed and 6 strikeouts in the Mariners second game of the season on March 27 vs. Cleveland, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the Rye, New York native has pitched at least 7.0 innings in both of his career starts against the Yankees?...Kirby has only faced the Yankees twice in 113 career starts, both occurring in 2023...in those games, he has a 1.80 ERA (3 ER, 15.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts and no walks...in his start at T-Mobile Park against them on May 31, 2023, Kirby threw 8.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts in an eventual 1-0 win, with **Cal Raleigh** supplying the walk-off single in the bottom of the 10th that scored now-Yankee José Caballero...fittingly, Raleigh opened up the current series with a walk-off single in the bottom of the 9th of a 2-1 victory on Monday night.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 1

- **1997** - **Ken Griffey Jr.** homers in his first two at bats of the season (both off David Cone) in a 4-2, Opening Day victory over the Yankees.
- **2011** - **Félix Hernández** threw the first 9.0 inning complete game in Mariners Opening Day history at Oakland. After allowing a 2-run home run in the first inning, retired 23 of the next 26 batters he faced. Was the first Opening Day CG since Ben Sheets in 2007 and first 9.0-inning CG by an AL pitcher since Bartolo Colon in 2002.
- **2021** - The Mariners come back from 5 runs to beat the Giants 8-7 on opening day. Mariners won on a bases-loaded walk by Jake Fraley. Mitch Haniger started in right field, his first game since June 6, 2019 (665 days).

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 2nd start of the 2026 season and 1st against the Yankees..is making the 114th start of his career and his 3rd career start against the Yankees.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...W#1 on Mar. 27 vs. Cleveland, tossing 6.0 innings of 1-run baseball on 1 hits and 2 walks while punching out 6 batters...he threw 90 pitches (57 strikes)

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"The biggest thing for me is just to find a way to get back in control and stay in control," Kirby said. "Those runners out there in that situation are the least of my worries, just go attack. I feel like I've made a big step in that side of my game. I'm excited to keep up with it and keep doing the work to stay in his first start of the season. consistent."

AGAINST THE YANKEES...making his first start against the Yankees since June 20, 2023 at Yankee Stadium when he tossed 7.0 IP, allowing 3 earned run on 8 hits and no walks while striking out 4...in his first career start against the Yankees on May 31, 2023, he threw 8.0 shutout innings with 7 strikeouts to just 3 hits allowed.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME...across 55 career starts at home, he is 23-16 with a 3.04 career ERA (108 ER, 319.2 IP) and 336 strikeouts to just 49 walks allowed...his 3.04 career ERA at home ranks 3rd-best in Mariners history among pitchers with 50+ home starts, trailing **Luis Castillo** (2.75) and **James Paxton** (2.99)...his 6.86 career strikeout-to-walk ratio at home is a franchise-best mark, ranking ahead of **Logan Gilbert** (6.56).

RISE AND SHINE...is starting his first day game of the season and his first since tossing a career-high 14 strikeouts on Sept. 14 vs. LAA...is 16-8 across 39 career day starts, with a 3.36 ERA (84 ER, 225.0 IP) and 222 strikeouts to just 25 walks allowed...owns a career 1.062 WHIP, and both an 8.88 strikeouts-per-nine and strikeouts-to-walks.

2025 TOTALS...went 10-8 with a 4.21 ERA (59 ER, 126.0 IP) with 29 walks and 137 strikeouts over 23 starts last season.

K FOR KIRBY...wrapped the 2025 season with a career-best 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine innings, surpassing his previous career-high 9.2 SO/9 in 2022, and a career-best K% of 26.1...tossed a combined 31 strikeouts across his last 3 starts of the 2025 regular season (9/14-9/26) which is the most by a Mariner across a 3-game span since **James Paxton** tossed 33 strikeouts from April 26-May 8, 2018.

ANOTHER STELLAR SEASON...finished the 2025 regular season with a 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine-innings and a walk percentage of 5.5, joins **Logan Gilbert** (2021, '24, '25) and **Felix Hernandez** (2013, '14) as one-of-three Mariners starting pitchers to record multiple seasons with a strikeouts-per-nine innings over 9 and a sub-6% walk percentage.

NO FREE PASSES...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 113 career games...owns the 2nd-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher, behind only **Carlos Silva's** 150 game streak from 8/2/2003-8/15/2008.

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 106 of 113 career regular season starts, which are the most such games in the MLB through a starting pitcher's first 113 career starts, ranking ahead of **Chris Paddack** (102 G, 2019-2025)...are also the 3rd-most such games by any starting pitcher since 2022, trailing **Miles Mikolas-STL** (121) and **Logan Webb-SF** (111)...his 106 games of 2-or-fewer walks are tied for 9th-most such games by a starting pitcher in Mariners history.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 500 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (93), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.68), walks-per-nine innings (1.31), and walk rate (3.6%).

500 CLUB...reached 500 career strikeouts on June 8, 2025 vs. Angels, joining **James Paxton** (563), **Félix Hernández** (539), **Logan Gilbert** (526), and **Erik Hanson** (503) as the only pitchers in Mariners history to collect 500+ strikeouts in their first 93 career starts...allowed just 68 walks to his 509 strikeouts, the 2nd-fewest walks allowed by a player through his first 500 career strikeouts, behind **Koji Uehara-4 Tms** (63 BB).

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at LAA then on Sept. 14 vs. LAA at home...was the only pitcher in the MLB last season to record multiple games of 14+ strikeouts without a walk and the first to do so since **Jacob deGrom** tallied 3 such games in 2021...the feat has also been accomplished only 5 times in franchise history by 3 different pitchers:
