THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

A BOND BEYOND BASEBALL: MLB Network's Anthony Cas trovince and Paul Solga teamed up on "A Bond Beyond Baseball," a compelling, heartfelt story about the friendship and working relationship of Arizona Diamondbacks' General Manager Mike Hazen \& Manager Torey Lovullo.

- In 17 plate appearances last season vs. Cubs while with the Giants, Joc Pederson hit .733 (11-for-15) with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 6 RBI

SERIES-LY: The D-backs have won 2 consecutive series (@ COL, vs. STL) and 3 of their 5 on the season.

SHUT 'EM OUT: Yesterday's victory marked their first shutout at home vs. Cardinals since April 28, 2016 (W; 3-0)... it was Arizona's second shutout this season (also: W, 7-0 vs. Yankees on April 2).

OH MY, LOURDES: Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s 18 RBI are tied for second in the Majors (also: Spencer Steer/CIN), behind Marcell Ozuna/ATL (21)...Gurriel's 18 RBI thru the team's first 16 games of a season also ties for the most by a D-back in the span (also: Mark Trumbo/2014 and Luis Gonzalez/2001).

- This season, Gurriel Jr. is batting .500 (11-for-22)/1.405 OPS with runners in scoring position, with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 15 RBI.

SCORING FIRST: The D-backs have scored first in all 8 games they have won this season...they have scored first in a game 12 times, tied for the second most in the Majors (also: Dodgers and Royals), only behind the Red Sox (13) and ahead of the Cubs (11) and Padres (11).

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 10 games this season with $1+$ runs scored in the first inning is the most in the Majors.

- The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 8 of their first 16 games this season...no other team has more than 5 instances so far this season (Angels). - In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 1 run twice, 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 25 runs with a .439 average ( 36 -for- 82 )/1.288 OPS and 9 doubles, 7 home runs and 8 walks.

BARRELING IT UP: Ketel Marte's 31 hard hits (No. of batted balls with exit velocity of $95 \mathrm{mph}+$ ) rank third in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (34) and Bobby Witt Jr./ KC (33) while Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s 29 are tied for fifth. -Christian Walker's 17.5 barrel pct. (percentage of batted balls that are classified as barrels) ranks tenth.. Bobby Witt Jr./KC (24.0) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (23.3) are top 2 in MLB.
