**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets blanked the Marlins, 1-0, in Miami yesterday... The Mets snapped a brief two-game skid...New York is in a stretch of 13 straight games to start the second-half and are 1-1 in that span...The Mets begin the second-half with a four game set in Miami (1-1) followed by a twogame series in The Bronx...The Mets return to Citi Field on Thursday, July 25 for a seven-game homestand against the Braves (four games) and the Twins (three games).

**WINNINGI:** With a win tonight, the Mets would move back to four games above .500, which matches a season-high...The last time the Mets were five games above .500 was on April 23, 2023 (14-9)...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 26-12... Their 26 wins are tied for the most in the majors in that span, as is their .684 winning percentage.

**DINGERS!:** The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 123 home runs this season...The Mets have five players who have hit 10 or more home runs this year (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, J.D. Martinez, Brandon Nimmo and Mark Vientos)...Only the Padres and Orioles have more with seven players...Last year, the Mets featured eight players with 10 or more home runs, tied for the third-most in franchise history.

**20/20 VISION:** Francisco Lindor currently sits at 26 doubles, 17 home runs and 19 steals this season...Last year he became the ninth player in franchise history to record 20+ doubles, 20+ homers and 20+ steals in a single season... He is looking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple 20/20/20 seasons joining Howard Johnson (x5, 1987-91), Darryl Strawberry (x4, 1984, 1986-88), Carlos Beltrán (x2, 2007-08) and David Wright (x2, 2006-07).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets have played 45 games on the road entering today...That is tied with the Phillies for the second-fewest in the majors...Only the Rays (44) have played fewer...They are 24-21 away from Citi Field in 2024... Their .533 winning percentage is the sixth in The Show and third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have hit .265/.329/.437 on the road this year...They rank second in the majors in average, OBP and SLG.

WAY, AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .287/.407/.554 with 35 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 25 walks in 41 games on the road this season...He ranks sixth in the majors with a .407 road OBP...This compares to a .211/.318/.358 slashline with 24 runs, eight doubles, one triple, 32 RBI and 26 walks in 51 games at home in 2024.

**JUST THE TWO OF US:** Brandon Nimmo moved to the two spot for the first time on June 13 vs. Miami...He has appeared in 30 games in the two-hole and the Mets are 20-10 in that span...Nimmo is batting .299 (35-117) with 27 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs, 31 RBI, 17 walks, three steals with a .397 OBP, a .590 SLG and a .987 OPS when batting second this season...He has safely reached base in 28 of his last 29 games, posting a .402 OBP in that span...He has collected 63 RBI in 92 games this year...He recorded a careerhigh 68 RBI in 152 games last season.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 38 games since then, he is batting .285/.372/.536 with 30 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 34 RBI, 18 walks, four steals with a .909 OPS....He has brought his OPS up from .728 on May 31 to .806 entering today.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!:** The Mets are 10-6 this month...Their .625 winning percentage this month is the third-best in the National League...They have posted a 4.47 ERA, while batting .2450/.321/.434 this month...This compares to 16-8 record with a with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June.

**RECORD SCRATCH:** The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 10-6 in this stretch...The Mets are 32-22 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

**LET'S GO FISHING:** J.D. Martinez, a native of Miami, is a .300 (15-50) hitter with four runs, four doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI and nine walks in 13 career games at loanDepot park...Francisco Lindor has hit .286/.386/.429 with 17 runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI and 15 walks in 29 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has hit .276/.378/.494 with nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 27 RBI and 25 walks in 47 games in Miami...Pete Alonso has recorded 19 extra-base hits (12 home runs) with 24 RBI in 40 career games at the home of the Marlins.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** In 54 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .298/.385/.518 with 39 runs, 18 doubles, 10 home runs, 32 RBI, 25 walks, 13 steals with a .903 OPS...Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and second in the NL with a 4.3 fWAR this season...He has posted a 3.7 fWAR since May 1...That is fifth-best in the majors in that span...In 68 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .278/.356/.491 with 12 home runs and 41 RBI...The Mets are 30-23 when Lindor bats first this season.

### BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST START:** Took the bump on July 13 vs. Colorado at Citi Field...Allowed three runs on seven hits with one walk and struck out five over 4.1 innings...The Mets earned a 7-3 win in the game.

CHRISTIAN SCOTT RHP

**SINCE YOU'VE BEEN BACK:** Has made three starts since he has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...Has posted a 5.17 ERA (9 ER/5.2 IP) in that span with four home runs, four walks and 10 strikeouts.

**DOWN AT THE FARM:** Since he returned to Triple-A, Scott made four starts with the Syracuse Mets, posting a 2.12 ERA (4 ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...All together in nine starts at Triple-A, Scott is 3-0 with a 2.76 ERA (13 ER/42.1 IP) with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

**WHAT A DEBUT:** Christian Scott made his major league debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts... He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year... Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

**SIZZLING IN SYRACUSE:** At the time of his first call up, was 3-0 with a 3.20 ERA (9 ER/25.1 IP) at Syracuse...Has made five starts, allowing six walks and striking out 36...Led the International League in WHIP (0.71) and batting average against (.136), while placing fourth in strikeouts (36) and ninth in ERA (3.20).

**23 AND ME:** Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts.

**HE'S GOT PROSPECTS:** Entered the 2024 season as the 99th best prospect in the minors by ESPN.

**SLIDE TO THE RIGHT:** While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today...Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

**MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND:** In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.

- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City...Has 29 multi-hit games, tied for the seventh-most in the NL and tied for 14th-most in the majors.

- Walked twice in four consecutive games from July 12-19, tied with David Wright (5/17-20/09) for the longest such streak in franchise history.
- Is one of 14 players in major league history to have 15 or more home runs, 15 or more stolen bases and 25 or more doubles prior to the All-Star Break...Is the first Met to accomplish the feat and is the second shortstop in major league history to accomplish the feat (Also: Bobby Witt Jr., 2024).
- Is one of seven players in the majors with three or more four-hit games this season.
- Is one of eight players in the majors with 15 home runs and 15 stolen bases this season...Is the sixth player in franchise history to have 15 homers and 15 stolen bases before the All-Star Break and the first since Carlos Beltrán (2008).
- Had 11 doubles in June, tied for second-most in the month...His 15 extra-base hits were tied for the eighth-most in June while his 20 runs during the month were tied for the 13th-most in the majors.
- Has a 1136 OPS as the first batter of the game, the second-highest such mark in the majors (Min. 30 Plate Appearances).
- Has batted .308/.390/.536 in his last 52 games dating back to May 19...Hit safely in 11 straight games from May 21-June 1.
