TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Cardinals continue their National League Division Series today with Game 3 at Busch Stadium...The clubs met six times in the regular season, with the Braves winning four of the games while outscoring St. Louis, 29-27.

A The clubs have met four times previous in the postseason, with the Cardinals winning three of the matchups...St. Louis swept the 1982 LCS from Atlanta, before the Braves took the 1996 LCS in seven games...The Cardinals then swept the NLDS in 2000, before winning the 2012 Wildcard Game.

A In all, the Braves have lost 11 of 16 postseason games with St. Louis, but snapped a five-game losing streak to the Cardinals in the playoffs with a 3-0 win in Game 2.

A The Braves won both of the series with the Cardinals in the regular season, taking two-of-three in Atlanta, May 14-16, before winning another two-of-three at Busch Stadium, May 24-26.

A RHP Mike Soroka started against the Cardinals twice this season, his first two career appearances against St. Louis...He went 7.0 shutout innings on May 15 at SunTrust Park in a 4-0 win, before going 6.0 innings and allowing two runs, one earned, to take a no-decision in a 6-3 loss...The rookie will be making his first career postseason appearance.

A RHP Adam Wainwright is 9-4 with a 3.63 ERA (38 ER/94.1 IP) in 19 career games, 14 starts, against the Braves, but 1-2 with a 7.65 ERA (17 ER/20.0 IP) over his last four starts dating to 2016 against them.

WIN: The Braves tied up their best-of-five National League Division Series on Friday with a 3-0 win over St. Louis...The Braves are looking to take a lead in a playoff series for the first time since 2002, when they won Game 2 and Game 3 against San Francisco to lead 2-1.

A This is the Braves' eighth playoff matchup since that series, including a one-game Wild Card game with St. Louis in 2012.

A The last time the Braves won a playoff round was in 2001, when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

A The Braves have lost nine consecutive playoff rounds (including the 2012 Wild Card game), dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona..That streak is the second longest in MLB history...Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998.

A The Braves are 3-16 in postseason play when they drop Game 1...They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games.

A They also won the 1991 LCS over Pittsburgh after losing Game 1 and the 1957 World Series.

GAME 3: The Braves are set to play their 35th Game 3 of a playoff round today, and they are 13-21 (.382) in these games...They have lost five of the last six such games, although they staved off elimination in Game 3 of the NLDS last season by beating Los Angeles, 6-5.

A Today will be the 16th Game 3 the Braves have played with the series tied 1-1...The Braves are 4-11 (.267) in these games and have lost five straight.

A The Braves last won a Game 3 with the series tied at 1 apiece in the 2002 NLDS, when they beat San Francisco, 10-2, at Pacific Bell Park

A The Braves are 2-9 in series when they lose Game 3 to go down 2-1, with none of the wins coming in a division series...They went down 2-1 with a Game 3 loss in the 1996 LCS to St. Louis, before coming back to win the series in seven games...They also won the 1957 World Series with a similar Game 3 loss, rallying to beat the Yankees in seven games.

A The Braves are 2-2 in series play when winning a Game 3 after splitting the first two games...They lost the 2002 NLDS to San Francisco and the 1993 LCS with Philadelphia.

ROOKIE START: RHP Mike Soroka is set to start today in his postseason debut.

A The righty will become just the third rookie pitcher in franchise history to make a postseason start...Julio Teheran was the last to do so, starting Game 3 of the 2013 NLDS at Los Angeles...Teheran allowed six runs, earned, over 2.2 innings to lose, 13-6.

A Vern Bickford started for the Boston Braves in Game 3 of the 1948 World Series at Cleveland, and took the loss after allowing four hits and two runs (one earned) in 3.1 innings.

A Soroka, at 22 years, 63 days, is the youngest pitcher to start a playoff game since Julio Urias went 3.2 innings on October 19, 2016 in the NLCS against the Cubs...Urias took a 10-2 loss.

A The last younger pitcher to start a Game 3 or better was 21-year-old Clayton Kershaw for the Dodgers in Game 1 of the 2009 NLCS vs. Philadelphia.

A The last pitcher younger than Soroka to start a playoff road game was Madison Bumgarner, who at 21 won Game 4 of the 2010 World Series with 8.0 shutout innings over Texas.

A The only younger pitcher than Soroka to start a Braves postseason game was 21-year-old Steve Avery, who made four starts for Atlanta in 1991

FIRST INNING LEADS: The Braves have led 1-0 after the first inning in each of the first two games of this series...2B Ozzie Albies has scored each of the runs.

A Albies hit .340/.386/.649 with 19 runs in the first inning this season.

A The Braves were 35-14 (.714) in the regular season when taking a lead to the second inning, which was better than the league average of .684.

Today's Game

- A** Make his first career postseason appearance.
- A** Becomes just the third rookie pitcher in franchise history to make a postseason start...Julio Teheran was the last to do so, starting Game 3 of the 2013 NLDS at Los Angeles.
- A** Vern Bickford started for the Boston Braves in Game 3 of the 1948 World Series at Cleveland, and took the loss after allowing four hits and two runs (one earned) in 3.1 innings.
- A** Made 29 starts during his rookie season, going 13-4 with a 2.68 ERA (52 ER/174.2 IP), 142 strikeouts and a .236 opponents' average.
- A** Ranked fifth in the majors and third in the NL in ERA...Only Hyun-Jin Ryu (2.32), Jacob deGrom (2.43), Gerrit Cole (2.50) and Justin Verlander (2.58) were better.
- A** His 2.68 ERA was the lowest by a rookie in the majors, and the lowest by any rookie pitcher since Miami's Jose Fernandez pitched to a 2.19 ERA over 28 starts in 2013.
- A** Soroka's mark was third lowest by any Braves rookie in the live-ball era (since 1920), trailing just a 2.38 ERA by Jim Turner in 1937 and a 2.57 mark by Nate Andrews in 1943, both of which came when the franchise was still in Boston.
- A** Went 7-1 with a 1.55 ERA (17 ER/98.2 IP) over 16 starts on the road.
- A** Soroka's 1.55 ERA on the road was best in the majors among qualified starters, and nearly a full point lower than the closest pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2.34).
- A** Since 1913, only three qualified Braves pitchers had a better ERA on the road than Soroka's mark this season...Greg Maddux pitched to a 1.12 ERA in 1995 and a 1.37 ERA in 1994, while Bill James compiled a 1.53 ERA on the road for the 1914 Boston Braves.
- A** Has made two career starts against St. Louis, both of which came this season... Combined to go 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA and a .182 opponents' average (8-for-44).
- A** Allowed just eight hits and two runs (one earned) over 13.0 innings.
- A** Started at Busch Stadium, May 25, and allowed five hits and two runs (one earned) in 6.0 innings...Atlanta lost, 6-3.

2019 Recap

- A** Turned 22 years old, August 4...Went 12-3 with a 2.58 ERA (40 ER/139.2 IP) in 24 starts aged 21 or younger.
- A** Soroka's 24 starts before turning 22 are fourth-most in franchise history since 1908, and the most since Steve Avery made 56 such starts.
- A** He is one of 145 pitchers in the live-ball era (since 1920) to make at least 24 starts aged 21 or younger...Of those 145 pitchers, Soroka's 2.58 ERA was fifth lowest, trailing just José Fernandez (2.25 in 36 starts), Dwight Gooden (2.28 in 99 starts), Mark Fidrych (2.34 in 29 starts) and Vida Blue (2.36 in 49 starts).
- A** Went 9-1 with a 2.42 ERA (24 ER/89.1 IP) over 15 starts to open the season and became the youngest pitcher in franchise history to be named an All-Star.
- A** Made his All-Star Game debut with a scoreless sixth inning, July 9 at Progressive Field...Retired Whit Merrifield, Carlos Santana and Dan Vogelbach.
- A** Allowed no more than one earned run in each of his first eight starts this season... Soroka joined Cincinnati's Edinson Vólquez (2008) and Oakland's Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in the live-ball era (since 1920) to begin the season with eight consecutive starters of one earned run or less...No pitcher has gone nine straight.
- A** For his career, the righty allowed one earned run or fewer in 11 of his first 13 starts...Since earned runs became an official statistic in both leagues in 1913, no other pitcher in history had as many such starts among his first 13 career games...In fact, Soroka was the only one to have eight such starts through his first 10 career games.
- A** Soroka's 1.07 ERA was the third lowest in history (since 1913) by a pitcher aged 21 or younger in his first eight starts of the season, according to research by the Elias Sports Bureau...Only Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela (0.50, 1981) and Oakland's Vida Blue (1.02, 1971) had lower marks through eight starts.
- A** A native of Calgary, Alberta, he beat the Blue Jays for the first time, 9/2 at SunTrust Park...Allowed three runs over 5.0 innings.
- A** Became the first Canadian-born Braves pitcher to ever beat Toronto, and the second to ever beat a Canadian franchise...Claude Raymond, a native of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, pitched 2.0 innings of relief to beat the Expos on 5/16/69.
- A** Lost at Toronto, 8/27, for his first career loss on the road...Allowed eight hits and two runs over 6.0 innings.
- A** The loss also marked the first time he lost consecutive decisions in his career, a streak that span eight total starts...Also lost on 7/20 vs. WSH...Went winless during the stretch despite a 2.81 ERA (16 ER/51.1 IP).

Career Recap

- A** Selected by Atlanta with the 28th overall pick in the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.
- A** Went 23-20 with a 2.84 ERA (117 ER/370.2 IP) over 69 career minor league games, including 67 total starts.

- After 30 starts in the regular season, he's made back-to-back scoreless relief appearances in the NLDS against St. Louis.
- Went 17-6 with a 4.02 ERA (74 ER/165.2 IP) in 33 appearances for Atlanta during the season, including 30 starts...In his three relief appearances, did not allow a run over 5.1 innings, walking three and fanning five.
- Appeared in relief in all four games of the 2018 NLDS, allowing one run and one hit in 2.1 innings.
- Pitched out of the bullpen in his last appearance, 9/28 at NYM...Struck out five in 3.2 scoreless innings.

Shane Greene • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 30 yrs • #19

Saves/Opp: 1/3 **Holds:** 10 **1st Batter/Retired:** 27/19 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/4

- Made his first postseason appearance yesterday, gave up a leadoff double to OF Marcell Ozuna but went on to strand him after retiring the next three hitters he faced to close the sixth.
- Went 0-1 with a 4.01 ERA (11 ER/24.2 IP) in 27 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.30 ERA (16 ER/62.2 IP) in 65 games on the season...He has converted 23 of 28 save opportunities.
- Pitched to a 14.54 ERA (7 ER/4.1 IP) over his first six games with Atlanta...Pitched to a 1.77 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP) in his final 21 appearances and converted his only save chance and all nine holds.
- Snapped a streak of 13 consecutive scoreless appearances on 9/7 vs. Washington...Held opponents to just four hits while striking out 14 through 13.0 innings during the streak...Logged his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 vs. WSH.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...At the time ranked fourth in the AL with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 18/25 **Holds:** 9 **1st Batter/Retired:** 70/44 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 26/12

- Allowed two runs in 0.2 innings during his postseason debut...Went 9-2 with a 3.84 ERA (31 ER/72.2 IP) in 70 games this season...Converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019.
- Had nine wins out of the bullpen, the most by a Braves reliever since Mike Remlinger had 10 in 1999...His nine wins tied for fifth most by a Braves reliever since 1913.
- Left-handers had just 17 hits in 108 at-bats (.157) against him...Righties batted .331 (59-for-178).
- Finished the season with 106 strikeouts, second most in the NL by a reliever behind Milwaukee's Josh Hader... Had a career-best 13.13 SO/9.0 IP ratio, sixth best in the NL.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002.
