RAY MATTER—Last night the offense scored 8 runs on 11 hits, 7 BB and 1 HBP and the Rays snapped a 3-game losing streak...the Rays are 1-3 in their last 4 games and 4-8 in their last 12 games...in scoring 2 runs in the 1st inning last night, the Rays claimed their first lead since the end of the 3rd inning on Tues vs. TEX, going 25 innings in between...the Rays are 6-8 through 14 games for a second straight season, and in 2020 they went 34-12 the rest of the way to finish 40-20 and run away with the AL East... the Rays are tied for 3rd in the division and 3.5 GB of the Red Sox (9-4).

- + The Rays are 6-2 when scoring first but 0-6 when their opponent scores first...the Rays have blown a lead in five of their 8 losses... the five blown leads (games eventually lost after having the lead) are tied with the White Sox for 2nd in the majors behind the Twins (6) and three shy of their total from the shortened 2020 season (8)... in comparison, last season the Rays trailed in 40 of their 60 games but had 20 come-from-behind wins, 2nd in the majors (Padres, 22).
- + The Rays are 3-4 on the road this season and 23-10 (.697) since Aug 10, 2020, 2nd in the majors and best in the AL over that stretch.
- + The Rays are 2-2-0 in series play after going 13-3-4 last season, which included 11-1-4 in their last 16 series beginning on Aug 4.
- + The Rays are 5-2 this season against teams that made the expanded postseason in 2020, and 1-6 against teams missing the playoffs.
- + The Rays are 4-2 when leading after 7 innings...reg+post, they entered this season having won 63 straight games when leading after 7 innings, which was the longest active streak in the majors.
- This series the Rays continue stretches of games on 13 consecutive days (April 9-21) and 30 games in 31 days (April 9-May 9).

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—Last night marked the Rays 2nd-highest scoring game of the season behind April 9 vs. NYY (10)...it snapped a streak of 4 runs (or fewer) in six consecutive games, their longest streak since July 16-26, 2019 (10)...last night the Rays reached double-digit hits for the third time this season, all coming against the Yankees...Rays batters saw 184 pitches, their most in a 9-inning game since Aug 13, 2020 at BOS (204).

- + In the last 7 games, the Rays are batting .218 (52-for-238) including .150 (9-for-60) with RISP...this season their .225 avg. ranks 18th in the majors and 10th in the AL, and their 13 HR are tied for 22nd in the majors and tied for 13th in the AL...the Rays have totaled 3 HR in the last 5 games...this comes on the heels of the 2020 postseason, when the Rays hit 34 HR—the most in a single postseason in major league history...33.9 pct. (19 of 56) of their runs this season have come on homers, after 67.1 pct. (53 of 79) in the 2020 postseason.
- + Last night the Rays became the first visiting team to win at Yankee Stadium without hitting a homer since the Angels on Sep 18, 2019... it was the first time this season the Rays won with 0 HR after going 14-5 in 2020, the best mark in those games since the 1906 Cubs.
- + The Rays are 0-3 in extra-inning games and have been outscored, 9-2, in five extra frames, which begin with a runner on second.

CHICKEN ON THE BONE—This season the Rays are batting .209 (27-for-129) with RISP, 25th in the majors...with RISP/2 out, their .158 avg. (9-for-57) ranks 27th in the majors...despite scoring 8 runs last night the Rays hit .200 (3-for-15) with RISP and left 11 on base...the Rays have stranded 103 baserunners this season, tied for 6th in the majors and 2nd in the AL.

- + The Rays have had 30 PA this season with a runner on third and less than 2 outs, and that runner has scored 13 times (43.3 pct.), 20th in the majors...the major league avg. in those situations is 47.7 pct.
- + In the last 14 innings, the Rays offense has 15 BB but only three have come around to score...last night the leadoff hitter reached in six of 9 innings but only came around to score twice.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE—The Rays have used a majors-most 34 players this season and their 19 pitchers used are tied with the Blue Jays for most in the majors...they have used seven starting pitchers, tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Blue Jays (8)...the Rays have 10 players on the injured list, tied with the Rangers for 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (11).

- + The Rays have INF Vidal Bruján, LH Dietrich Enns, RH Louis Head, RH David Hess and C Kevan Smith on the taxi squad for this 6-game road trip to New York (1-0) and Kansas City (3)...none of those five players have appeared in a game so far this season.
- + The Rays used three of five taxi squad players on their first trip.

NOT THE RAYS WAY—The Rays rank 22nd in the majors and 11th in the AL with a 4.65 ERA (127.2-IP, 66-ER)...they have allowed 76 runs this season, their most in the first 14 games since they were known as the

Devil Rays in 2007 (93)...the Rays have allowed 8 runs (or more) five times this season, tied with the Athletics and Cardinals for most in the majors... they have allowed 6 runs (or more) seven times, tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (9)...they have allowed 5 runs (or more) nine times, tied with the Athletics and Diamondbacks for most in the majors.

- + The Rays have allowed fewer than 4 runs only four times in 14 games and three have been shutouts, tied for the major league lead.
- + Rays pitching has allowed a majors-most 14 hits and 3 HR in 0-2 counts, and their .250 opp avg. (14-for-56) in 0-2 counts is the highest in the majors (ML avg. is .133)...the three 0-2 homers are more than they allowed in the shortened 2020 campaign (2)...the Rays have also allowed a major-league-most 52 hits in 2-strike counts.
- Last season the Rays ranked 3rd in the majors with a 3.56 ERA behind the Dodgers (3.02) and Indians (3.29)...it was the second consecutive season the Rays finished among the majors' top three in ERA, and fourth straight season they finished among the top ten.

RELIEF VALVE—The Rays bullpen has a 5.72 ERA (56.2-IP, 36-ER), 28th in the majors and ahead of only the Rockies (5.84) and Tigers (7.24)...its .294 opp avg. (64-for-218) is the worst in the majors; in 29th place is the Rockies at .289...the Rays have allowed 35 runs this season in the 7th inning or later, most in the majors (Twins, 28) and more than half of their total from last season (62)...Rays relievers have allowed eight of the club's 14 HR... this includes 4 HR in the 8th inning, 1 HR in the 9th and 1 HR in extras.

- + Rays relievers have allowed 4 runs (or more) in six of 14 games.
- + Last season the Rays ranked 3rd in the majors in bullpen ERA (3.37) behind the Athletics (2.72) and Dodgers (2.74).

RAYS vs. YANKEES—The Rays are 3-1 against the Yankees this season (2-1 at home, 1-0 on the road) compared to 3-7 against all other opponents... in addition, since the start of last season the Rays are 6-1 at Yankee Stadium, where all other visitors are 7-24 (.226)...this comes on the heels of a 2-8 record at Yankee Stadium in 2019 and a 13-35 mark from 2015-19... last night was the fourth straight time the Rays won the series opener in the Bronx...with a win today or tomorrow, the Rays would clinch a sixth straight regular-series win over the Yankees...their current streak of five straight is the longest in the majors since the Blue Jays (6) from 2015-16.

- + The streak of five series wins is also the longest in club history.
- + Since Sep 24, 2019, the Rays are 13-3 against them in the regular season with a +29 run differential (79-50)...today is the fifth of 19 meetings between the two clubs this season, which includes 16 in advance of the trade deadline...the Rays and Yankees end the regular season facing each other in a 3-game series in the Bronx.

CY-LER—Today's starter Tyler Glasnow is 1-0 with a 0.46 ERA (19.2-IP, 1-ER) and 29 SO in 3 starts...he ranks among AL leaders in ERA (2nd), WHIP (0.51, 2nd), innings (tied for 3rd), strikeouts (tied for 2nd), SO/9 IP ratio (13.27, 4th), opp avg. (.108, 2nd) and fWAR (1.3, 1st)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 29 SO are the most by a Ray in his first 3 starts of a season, passing Blake Snell (27) in 2019 and Drew Smyly (27) in 2016.

- + According to Stats LLC, Glasnow is the third pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to have at least 29 SO and no more than 1 run allowed over their first 3 starts of a season...he joined PHI Curt Schilling (34-SO, 1-R) in 1998 and BOS Pedro Martínez (32-SO, 1-R) in 1998...Schilling finished with 300 SO in 1998 and Pedro had 251.
- + Glasnow is unbeaten in his last 11 regular-season starts, going 6-0 with a 2.74 ERA (65.2-IP, 20-ER) and 101 SO over that stretch.
- + He is the first Ray to make the season-opening rotation and go 6 IP (or more) and allow 1 run (or fewer) in each of his first 3 starts...the only other Ray to do this to start his season was **Jake Faria**, who did it in his first three career starts after his June 2017 call up.

WACHA WACHA—Last night Michael Wacha pitched six scoreless innings and recorded his first win since July 27, 2020 at BOS (with NYM)... it marked his longest scoreless start since June 10, 2019 at MIA (6 IP, with STL) and his 9 SO were one shy of tying his career high...his only hit allowed was a single to Gio Urshela in the 2nd inning...he became the 10th visiting pitcher all-time to allow 1 hit (or fewer) and record 9 SO (or more) over at least six scoreless innings against the Yankees, first since BOS Chris Sale on June 30, 2018...the first game of this type was a no-hitter by CLE Bob Feller on April 30, 1946, a 1-0 win on a 9th-inning homer.

- + His 18 swings-and-misses were his most since July 8, 2015 (19).
- + Extended his scoreless streak to 9 IP, all against the Yankees.

LAST START—On Mon vs. TEX, went a career-high 7.2 IP and recorded a career-high 14 SO...his 14 SO were the most by a Ray since Chris Archer (15) on June 2, 2015 at LAA and were one shy of tying the club record shared by Archer and James Shields on Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL...retired his first 11 BF, including 7 SO, before a 2-out walk in the 4th inning...allowed his first hit with 1 out in the 5th, but erased the runner with a strikeout/caught stealing three pitches later...retired his next 6 BF, and struck out the side in the 7th, before a leadoff single in the 8th...was removed from the game after retiring his next 2 BF...was the first Ray to pitch into the 8th inning since Ryan Yarbrough on Sep 20, 2020 at BAL (1 BF in 8th), and it marked the longest outing by a Ray since Yarbrough (8.2 IP) on Aug 11, 2019 at SEA...his line: W, 7.2 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 14 SO, 102 pitches, 73 str.

- + Had a career-high 27 swings-and-misses, the most by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (2008), passing **Blake Snell** (26) on May 12, 2019 vs. NYY...had 14 with the fastball, 7 on curveball and 6 on slider.
- + According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 29 SO are the most by a Rays pitcher in his first 3 starts of a season...the previous record was held by Blake Snell (27) in 2019 and Drew Smyly (27) in 2016.
- + According to Stats LLC, Glasnow is the third pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to have at least 29 SO and no more than 1 run allowed over their first 3 starts of a season...he joined PHI Curt Schilling (34-SO, 1-R) in 1998 and BOS Pedro Martínez (32-SO, 1-R) in 1998...Schilling finished with 300 SO in 1998 and Pedro had 251.

HOT START—Is the first Rays pitcher to make the season-opening rotation and go 6 IP (or more) and allow 1 run (or fewer) in each of his first 3 starts...the only other Ray to do this to start his season was **Jake Faria**, who did it from June 7-18, 2017 in his first three career starts after his call up...enters today's game on a streak of 12.2 consecutive scoreless innings.

- + Since the end of the 2020 season, is unbeaten in his last 11 starts and the Rays have gone 10-1 in them...during that span, he is 6-0 with a 2.74 ERA (65.2-IP, 20-ER), .173 opp avg. and 101 SO...his 6-game winning streak ties a career high (March 30-May 3, 2019).
- + Ranks among AL leaders this season in ERA (0.46, 2nd), WHIP (0.51, 2nd), innings pitched (19.2, tied for 3rd), strikeouts (29, tied for 2nd), SO/BB ratio (9.67, tied for 2nd), bWAR (1st, 1.1) and fWAR (1st, 1.3).

vs. YANKEES—Is 1-2 with a 3.70 ERA (24.1-IP, 10-ER) in five career starts against the Yankees, including 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2-IP, 2-ER) in 2 starts at Yankee Stadium...last faced them in the regular season on Aug 31, 2020 at Yankee Stadium, recording the win after throwing six scoreless innings...didn't allow a hit until a 1-out DJ LeMahieu infield single in the 6th inning and retired 16 of his first 18 BF, allowing only a 2-out Brett

Gardner walk in the 3rd and a 1-out Mike Tauchman SO/WP in the 5th.

+ Made 2 starts against them in last season's ALDS, going 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1-IP, 4-ER)...in Game 2, allowed 4 runs in 5 IP and recorded a Rays postseason-record 10 SO...all 4 runs allowed came on Giancarlo Stanton homers in the 2nd and 4th innings...started the decisive Game 5, pitching 2.1 scoreless innings on 2 days' rest.

G(L)AS HIM UP—His avg. 4-seam fastball velocity this season is 97.3 mph, according to StatCast, 6th-fastest in the majors (min. 100 total pitches)... opponents are batting .080 (2-for-25) against the pitch, 4th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 20 AB)...the pitch value of 6.2, according the FanGraphs, on his fastball is the best mark of any pitch in the majors this season.

CRAZY CURVE—Has 15 SO with the curveball this season, tied with MIN José Berríos for the most in the majors...has achieved this despite throwing it on just 13.4 pct. of his pitches...has limited batters to a .083 avg (2-for-24) on at-bats ending with the curveball, 3rd-lowest in the majors (min. 10 AB)...has recorded a 57.1 pct. whiff rate on the pitch this season, the 2nd-best mark in the majors behind OAK Jesús Luzardo (65.4).

ROLLIN' AS A RAY—Since making his Rays debut on Aug 1, 2018, he is 13-7 with a 3.03 ERA (193.1-IP, 65-ER) and 260 SO in 37 starts...min. 175 IP, since being acquired by the Rays he ranks 2nd in the AL in opp avg. (.189), 3rd in WHIP (0.98) and 4th in SO/9 IP ratio (12.10)...is allowing 2.70 BB/9 IP since the trade, compared to a 5.79 BB/9 IP ratio with the Pirates.

KING OF THE ROAD—Since the start of the 2019 season, is 7-0 with a 1.77 ERA (76.1-IP, 15-ER) and 106 SO in 14 starts on the road, including seven scoreless starts...his 7-game road winning streak is tied with **David Price** from May 15-Aug 16, 2012 for the longest road winning streak all-time by a Rays starter...min. 50 IP, leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors in road ERA behind ATL **Mike Soroka** (1.46) since the start of 2019...opponents are batting .159 (43-for-270) against him over that stretch.

2020 IN REVIEW—In his second full season with the Rays, led the team with 57.1 IP, 91 SO and tied for 2nd with 5 wins behind **Pete Fairbanks** (6)...went 5-0 with a 3.00 ERA (42-IP, 14-ER) and 64 SO in his last 7 starts beginning on Aug 19...this lowered his season ERA from 7.04 to 4.08.

+ His avg. fastball velocity, according to StatCast, was 96.9 mph, 2nd in the AL (min. 200 BF) behind CWS Dylan Cease (97.5)...reached 100 mph three times, including a career-high 100.9 mph on Sep 18...got 73 swings-and-misses against his fastball, 4th in the AL.
