**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets dropped their season opener, 3-1, yesterday...New York continues their opening homestand with a three game series against the Brewers and three contests against the Detroit Tigers...Following this series, the Mets head out on the road for the first time in 2024, visiting Cincinnati (three games) and Atlanta (four games).

**A STAR IS BORN:** Starling Marte connected for the Mets first home run of the season yesterday...He owns a career .269/.325/.433 slashline with 15 home runs and 47 RBI in 125 career games at the ballpark...It marked his first home run since July 4, 2023 at Arizona.

**LUIS, LUIS:** Luis Severino is slated to make his first start as a member of the Mets today...His 788 career strikeouts rank fourth among active Dominican pitchers...Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games.

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** Sevy will become the 25th starting pitcher to start a game for both the Mets and Yankees...Bartolo Colon was the last player to do so.

**SOUND THE TRUMPETS:** RHP Edwin Díaz next appearance will be his first for the Mets since 2022...The closer suffered a season-ending ruptured patella tendon in March of 2023...In 2022, Díaz was named the Trevor Hoffman National League Relief Pitcher of the Year after posting a 1.31 ERA (9 ER/62.0 IP) with 32 saves and 118 strikeouts...A two-time All-Star, Díaz has pitched to a 2.93 ERA (130 ER/399.1 IP) and has recorded 205 saves over seven major league seasons.

**MENDOZA LINES:** Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES:** The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joey Wendle; trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramírez and OF Tyrone Taylor as well as waiver claim INF Zack Short

**TWO AWAY:** Pete Alonso is two RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 498 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

**30-FOR-30:** Francisco Lindor became the fourth player in franchise history to collect 30 stolen bases and 30 home runs in a season...He joined join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991, 1989, 1987) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...He joins Barry Larkin (1996), Alex Rodríguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007) and Hanley Ramírez (2008) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...In addition, joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramírez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.

**IN THE CITI:** New York earned a winning season at Citi Field in 2023, going 44-37 at home last season...The Mets have earned a winning season at Citi Field in each of the last three seasons...The Mets have smashed 115 home runs at Citi Field in 2023...That is the second-most home runs at home in team history...Only the 2019 team (126) hit more at home.

**INVADER NIM:** Last season, Brandon Nimmo established career highs in many offensive categories including, games played (152), hits (162), homers (24), XBH (60) and RBI (68)...Nimmo's six triples were tied for eighth in the NL and his 13 triples since 2022 are tied for the most in the NL during that span...Since 2018, Nimmo has sported a .382 OBP, the fifth-highest mark in the NL and the 10th-highest mark in the majors during that time frame (Min. 2000 plate appearances)...His 24 home runs from the lead-off spot were the tied with Tommie Agee (1970) for the second-most by a Met in a single season.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor and Francisco Alvarez recorded at least 25 home runs last season...The 2023 Mets tied a franchise record with three players recording at least 25 homers...They joined the 2008 (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado, David Wright), 2006 (Beltrán, Delgado, Wright), 1999 (Edgardo Alfonzo, Mike Piazza, Robin Ventura) and 1987 (Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds, Darryl Strawberry) teams.

**THIS BUD'S FOR YOU:** In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

**THE GOOD DOC:** On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

**METS DEBUT:** Severino will embark on his first season with the Mets today after spending the entirety of his career with the Yankees...He becomes the 25th starting pitcher to start a game for both the Mets and Yankees (last was Bartolo Colon, who pitched with the Yankees in 2011 before joining the Mets from 2014-16).

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Has 788 career strikeouts rank fourth among active Dominican pitchers...Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

**2023 RECAP:** Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

**VELOCITY:** In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.

**NEW HOME:** Severino will also make his Citi Field debut today...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks.

**SPRING STATS:** In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (0-0, 0.00)

**CAREER-HIGHS:** Last season, Megill established career bests in starts (25), innings (126.1), strikeouts (105) and quality starts (six) surpassing his previous highs of 18 starts, 89.2 innings, 99 strikeouts and four quality starts set in 2021.

**NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK:** This season, Megill went 7-3 with a 3.19 ERA (26 ER/73.1 IP) in 13 home starts this season...In 12 road starts this season, Megill went 2-5 with a 6.79 ERA (40 ER/53.0 IP)...Among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road, Megill's 3.60 home/road differential was the fourth largest in the majors behind teammate David Peterson (4.58), Julio Urias (4.28) and Alex Cobb (3.75)...Courtesy of Elias.

- Led the NL and ranked second in the majors with 21 HBP.

- Appeared in 86 games, his fewest since 2017 when he played in 77 contests...Only appeared in four games after the All-Star Game, including his final contest on August 5...Was on the IL from July 20 - August 4 with migraines and again from August 7 (retroactive to August 6) - end of season with a right groins strain.
- Finished tied for 16th in the National League with 24 stolen bases in 2023...Ranks second among active players with 338 stolen bases...Elvis Andrus is first with 347...Posted his ninth season with 20 or more stolen bases...Only 35 players in the Integration Era (since 1947) have had more 20-steal seasons...He has swiped 20 or more bags in nine of 11 seasons since 2013...No other player in the majors has done so more than seven times during that span.
