Ichiro Suzuki is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in 46 days on July 27 in Cooperstown... he is also set to have his #51 retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

VS. DIAMONDBACKS

The Mariners and Diamondbacks square off for their first and only series of the season...the Mariners won last season's series matchup against Arizona at T-Mobile Park 2-1.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners will play the finale of their 6-game road trip with the last of 3 games at the Arizona Diamondbacks (0-2)...Seattle previously wrapped up 3 games at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2)... following the series at the Diamondbacks, the Mariners will return home to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand, with 3 games against the Cleveland Guardians (6/13-6/15) and 3 games against the Boston Red Sox (6/16-6/18)...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game to the Diamondbacks by a 10-3 final score... Seattle is 16-17 at home and 17-16 on the road this season.

- Bill Withers Would be Proud** - The Mariners own an MLB-best 16-8 (.667) record in day games this season.
- What A Homer** - Seattle is 30-17 (.638) when hitting a home run this season, and 3-15 (.200) when being held without a homer.
- Length** - The Mariners are 21-7 (.750) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings this season, and 6-2 when their starting pitcher goes 7.0+ innings.
- Strive For Five** - Seattle is 22-6 (.786) when scoring 5+ runs in a game, and 11-27 (.289) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- No June Swoon** - **Randy Arozarena** belted his 8th home run of the season yesterday, and is batting .306 (11x36) with 3 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 2 SB and an .822 OPS in 9 games in June...**Julio Rodríguez** is batting .333 (12x36) with 1 triple, 2 RBI and 4 stolen bases in June.
- Rehab Update** - Mariners All-Star starting pitcher **Logan Gilbert** tossed 5.0 scoreless innings allowing 1 hit with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts over 72 pitches (43 strikes) yesterday for Triple-A Tacoma in his 3rd rehab start.

MARINERS.COM/VOTE...voting for the 95th MLB All-Star Game, set for Atlanta on July 15, is officially underway...fan voting is split into two phases with phase 1 running until June 26, with fans allowed to submit up to 5 votes per day during phase 1...after phase 1 is completed, the top 2 vote getters at each position (top 6 outfielders) will face off head-to-head in phase 2 of voting, which will determine who will start the All-Star Game, phase 2 of voting will run from June 30-July 2...the overall leading vote getter in each league will skip phase 2 and receive an automatic starting assignment...the All-Star starters will be announced on ESPN on July 2 and full rosters on July 6...vote for Mariners at Mariners.com/Vote.

CAL RALEIGH: THE CATCHER THAT CRUSHES...catcher **Cal Raleigh** is having an incredible season, batting .264 (64x242) with 44 runs, 11 doubles, 26 home runs, 53 RBI, 38 walks and 7 stolen bases, with a .370 on-base percentage, .632 slugging percentage and 1.002 OPS...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks 1st in home runs, 2nd in slugging percentage, T-3rd in OPS, 5th in extra-base hits (37), 4th in total bases (153), 6th in RBI, 2nd in fWAR (4.0) and 2nd in wRC+ (182)...Cal has appeared in 65 of the Mariners 66 games this season.

CAL AND CATCHER HISTORY: AN ICONIC DUO...there have only been 3 MLB seasons where a catcher has had 20+ HR and 5+ SB prior to the All-Star Break, with Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** having done so in back-to-back seasons...Cal has 26 HR and 7 SB and counting this season after amassing 20 HR and 5 SB last season...he is joined by Hall of Famer Carlton Fisk who had 23 HR and 9 SB before the 1985 All-Star Break...if Cal can reach 30 HR and 10 SB before the All-Star Break, it will mark only the 8th time in MLB history that has been achieved (last: Shohei Ohtani-LAA in 2023).

PURE FUEGO...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** tossed a perfect 9th inning with 1 strikeout on just 8 pitches in Monday's game...in 29 appearances this season, Muñoz is 2-0 with 18 saves and a 1.30 ERA (4 ER, 27.2 IP) with 10 walks (2 intentional), 36 strikeouts and a 0.830 WHIP, holding opponents to a .140 batting average...Muñoz ranks T-3rd in saves (18) in MLB (also: Kyle Finnegan-WSH) and 2nd in the AL, trailing only Carlos Estévez-KC (19)...the March/April AL Reliever of the month set the Mariners record for most innings pitched (23.2) to begin a season without allowing an earned run.

J.P. STANDS FOR JUST PRODUCING...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** went 1-for-4 last night...J.P. has an active 11-game on-base streak (5/30-c), during which he is batting .429 (18x42) with 3 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 8 walks and 7 multi-hit contests, getting on base at a .529 clip with a 1.124 OPS...his .401 OBP this season ranks 7th in the Majors...J.P. is on pace to become the 8th Mariners player (done 20x) to have a qualified season with a .400 OBP or better and first since Ichiro Suzuki in 2004 (.414).

LATE AND LETHAL...since being reinstated from the Injured List on May 3, **Matt Brash** has posted a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 10.1 IP) in 12 appearances with 6 holds and 12 strikeouts, limiting opponents to a .194 average (7x36) with a 1.06 WHIP...in 27 appearances this season, **Gabe Speier** is 2-0 with a 2.19 ERA (6 ER, 24.2) and holds a 38.1% strikeout rate and 32% strikeout-to-walk rate, ranking 4th and 3rd among American League relievers (min. 20 IP) this season, respectively.

JULIO RUNS IT DOWN BY THE BALLYARD...**Julio Rodríguez** has been one of the elite outfield defenders since he made his MLB debut in 2022, ranking T-3rd with 36 Outs Above Average (*Baseball Savant*), trailing only Daulton Varsho-ARI/TOR (48 OAA) and Jose Siri-HOU/TB/NYM (41 OAA)...this season, Julio ranks T-3rd in the Majors and T-2nd in the AL among outfielders with 7 OAA...Julio is tied for the MLB lead among outfielders with 10 Defensive Runs Saved (*Sports Info Solutions*) and ranks T-3rd among all positions trailing only Taylor Walls-TB (14 DRS) and Matt Olson-ATL (13 DRS).

#51...The Mariners announced Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson's** number 51 will be retired by the club during the 2026 season (exact date TBD)...Johnson's #51 will be the 5th number retired by the Mariners, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (#24), **Edgar Martinez** (#11), **Ichiro Suzuki** (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired by all MLB teams)...Johnson is the 13th player to have his number retired by multiple MLB franchises, while #51 is the eighth number to be retired by the same club for multiple players.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...following tomorrow's off-day, the Mariners return home for a 6-game homestand against the Cleveland Guardians (3 G, 6/13-15) and Boston Red Sox (3 G, 6/16-18)...upcoming events and promotions on the homestand include **Sing-Along Fireworks Night** on Friday, **African American Heritage Night** on Saturday and **Father's Day** on Sunday.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Randy Arozarena** and **Rowdy Tellez** hit back-to-back homers in the 6th inning, the Mariners 5th set of back-to-back homers this season, joining **Cal Raleigh** and Arozarena (2x, 9th inning on 4/17 at CIN and 1st inning 5/30 vs. MIN), **Julio Rodríguez** and **Jorge Polanco** (1st inning, 4/26 vs. MIA) and Rodríguez and Raleigh (1st inning, 5/27 vs. WSH), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...both Arozarena and Tellez's home runs came on the 8th pitch of their respective at-bats, becoming the first Mariners in the Pitch Tracking Era (1988-c) to hit back-to-back home runs after each seeing at least 8 pitches?

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 13th start of the season tonight and his 1st against Arizona...marks his 53rd Major League start and 2nd career start against Arizona.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 GS) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on June 5 vs. Baltimore, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing 4 hits (2 HR) on 4 runs, with 2 walks, and 6 strikeouts...Woo is the only starting pitcher this season to throw at least 6.0+ innings pitched in their first 12 starts, and the first since Joe Musgrove-SD threw 6.0+ innings in his first 15 starts of the 2022 season (4/9-7/7/22)...he has the 2nd most innings pitched (76.1 IP) in a pitcher's first 12 appearances this season (trailing only Framber Valdez-PHI: 78.0 IP).

ONE OF WOO...Woo is 1 of 5 pitchers in franchise history to throw 6.0 innings in their first 12 starts of the season (last: Cliff Lee 13 starts, 4/30/10-7/4/10)...he has thrown at least 6.0 innings pitched in 21 of his last 24 starts (8/2/24-c)...Woo is also 1 of 6 starting pitchers this season with less walks than games started this season (min. 10 GS).

NO FREE BASES...ranks 3rd in BB/9 (1.30) and K/BB (6.27), with his 11 walks this season tied for the 4th-fewest in MLB among qualified starting pitchers.

WOO-DERFUL ROAD STRETCH...in his last 10 road starts dating back to last season (8/31/24-c), Woo has thrown at least 6.0+ innings pitched in 9 of 10 contests...in 30 career road starts, he has 22 games with 5.0+ innings pitched, and 17 of 29 starts with at least 6.0+ innings pitched...Woo ranks 1st in fewest hits allowed (141), baserunners allowed (186), 2nd in walks (34), and 3rd in fewest runs allowed (70) for a pitcher in their first 30 road appearances in franchise history (min. 150.0 IP).

NATIONAL SUCCESS...making his 12th career start against a National League team, Woo is 4-2 with a 3.22 ERA (24 ER, 67.0 IP), 0.90 WHIP, and an .192 AVG against...Woo has thrown 6.0 innings in each of his last 5 starts against NL teams, while throwing 39 SO and just 2 walks...in 7 career starts against NL-West teams, he is 3-1 with a 3.07 ERA, (15 ER, 44.0 IP) .178 AVG against, 0.82 WHIP, and 8 walks to 35 SO.

DOMINATING THE DAY...in his last 10 day games (8/25/24-c) Woo is 5-2 with a 3.83 ERA (26 ER, 61.0 IP) and a 1.07 WHIP, throwing at least 6.0 innings in 9 starts, with 58 strikeouts to just 8 walks.

HOT START...in his first career 52 games, Woo ranks 1st in baserunners allowed (305), 2nd in fewest hits allowed (233), runs allowed (111), 4th in fewest BB (55), 5th in ERA (3.34) in franchise history (min. 250.0 IP)...Woo also joins teammate **George Kirby** as 1 of 2 pitchers in franchise history in their first 52 games to record more than 250 strikeouts and 60 or less walks.

FIRST HALF SUCCESS...among starting pitchers in franchise history before the All-Star break (min. 25 GS), Woo ranks 1st in ERA (3.02), WHIP (0.96), opponent OBP (.251), SLG (.336), OPS (.586), BR/9 (8.88), 2nd in AVG against (.215), SO/BB (5.64), and BB/9 (1.45), 3rd in H/9 (7.20).

PITCHING IN JUNE...in 9 career starts in June, Woo holds a 2-3 record with a 4.10 ERA (19 ER, 41.2 IP), 1.10 WHIP, .267 OBP, and 9 BB with 48 SO...in 8 of 9 starts, Woo has walked 2-or-less batters, and recorded 6+ SO in 5 of those 9 starts in June.

INSTANT IMPACT...since his big league debut (6/3/23), Woo ranks within the top-ten in WHIP (1.01), hits allowed (229), walks (53), BB/9 (1.71), K/BB (4.85), and BB% (4.8%) among all pitchers with at least 250.0 IP during that span.

LOW, LOW, LOW...his 1.01 WHIP through his first 3 seasons is the lowest in franchise history by a starting pitcher through 3 seasons, with his 3.34 career ERA ranked 2nd best by a starting pitcher in franchise history (min. 250.0 IP)...since the start of last season, in 34 starts Woo is 14-6 with a 2.96 ERA (65 ER, 197.2 IP), 24 walks, 170 strikeouts, with 24 of those starts throwing at least 6.0 innings.

MANY MAY FLOWERS...in 6 May starts, Woo held a 2.58 ERA (11 ER, 33.0 IP) with 33 strikeouts and 2 walks, holding opponents to a .233 batting average...Woo's 16.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and his 0.47 BB/9 ranks 1st all-time in Mariners history in the month of May.

EXCLAMATION ON 100...in his 5th road start of the season (5/7 at ATH) Woo threw a career high 100 pitches...on his 100th pitch of the game, Woo recorded his 3rd strikeout of the 6th inning, and it was the 3rd time this season he has recorded 3 strikeouts in an inning (4/24 at BOS in the 1st inning and 5/2 at TEX in the 5th inning).
