## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (37-41) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (37-41) June 25, 2024 at Great American Ball Park, Cincinnati, 0H - 7:10 EDT - GAME \#79/ROAD \#40 RHP MITCH KELLER (8-4, 3.11 ERA) vs. RHP HUNTER GREENE ( $5-2,3.35$ ERA)

THE PIRATES:...lost 11-5 last night in the opener of their three-game series against the Reds...Have gone 14-12, including 5-6 on the road, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone 28-3 (.903 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Are hitting . 282 (42-for-149) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks ninth in MLB...Have gone 9-5 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have the second-best ERA (3.38) among starting rotations this month behind the Mariners (3.10)...Have surrendered 18 home runs this month, which is tied for the second-fewest among all teams in MLB along with the Tigers (the Phillies have allowed a league-low 17 home runs this month)...Have gone deep in six straight games (had a season-high seven straight games with a home run from 5/11-17)...Have drawn at least one walk in 43 straight games; the second-longest active streak in MLB behind the Phillies ( 62 straight).

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller worked 7.0-plus innings in his last start Wednesday against the Reds, giving him 46 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today and the longest in MLB since Max Fried had 50 straight from June 6, 2021, to September, 30, 2022...It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 357 (30-for-87) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs and 14 RBI during his current career-high 21-game hitting streak...It's the longest active

That year Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games, Jason Kendall had a 23-game streak, and Aramis Ramirez hit safely in 22 straight games.

RUN-PRODUCING REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds has knocked in a run in five straight games, which is tied for the longest RBI streak by a Pirate this year along with Connor Joe and Michael A. Taylor... Reynolds recorded an RBI in six straight games on two occasions in 2023, doing so from April 2-8 and from April 22-30...The only three players in MLB with longer active RBI streaks are Shohei Ohtani (eight games), Brendan Donovan (seven games) and Yandy Díaz (six games).

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz has hit two of his three longest home runs of this season in the last three games (his 458-foot shot last night was the second-longest of his career)...Cruz' 11 home runs as a shortstop rank sixth at that position in the National League (Elly De La Cruz leads with 14)...Cruz also has each of the top two, three of the top five, and five of the 10 hardest hit balls in MLB this season according to Statcast (his hardest hit this year registered at 121.5 miles-per-hour on his double against San Francisco's Camilo Doval on May 21)...Cruz also now has three home runs in his first eight career games at Great American Ball Park, which are the most by any visiting batter in that span since the park opened in 2003.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today three strikeouts shy of tying Billy Wagner for the most punchouts (1196) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history... The 36 -year-old Chapman is tied for seventh in strikeouts (45) among all National League relief pitchers this season...Chapman's average of 15.00 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ranks third in all of MLB among relievers behind Jeremiah Estrada (16.41) and Fernando Cruz (15.32).
CUTCH AND THE REDS: Andrew McCutchen has 34 career home runs against the Reds, which are his second-most vs. any team (he has gone deep 40 times against the Brewers)...McCutchen is also one RBI shy of 100 in his career vs. Cincinnati (the only two teams he has collected more RBI against are the Cubs and Brewers with 106 apiece).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 28 -year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season, all with the Pirates...Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, making him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First Year Player Draft.
\#WINNING: The Pirates are 7-1 in Keller's last eight starts since May 6 vs. LAA.
LAST TIME OUT: Took a no-decision after tossing 7.0-plus shutout frames while allowing just two hits and recording seven strikeouts and two walks against the Reds in a 1-0 Pirates victory at PNC Park on June 19.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Keller enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including sixth in innings pitched (92.2), tied for sixth in wins (8), 10th in run support (53) and in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.78).

GETTING IT DONE: In seven starts since the beginning of May, Keller owns a 1.54 ERA (9 ER in 52.2 IP) and .221 (43-for-195) batting average against... His ERA in that time is the best mark in the NL and ranks second in the Majors behind only CWS Garrett Crochet (1.36).

- He has allowed two or fewer runs in seven of those eight starts in that time, one or fewer six times and has posted scoreless outings three times.

VS. CINCINNATI: Keller will be making his 16th career start against the Reds and his second of the 2024 season...As noted above, he tossed 7.0-plus shutout frames, allowing just two hits with seven strikeouts against just two walks in his last outing on June 19.

- Is 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA ( 3 ER in 19.0 IP) and .167 opponents average in his last three starts against Cincinnati since April 21, 2023.
- He made three starts against Cincinnati in 2023, going 1-0 with a 3.78 ERA (7 ER in 16.2 IP).

CENTRAL PERK: Keller has gone 4-1 with a 3.07 ERA ( 19 ER in 55.2 IP) in his last nine starts against teams from the National League Central since August 13, 2023...The Pirates are 7-2 in those games.

ALL HE DOES IS WIN: Keller posted his seventh win of the season on June 1, marking the second consecutive year he had seven wins by June 1 (was 7-1 in 2023)... Prior to Keller doing so last year, the last Pirate with seven-plus wins through play on June 1 was Gerrit Cole (8) in 2015.

- Keller is the first Pirate to have seven-plus wins through June 1 in consecutive years since Howie Camnitz from 1908 (7) to 1909 (8)...The only other Pirates to accomplish this feat were Frank Killen in 1896 (10) and 1897 (8) (courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau).
- Keller is the fifth MLB pitcher since 2013 to reach seven-plus wins by June 1 in back-to-back seasons...The other four: Justin Verlander ('18-'19), Clayton Kershaw ('16-'17), Felix Hernandez ('14-'15), and Adam Wainwright ('13-'14) [Source: OptaStats].

IT'S GOING TO BE MAY: In four starts in the month of May, Keller went $4-0$ with a 1.30 ERA (27.2ip/4er) and a 212 opponents average...He ranked in the top 10 in the NL in several categories, including complete games (T1st, 1), wins (2nd), ERA (3rd), opponents OPS (9th, .572 ) and opponents slugging percentage (10th, .313 ).
