AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will complete their seven-game homestand tonight with the final game of a four-game set vs. Oakland (2-1 thus far)...are 4-2 on the homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay this past weekend and winning two of their first three games vs. Oakland...after this homestand, will embark on a seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (4/29-5/2).

- Have won five of their last seven games (since 4/17).
 Their 17-8 record (.680) is the third-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (17-6, .739) and Cleveland (17-7, .708)... their 17 wins are tied with Atlanta and Cleveland for the most in the Majors.
- Marks just the third time in the last 21 years (since 2004) and the fourth time in the last 24 years (since 2001) the Yankees have gone 17-8 or better to start a season (went 20-5 in 2003, 18-7 in 2022 and 17-8 in 2010).
- With a win tonight, it would also mark just the third time in the last 21 years (since 2004) and the fourth time in the last 24 years (since 2001) the Yankees have gone 18-8 or better to start a season (went 20-6 in 2003, 19-7 in 2022 and 18-8 in 2010).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an
- off day (4/19-5/5)... are 4-2 so far. Eight of the Yankees' 17 wins are come-from-behind wins.
- ▶ Have won six of their seven completed series this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Athletics, 7-3, on Wednesday at Yankee Stadium...RHP Clarke Schmidt (5.1IP, 4H, 3R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP) made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year...CF Aaron Judge (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his fourth HR of the year with a two-run shot in the first inning...1B Anthony Rizzo (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) homered in his second straight game, hitting a solo HR in the fifth inning...SS Anthony Volpe (2-for-5, 1R, 1 triple, 1RBI) hit an RBI triple in the fourth inning...RF Juan Soto (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB, 1SF) hit his team-leading sixth HR of the year with a solo shot in the sixth inning...C Austin HR of the year with a solo shot in the sixth inning...C Austin Wells (2-for-3, 1R, 1BB) reached base three times...RHP Luke Weaver (2.2IP, 3K) tossed 2.2 perfect innings of relief...RHP lan Hamilton (1.0IP) tossed a perfect ninth inning.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.01 ERA (134.1IP, 45ER) in 25 starts this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (1.73) and Philadelphia (2.20)... have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 22 of their 25 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 16 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 starts...have not allowed more than 4ER in any start this season.

> Have posted a 1.98 ERA (41.0IP, 9ER) with 46K in their last seven starts (since 4/17).

MATCHING UP: Since 2022, the Yankees are 12-4 in their last 16 games vs. Oakland...are 18-7 in their last 25 games vs. the A's (since 8/31/19)...including this series, have won or split each of their last eight series against Oakland since 8/30/19 (are 5-0-2 in

their completed series over that stretch).

• Are 12-2 in their last 14 games vs. Oakland at Yankee Stadium (since 8/31/19) and 16-4 in their last 20 games

hAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: Today marks the 100th birthday of Art Schallock, the oldest living former Major League player...the former pitcher appeared in parts of five Major League seasons with the Yankees (1951-55) and Baltimore (1955), going 6-7 with a 4.02 ERA (170.1IP, 76ER) in 58 games (14 starts)...Schallock, who won three World Series rings with the Yankees (1951-53), will celebrate his birthday today with a party at his senjor living center in Sonoma Calif party at his senior living center in Sonoma, Calif.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his fourth HR of the year with a two-run shot in the first inning...marked the 261st home run of his career, surpassing Derek Jeter for ninth place on the

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers retired each of their 11BF on Wednesday vs. Oakland...have not allowed a hit over their last two games (7.11P)...the Yankees bullpen owns the sixth-lowest ERA (2.86) in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (1.87), Cleveland (2.24), Seattle (2.58), Minnesota (2.72) and Milwaukee (2.85).

The Yankees are 10-0 this season when they lead after six

- innings, 14-0 when leading after seven innings and 14-0 when leading after eight innings.
- RHP Ian Hamilton has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this year.
- RHP Clay Holmes has not allowed an earned run in 12 appearances this season (12.0IP, 12H, 3R/0ER, 1BB, 10K, 2HP)...his nine saves are tied for the most in the Majors and his 12.0IP are the second-most among Major League relievers who have not allowed an earned run this season (Chicago-NL's Mark Leiter Jr. - 12.1IP)

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo homered in his second straight game on Wednesday vs. Oakland, hitting a solo HR in the fifth inning...has homered in back-to-back games for the first time since 5/19-20/23 (also 2G)...with a HR tonight, it would mark the 12th time in his career that he has homered in at least three straight games and first since 8/29-9/18/22 (3G).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP NESTOR CORTES (1-1, 3.41 ERA)

LHP Nestor Cortes will make his sixth start of the season and third home start in tonight's series finale vs. Oakland...the 29-year-old will start or regular four days' rest...made his previous start on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings and collecting a season-high 9K without recording a decision...marked his second scoreless start this season (also 0R in 8.0IP on 4/8 vs. Miami)...is 1-1 with a 3.41 ERA (29.0IP, 26H, 11ER, 5BB, 28K, 3HR, 1HP) in five starts this season...went 5-2 with a 4.97 ERA (63.1IP, 59H, 36R/35ER, 20BB, 67K, 11HR) in 12 starts for the Yankees in 2023...has made five career Opening Day rosters (2018 with Baltimore, 2020 with Seattle and 2022-24 with the Yankees)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 49-of-59 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 41 of those starts...in 67 appearances (59 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 20-10 with a 3.12 ERA (343.2IP, 119ER), 361K and a .211 (268-for-1,270) opponents' BA...over that span (min. 300.0IP), ranks second in the AL in opponents' OBP (.265) and Opponents' OBP (.265) and opponents' BA, sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents' SLG (.360)...made his first career All-Star team in 2022...was originally selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...was selected by the Baltimore Orioles from the Yankees in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18...was acquired by the Seattle Mariners from the Yankees in exchange for international signing bonus pool money on 11/25/19...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 12/10/20...over parts of seven Major League seasons, has played with Baltimore (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21-24) and Seattle (2020).

- LAST TIME OUT: Made his previous start on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings and collecting a season-high 9K without recording a decision.
 His 9K marked his most in a game since his career-high-tying 12K on 10/1/22 vs. Baltimore...also marked his most strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk
 - Retired 11 of his first 13 batters faced (two singles).
 - Became the first pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 7.0IP scoreless innings with 0BB allowed in consecutive home outings.

2024: Through his first five starts this season, has gone 1-1 with a 3.41 ERA (29.0IP, 26H, 11ER, 5BB, 28K, 3HR, 1HP)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in three of his five starts with two starts
