## Detroit Tigers (15-15) at Atlanta Braves (21-9)

Wednesday, April 29, 2026 • Truist Park, Atlanta, GA • 7:15 p.m. ET

**WE MEET IN THE MIDDLE:** The first-place Detroit Tigers tonight continue their three-game series at the Atlanta Braves after dropping the series opener, 5-2, last night at Truist Park ... this set represents the backend of a two-city, seven-day, six-game road trip vs. a pair of first-place clubs that started off last weekend in Cincinnati (1-2).

- The 15-15 Tigers are a major-league best 10-2 at home this year and 5-13 on the road ... they are 10-3 during the day and 5-12 at night ... they are 5-6 vs. American League competition and 10-9 vs. National League competition.
- After this series in Atlanta, the Tigers will return to Detroit on Friday to begin a six-day, six-game homestand vs. the Texas Rangers and Boston Red Sox.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Tigers will leave Atlanta tomorrow and complete the month of April with 20 road games under their belt already this season, a total that represents nearly one-quarter of their road slate for the entire campaign ... the Tigers will join the Los Angeles Angels as the only teams in all of baseball to enter the month of May with 20 road games in the books.

- With 20 road games in March/April, the Tigers will shatter their franchise mark for most road games played prior to the month of May ... the previous club mark for road games prior to May 1 came in both 2019 and 1996 when the club played 16 away games before May 1.

**WE'VE REALLY BEEN OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** The Tigers will also leave Atlanta tomorrow and complete the month of April with 21 interleague games played already this season, the most of any team in all of baseball ... put differently, seven of Detroit's 10 series and nearly two-thirds of its schedule (21-of-32 games) prior to May 1 will take place against interleague competition ... no other team will enter May with more than 18 interleague games played through the end of April.

- The Tigers will quickly make up for lost time, however, as they will play all but three games (59 of 62 contests) against A.L. competition from May 1-July 9, including 50 games in a row from May 15-July 9 against intraleague foes (barring postponements).

**THAT'S EITHER HERE OR THERE:** While Tarik Skubal has gone 20-2 with a 2.15 ERA (52 ER/218.0 IP) in 34 starts at home since the start of the 2024 season, he has also turned in a solid 2.54 ERA (58/205.2 IP) and 0.96 WHIP in 34 starts on the road in this span, the second-lowest road ERA and second-lowest road WHIP in all of baseball (minimum 30 starts) ... yet Skubal is only 14-10 despite 23 quality starts, the most in the majors, in those 34 starts on the road these past three seasons.

**ENCORE, ENCORE:** Tarik Skubal is on a mission to become only the third pitcher in baseball history to win at least three-straight Cy Young awards, aiming to join fellow southpaw Randy Johnson (4, 1999-2002) and righty Greg Maddux (4, 1992-95), both of whom did so in the N.L.

**IT IS IN FACT GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** Kevin McGonigle has a 2.0 bWAR through his first 29 major league games, tied with Atlanta's Matt Olson for tops in the big leagues this season.

**IT'S ALIVE AT 25:** Kevin McGonigle has reached base safely in his last 25 starts, the first Tigers rookie to do so since Austin Jackson reached in 25-straight starts in 2010 ... the last Tigers rookie to reach base safely in more than 25 starts in a row?: Ricky Peters with a 26-start streak back in 1980 ... the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach in 25-or-more starts in a row?: 21-year-old Al Kaline in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-August 28, 1956.

- McGonigle's run of reaching base safely in 25-straight starts is the longest active streak in the majors, two starts more than anyone else (Nick Kurtz is at 23 starts).
- McGonigle is the first big league player ever 21-years-old or younger to reach base safely in 25-consecutive starts within the early season months of March/April.

**A DANDY DOZEN:** Kevin McGonigle last night extended his hitting streak 12 games, becoming the first 21-year-old or younger Tiger with a 12-game hitting streak since 21-year-old Riley Greene had a 13-gamer in 2022 ... the last such Tiger to do so entirely within the early season months of March/April?: 20-year-old Al Kaline and his 14-game hitting streak from April 12-29, 1955.

- McGonigle is now tied for the third-longest active hitting streak in all of baseball, trailing only Arizona's Ildemaro Vargas (21 games in 2026) and Houston's Yordan Alvarez (13 games).

**GO GREENE:** Riley Greene is now batting .385 (20-for-52) with four doubles, three homers, 11 RBI, a .492 on-base percentage, a .635 slugging percentage and a 1.127 OPS in his last 16 games over the last two+ weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in on-base percentage, ranks sixth in the majors in batting average and is eighth in the majors in OPS in this span.

- In his first 30 games this season, Greene is slashing .292/.395/.453 with a 14.5 walk percentage and a 24.2 strikeout percentage ... in his first 30 games last season, Greene slashed .261/.302/.455 with a 5.6 walk percentage and 31.0 strikeout percentage.

**AND FINALLY:** Kevin McGonigle will be the first Tiger to wake up on May 1 with at least 11 doubles since Miguel Cabrera had 11 doubles through April of 2010 ... McGonigle will be the first Tigers left-handed batter ever in club history to enter May with 11 doubles ... thanks to Elias.

- Makes his seventh start of the season tonight against Atlanta, having gone 6.0+ innings in all but one of his outings this year...he has allowed one earned run or less in four of his six games, entering tonight with a 3-2 record and a 2.72 ERA.
- Made his 2026 home debut on April 12 against Miami after his first three starts of the season came on the road...earned his second win of the year, going 6.2 one-run, two-hit innings, allowing two walks while striking out seven...last year, he went 9-1 with a 2.13 ERA (24 ER/101.1 IP) in 16 starts at Comerica Park, the lowest home ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest home mark in the majors.
- Suffered losses in back-to-back starts (April 1 at ARI, April 7 at MIN) for the first time since his first two starts of the 2025 season at Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle.
- Earned his first win of the season on Opening Day against San Diego, allowing no earned runs over 6.0 innings.
- The 29-year-old became Detroit's first starter to open the season in three consecutive years since his current rotation-mate Justin Verlander made seven consecutive Opening Day starts for the Tigers from 2008-2014...with the start, the Tigers have deployed a left-hander on Opening Day in seven consecutive seasons, marking the longest active stretch across the Majors.
- Posted a career-best 2.21 ERA (48ER/195.1IP) and 241 strikeouts last season...led the AL in ERA (second overall behind Paul Skenes), and second amongst all pitchers in strikeouts (Garret Crochet led with 251 K).
- Won the American League Cy Young Award for a second consecutive season, receiving 26 out of 30 first place votes (four for Garrett Crochet)...became the first repeat AL Cy Young winner since Pedro Martinez in 1999 and 2000...joins Denny McLain as the only Tigers to win multiple Cy Youngs with Detroit...while he did not receive the Triple Crown title, his 6.5 bWAR was a career best that topped Crochet (6.3) and Hunter Brown (6.1). His 7.3 strikeout-to-walk ratio outpaced Crochet's at 5.54, and Skubal's 187 ERA+ was the best by an AL pitcher since Justin Verlander in 2022.
- The back-to-back reigning AL Cy Young winner, who became the 12th pitcher in MLB history to win consecutive Cy Young Awards, will become the ninth pitcher to start on Opening Day following consecutive award-winning seasons, joining Hall of Famer Jim Palmer (1976-77); Hall of Famer Greg Maddux (1993-96); Roger Clemens (1998-99); Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (2000-03); Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez (2000-01); Tim Lincecum (2009-10); Clayton Kershaw (2014-15); and Jacob deGrom (2019-20).
- Set an MLB Postseason record with seven consecutive strikeouts on Oct. 10, 2025, against the Seattle Mariners...became MLB leader in single-postseason strikeouts per nine innings pitched, posting 15.677K/20.2 IP.

- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.
