METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the A's, 3-2, yesterday to earn their fourth series win of the season...The Mets have won a season-high three straight games and are a season-high three games over .500...The Mets are on their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip against the Athletics (2-0), Dodgers (three games) and Giants (four games).

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are looking for their first sweep of the season...The Mets are seeking their second sweep of the A's in franchise history...New York took three straight from the A's from June 22-24, 2007.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in seven games and has yet to allow a run...He allowed only four hits with eight strikeouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .167 (2-12) batting average this season...He has converted all three save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 160 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

JOSÉ, JOSÉ, JOSÉ: José Butto is slated to start today's contest...Butto was selected as the Minor League Pitcher of the Week for the International League during the first week of the season...Butto made one start last week on April 9 against the Rochester Red Wings...He hurled 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits, walked two and struck out five...In two starts this year, Butto is 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with five walks and eight strikeouts.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has collected a hit in eight of his last nine games, batting .353 (12-34) in that span with nine runs, six home runs, 11 RBI, five walks with a .436 OBP and an .882 SLG in that span...Alonso has hit seven home runs this season, which is tied for the major league lead.

WHEN YOU'RE FIFTEEN: Alonso has slugged seven homers in the team's first 15 games of the season, which is tied for the second-most in team history with Todd Hundley (1996) and Dave Kingman (1976)...Jeff Kent hit eight home runs in New York's first 15 games in 1994.

ROAD WARRIOR: Alonso has hit 87 home runs on the road in his career...That places him in sixth place in franchise history...Next up is Carlos Beltran who hit 88 road home runs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso batted .333/.410/.639 against AL opponents last season with 15 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI and 10 walks...His six home runs were tied for the sixth-most in the majors...Alonso has hit 30 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 30 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player in that time frame...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in seven games, owning a .529 OBP in that span...Overall, in 14 games this season, Nimmo is batting .289 with nine runs, three doubles, eight RBI, 14 walks and a .468 OBP...His .468 OBP ranks eighth in the majors and fourth in the Senior Circuit...The left-handed hitter has drawn 337 walks in his career, which places him 18th in franchise history...John Milner is next with 338 walks...Nimmo has posted a .388 OBP, which is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 2,000 PA)...Only John Olerud (.425) and Dave Magadan (.391) had higher OBP.

A'S-METS NOTES: The Mets played a three-game set in Oakland from September 23-25 last season...Prior to that series, the Mets had not visited Oakland since 2014.

OAK AGED: Pete Alonso is .450 (9-20) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI and four walks in five games at the home of the Athletics...Brandon Nimmo is .500 (8-16) with seven runs, five RBI and three walks in five games there...Jeff McNeil is 6-22 with four runs, a double, an RBI and two walks in five contests...In 22 games in Oakland, Francisco Lindor has hit .365/.385/.576 with 14 runs, nine doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI and four walks...Starling Marte played 34 games at the ballpark and slashed .329/.375/.514 with 12 doubles, a triple, four home runs and 25 RBI...Mark Canha appeared in 324 games at the ballpark and has slashed .243/.348/.435 with 52 doubles, six triples, 46 homers, 147 RBI and 128 walks.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...In 2022, the Mets went 9-11 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 237-227 record in Interleague play...The team's .511 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERSTELLAR: Jeff McNeil owns a .335/.381/.471 slashline with 37 runs, 14 doubles, seven home runs and 34 RBI in 69 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .330/.392/.551 with 115 runs, 45 doubles, 11 triples, 27 home runs and 86 RBI in 172 Intearleague games...They rank first and second in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .335 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

THE SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR WAY: Francisco Lindor has hit safely in five straight games and in eight of his last nine games...In nine games since April 5, Lindor is batting .314 (11-35) with 10 runs, five doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, four walks, a steal with a .400 OBP and a .714 SLG.

THE WALKMAN: The Mets lead the majors with 78 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo is tied for second in the majors with 14 walks...Jeff McNeil has recorded 10 walks, while Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor have nine free passes each this season.

OUCH: The Mets once again own the major league lead with 13 HBP...Mark Canha has been hit by 46 pitches at Oakland Coliseum, the most in the history of the ballpark...Only five active players have been hit by more pitches in a single ballpark during their career...Courtesy Sportradar.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed only two errors in 15 games this season...The team's .996 fielding percentage is the best in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen 17 bases this season, which is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...Starling Marte is tied for second in the NL with six steals...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for seventh in the NL, has stolen three bases in 14 games this year...Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

CURTAINS FROM CURTISS: John Curtiss hasn't allowed a run in his last five games, tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with six strikeouts...Overall, he has yielded one run overall in 7.1 innings (1.23 ERA) in six outings.

BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

DEBUTTO: RHP José Butto is set to make his season debut today...He made his major league debut on August 21 last season in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-innings home runs by Mark Canha.

LAST TIME OUT: Butto threw 6.0 shutout innings on April 9 vs. Rochester, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out five.

SINCE HIS MLB DEBUT: Butto has made eight appearances (seven starts) for Syracuse (AAA) since making his major league debut last August...In those games, he is 2-1 with a 1.79 ERA (8 ER/40.1 IP)...He has allowed only 26 hits and 12 walks, good for a 0.94 WHIP in that span...Butto has 35 strikeouts over those eight outings.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss in the Mets' 4-2 setback vs. San Diego on April 11 after throwing 5.2 innings and allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts.

TOUGH LUCK: In Peterson's two losses this season, he has thrown 10.2 innings and allowed a total of three runs...That comes out to a 2.53 ERA...That is the lowest ERA in losses among all pitchers with at least two defeats this season.
