PITTSBURGH PIRATES (44-62) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (54-52)

July 28, 2025 - Oracle Park - San Francisco, CA - 6:45 PDT - Game #107/Road #51

RHP Mitch Keller (4-10, 3.53 ERA) vs. LHP Carson Whisenhunt (Major League Debut)

THE PIRATES: went 5-4 on their recent nine-game homestand from July 18-27 against Chicago-AL (0-3), Detroit (3-0) and Arizona (2-1)...Are one of four teams in Major League Baseball that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings this season (37-0)...Are 32-36 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta (their 19 errors since Kelly's debut are the second-fewest in MLB)...Are 14-2 over their last 16 games when scoring at least four runs (since June 6).

NO CYN OF SLOWING DOWN: Paul Skenes allowed just three hits and one walk while striking out nine batters over 6.0 scoreless innings in Sunday's 6-0 win vs. Arizona...The 23-year-old Skenes has a 1.83 ERA (133.0ip/27er) and 146 strikeouts through his first 22 starts of 2025... Per OptaStats, the last Major League pitcher to match those stats through his first 22 starts of a season was Los Angeles (NL)'s Clayton Kershaw (1.73 ERA, 194 strikeouts) in 2014, when he was the National League's MVP and won the Cy Young Award...Skenes' 0.67 ERA (27.0ip/2er) this month is the fifth-lowest by a Pirates pitcher in any calendar month (minimum 25.0 innings pitched) in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920), trailing Bob Moose (0.34, September 1975), Dock Ellis (0.63, September 1972), Jim Nelson (0.64, June 1970) and Zane Smith (0.66, September 1990).

PITCHING PROWESS: Pirates pitchers allowed just one unearned run over 29.0 innings in last weekend's series against the Diamondbacks at PNC Park...It marked only their fifth series since at least 1901 where they pitched at least 29.0 innings without allowing an earned run (all four other instances came in 1911)...The only two other Major League teams since 1973 to do that in a series were Oakland in 2018 (August 3-5 vs. Detroit, 31.0 innings) and Milwaukee in 2013 (July 19-21 vs. Miami, 31.0 innings)...Pittsburgh has pitched 13 shutouts this season, the second-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind San Diego (14)...The 13 shutouts are the Pirates' most in a season since 2018, when they had 16.

PUNCHING TICKETS: Pittsburgh pitchers have recorded at least nine strikeouts in six straight games (since July 21 vs. Detroit), its longest-such streak since September 17-25, 2022 (eight straight)...The Pirates' 65 strikeouts since July 21 are the fourth-most in Major League Baseball.

ALL IN THE PHAMALEE: Tommy Pham went 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI and a run scored in Sunday's win vs. Arizona, raising his July average to .356 (21-for-59)...Pham, who enters tonight's game two RBI shy of 500 for his career, is batting .390 (32-for-82) since June 22 vs. Texas, the third-best average in all of Major League Baseball in that span (minimum 90 plate appearances).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz was 2-for-3 with a double, two RBI, a walk and a run scored on Sunday vs. Arizona...Over his last 14 games (since July 8 at Kansas City), he is batting .333 (16-for-48) with seven extra-base hits, nine RBI and six stolen bases...Cruz became the first Pirate with seven extra-base hits, nine RBI and six stolen bases in a 14-game span since Starling Marte from July 6-22, 2018.

BACK IN THE BAY: Andrew McCutchen, who played in 130 games with San Francisco in 2018, has 24 extra-base hits this season at the age of 38... According to OptaStats, that's the most extra-base hits by a Pirate in a season at age 38 or older since Willie Stargell had 51 extra-base hits in 1979 (age 39).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: The Pirates are 9-1 in their last 10 games (since May 31 at San Diego) when Bryan Reynolds, who was acquired from San Francisco on January 15, 2018, has at least one RBI...His 913 hits since debuting in 2019 are the third-most among Major League switch hitters, behind José Ramírez (961) and Francisco Lindor (932)...The only switch hitters in Pirates history with more hits are Max Carey (2416), Johnny Ray (1009) and Claude Ritchey (965).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 28, 2014: Vance Worley tossed his first career shutout, allowing just four hits and one walk on 100 pitches in Pittsburgh's 5-0 win over San Francisco at AT&T Park. The Pirates opened the scoring with a four-run first inning, highlighted by RBI singles from Neil Walker and Russell Martin. Josh Harrison added to Pittsburgh's lead with a second-inning, solo shot off Madison Bumgarner.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller allowed three runs on six hits and three walks while striking out five batters over his 6.0 innings of work on July 22 vs. Detroit, winning an 8-5 decision (all three runs came on a three-run, fifth-inning home run from Jake Rogers).

AGAINST THE GIANTS: Keller is 1-2 with a 4.91 ERA (22.0ip/12er) in four career starts against San Francisco, including a 7.36 ERA (11.0ip/9er) in two starts here at Oracle Park...His last start against the Giants came on May 31, 2023, in San Francisco...That afternoon, he allowed four runs over his 6.0 innings of work, winning a 9-4 decision.

OF LATE: Since allowing six runs in 6.1 innings on June 5 vs. Houston, Keller has a 2.59 ERA (48.2ip/14er) and a .209 batting average against in his last eight starts (since June 10 vs. Miami)...His 2.59 ERA in that span ranks ninth among qualified NL pitchers.

A SKY-HIGH JULY: Keller has a 2.10 ERA (25.2ip/6er) in his first four starts in the month of July...That's the eighth-lowest ERA among National League pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched in July, behind only teammate Paul Skenes (0.67), Chicago's Matthew Boyd (0.67), New York's David Peterson (1.05), San Diego's Nick Pivetta (1.17), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (1.19), Miami's Eury Pérez (1.29) and Cincinnati's Nick Lodolo (1.61)...He's gone at least 6.0 innings in all four starts in July.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE: Keller has recorded 15 quality starts this season, tied with Houston's Framber Valdez, San Francisco's Logan Webb, Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler and Seattle's Bryan Woo for the most quality starts among all Major League pitchers.

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller enters tonight's start with 784 strikeouts, 18th-most in Pirates history...Howie Camnitz ranks 17th with 806 (Bob Friend ranks first with 1682).

CLOSE CALLS: Keller has pitched in 10-one run games this season (last on July 13 at Minnesota)...He is 1-4 with a 2.53 ERA (67.2ip/19er) and 49 strikeouts in those starts.

DON'T WALK HERE: Keller issued two walks or fewer in a career-high 12 straight starts from May 13 at New York (NL) to July 13 at Minnesota...His 30 total walks this season are tied with New York (AL)'s Max Fried and San Francisco's Logan Webb for the fifth-fewest among all Major League pitchers with at least 125.0 innings pitched, behind only Tampa Bay's Zack Littell (17), Detroit's Tarik Skubal (19), Seattle's Bryan Woo (24) and Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler (28)...Teammate Paul Skenes (32) ranks eighth.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Keller is allowing only 0.72 home runs per 9.0 innings pitched this season, the fifth-lowest mark among all qualified pitchers in the National League, trailing only teammate Paul Skenes (0.41), New York's David Peterson (0.52), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (0.58) and San Francisco's Logan Webb (0.66).

AND THE WHIFF: With his third-inning strikeout of Masyn Winn in the 5-0 victory on July 2 vs. St. Louis, Keller became PNC Park's all-time leader in strikeouts (he has 394 total strikeouts at the stadium)...Paul Maholm, who had 383 strikeouts, ranks second.
