METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Marlins, 7-4, last night...The defeat snapped a three-game winning streak...The Mets have won five of their last seven and eight of their last 12...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 6-4 in that span...Tonight, the Mets play their fourth game of a seven-game homestand (3-1) against the Phillies (3-0) and Marlins (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head out on the road for the penultimate time of the season, a 10-game trip against Detroit (three games), Cincinnati (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: This week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation...Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

HIS NAME IS JONAH: Today will mark Jonah Tong's Major League debut...Tong is currently ranked the number 44 prospect in baseball and the number four prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.com...He will become the seventh player (sixth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro, Blaine Tidwell, and Nolan McLean...He is also the 44th pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record...The previous high was 42 in 2021...They are only trailing the 2024 Miami Marlins by one (45) for the most pitchers used by a team in a single season.

YOUNG MAN'S GAME: At 22 years old and 71 days he will become the youngest pitcher to start for the Mets since Jenry Mejia (20 years old and 339 days) on September 15, 2010 and the youngest Mets starting pitcher to make their Major League debut since Jon Niese (21 years old and 311 days) made his debut on September 2, 2008...He will become one of 12 pitchers in franchise history to make his Major League debut as a starter at age 22 and 71 days or younger...Will become the third-youngest starter at the time of their debut in the Majors this season and will only be older than Chase Petty and Didier Fuentes were.

A MINOR THING: In 22 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, Tong has posted a 1.43 ERA (18 ER/113.2 IP) and has recorded a Minor League-leading 179 strikeouts...His 1.43 ERA is the best among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He ranks first in batting average against (.148, 58-392) and third in WHIP (0.92) among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He has given up one or zero earned runs in 12 of his last 13 starts dating back to June 4 and he has a 0.90 ERA (7 ER/69.2 IP) with a 13.82 K/9 over that span.

TONG 'EH': Tong was born in Markham, ON and he will become the 12th player born in Canada to play a game for the Mets...He will become the eighth Canadian to pitch for the team in franchise history and the third this season (Jared Young 6/15 and Zach Pop 7/6)...He will become the third Canadian to start a game for the Mets and the first since 1962 (also: Ray Daviault, 1962 and Ken MacKenzie, 1962)...He will become the 22nd player born in Canada to play in the majors this season...He will be the youngest Canadian-born player to make their Major League debut since Josh Naylor debuted at 21 years old and 336 days on May 24, 2019.

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets are 10-15 in August...In 25 games this month, the Mets are batting .281/.357/.485 with 46 doubles, one triple, 43 home runs, 147 RBI and 93 walks...They rank third in the majors with an .841 August OPS and SLG and second in OBP...The Mets pace the NL in home runs during the month.

HOME GROWN: The Mets Major League roster currently features several players who were either drafted or signed as non-drafted free agents and developed through the Mets organization: Brandon Nimmo (1st Rd. 2011), David Peterson (1st Rd. 2017), Brett Baty (1st Rd. 2019), Pete Alonso (2nd Rd. 2016), Mark Vientos (2nd Rd. 2017), Nolan McLean (3rd Rd. 2023), Jonah Tong (7th Rd. 2022), Jeff McNeil (12th Rd. 2013), Hayden Senger (24th Rd. 2018) and Ronny Mauricio (NFA 2017).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 6-4 in that span...Overall, they are 22-17 against the division...The Mets are batting .271/.341/.465 against the NL East, while posting a 3.95 ERA.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not lost a season series against the Marlins since 2017...New York is 86-59 all-time against the Marlins at Citi Field.

RISPY BUSINESS: In 25 games in August, the Mets are batting .367 (80-218) with 17 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 105 RBI, 35 walks, a .438 OBP, and a .592 SLG with RISP...Their .367 average and .438 OBP tops the majors in August, while their .592 SLG is second.

HOME SWEET HOME: This season, the Mets are 44-25 (.638) in home games...The team is fifth in the NL and tied for sixth in the majors in home winning percentage...Their 3.56 home ERA is the fifth-lowest mark in the NL and the ninth-lowest in the majors.

MIAMI VICE: Tonight, the Mets face the Marlins for the eighth time this season...The Mets have won each of their first two series against Miami this season, going 2-1 atloanDepot Park from March 31-April 2 and 2-1 at Citi Field from April 7-9...The Mets have not lost a series of two or more games against the Marlins in Queens since they dropped two of three from August 25-26, 2020...Since 2018, the Mets are 74-45 against Miami.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors with 108 RBI...His 108 RBI are tied with Robin Ventura (1999) for the second-most in franchise history through the team's first 134 games...Only Carlos Beltrán (112, 2006) had more...Has recorded 28 games with multiple RBI this season, which are tied for the second-most in the majors with Kyle Schwarber and Eugenio Suárez (trails Cal Raleigh, 32)...His 188 games with multiple RBI since his debut in 2019 are the most in the majors (next: Matt Olson, 165).

POLAR POWER: He hit his 30th homer of the season last night...He joins Albert Pujols as the only hitters in Major League history to have at least 30 home runs in each of their first six non-shortened seasons...He's also the only Met to record 30 home runs in six seasons...Since making his debut in 2019, he joins Kyle Schwarber as the only players to record six such seasons...He is one of six players in Major League history to record six such seasons in their first seven seasons, joining Albert Pujols, Mark Teixeira, Frank Robinson, Eddie Mathews and Ralph Kiner.

HANG 10: Alonso's 256 home runs are the 10th-most in Major League history through a players first 980 games trailing only Aaron Judge (308), Ryan Howard (274), Ralph Kiner (270), Harmon Killebrew (269), Giancarlo Stanton (265), Juan González (263), Shohei Ohtani (263), Albert Pujols (258) and Albert Belle (258)...Are the third-most in Major League history through a player's first seven Big League seasons behind Kiner (294) and Pujols (282).

BRETT THE MET: Over his last 19 games, Brett Baty has a .344/.412/.574 with four home runs, two doubles, seven RBI and 16 runs...In 60 games at Citi Field, Baty is slashing .309/.372/.552 with 11 home runs, 28 RBI, five doubles, one triple, 16 walks and 31 runs...His 15 home runs this season are a career high.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stole 110 bases in 124 attempts this year...Their 88.7% success rate is the highest in the majors...The Mets 110 stolen bases are their most through the first 134 games of a season since their 113 stolen bases through the first 134 games of the 2011 season.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 108 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

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SWING AND A LOT OF MISS: Tong is the Minor League strikeout leader and through his two starts in Triple-A he has generated a 21.9% whiff rate...His whiff rate is tied for the eighth-most among Triple-A pitchers who have thrown at least 100 pitches...23 of his 39 swing and misses were generated by his fastball...This season he has a K/9 of 14.17 and for his career it sits at 13.70...His arsenal contains a four-seam fastball, a changeup, a slider, a curveball, and a cutter.

CAREER NOTES: Tong was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Amateur Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy in Statesboro, GA...Across three minor league seasons he has posted a 2.54 ERA (70 ER/247.2 IP) over 57 appearances (53 starts) and recorded 377 strikeouts...While with Double-A Binghamton this season he was named EAS Pitcher of the Week twice (week of 5/11 and the week of 5/17) and EAS Pitcher of the Month twice (May and June).

- Earned the win on August 25 vs. Philadelphia after stranding an inherited runner in the fifth inning...Was his fourth career Major League win and his first since September 30 vs. Arizona while with San Diego.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on August 25...In 15 relief appearances with the Mets this season, he has a 2.03 ERA (3 ER/13.1 IP) and three holds...Has stranded nine of 12 inherited runners with the Mets and 11 of 14 inherited runners this season.
- 12 of his 15 relief outings with the Mets this season have been scoreless and he has struck out 17 batters over his 13.1 innings pitched, good for a K/9 of 11.48.
- He threw a scoreless ninth inning and struck out three at San Francisco on July 25 (1.0 IP, H, 3 K)...It marked the ninth time in his Major League career that he struck out three or more in an outing.
- Has made 10 appearances for Triple-A Syracuse this season and he has a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) and he held batters to a .211 average (8-38).
- Was acquired by the Mets from the Arizona Diamondbacks in exchange for cash considerations on May 15...Made five appearances with Arizona this season, tossing 6.1 combined innings in relief...Began this season with Triple-A Reno, where he posted a 1.69 ERA (1 ER/5.1 IP) and seven strikeouts in five games before his contract was selected by Arizona on May 1.
- Over parts of five Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2018-19, '22-23), Diamondbacks (2025) and the Mets (2025), has gone 3-5 with a 4.58 ERA (30 ER/59.0 IP), 25 walks and 75 strikeouts over 59 relief appearances...Made only one appearance in each of the 2019, '22 and '23 seasons.

- Earned his career-high-tying sixth win of the season after getting the final five outs against Philadelphia on August 26 (1.2 IP, 4 K)...Struck out a season high four of the five batters he faced...His four strikeouts were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.
- Threw a scoreless ninth inning on August 23 vs. Atlanta (1.0 IP, H, 2 K)...Has recorded multiple strikeouts in four of his last six games.
- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career six-out save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last five outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- In 182 career appearances at Citi Field, he has posted a 1.99 ERA (41 ER/185.0 IP) with 81 saves...This season he has a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) with 15 saves over 31 appearances at home.
- Has gone 4-for-4 in save opportunities against division opponents this season and has a current 10.0 scoreless inning streak vs. the NL East...He has not allowed an earned run in each of his last 11 appearances vs. the NL East dating back to April 23.
- Has converted 12 of his 13 career save opportunities against the Marlins...He has struck out 59 batters over 32.2 IP against the Marlins good for a K/9 of 16.26.
- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.

- Has allowed just three earned runs over his last 39 games, posting a 0.66 ERA (3 ER/41.0 IP) with 11 walks and 61 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 0.66 ERA is the best in the majors and his .150 opponents' BA is the fifth best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Aroldis Chapman's 0.84 ERA in that span.
- Among qualified relievers this season, is fifth in K/9.0 IP (13.50, first in NL), fourth in ERA (1.60, first in NL), eighth in opponents' BA (.162, third in NL), and tied for ninth in saves (24, fourth in NL)...Among qualified NL relievers is fourth in opponents' SLG (.249) and in opponents' OPS (.510), and tied for fifth in wins (6)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 40.2 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fifth-best in the majors.
- Over 49 games this season, has gone 6-2 with 24 saves, a 1.60 ERA (9 ER/50.2 IP), 17 walks and 76 strikeouts...The Mets are 38-11 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .162 (28-173) average against Díaz this season...With two outs and runners in scoring position, has allowed just one hit in 23 at-bats (.043 BA)...He has recorded five saves this season of four outs or more which are tied for the most-such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (516), third in saves (140), eighth in appearances (320) and tied for seventh in wins (24).
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.
- Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team after going 3-0, 15-for-16 in save opportunities with a 2.22 ERA (7 ER/28.1 IP) in 28 first half appearances...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
