# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (10-5) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (8-7) APRIL 14, 2024 at Citizens Bank Park, Philadelphia, PA - 1:35 EDT - GAME \#16/ROAD \#11 RHP MITCH KELIER (1-1, 5.29 ERA) vs. RHP ZACK WHEELER ( $0-2,1.89$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:....were walked off for the first time this season yesterday afternoon...Will look to avoid losing back-to-back games on the road for the first time this season...Began the season 5-0 for the first time since 1983...Swept a season-opening four-game series on the road for the first time since doing so in 1903 in Cincinnati... Opened the season with a 12 -inning, come-from-behind, last at-bat win on March 28 against the Marlins.

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Mitch Keller gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this four-game series against the Phillies...The 28 -year-old Keller earned his first win (6.0ip/2er) of the season Monday night against the Tigers.

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller tossed 6.0 innings Monday night against the Tigers, giving him 34 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today...It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.

WHAT'S AT STAKE: The Pirates were walked off for the first time this season yesterday afternoon while also losing a game in the final at-bat for the second time (also Tuesday against the Tigers at PNC Park)...Prior to yesterday, Pittsburgh's previous walkoff loss also came here at Citizens Bank Park last year on September 26.... Pittsburgh has gone 3-0-1 in its first four series of the season heading into the deciding game of this four-game weekend series at Citizens Bank Park.

ON DECK: Pittsburgh will continue its seven-game road trip tomorrow night with the beginning of a three-game series against the Mets...The Pirates went 3-3 against the Mets in 2023 after taking two of three games at PNC Park from June 9-11 while dropping two of three games at Citi Field from August 14-16.

BRYAN ON THE BASES: Bryan Reynolds reached base safely in all four of his plate appearances yesterday after going 1 -for-1 with three walks, a stolen base and run scored... Reynolds comes into today tied for third among all National League players with 11 walks.

HOMETOWN HELLO: Pirates prospect Anthony Solometo, who is a 2021 graduate of Bishop
Eustace (NJ) Prep School, is slated to make his second start of the season today with Double-A
Altoona...The 21 -year-old Solometo allowed one hit in 4.0 scoreless innings in his season debut with Altoona on April 7 at Akron... Solometo is currently rated No. 76 among MLB Pipeline's top 100 prospects...The Pirates have four pitchers (Paul Skenes, Jared Jones, Anthony Solometo and Bubba Chandler) ranked among the game's top 100 prospects according to MLB Pipeline...That's the most top 100 pitching prospects among all organizations.

START ME UP: Pittsburgh's starting pitching staff has allowed 15 earned runs in 56.0 innings in the last nine games (2.41 ERA)... Pittsburgh's 3.56 starting rotation ERA (86.0ip/34er) is the sixth-lowest among all teams in MLB...The only five starting rotations to record a lower ERA are the Red Sox (1.96), Royals (2.63), Yankees (2.69), Phillies (2.84) and Rangers (3.36).

ROTATION RANKINGS: The Pirates rank sixth in all of MLB in walks per 9.0
innings (2.41)...The only five starting rotations averaging fewer walks per 9.0 PLAYERS WHOSE 300TH CAREER innings are the Mariners (1.84), Orioles (1.95), Reds (2.19), Royals (2.22) and HOME RUN CAME AS A PIRATE

Giants (2.26)...Pittsburgh's starting rotation also has the eighth-lowest batting PLAYER average against (.237) in all of MLB...The only seven starting rotations with a lower batting average against are the Rangers (.203), Phillies (.208), Dodgers (.208), Red Sox (.215), Tigers (.220), Royals (.221) and Yankees (.226).

CUTCH CLOSING IN ON 300: Andrew MCCutchen is one home run shy of 300 in his career... The 37-year-old McCutchen ranks fourth all-time in Pirates history with 215 home runs (Willie Stargell ranks first with 475)...In addition, McCutchen's next home run would also make him one of just 13 players all-time with at least 2000 hits, 400 doubles, 45 triples, 300 home runs and 200 career stolen bases...Giancarlo Stanton leads all active players with 406 home runs.
