THE PIRATES:...have lost a season-high five straight games...Were doubled up 4-2 in the middle game of their weekend series against the Red Sox yesterday afternoon...Went 3-0-2 in their first five series before being swept by the Mets from 4/15-17 for their first series loss...Are 2-3 against the AL East this season (their next series against the AL East after today will take place in Toronto from $5 / 31$ to 6/2)...Will close out the 2024 campaign at Yankee Stadium from 9/27-29... Began the season 5-0 for the first time since 1983...Swept a season-opening four-game series on the road for the first time since doing so in 1903 in Cincinnati.

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Martín Pérez gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this weekend series against the Red Sox...Pérez comes into today 11th among all National League pitchers with a 2.55 ERA....This will be Pérez' second home start of the season...In his only other start at PNC Park, he allowed one run in 8.0 innings and was in line for the win before coming away with a no-decision in the team's last at-bat loss vs. Detroit on April 9 .
ON DECK: Tomorrow the Pirates will open a four-game series against the Brewers, which will be their first series against a National League Central team this season...The Pirates went $25-27$ against their own division in 2023.
KE'S TO THE GAME: The next game for Ke'Bryan Hayes will be the 400th of his big league career...Hayes made his big league debut as a member of the Pirates on September 1, 2020, against the Cubs...Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Hayes has the most Defensive Runs Saved (60) by any player in MLB regardless of position according to the Fielding Bible...The next closest player is Ryan McMahon (52).
REYNOLDS AND THE RED SOX: Bryan Reynolds went 3 -for-4 yesterday afternoon against
