## STRIKEOUTS

RHP Trevor Bauer ( 11 strikeouts on Mon) and RHP Sonny Gray (10 strikeouts last night) are the first Reds pitchers to record at least 10 strikeouts in consecutive starts since RHP Gary Nolan (10) and RHP Jim Maloney (10) did it on $9 / 20 \& 9 / 21,1968$ at Hou....according to Elias Sports Bureau, in modern history Reds pitchers never have recorded at least 10 strikeouts in 3 consecutive starts...RHP Luis Castillo, this afternoon's starting pitcher, has three 10 -strikeout games this season and six 10 -strikeout games in his career, with a single-game high of 13 on $8 / 5 / 19$ vs LAA.

## QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

In their previous 8 series, the Reds went 4-1-3 ( $2-1$ at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl, 2-0 vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs, $0-3$ at Wsh, 2-2 vs StL)... the 4-0-2 stretch was the Redlegs' longest series streak of the season without a loss.

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3 -game series vs Mark Grant's Padres and Game 7 (3-3) of a 7 -game homestand that included a 2 -2 series split vs the first-place Cardinals...is Game 16 (7-8) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park ( $2-0$ vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs, $0-3$ at Wsh, $2-2$ vs StL, 1-1 vs SD)...following tomorrow's off day and beginning Friday night the Reds will embark on their ongest road trip of the season, a 3-city, 10-day, 11-game road trip to Pit's PNC Park ( 3 g ), Mia's Marlins Park ( 4 g ) and StL's Busch Stadium ( 4 g , day/ night DH on $8 / 31$ ).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are $4-2$ this season vs SD and regardless of today's outcome will win their first season series vs the Padres since 2012 (6-2)...between season series wins the Reds went 18-26 vs SD... Reds pitchers have recorded 26 strikeouts the first 2 games of this series, 12 strikeouts shy of the club record for a 3 -game series ( $38 \mathrm{k}, 9 / 22-9 / 25$, 1995 at Phi \& 9/29-10/1, 2015 vs Cubs)...the teams have combined for 52 strikeouts, 19 shy of the Reds record for combined strikeouts in a 3-game series (71k, 9/22-9/24, 1995 at Phi).

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds are 1-1-2 in the first 4 series of the season vs the Pirates...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field...from $3 / 31-4 / 5$ the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 \& 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin )...last season the Reds lost 8 of their last 9 and 10 of their last 12 games vs the Pirates, including a 7-game losing streak from 7/20-9/28.

SNAPPED: Josh Naylor's solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning last night vs SD snapped Sonny Gray's career-high scoreless streak at 23 innings...ties for the second-longest scoreless streak in the Major Leagues

Hoover's 26.1-inning streak from 6/13-8/19, 2013...is the longest by a Reds starter since Tom Browning's 23-inning streak from 5/29-6/8, 1990...is the longest by a Reds righthanded starter since Tom Seaver's 27-inning streak from 9/15-9/30, 1977

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino produced 11 HR in his first 17 career games, including a 3-homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season. Established modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10) and first 17 career games (11)...will share, at least, with Rhys Hoskins the modern Major League record for HR in a player's first 20 career games
Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it, the second this season (Chi's Kris Bryant, $5 / 17$ at Wsh, 7 th-9th).
Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
Is the third rookie batter since 1900 to produce at least 10 HR over an 11-game span (8/6-8/17), joining LAD's Cody Bellinger (2017) and Det's Rudy York (1937).
With 11 HR, all in August, is 3 shy of the club record for home runs in a calendar month...Frank Robinson hit 14 HR in August 1962, and Greg Vaughn had 14 HR in September 1999.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (102), HR (37), RBI (99) and slugging percentage (.591), are tied with the Mets for the lead in batting average (.308) and rank second in the first frame in on-base percentage (.366)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 102-67, and are 31-8 (.795) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first.

REHABBING: RHP Tyler Mahle, on the injured list since $\mathbf{7 / 2 2}$ with a left hamstring strain, on Friday began a rehabilitation assignment for Louisville vs Rochester, started and received no decision in the $5-2$ loss (1.1ip, 3h, 3er, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{k}, 37$ pitches)... he is scheduled to pitch again for the Bats tonight at Columbus...C Curt Casali, on the injured list since $7 / 18$ with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, on $8 / 9$ and $8 / 10$ made 2 rehab apps before he was shut down with soreness in his left hamstring...last night returned to that rehab assignment with Louisville and caught 5 innings (1-3)...IF/OF Derek Dietrich, on the injured list since $8 / 5$ with left shoulder inflammation is 2 games into a rehabilitation assignment with Louisville (1gs at 2B, 1 gs at DH, 2-for-8, 1hbp, 2r).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 78 of the Reds' 125 games so far this season, including 52 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once solely as a pinch hitter, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 4 times as a CF 3 times as a LF, 8 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF ( $3 / 28$ vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 391.1 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

## RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...in Fri's 13-4 loss vs StL allowed a career-high 8 runs and tied career highs by allowing 9 hits and 3 home runs (3-run by Dexter Fowler, 2-run by Paul DeJong, 2-run by Paul Goldschmidt)...in his last 30 apps beginning $9 / 1 / 18$ is 14-6 and in that span ranks third among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.73...this season ranks among the National League eaders in wins (T8th), ERA (8th), strikeouts (7th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (6th, 10.64)...in his career has allowed 13 HR in the first inning, his highest total in any inning and including 3 HR in the first frame this year...in his $7-4$ win on $8 / 5 \mathrm{vs}$ LAA, his career-high 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on $8 / 23 / 15$ vs Ari...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his Major League debut in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

During that award-winning week, from $8 / 3-8 / 2$ hit . 517 in a career-high 9-game hitting streak and from 8/5-8/12 produced at least 1 RBI in 7 consecutive apps, the longest RBI streak by a Reds batter this season...his 4 -game HR streak from 8/6-8/10 was the longest by a Reds batter in 2019 and fell 1 game shy of the franchise record for HR in consecutive games.
His 2-run HR on 8/8 off Chi's Cole Hamels traveled 118.3 miles per hour, the hardest hit ball by a Reds batter in the Statcast Era and tied for the hardest hit home run in the Major Leagues this season (Gary Sánchez, Pete Alonso).
On 8/3 at Atl, in his third Major League appearance, produced his first career hit (single off Dallas Keuchel), first career HR (3-run off Keuchel) and first career RBI. Was an International League All-Star at Louisville (78g, .299, 28hr, 53rbi).

2nd Half: 22-66 (.333), 3 2b, 4hr, 14rbi, .921ops Hit safely in 5 of his last 7 apps ( $8-21, .381,22 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 4 \mathrm{rbi}, .619 \mathrm{slg}, .480 \mathrm{obp})$. In his last 11 apps beginning $8 / 10$ is hitting . 333 (11-33, $22 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, 1.005 \mathrm{ops})$ Since coming off the IL, the Reds are 11-8 in his 19 starts and $8-5$ in his last 13 starts. Since he came off the injured list on $7 / 26$ has hit safely in 13 of his 19 starts and produced at least 1 RBI in 7 of those 19 starts.

In the 17-9 win on $7 / 13$ at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on $7 / 6 / 1949$ vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
Has 2 career pinch-hit HR, both this season (7/21 vs StL off Andrew Miller, 8/12 at Wsh off Sean Doolittle).
In 40 apps for Louisville hit . 290 ( 8 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10 g in LF, 25 g in CF).
52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c
2nd Half: 12-41 (.293), 2 2b, 1 hr , 4rbi Has 7 HR and 24 RBI...are the first home runs of his career...entered the season with 11 career RBI in 59 apps
Since he came off the concussion list on $7 / 28$ is hitting .281 ( $9-32,12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 2 \mathrm{rbi}$ ) in 14 apps and 7 starts ( 5 gs at $\mathrm{C}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at 1 B ).
This season has made 13 apps and 9 starts at C ...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at C ( 3 g in 2017, 1 g in 2018). this spring training caught 36.0 innings
Has made 29 starts ( 11 gs at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 9 \mathrm{gs}$ at $\mathrm{C}, 6 \mathrm{gs}$ at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 3 \mathrm{gs}$ at 3 B ).
In his career has played $1 \mathrm{~B}(15 \mathrm{~g}, 7 \mathrm{gs}), 2 \mathrm{~B}(33 \mathrm{~g}, 11 \mathrm{gs}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(33 \mathrm{~g}, 17 \mathrm{gs}) \& \mathrm{C}(17 \mathrm{~g}, 9 \mathrm{gs})$ Leads Reds pinch hitters in at bats, hits, doubles and RBI (9-33, .273, $32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 6rbi)...hit his only career pinch-hit HR on $5 / 5$ vs SF (solo off Will Smith)
Made his only Major League pitching appearance in a $12-5$ loss on $8 / 8$ vs Cubs (1.1ip, 1h)...became the first Reds player to pitch and catch in the same game since Dee Moore in 1936

3 FREDDY GALVIS, inf Blue Jays: 115g, .267, 24 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 54rbi, 4sb On 8/12 was claimed off waivers from the Blue Jays.
Has 21 HR, a new single-season career high (20hr, 2016)...with 60 RBI, is 7 shy of his single-season career high $(2016,2018)$.
Has hit safely in 7 of his 8 apps for the Reds
For the Blue Jays played SS (103g, 102gs) and 2B ( $5 \mathrm{~g}, 4 \mathrm{gs}$ )...has made all 7 of his starts for the Reds at 2B.
Did not play on $4 / 24$, snapping his streak of 349 consecutive games played...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Freddie Freeman 2nd, 194g).
In each of the 2017 and 2018 seasons played in 162 games...his 1,441.0 innings in the field in 2018 were the most by any player in the Major Leagues.
In his last 53 apps for the Blue Jays hit .300, raising his season BA from . 236 to .267.
4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss
2nd Half: 37-116 (.319), 7 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 14rbi, 3sb Last night went 0-for-3, snapping a 14-game hitting streak during which he hit . 420 (21-50, 5 2b, 1 3b, $1 \mathrm{hr}, 7 \mathrm{rbi}, 1.032 \mathrm{ops}$ )... was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and the longest by a Reds batter since Joey Votto's 17-game hitting streak from 7/26-8/12, 2017.
After missing 3 games with soreness in his right biceps, returned to the lineup on 8/12 and in 9 games since then is hitting 353 (12-34, 3 2b, $1 \mathrm{hr}, 4 \mathrm{rbi}, .500 \mathrm{slg}, .361 \mathrm{obp})$. In the first inning, leads the National League in hitting (.478) and slugging percentage (.870) while ranking second in the first frame in on-base percentage (also .478). With 115 hits is tied with Eugenio Suárez for the most on the team...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
With 8 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...his career high for RBI in a season is 54 (2017).
After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving primarily to 2B.

34 BRIAN O'GRADY, inf/of 2nd Half: 8g, 1gs, 1-10 (.100) Was recalled from Louisville prior to Sunday's game, when Joey Votto went on the injured list with a low back strain.
Has made 3 apps since Sunday's promotion, including 2 apps as a pinch hitter (0-2, 1 k ) and his first Major League start on Tue vs SD (LF, 0-3).
Is in his second stint with the Reds this season...from 8/8-8/12 went 1 -for- 5 in 5 apps ( 1 g at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{~g}$ in CF, 3 g as PH )
In the eighth inning of the $12-5$ loss on $8 / 8$ vs Cubs made his Major League debut as a defensive replacement in CF for Nick Senzel, who moved to 2B for Kyle Farmer, who went in to pitch...was Senzel's first Major League appearance at 2B and Farmer's first pitching appearance since high school.
Entered the 10-1 win on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in the top of the sixth inning, replacing Joey Votto at 1B...in the seventh inning singled off Alec Mills for his first Major League hit. Made 103 apps for the Bats (.273, 27 2b, 1 3b, 27hr, 70rbi, 17sb)...when promoted the first time, on $8 / 5$, was just 1 of just 3 players in professional baseball with at least 27 doubles and 27 HR (Pit's Josh Bell, 34 2b, 27hr \& Min's Max Kepler, 27 2b, 30hr). 2nd Half: 24-83 (.289), 4 2b, $13 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 13 \mathrm{rbi}$ In 62 apps beginning $5 / 31$ is hitting .283 (43-152, $82 \mathrm{~b}, 23 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 21 \mathrm{rbi}, 1 \mathrm{sb})$, raising his season batting average from . 199 .
Leads the team with 42 starts at 2B (last, $8 / 8$ vs Cubs)...made 18 starts at SS, secondmost on the team behind José Iglesias and most recently in 3 straight games from 8/9-8/11 while Iglesias recovered from soreness in his right biceps.
Made 1 start at 3B (Sat vs StL), his only career start at that position, and 11 starts in the outfield, including 9 starts in LF (last, Mon vs SD) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
Has played 2B $(67 \mathrm{~g})$, SS $(33 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(5 \mathrm{~g})$, LF $(24 \mathrm{~g})$, CF $(5 \mathrm{~g})$ and $\mathrm{P}(2 \mathrm{~g})$.
Made the first 2 pitching apps of his career...with 2 outs in the ninth inning of the 11-4 loss on $7 / 30$ vs Pit, in a game that featured 9 ejections, threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8...in the $13-4$ loss on $8 / 16$ vs StL threw a scoreless ninth inning, allowed only an infield single to Kolten Wong.
Because of Scooter Gennett's injury in spring training, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the team's starting SS...has made 5 apps and 1 start at 3B.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf
2nd Half: 33-119 (.277), 7 2b, 2 3b, 2hr, 11rbi, 4sb Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
Hit safely in 4 of his last 5 apps (4-16, .250, solo HR, .438sig, .333obp)
His .285 batting average through $8 / 2$ is a season high.
Has 3 leadoff HR (5/6 vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, 6/12 at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on $4 / 23$ and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit .257 ( $12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 2 \mathrm{rbi}$ ).

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

 2nd Half: 35-130 (.269), 14hr, 23rbi, .989ops First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.Leads all Major League third basemen with 34 HR, tying last season's career high... the franchise record for HR in a season by a third baseman is held by Tony Pérez, who in 1970 hit 40 HR overall and 39 HR while playing that position.
In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues in HR (12) and ranks fourth in the majors in RBI (22) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.720) and 14th in batting average (.330).

Beginning 6/30, homered in 16 of his last 44 apps (18hr), including a pair of 2-homer games ( $7 / 1$ vs Mil, $7 / 22$ at Mil).
Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in club history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons. Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th).

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 29-87 (.333), 7 2b, 4hr, 10rbi, .954ops With Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1B in 5 of the Reds' last 6 games...hit . 353 in those 5 starts (6-17, $12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{rbi})$...are his first career starts at that position.
Started 8 of the Reds' last 9 games and PH/LF in the other (5gs at 1B, 2gs at 2B, 1gs in LF)...in those 9 apps hit . 355 (11-31, 2 2b, 2rbi).
In his last 12 apps beginning $8 / 9$ is hitting .341 (14-41, 52 b , 3rbi, .372 obp ), raising his season BA from . 275 .
In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, has made 31 apps and 20 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
Has made 27 starts ( $13 \mathrm{gs} / 24 \mathrm{~g}$ in LF, $6 \mathrm{gs} / 13 \mathrm{~g}$ at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs} / 6 \mathrm{~g}$ at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 5 \mathrm{gs} / 7 \mathrm{~g}$ at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, $6 / 23$ vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479 -foot HR on 4/3/18. Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez 3 times, Aristides Aquino 4g).
Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 $3 \mathrm{~b}, 14 \mathrm{hr}, 43 \mathrm{rbi}, 8 \mathrm{sb}, 1.097 \mathrm{ops}) \ldots$...started at $1 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$, 2B $(20 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$ and LF $(3 \mathrm{~g})$. In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month (.358, 11 hr, 28rbi).
In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13). Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 28-86 (.326), 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 12rbi, .949ops Because of upper back spasms didn't start any of the Reds' last 6 games, but Sun vs StL pinch hit and walked...last started last Wed at Wsh (CF, 1-3, 2bb).
In his last 17 apps beginning $7 / 29$ is hitting . 364 (16-44, 2 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, 1.007ops). In his last 27 apps beginning $7 / 18$ is hitting .342 (25-73, 52 b , 3hr, 9rbi, .982ops). Has 4 career leadoff HR, including 3 this season ( $6 / 18$ vs Hou off Justin Verlander, $7 / 31$ vs Pit off Dario Agrazal, 8/12 at Wsh off Erick Fedde)...the leadoff HR off Fedde came on the first pitch of the game.
Has 16 HR, a new single-season career high ( $7 \mathrm{hr}, 2017$ \& 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
Has made 87 starts, including a team-high 59 starts in LF (16gs in CF, 11gs in RF).
