RECENT REDBIRDS: The defending NL Central Division Champion St. Louis Cardinals conclude their first roadtrip (MIL-3, COL-3) of the season today with the rubber game of a three-game series against the Colorado Rockies at Coors Field...the Cardinals snapped a two-game skid with a 9-6 come-from-behind win last night to improve their road trip record to 2-3...the Cardinals, with a win today, can secure their first series win since taking 2-of-3 in their season-opening series against Toronto...the Cardinals have not won consecutive games at Coors Field in the same calendar year since back-to-back wins here Sept. 19-20, 2016...this week marks the Cardinals lone series visit to Denver, their first games here in the month of April since 2003...the Rockies will visit St. Louis for a three-game series August 4-6.

TAP THE ROCKIES: St. Louis has won their season series vs. the Rockies in each of the 12 seasons (2010-2022) and 21 times in 27 seasons since Colorado joined MLB as an expansion team in 1993. WILD, WILD WEST: Since 2019, the Cardinals are 38-12 at home vs. the National League West, but just 20-30

MILE HIGH HIKE: The Cardinals are one of just three NL teams that have never had a pitcher throw a complete game at Coors Field...the Cardinals (104 games played at Coors), Cubs (99) and Mets (98) make up that group...the Cardinals, who also had no route-going efforts in their 12 games played in 1993-94 at Denver's Mile High Stadium, also lack a complete game effort in their 57 alltime games played at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park.

A NIGHT FOR NOLANS: Starring at a 6-2 deficit in their 7th last night, the Cardinals climbed back to even when Nolan Arenado cleared the bases with a 3-run double, the Cardinals first hit of the season with the bases loaded (they had been

0-for-8 with just 1 RBI)...Nolan Gorman then sparked a three-run 9th inning with a titanic blast to right, his team-leading 3rd homer of the season, helping to secure the 9-6 comeback win.

DONNY'S DEFENSIVE GEMS: Making his first start of the season in left field last night, Brendon Donovan, the first-ever recipient of the Rawlings Gold Glove for a Utility player, made his team-high 4th defensive gem of the season with a leading grab at the track in the 8th inning... Donovan already has had defensive gems at three positions this year, also doing so at 1st base on Monday and a previous pair at 2nd base.

BURLEY CYCLE: Rookie Alec Burleson collected his 2nd career professional triple Monday night, and his first in the majors...by doing so, Burley became the first Cardinal to hit for the season cycle in 2023 with at least one single, double, triple and homer...Burleson also extended his hitting streak to 6 games, the 5th longest active streak in the NL.

INNING BY INNING: The Cardinals have struck for a season-high 13 runs in their 3rd innings and 10 in the 4th...they are still looking to score a run in both the 2nd inning and 5th inning this season...they have left a combined 21 runners on base in their 2nd & 5th innings.

WALKER MAKING HISTORY: Rookie Jordan Walker singled in the 7th inning last night to extend his hitting streak to 11 games, extending his Cardinals rookie record for the longest hitting streak to begin a career...the Rockies David Dahl (2016) and Reds Chuck Aleno (1941) hold the MLB rookie record for longest hitting streak to begin a career at 17 games. (Elias)

SPLENDID: Jordan Walker's 11-game hit streak to begin his career is just the 2nd all-time by a player age 20 years or younger... Philadelphia Athletics outfielder Eddie Murphy hit safely in each of his first 12 games in 1912 at age 20...Walker on Monday night passed Ted Williams (1939, age 20) who hit in 9-straight games to launch his Hall of Fame career...current Cardinals Bench Coach Joe McEwing holds the Cardinals franchise rookie record for longest hitting streak, doing so in 25 games (June 8-July 4, 1999), the 8th-longest hit streak in franchise history...Walker and the Phillies' Bryson Stott (11) entered play today with the majors' longest hit active streaks.

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Rookie outfielder Jordan Walker, the Cardinals 1st round draft selection in 2020, is the MLB rookie leader in hits (14) and in batting (.326) among rookies; he ranks 6th in OPS (882)...his 8 RBI rank 3rd behind the Angels' Logan O'Hoppe (10) and the Dodgers' James Outman (9)...Walker's first 14 hits have come off of 14 different pitchers.

CLOSE TO CARGO: Nolan Arenado who hit his 1st homer of the season and 300th of this career Sat. at Milwaukee, is currently ranked 4th all-time in Coors Field homers (138), one back of Carlos "Cargo" Gonzalez (139)...he's HR'd twice at Coors as a member of the Cardinals

OFF THE BAT: According to Baseball Savant, St. Louis ranks T1st in MLB in hard hit balls of 95+mph (140) with the Dodgers and 5th in average exit velocity (90.6 mph)...Jordan Walker (19), Paul Goldschmidt (18) & Nolan Arenado (17) are pacing the team in hard hit balls.

Nolan Arenado played eight seasons with Colorado (2013-20), where he was a five-time NL All-Star and the winner of four Silver Sluggers, eight Gold Gloves, and four Platinum Gloves...originally selected by Colorado in the 2nd round of the 2009 Draft...Acquired by St. Louis with cash in exchange for Austin Gomber, Elehuris Montero, Tony Locey, Mateo Gil and Jake Sommers.

Nolan Arenado's cousin, Josh Fuentes, played three seasons with the Rockies (2019-21) and college baseball at Missouri Baptist University (2014) in St. Louis

Randal Grichuk played parts of his first four MLB seasons in St. Louis (2014-17)...originally joined the Cardinals via trade with the Angels, packaged with **Peter Bourjos** in exchange for **David Freese** and **Fernando Salas** (Nov. 22, 2013)...later traded St. Louis to Toronto for Conner Greene and Dominic Leone (Jan. 19, 2018).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist Benjamin Hochman previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations John Mozeliak began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season... graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher... graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Daniel Bard made 10 appearances for Springfield (AA) in 2017

Austin Gomber pitched parts of two seasons with St. Louis (2018, '20)...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 4th round of the 2014 MLB Draft...shared Cardinals Co-Minor League Pitchers of the Year honors with **Alex Reyes** in 2015.

Cardinals Hall of Famer Matt Holliday was originally selected by Colorado in the 7th round of the 1998 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons for the Rockies (2004-08, '18) where he was a three-time All-Star and appeared in the 2007 World Series.

Elehuris Montero signed with St. Louis as an international free agent (Aug. 29, 2014)...played five minor leagues seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2015-19).

Pierce Johnson pitched three seasons (2010-12) at Missouri State University...set the school's single-season record with 119 strikeouts in 2012.

Cardinals Asst. GM & Scouting Director Randy Flores pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter Derrick Goold is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafavette. Colo...worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

Rockies Communications Coordinator Kevin Collins previously served as the 2015 Media Relations Intern for the Memphis Redbirds (AAA).

Rockies MLB.com Thomas Harding covered the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) for two seasons for the Commercial Appeal (1998-99)...mentored recent Cardinals MLB.com writer Anne Rogers.

- Makes his 3rd start of the season, first against the Rockies in 2023 and first career start at Coors Field. Is one of 11 active pitchers to make 100 or more career starts without pitching at Coors Field; teammate Jordan Montgomery is among them at 110 (Elias).
- Is 15-9 with a 2.45 ERA in 35 career day game starts. Ranks 6th among active pitchers in day game ERA behind deGrom (2.05), Chapman (2.25), Kimbrel (2.33), Kershaw (2.40) and Alcántara (2.42).
- · Needs five strikeouts to tie Theodore Breitenstein for 30th all-time in Cardinals history and seven to tie Andy Benes for 29th at 614.
- · Has walked six or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season. If he walks six batters today, he will be the first Cardinals pitcher to notch three consecutive appearance with six or more walks since 1931 ("Wild" Bill Hallahan - also started the season with three straight) and the 5th Cardinals pitcher all time (Roy Golden - 5, Bill Hallahan, Bob Harmon & Jack Dunleavy - 3).
- Has held his opposition to six hits or fewer in 27 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 20, 2020, 2nd only to Jacob deGrom (36; 8/19/20-present).
- Owns a career mark of 8-3, 3.12 ERA in 14 career starts in the monh of April. Had his streak of 6-straight April decisions snapped in his last start at MIL, with his previous April loss also vs. MIL in 2019.
- Trails only Wainwright & DeJong in years of Cardinals service on current roster.
- ullet Has held his opposition to a .203 career batting average, ranking 13th among MLB pitchers with more than 500 career innings pitched in the Live Ball Era (post-1920): sandwiched between Nolan Ryan (12th, .204) and Sandy Koufax (14th, .205).
- · Missed a total of 122 games last season due to a right shoulder injury (64 games from April 7-June 14 and another 58 games from June 27-Sept.4)
- Since becoming a full-time starting pitcher in 2018, ranks 15th among MLB pitchers with a 10.32 strikeouts/9 IP (min. 500 IP).
- St. Louis sports a 53-47 overall record in Flaherty's 100 career starts. In his first 51 starts from his MLB debut (9/1/2017) until the 2019 All-Star Break, St. Louis went 21-30 (.412). In his last 47 starts (July 16, 2019-present), St. Louis is 32-17 (.653).
- In 100 career starts, is 34-10 when receiving 2+ runs of support, 27-2 when receiving 3+ runs, and 23-0 with 4+ runs of support. Has received 2 or fewer runs of support in 60 of 100 (60.0%) career starts.
- Is 20-13 in 50 career games (47 starts) at Busch Stadium. His .188 opponent batting average is the lowest in stadium history (min. 100 IP), while his 292 strikeouts (8th) and 2.79 ERA (7th) at Busch both rank in the Top 10 among all pitchers in the ballpark's history (since 2006).

• Worked around six base on balls in his 5.0 IP, but allowed 2 runs on four hits and fell to the Brewers by a 4-0 score last Friday (4/7) in the opening game of the current road trip.

- Threw 5.0 innings of no-hit ball in his first start of the season vs. TOR (4/1), became the 16th pitcher since 1901 to issue seven walks in a scoreless and hitless outing of any length (Langs); and the 5th pitcher in Cardinals history to pitch exactly 5.0 innings without allowing a hit or a run in a start.
- Ran his streak of consecutive games with six hits or less to 27 in a 4-0 loss at MIL (4/7). Allowed just two runs on four hits. His 60th career start receiving two runs of support or less. Walked six batters in the game, first Cardinals pitcher to walk 6+ batters in consecutive games since Carlos Martínez (2018).
