TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 28, 2022: Aaron Judge hits his 61st HR of the season at Toronto, tying Roger Maris (61HR in 1961) for the most home runs in a single season in American League history. The HR was hit in the seventh inning off Tim Lincecum.

Sept. 28, 2008: On the season's last day in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Fenway Park, Mike Mussina records his 20th win, becoming the oldest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games for the first time.

Sept. 28, 1968: Mickey Mantle plays his final career game, starting for the Yankees at Boston's Fenway Park. Hitting third, he bats in the top of the first and pops out to Red Sox shortstop Rico Petrocelli before being replaced in the field at 1B by Andy Kosco.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 29, 1987: Don Mattingly hits his sixth grand slam of the season in a 6-0 win vs. Boston (off Bruce Hurst), setting a Major League record (since tied in 2006 by Travis Hafner).

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final road trip of the season with the final game of a three-game set at Toronto (2-0 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Kansas City this weekend (Fri.-Sun.).

- Are 11-5 in their last 16 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a Major League-best 19-9 (.679) record since 8/28**...are 21-12 in their last 33 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 6-0, on Wednesday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (9.0IP, 2H, 0BB, 5K) tossed his fifth career shutout and second of the season...

RF Aaron Judge (2-for-3, 3R, 2HR, 4RBI, 2BB/1IBB) recorded his seventh multi-HR game of the year and 34th of his career, hitting a go-ahead two-run HR in the fourth inning and a two-run HR in the seventh inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4, 2RBI) hit a two-run single in the fifth inning.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge recorded his seventh multi-HR game of the year and 34th of his career on Wednesday at Toronto...hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the fourth inning and a two-run HR in the seventh inning...**his seven multi-HR games are the second-most in the Majors this season, trailing only Atlanta's Matt Olson (eight).**

- **His 34 multi-HR games are the fifth-most in franchise history**, trailing only Babe Ruth (68), Mickey Mantle (46), Lou Gehrig (43) and Joe DiMaggio (35)...his 34 multi-HR games since 2017 are the most in the Majors in that span (next: Manny Machado-30).
- **Has recorded at least seven multi-HR games in a single season for the third time in his career** (also recorded 11 multi-HR games in 2022 and seven in 2017)...**his three seasons with at least seven such games are tied for the second-most in Major League history**, trailing only Mark McGwire (four).
- **His 257 career home runs are the most by any Major League player through his first 832 career games** (next: Ryan Howard-245HR)...**his 34 multi-HR games are also the most by any Major League player through his first 832 career games** (previous: Ralph Kiner – 32G).
- 18 of his 37HR this season have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (16).
- The Yankees have gone 168-53 in his career when he homers...since 2020, the Yankees are 96-24 in those games...the Yankees are 24-4 this season when he homers.
- **Has hit 37HR in 103 games this season...is just the second player in Major League history to hit at least 37HR in a season while playing in 107 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees have four games remaining this season), joining Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland).
- **Is batting .417/.571/1.000 (15-for-36) with 10R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 12RBI and 13BB over his last 11 games (since 9/14-G2).**
- Has reached base in 43-of-89 plate appearances over his last 20 games (since 9/5), posting a .483 OBP in that span (20H, 23BB).
- **Has hit 5HR in his last four games (since 9/22).**
- Has 12RBI in his last five games (since 9/21).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 37HR are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the ninth-most in the Majors...**his 85BB rank sixth in the AL.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, his 18HR are tied for first in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors...also leads the AL with 50BB and ranks second in the Majors in that span, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (57).
- Has hit 34 career home runs vs. the Blue Jays, his second-most against any club (39HR vs. Baltimore)...**are the most by any Yankee vs. the Blue Jays all-time**...are the second-most HR by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017, trailing his own 39HR vs. Baltimore.
- Has hit 7HR in his last 6G at Rogers Centre (since 9/28/22).
- Is batting .444/.583/1.185 (12-for-27) with 8R, 2 doubles, 6HR, 12RBI, 9BB and 1SB in his last 8G vs. the Blue Jays (since 5/15).

WINNING WAYS: With an 81-77 record, the Yankees need one win to clinch their 31st consecutive winning season (since 1993)...their current 30-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

- Their current 30-season streak is the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

BLANK SPACE: Yankees pitchers have not allowed a run in back-to-back games for the first time since 6/3-4/22...**have not allowed a run in their last 19.0 innings.**

- **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.58 ERA (108.1IP, 31ER) in 12 games vs. the Blue Jays this season.

COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole tossed his fifth career shutout and second of the season on Wednesday at Toronto (9.0IP, 2H, 0BB, 5K)...also tossed a CGSHO on 4/16/23 vs. Minnesota (9.0IP, 7/10/21 at Houston (9.0IP), Game 1 on 9/11/20 vs. Baltimore (7.0IP) and 5/4/18 at Arizona (9.0IP)...marked his eighth career complete game (first since 4/16/23 vs. Minnesota) and his fifth career nine-inning complete game (also 4/16/23 vs. Minnesota, 7/10/21 at Houston, 5/4/18 at Arizona and 7/27/16 vs. Seattle).

- **Is just the second Yankees pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 8.0IP and allow two-or-fewer baserunners in back-to-back starts**, joining Jameson Taillon (2GS from 5/27-6/2(G2)/22).
- **Is the first Yankees pitcher in the last 10 years (since 2014) and just the third Yankees pitcher in the last 18 years (since 2006) to throw multiple shutouts in a single season**, joining Iván Nova (two in 2013) and Hiroki Kuroda (two in 2012).
- Joins Houston's Framber Valdez (two) as the only two pitchers in the Majors this year to throw multiple shutouts.
- **Is just the second Yankee in the last 35 years (since 1989) and the third in the last 43 years (since 1981) to record two shutouts with 2H-or-fewer in a single season**, joining David Wells (two in 1998) and John Candelaria (two in 1988).
- **Went 15-4 with two shutouts, a 2.63 ERA (209.0IP, 61ER) and 222K in 33 starts this season...marks the lowest ERA by a qualified Yankee in the last 43 years (since 1981)**...is the lowest since Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41 games (17 starts) in 1980...also marks the fourth-lowest ERA by a qualified Yankee in the last 51 years (since 1973), trailing only Ron Guidry (1.74 in 1978), Rudy May (2.46 in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (2.58 in 1975).
- **His 2.63 ERA is the lowest in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25)...*if he were to finish the season with the lowest ERA in the AL*, he would be the 10th Yankee (14th time) to win an AL ERA title...would join Rudy May (1980), Ron Guidry (twice: 1978 and '79), Whitey Ford (twice: 1956 and '58), Bobby Shantz (1957), Ed Lopat (1953), Allie Reynolds (1952), Spud Chandler (twice: 1943 and '47), Lefty Gomez (twice: 1934 and '37) and Wilcy Moore (1927).
- **Wednesday marked his sixth start this season of at least 7.0 innings and three-or-fewer baserunners allowed (H/BB/HP), the most in a single season in franchise history** (previous: Mike Mussina - four in 2001).
- **Allowed 2R-or-fewer in 26 of his 33 starts this season, the most such starts in the Majors**...no other pitcher in the AL has more than 20 such starts...**his 26 such starts are tied with Ron Guidry (26 in 1978) for the second-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904).
- His 222K this season are tied with David Cone (222K in 1997) for the seventh-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing his own 257K in 2022, Ron Guidry's 248K in 1978, his own 243K in 2021, Jack Chesbro's 239K in 1904, CC Sabathia's 230K in 2011 and Luis Severino's 230K in 2017...**now owns three of the Yankees' top-eight single-season strikeout totals in franchise history.**
- **Went 5-0 with one shutout, a 1.29 ERA (48.2IP, 7ER) and 52K in his final seven starts (8/25-9/27)**...allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those seven starts...walked just five of his 178BF over that span...**the Yankees went 7-0 in those games.**
- **During the month of September, went 3-0 with one shutout, a 1.03 ERA (35.0IP, 4ER) and 34K**...marks the sixth-lowest ERA by a Yankees pitcher who made at least five starts in September in franchise history (since ER became an official stat in the AL in 1913), trailing only Lefty Gomez (0.60 ERA in Sept. 1937), Spud Chandler (0.81 ERA in Sept. 1943), Whitey Ford (0.90 ERA in Sept. 1963), Bob Shawkey (0.94 ERA in Sept. 1924) and Ron Guidry (0.96 ERA in Sept. 1978).
- Allowed more than 3R just five times in 33 starts this season, allowing 27 of his 64R in those five starts...**in his other 28 starts, allowed just 37 runs, averaging just 1.32 runs per game in those starts.**
- **The Yankees went 23-10 in his starts this season**...the Yankees' 23 wins in Cole's starts match the second-most by any team in the Majors in a pitcher's starts, trailing only Atlanta's 25 wins in Spencer Strider's starts.
- **Tossed at least 6.0 innings in 26 of his 33 starts this year, the most such starts in the AL and second-most in the Majors**, trailing only San Francisco's Logan Webb (27)...tossed at least 6.0 innings in 14 of his final 16 starts (7/2-9/27) and in 19 of his final 22 starts (5/28-9/27).
- Tossed at least 7.0 innings in seven of his final 12 starts (7/28-9/27), eight of his final 15 starts (7/8-9/27) and nine of his final 18 starts (6/20-9/27)...his 11 starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the second-most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Logan Webb (16) and Framber Valdez (16).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUKE WEAVER (3-5, 6.47 ERA)

RHP Luke Weaver will make his 29th appearance (25th start) of the season and third start with the Yankees in tonight's series finale at Toronto...the 30-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...made his last start on Friday vs. Arizona and earned the win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 3K)...marked his first career appearance at Yankee Stadium...was claimed off waivers by the Yankees from the Seattle Mariners on 9/12 and was added to the active roster prior to Game 2 of the doubleheader on 9/14 at Boston...in 28 combined games (24 starts) with the Cincinnati Reds (21GS), Seattle Mariners (5G/1GS) and Yankees (2GS) this season, is 3-5 with a 6.47 ERA (119.2IP, 149H, 88R/86ER, 39BB, 103K, 27HR)...over parts of eight Major League seasons with the St. Louis Cardinals (2016-18), Arizona Diamondbacks (2019-22), Kansas City Royals (2022), Cincinnati Reds (2023), Seattle Mariners (2023) and Yankees (2023), is 27-41 with a 5.14 ERA (570.1IP, 632H, 351R/326ER, 187BB, 565K, 88HR) in 143 games (105 starts).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his Yankees home debut on Friday vs. Arizona and earned the win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 3K)...retired 13 of his first 15BF...marked his first career appearance at Yankee Stadium...also marked his second scoreless start of at least 5.0 innings this season (also tossed 6.1 scoreless innings on 5/25 vs. St. Louis with Cincinnati).

- VS. TORONTO:** Will make his first career appearance vs. the Blue Jays tonight.
- ✦ Will mark his fifth appearance (fourth start) against an AL East club this season (three starts with Cincinnati: 5/20 vs. the Yankees, 5/31 at Boston, 6/28 at Baltimore; and one relief appearance with Seattle: 9/9 at Tampa Bay)...owns a 7.23 ERA (18.2IP, 15ER) over those four outings.
 - ✦ In seven career games (four starts) against the AL East, owns a 7.43 ERA (26.2IP, 22ER).

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: Made his Yankees home debut on Friday vs. Arizona and earned the win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 3K)...marked his first career appearance at Yankee Stadium.

- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on Saturday at Pittsburgh, recording a no-decision after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...surrendered a two-run HR to Bryan Reynolds in the first inning and allowed a sac fly to Endy Rodriguez in the third...retired nine of his final 10 batters faced (1 double).

2023: In 28 combined games (24 starts) with the Cincinnati Reds (21GS), Seattle Mariners (5G/1GS) and Yankees (2GS) this season, is 3-5 with a 6.47 ERA (119.2IP, 149H, 88R/86ER, 39BB, 103K, 27HR).

- ✦ Signed a one-year Major League contract with Cincinnati on 1/13...began the 2023 season on the 15-day injured list with a right elbow flexor strain...made two rehab starts with Triple-A Louisville (9.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 4BB, 9K, 1HR) before being reinstated on 4/20...went 2-4 with a 6.87 ERA (97.0IP, 125H, 76R/74ER, 34BB, 85K, 24HR) in 21 starts with the Reds.
- ✦ Was released by the Reds on 8/18 and signed a Major League contract with the Mariners on 8/22...in five games (one start) with Seattle, went 0-1 with a 6.08 ERA (13.1IP, 16H, 9ER, 3BB, 8K, 2HR)...was designated for assignment by Seattle on 9/10.
- ✦ Was claimed off waivers by the Yankees from the Seattle Mariners on 9/12 and was added to the active roster prior to Game 2 of the doubleheader on 9/14 at Boston.

FOR STARTERS: Has made 24 starts this season with Cincinnati (21GS), Seattle (1GS) and the Yankees (2GS), going 3-5 with a 6.55 ERA (110.0IP, 80ER).

- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in six of his last eight starts (since 7/23).
- ✦ Recorded 8K in back-to-back starts to begin the season (4/20 at Pittsburgh and 4/25 vs. Texas - both with Cincinnati).

CAREER NOTES: Over parts of eight Major League seasons with the St. Louis Cardinals (2016-18), Arizona Diamondbacks (2019-22), Kansas City Royals (2022), Cincinnati Reds (2023), Seattle Mariners (2023) and Yankees (2023), is 27-41 with a 5.14 ERA (570.1IP, 632H, 351R/326ER, 187BB, 565K, 88HR) in 143 games (105 starts).

- ✦ Was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Florida State University.
- ✦ Was acquired by the Diamondbacks, along with C Carson Kelly, INF Andrew Young and a competitive balance draft pick, for INF Paul Goldschmidt on 12/5/18.
