To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game homestand against the Padres (3-0) and Mets (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...marks their first multi-series homestand comprised of solely NL opponents since May 6-11, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field (PHI/MIL)...have won four straight and six of their last seven games in the wake of a 2-7 stretch (Aug. 14-22)...are an AL-leading 17-8 in their last 25 games (Aug. 3-pres.) and an MLB-best 26-12 in their last 38 (July 20-pres.)...have the AL's hardest remaining schedule with an opp. winning pct. of .514...five of their eight remaining opponents are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...have spent 105 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 65 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record for 104 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- ★ **Jonny DeLuca** hit a game-tying, two-run homer in the bottom of the 9th and **Jorge Mateo** delivered the winning hit with an 11th-inning single in yesterday's 5-4, walk-off victory, completing a three-game sweep of the Padres, the Rays MLB-leading 14th of the year.
- ★ It marked their third walk-off victory, joining walk-off PA by **Jonathan Aranda** on April 11 vs. NYY (FC) and May 3 vs. SF (1B)...the club improved to 7-6 in extra-inning contests (3-2 at home) and earned its 34th comeback win, tying the White Sox and Yankees for the AL lead...the Rays have recorded consecutive come-from-behind wins for the first time since a three-game streak from Aug. 9-10 (at SEA x2, at ATH).
- ★ It was the Rays third win when trailing entering the 9th inning, joining Aug. 4 at COL (trailed 7-5, won 9-7 in 11 inn.) and April 16 at CWS (trailed 3-2, won 5-3)...it was also their AL-most 13th win when trailing through six frames, second most in MLB to the Phillies (15).
- ★ The club has won back-to-back games by one run for the fourth time this season (last: Aug. 7-8) and is 9-3 in its last 12 one-run affairs (July 26-pres.) following a 2-9 skid (June 1-July 18)...its last longer streak was a team-record-tying three straight wins by one run from June 4-6, 2025...overall, the Rays 20-13 (.606) mark in one-run affairs ranks second in the AL/fourth in MLB.
- ★ The Rays have won 10 consecutive games vs. NL opponents after starting 12-17 vs. Senior Circuit clubs, tied for the second-longest Interleague winning streak in club history (see table on the right)...they have homered in all 10 games of the streak, with multiple homers in eight of the 10 victories...it marks their longest single-season streak of homers vs. NL clubs since April 3-May 18, 2023 (12 straight).
- ★ Overall, the Rays have recorded multiple home runs in three straight games for the second time this season, joining a six-game streak from June 25-July 1...the club is 40-1 when out-homering opponents, recording 27 straight wins in such contests since the lone loss on May 25 at BAL.

THE RAY WAY—With yesterday's victory, the Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...it marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998-2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (17), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ★ The Rays have opened a season with five straight winning months for the second time, joining 2008...the 2008 squad posted a 13-14 record in September, but went on to make the first World Series appearance in franchise history.
- ★ They are 18-9 in August—with a win tonight, the Rays would secure their fourth-most wins during the month in team history, trailing 2021 (21-6), 2020 (21-7), and 2008 (21-7).

HOW SWEEP IT IS—The Rays MLB-leading 14 sweeps are tied with 2021 for the most in franchise history and are the most by any club since the Astros (15) and Dodgers (17) in 2022...since 2000, only eight AL clubs have recorded more sweeps in a season: Houston in 2022 and 2019 (17), Boston in 2018 (15), Cleveland in 2016 and 2017 (both 15), Chicago-AL in 2005 (15), and both Oakland (17) and Seattle (17) in 2001...the Rays have swept four of their last eight sets and have won back-to-back series on the heels of three straight series losses (Aug. 14-23)...the club is 12-6-2 across its last 20 sets (June 19-pres.), with seven of the 12 series wins coming via sweeps.

- ★ The Rays 28-16 (.636) mark in series openers ranks third in the majors to the Brewers (31-13/.705) and Yankees (29-15/.659)...in club history, only the the 2020 (13-6/.684) and 2023 Rays (34-18/.654) have posted better winning percentages in series-opening games.

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in seven of the last eight games, turning in a 2.22 ERA (.73 OIP, 18ER) while holding opponents to a 172-/211/263 (45-for-262) line...all marks are the best in the majors over that stretch (Aug. 20-pres.)...they also have MLB's best WHIP in that span (0.79), with the Dodgers (1.01) being the next closest staff...entering that span, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 1.88 ERA during the eight-game span, going 4-0 with 34 SO against 5 BB...five of their last seven starts have been quality.

CAMI CRUSH—Junior Caminero has homered in back-to-back games on the heels of a career-high-tying 15-game drought without a long ball...this marks the ninth time this season and 19th time in his career he has homered in two consecutive games or more, surpassing **Aubrey Huff** (18x) for fourth most in franchise history, five streaks shy of fifth-ranked **Brandon Lowe** (23x)...with 37 HR, Caminero is tied with HOU **Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only PHI **Kyle Schwarber** (40) and CHC **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (38) across all of MLB...this marks the latest date in franchise history a Rays player has held at least a share of the AL home run lead...the 37 HR are third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is 3 HR shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 26 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

- ★ Caminero has hit safely in a career-high 13 straight games, the majors' longest active streak and the longest by a Ray since **Chander Simpson**'s career-best 18-game run from June 25-July 19, 2025...he is slashing .360/.418/.520 (18-for-50) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI and a .938 OPS during the streak, tying for second in the AL in hits over that span behind TOR **George Springer** (19).
- ★ After his 440-ft. shot yesterday, Caminero has recorded an MLB-leading 7 HR that traveled 440 ft. or farther, most by a Ray under Statcast (since 2015)...his eight such homers in his career are the most by any Ray over that timeframe, besting **Steven Souza Jr.**'s seven.

A CHAN OF MANY TALENTS—During the month of August, **Chandler Simpson** is tied for the AL's most hits (39, tied with KC **Jac Caglianone**) and stolen bases (10, tied with NYY **Jazz Chisholm Jr.**)...he is attempting to become the first player in franchise history to hold at least a share of the league lead in both categories during a calendar month (Elias)...over his last 59 games (June 19-pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.360/82-for-224), hits, and stolen bases (23)...over that span, the Rays 41-24 (.631) record is second in MLB to the Red Sox (45-20/.692), and Simpson has batted .404 (57-for-141) with an .864 OPS in Rays wins, MLB's best average in team wins within that span (min. 100AB in wins), ahead of LAD **Freddie Freeman** (.395)...entering that timeframe, he endured a 3-for-44 skid from May 30-June 17, and the Rays 6-11 mark in that stretch was tied for second worst in the majors.

- ★ On the year, Simpson leads the AL with 47 multi-hit games...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...his majors-most 55 infield hits are 18 more than the next closest player (MIA **Otto Lopez** - 37) and are the sixth most by any player in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), including the most since MIA **Dee Strange-Gordon** (64) in 2015, according to Baseball Savant...he is 10 infield hits shy of SEA **Ichiro Suzuki**'s record of 65 from 2010.
- ★ With 37 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is three steals shy of joining CAI **Chad Curtis** (1992-93), MON **Delino DeShields** (1990-91), STL **Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

THE BAKE SHOW—Bryan Baker has converted a franchise-record 28 consecutive save opportunities (May 17-pres.), pushing his season-long total to an MLB-leading 39 saves, most by a Ray since **Alex Colomé** led MLB with 47 in 2017 and the second most by a Tampa Bay closer before the end of August...one shy of Colomé (40) during the same season...Baker's 28-save streak ties SD **Mason Miller** (March 28-July 29) for MLB's longest this season and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since CLE **Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20-Sept. 25, 2024...he is attempting to join Colomé as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season.

FROM THE BIG APPLE TO THE BAY—The Rays begin their three-game set against the Mets tonight at Tropicana Field, the 14th series between the clubs in franchise history (8-5-0 in previous 13)...the Rays swept the Mets in their three-game series at Citi Field last season (June 13-15), outscoring them 24-9...they have won 16 of their last 21 games against the club dating since **Kevin Cash** took the helm in 2015...only the Astros (15-4/.789) have a better record vs. New York-NL in that span...they have won eight straight games over the Mets at Tropicana Field, their second-longest home winning streak over an NL opponent behind a nine-game run vs. PHI (2014-25) and tied for their sixth longest against any club.

- ★ **Yandy Diaz** has hit safely in all seven of his career games against the Mets, going 15-for-31 (.484) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 8 RBI, 2 BB, and 5 R...in 16 career games vs. New York-NL, **Cedric Mullins** has gone 20-for-51 (.392) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 3 RBI, 3 BB, and 8 R.

TONIGHT'S START—**Ian Seymour** is slated to make his 12th start of the season and his 42nd appearance...marks his 61st career appearance and 17th career start...has gone 3-3 with a 3.20 ERA (39.1IP, 14ER) over his last seven outings (four starts)...was selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- In his last 12 outings (eight starts) since June 25, he ranks highly among AL qualifiers in strikeouts (5th, 83), wins (T5th, 6), and WHIP (9th, 1.05).
- With a win tonight, he would become the third AL southpaw to reach double-digit wins this season alongside **CLE Parker Messick** (11) and teammate **Shane McClanahan** (10)...Seymour is currently tied with **CLE Joey Cantillo**, **CWS Anthony Kay**, **BOS Jake Bennett**, **KC Noah Cameron**, and **BAL Trevor Rogers** with nine victories.
- Since transitioning to a starting/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 3.79 ERA (76.0IP, 32ER), 1.07 WHIP, and .220 (64-for-291) opp. average (15G/10GS) compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).
- Among AL pitchers with at least 100.0 innings this season, his 4.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio is the 11th best and among AL southpaws, he is second to **BOS Payton Tolle** (4.03).

LAST TIME OUT—On Aug. 25 at DET, he entered the game as the scheduled bulk reliever for Casey Legumina...he turned in 5.2 innings out of the bullpen with seven hits, four runs (3ER), five strikeouts, and one home run...he suffered the loss in the outing, the first time he has taken the loss in back-to-back outings since Sept. 5-11, 2025 vs. CLE/at CWS...

- Prior to the outing, he had struck out seven batters or more in each of his first four starts during August...entering play today, he is tied for the third most in the AL this month with **BOS Payton Tolle** (38), behind **TOR Dylan Cease** (43) and **CLE Parker Messick** (39)...his 38 strikeouts are tied with his total from July 2026 for the most since **Shane McClanahan** (42) in March/April 2023.

THE UNSLEEPING CITY—Seymour would be making his first career outing against the Mets tonight...in four career outings against the NL East, he is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (12.2IP, 5ER), 15 strikeouts, and a 1.11 WHIP...three of those outings have come in 2026, with two against Miami (May 15 & May 17) and one against Washington (June 20).

- Seymour is 3-1 with a 4.50 ERA (36.0IP, 18ER), 44 strikeouts, and a 1.22 WHIP against the NL in his career in 18 outings...he has made four career starts in Interleague games to a 2-1 record, 3.50 ERA (18.0IP, 7ER), and a 1.17 WHIP.
- The Rays are 10-8 when he pitches against a NL foe in his career...the Rays are also 7-6 when starting a southpaw against NL opposition this season.

DOME SWEET DOME—Seymour has appeared in 22 games (seven starts) at the Trop this season...in those outings, he is 4-3 with two saves, a 3.77 ERA (57.1IP, 24ER), 67 strikeouts, and a 0.99 WHIP...the Rays are 15-7 when he pitches at home this season.

- In home night games at the Trop this season, he is 2-0 with a 3.16 ERA (31.1IP, 11ER), 41 strikeouts, and a 0.93 WHIP.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 29.0 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking sixth among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to LAD **Tarik Skubal** (32.7%), NYY **Brent Headrick** (32.0%), HOU **Steven Okert** (30.4%), CLE **Joey Cantillo** (30.2%), and LAA **Reid Detmers** (29.1%)...107 of his 128 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, second most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (121)...Seymour's 107 swinging strikeouts are sixth most among AL southpaws this season.

- His out-of-zone swing pct. (34.7%) has increased 8.3 points from his mark last season (26.4%).

CHANGE OF PLANS—CHANGE OF PLANS—Seymour has utilized his changeup 29.8 pct. of the time this season, down from his 31.4 pct. usage rate in 2025...his 29.8 pct. usage rate in 2026 ranks fifth in the majors (min. 1,500 pitches) and third among southpaws behind **PHI Cristopher Sánchez's** MLB-leading 37.7 pct. clip and **ATL Martín Pérez** (30.9%)...min. 400 changeups thrown this year, Seymour's 39.2 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the fifth-highest mark in the majors behind **DET/LAD Tarik Skubal** (47.5%), **Sánchez** (47.1%), **SD Bradgley Rodriguez** (40.7%), and **CLE Joey Cantillo** (40.4%).

THESEYMOURSHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside **BAL Tippy Martinez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), **STL Al Buzle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), **BOS Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), **CWS Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and **BOS Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)....all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
- Seymour's seven strikeouts were the most by a Rays reliever since **Jesse Scholtens** struck out nine batters on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
