METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Nationals 5-0 last night...New York has won five straight, six of their last seven, 10 of their last 12 and 14 of their last 17...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (2-0) against the Nationals (2-0) and Rays (three games).

I WOULD WALK .500 MILES: The Mets are a season-high 20 games above .500...In 2024, the team reached a high-water mark of 18 games above .500 on Sunday, September 22...The last time the Mets were 19 or more games above .500 was when they were 101-61 at the end of the 2022 season.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a five-game winning streak...The team is batting .297/.371/.566 in that span while posting a 2.35 ERA...They have outscored their opponents 35-12 in the streak...Their longest winning streak this year is seven games (4/17-4/23).

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 44-24 record this season...That is the best record in the National League...It is tied with the Tigers for the most wins in the majors...It is tied for the second-best record to start a season...Only the 1986 (47-21) team had a better season-opening record...The 2022 and 1988 teams also went 44-24 to start the season.

ODDS + ENDS: The Mets improved to 10-1 in home series this season and 14-6-2 in series on the year...They are now 19-5 when hitting two or more homers in a game and 13-1 when hitting three or more home runs...New York is 11-4 vs. NL East opponents...The Mets are seeking their sixth sweep of the season.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 26-7 at home this season, the best home start in franchise history...It is the best home start to a season in the majors since Tampa Bay went 27-6 at home in 2023...Their 2.52 ERA at home is the best in the NL...Their .788 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...The Mets have won five straight at Citi Field and nine of their last 10.

HANG 10: According to Sarah Langs, Pete Alonso has 20 RBI in his last 10 games, which is tied for the most RBI in a 10-game span in a single season in Mets history, with: Francisco Lindor (2022), Yoenis Cespedes (2016), Mike Piazza (2000 and 1999)...Alonso has recorded 20 RBI in 10 games this month, the most in the majors...The Mets record for most RBI in a single month is 36 in September of 1985 by Gary Carter.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has safely reached base in 19 straight games...The 19-game on-base streak is now the second-longest streak of his career...His career-best is a 36 games streak (8/2-9/9/19)...He is batting .320 (24-75) in that span with five doubles, eight homers, 26 RBI, five walks, a .395 OBP and a .707 SLG in that span...Alonso has collected 63 RBI in 68 games this season...That is the most in the major leagues...He recorded 88 RBI in 162 contests last year...He is tied with himself (2022) for the most RBI in franchise history through the team's first 68 games...His 21 doubles are tied for the second-most in franchise history through as many games (trails only David Wright's 22 2B in 2012).

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in each of his last 13 games...He is batting .356 (16-45) with 15 runs, three doubles, five homers, 10 RBI, 14 walks with a .517 OBP and a .756 SLG...He has recorded multiple hits in three straight and four of his last five games...Soto has recorded a major league leading 55 walks...His 55 walks through the team's first 68 games are tied with John Olerud (199) the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have defeated the Nationals in each of the last nine games at Citi Field...It's the longest streak in team history...In addition, the Mets have won 12 of their last 13 games against Washington at Citi Field.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have recorded an 87.5 (56-64) stolen base percentage this season, the best in the majors...The team's catchers have caught 18 potential base stealers this season, which is tied for the fifth-most in the majors...Mets catchers have caught 38.3% potential base stealers this year, the second-best mark in the majors.

THE STRAND: The Mets have stranded 75.8% inherited runners this season, which is the fourth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...The Mets bullpen ranks second in the majors with a 2.78 ERA...They have allowed 18 home runs this season, tied for the third-fewest in the majors.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 45 times this year, which is the most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 94 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 82, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

HAPPY JEFF: Jeff McNeil has reached base safely in each of the last 14 games, batting .314 (16-51) with six runs, four doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, four walks, one steal, a .357 OBP and a .627 SLG...He has played in 78 games since the 2024 All-Star break...He has hit .278/.367/.535 with 34 runs, 17 doubles, three triples, 39 RBI, 30 walks, one steal and a .902 OPS.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets starting staff has allowed only more than four earned runs in one game this year when RHP Blade Tidwell made his major league debut and surrendered six earned runs over 3.2 innings of work...They have gone 34 consecutive games without allowing more than four earned runs, the second-longest active streak in the majors...Overall, the Mets starting staff has posted a 2.84 ERA, the best in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one earned run on five hits, two walks, and recorded six strikeouts in the win in Colorado on June 6...Marked his second consecutive quality start and his sixth on the season...He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in all 12 of his starts this season...Was his fifth game this season with six or more strikeouts in a game and the first time he has done it in back-to-back starts.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 12 starts this season, Senga has gone 6-3 with a 1.59 ERA (12 ER/68.0 IP), 30 walks and 65 strikeouts...His 1.59 ERA is the fifth lowest through a player’s first 12 starts of a season in franchise history, trailing only Jacob deGrom’s 0.50 ERA in 2021, Jerry Koosman’s 1.42 ERA in 1969, deGrom’s 1.52 ERA in 2018, and Koosman’s 1.43 ERA in 1968....Courtesy of *Elias*...His 1.59 ERA is currently the second-best in the majors and the best in the NL...Opponents are only batting .206 (50-243) off Senga this season which is the ninth-best mark in the NL.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or less in 29 consecutive starts dating back to 6/23/23...It is the longest active streak in the majors and tied for the third-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom’s 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22), deGrom’s 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) and is now tied with Dwight Gooden’s 29 starts (from 9/7/84-8/10/85).

VS. NATIONALS: Senga has made three career starts against the Nationals and he is 0-1 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER/17.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts in those starts...He pitched in Washington on April 25, and he gave up two earned runs over 6.0 innings on six hits and two walks...He struck out five Nationals in that start...He has recorded at least five or more strikeouts in each of his three starts against them.

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga’s "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga’s first 12 starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 43 of his 65 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 41.6% whiff rate, which is the fourth-best in the majors...His forkball has a run value of five which is tied for third in the majors.

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga’s first 42 career starts he has posted 276 strikeouts which is the 18th-most through a pitchers first 42 games in Major League history...It is the fifth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (first, 365), Matt Harvey (eighth, 299), Noah Syndergaard (11th, 294) and Jacob deGrom (17th, 279)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Yu Darvish (339) and Hideo Nomo (334).

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga’s 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden’s 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga’s 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

- Entered in the sixth inning on June 8 at Colorado and he allowed three earned runs over 4.0 innings, earning his first career save (S, 4.0 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, BB, 3 K)...It was just his fifth appearance as a reliever and his first since July 9, 2023, at Boston...He became just the second Met since 1997 earn a save and throw more than 4.0 innings in a game and the first since Brian Stokes did it in 2008 at Washington on August 13.

- He has made one start this season on June 2 at Los Angeles-NL and he threw 5.0 scoreless innings...He struck out three and he only allowed three hits and one walk.
- Began his rehab assignment on April 19 and made seven rehab starts between High-A Brooklyn, Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, combining to go 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA (12 ER/29.1 IP), 13 walks and 31 strikeouts...Did not allow more than three earned runs in each of those seven outings
- Was originally placed on the IL on March 27 (retro. 3/24) with right knee inflammation.
